LSC BASKETBALL

The West Texas A&M women earned the Lone Star Conference championship outright with a 2-1 week to improve to 14-1 in league play. In addition to the Lady Buffs set as the top seed, Midwestern State and Angelo State have clinched the No. 4 and No. 5 seeds, respectively. The rest of the bracket will be determined as play wraps up this week.

On the men's side, Tarleton State remains in front of Midwestern State by one game. The Texans clinched at least a share of their third LSC title at 12-1. All of the men's seedings are still up for grabs with TSU and MSU assured the top two spots.

The regular season concludes with five men's games and six women's contests this week.

The LSC men have a 118-80 overall record so far this season. In the NCAA South Central Region, the men's teams are currently 19-8 combined versus Heartland Conference teams and 1-3 against the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

The LSC women are 120-104 overall. The women's squads are currently 12-10 combined against the Heartland, and 7-6 versus RMAC teams, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

LSC BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

Lone Star Conference officials have added an extra benefit to advance tickets, which are on sale for the 2014 LSC Basketball Championship, set to be played March 5-8 at the Allen Event Center in Allen, Texas.

In addition to a \$15 savings off the regular price for all-session passes and avoiding fees by making an on-campus advance purchase, fans will get two chances to win prizes with every purchase. There will be one (1) Grand Prize Winner that receives a Destination Allen Prize Package including two (2) nights hotel plus gift cards to Allen restaurants and entertainment venues for use at this year's LSC tournament. Additionally, each fan base will have one (1) Team Pride Winner that receives a prize package of goodies and spirit gear provided by that school.

Those wanting access to all seven sessions can purchase adult all-session tickets at a reduced rate of \$45 through Feb. 26 at member schools. After the advance purchase deadline, the adult price moves to \$60 for all-session tickets or \$15 per session. Student prices will be \$32 for all-session tickets or \$10 by session and are available only at the Allen Event Center Box Office for University students with valid school I.D. (any institution) or children ages 2-18.

Tickets are also available at the Allen Event Center Box Office or through Ticketmaster (www.ticketmaster.com). Another option available to fans is to enjoy the view from one of the Allen Event Center's luxury suites. This marks the third straight year for the LSC Basketball Championship to be played in Allen, with the tournament again featuring eight men's and eight women's teams. The games will be played in doubleheader sessions throughout the event with a women's game followed by a men's game, including Saturday's final session starting at 3 p.m. that features both the men's and women's championship games.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

CO-MEN'S OFFENSIVE

De'Andre Upchurch, Tarleton State University, SR, Guard, Flint, Mich., Flint Northwestern HS

Upchurch became the first Texan player to score 30-points or more in a game since 2007, as he paced the Texan offense with a career-high 38 points in Saturday's win at Eastern New Mexico. The senior guard added to his all-around night with a career-high 10 rebounds to record his first-ever double-double. Upchurch averaged 25.5 points per game this week and now leads all players in conference-game-scoring with 18.3 ppg. On the week, Upchurch shot 48 percent from the field, 50 percent from downtown and 94 percent from the charity stripe. He averaged 6.5 boards per game, dished out five assