### LSC BASEBALL

Non-conference actions continues for Lone Star Conference teams this week.

In 2014, LSC teams are playing a 10-week schedule with a four-game series and three-game series against every other team. Each four-game series shall consist of a 9-inning game Friday, a 7x7 doubleheader Saturday and 9-inning contest Sunday, and each three-game series shall consist of a 9-inning game Friday and a 7x9 doubleheader Saturday.

The overall LSC Champion will be the team(s) with the best winning percentage in regular-season conference games, while the winner of the postseason championship will be recognized as LSC Tournament Champion and receive the league's automatic qualification into NCAA postseason. The championship will be played May 8-10, at the No. 1 seed.

LSC baseball teams are 32-17 overall this season. In the NCAA South Central Region, the teams are currently 13-5 combined versus Heartland Conference teams and 11-5 against the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

### PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

#### HITTERS

**Ryan Forkel, Eastern New Mexico University, SR, OF, Yorba Linda, Calif., Orange Lutheran HS/Saddleback College**  
 Forkel paced Eastern New Mexico offensively with a .714 batting average, six RBIs, five runs scored, .786 slugging percentage, .733 on-base percentage and two stolen bases in two attempts in a four-game series against New Mexico Highlands. He drove in at least one run in each game and plated three in the third contest of the series. Forkel also had three hits in games one and three and two base knocks in games two and four. In the field, he made five putouts in left field.

#### **Tyler McKnight, West Texas A&M University, SR, OF, Durango, Colo., Durango HS**

McKnight had a solid five games for the Buffs this week in five wins. He went 12 of 22 from the plate with three doubles, four runs scored, two RBI and a total of 15 bases, while slugging .682...McKnight reached base at a .583 clip and went 3 for 3 in stolen bases...He had six putouts in the outfield with no errors. Against McMurry, he went 10 of 19 with three runs scored, three doubles, two RBI and 13 total bases with two steals in the four game sweep of the War Hawks....In the final doubleheader, he was 7 of 10 with a run scored and two doubles and a RBI...For the season, he is second in average at a .429 clip and leads the team with 15 hits, four doubles and 21 total bases.

#### PITCHERS

#### **Drew Reidt, Cameron University, SR, P, Gray Summit, Mo., Pacific HS**

Reidt used 82 pitches and led the Aggies to a one-hit 5-0 win over Northwest Missouri on Friday, Feb 14. He tossed six innings with no walks, and struck out four hitters for his second win of the season. Reidt held the Bearcats to a .056 batting average. In three starts this season he has a 1.53 ERA and is holding opposing batters to a .231 batting average.

#### **Dylan James, West Texas A&M University, SR, RHP, Las Cruces, N.M., Mayfield HS**

James earned his first win of the season Friday in a 5-0 win at McMurry to open the series. James went all seven innings for the complete game shutout, scattering three hits, with one walk and eight strikeouts. The War Hawks hit just .120 against him which was the team-low for the staff this week. He now has two starts on the year with a 1-0 record in 13.0 innings. He has a 1.38 ERA for the year and a team-high 18 strikeouts as the opposition is hitting just .149 against him.

### OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Nick Gibert, Tarleton State University, collected a team-high six hits over the weekend, as he hit .600 with a pair of doubles. Gibert scored three runs for the Purple and White, and drove in a pair of runs as well for his first runs batted in as a Texan. His .800 slugging percentage was the second-highest on the team, while he led the squad with eight total bases.

Codey McElroy, Cameron University, led the Aggies with a .462 batting average off of six hits in four games. Scored five runs and had a .769 slugging percentage with 11 assists at shortstop. McElroy have a pair of doubles on Friday and came up with a triple and a pair of hits on Saturday.

Christian Summers, Angelo State University, blasted his first home run of the season on a three-run shot to right-center field and finished the ASU baseball team's three-game series against Lubbock Christian with four hits and four RBI. Summers, who was selected in the 19th round of the Major League Baseball Draft but decided to return to ASU, also scored three runs and was 2-for-2 on stolen base attempts against the Chaps. Summers now has seven hits and six RBI in the early part of his senior season.

Ben Monticello, Eastern New Mexico University, started the series opener against in-state rival New Mexico Highlands, throwing six scoreless innings as Eastern New Mexico completed their first-ever shutout of the Cowboys in 90 meetings. He struck out five and allowed just three hits as NMHU was only able to muster a .158 batting average off him. The combined shutout was the first of his career in a Greyhound uniform as Monticello improved to 2-0 on the season.

Robert Baker, Tarleton State University, picked up his second win of the season as he helped guide the Texans to a 14-5 win over Texas-Permian Basin on Friday. Baker threw five full innings of shutout baseball as he gave up just three hits and no runs during his outing. The Garland native notched four strikeouts and of the three hits

he gave up, none of them went for extra bases. Baker is now 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA and has eight K's in his last two starts for the Texans.

Jake Feckley, Angelo State University, became the winningest pitcher in Angelo State baseball history after striking out seven and not allowing an earned run in a 5-1 win over Lubbock Christian last Friday in Lubbock. Feckley (3-0, 0.00 ERA) has been as dominant as it gets through his first three starts and stifled the Chap hitters throughout the day. He limited them to a .192 batting average and allowed only one walk. He scattered five hits and took his career record to 18-8 and his career strikeout total to 131 which ranks third in program history. For the season, Feckley has 19 strikeouts and walked only three batters in 21.0 innings of scoreless baseball for the Rams.

## LSC NOTES (Submitted by LSC SID's)

### Angelo State

The Rams dropped their road series against Lubbock Christian two games to three after opening the series with a commanding 5-1 win in the opener. Jake Feckley continued his early-season dominance, throwing 8.0 innings with seven strikeouts and not allowing an earned run. He is now 3-0 on the season and became ASU's all-time wins leader (18-8) with the victory. ASU's offense was led by Tyler Coughenour (4 hits, 5 stolen bases), Brett David (3 doubles, 2 runs scored), Christian Summers (4 hits, one home run, 4 RBI) and David Goggin (4 hits, 4 RBI). The Rams return to action this weekend by hosting their first home games of the season against Colorado School of Mines at Foster Field.

### Cameron

Cameron went 2-2 last weekend splitting doubleheaders with Northwest Missouri State. Codey McElroy led the Aggie offense with a .462 average (6-13) with a pair of doubles and a triple. On the mound Drew Reidt tossed a six-inning one hit shutout in the win. Cameron will be off until Feb. 25 where they will travel to McMurry University.

### Eastern New Mexico

Eastern New Mexico went 3-1 last week in a four-game series at home against intrastate rival New Mexico Highlands. For the second straight season the Greyhounds took the season series from the Cowboys which hadn't happened since winning three straight season series from 1993-95. Ryan Forkel hit .714 (10-for-14) in the series with six RBIs, five runs, two stolen bases, .786 slugging and .733 on-base percentage. Of his 10 hits, nine were singles with one double. Blake Cooper and Colton Sims both drove in five runs. Cooper also stole two bases and hit his first career home run at ENMU. Dylan Nault blasted his first career homer in the series while Zachary Yantes recorded his first collegiate hit, a RBI double. On the mound, The Greyhounds compiled a 2.81 ERA in the series with 30 strikeouts, 15 walks and an opponent's batting average of .269. 15 of the 32 hits given up came in the finale game of the series. Ben Monticello and Aaron Anderson combined for the first shutout of NMHU in 90 meetings between the two teams in the first game of the series. Monticello went six innings, striking out five and giving up three hits to improve to 2-0 on the year while Anderson picked up the save and struck out four in three innings. Also getting wins were starters Matthew Artalejo (1-0) and Rusty Edwards (2-0). Jonathan Joy, Sheldon Moble and Jorge Quezada all made their Eastern

debut in game four out of the bullpen. This week the Greyhounds will hit the road for the first time this season. They play at Texas-Permian Basin on Saturday in a doubleheader starting at 11 a.m. MT. ENMU then travels to Hobbs, N.M. for another doubleheader on Sunday against the University of the Southwest with the first pitch scheduled for 12 p.m. MT.

### Tarleton State

The Texans went 2-1 with a pair of wins at Texas-Permian Basin and a defeat to Colorado School of Mines ... The Texans outscored the Falcons 20-8 on Friday before falling just 3-1 to the Orediggers on Saturday ... With the loss to CSM, Tarleton snapped a six-game winning streak ... The Texans hit .366 over the weekend with eight doubles and a triple ... The Texan pitching staff gave up 11 earned runs in 23.0 innings for a combined 4.30 earned run average ... Robert Baker threw five shutout innings in his win on Friday and has now thrown 10 innings of shutout baseball in his last two starts ... Jacob French got the other win for the Texans this weekend as he gave up three runs in his 5.2 innings of work ... He led all pitchers with seven K's on the weekend and currently leads the team with 13 K's on the season ... Nick Gibert and Alvaro Moreno led the team with six hits each this weekend ... Evan Robinson led the team with four runs scored, while Kevin Meredith knocked in a team-high four runs ... Robinson and Moreno led the Texans with two stolen bases on the weekend as well ... Tarleton leads the LSC with a .351 batting average and is third in the league with a 3.21 earned run average ... Luke Slentz is second in the LSC with a .565 batting average and Meredith leads the LSC with 12 RBI ... Ethan Lenz leads the conference with his two saves on the year ... Tarleton returns home this weekend to host Arlington Baptist in a three-game set that will begin on Friday ... The Texans have won eight straight games at Cecil Ballow Baseball Complex dating back to last season.

### Texas A&M-Kingsville

The Texas A&M-Kingsville baseball team went 0-1 last week as the Javelinas hit the road for the first time travelling to Houston-Victoria where they lost 7-3. It was third meeting between the two sides with Kingsville winning the first two contests at home the opening week of the season...This week the Javelinas host Texas College in a 3-game series at Nolan Ryan Field. The series begins on Friday with a 6 p.m. contest with a doubleheader on Saturday at 1 p.m... Taylor Taska has reached base safely in each of the first six games. The Javelina slugger is hitting .286 with team highs in home runs (2), RBI (6), runs scored (5), total bases (13), and walks (7). He boasts a .619 slugging percentage and .464 on-base percentage. His two home runs and seven base on balls are tops in the Lone Star Conference this season. Taska is the only Javelina to have reached base safely in every game this season, while Matt Perez has reached in the last five...In the most recent South Central Region rankings the Javelinas are ninth in the region. Kingsville is the only team ranked with a sub-.500 mark. The Javelinas were ranked third in the region last week...In Kingsville's four losses it is hitting .161 with runners in scoring position and .145 with runners on base, while opposing teams are hitting .278 and .289, respectively. In the Javelinas' two wins, they are batting .300 with runners in scoring position and .270 with runners on base.

### West Texas A&M

The Buffs went 5-0 this week as they hit a season-best .301...WT tallied 50 hits in 166 at bats, scored 31

runs and had eight extra-base hits with 23 RBI...WT slugged .367 and reached base at a .388 clip...Senior Tyler McKnight went a team-best 12 of 22 for a .545 average with three doubles and two RBI while scoring four runs...Junior Dylan Dyson went 8 of 15 with three RBI, including the walk-off, game-winning RBI single Tuesday against Southwestern Oklahoma State in the 2014 home opener, 5-4...WT swept McMurry in Abilene for the first road series win of the season... The staff tallied a 1.32 ERA for the week with two shutouts as it allowed just seven runs and six earned runs...WT had 42 strikeouts as the opposition hit just .187...The Buffs walked just six, while earning 21 free bases offensively...Against McMurry, WT had an 0.84 ERA and allowed just three runs while scoring 26...The Buffs fanned 39 War Hawks and walked just four...WT outhit McM 39-18...Senior Ashton Sivigliano led the team with 11 strikeouts...WT hit .295 for that series alone and had five extra-base hits with four doubles and the first home run of the year for the team (Beto Rodriguez)...WT committed just three miscues in the four game set.
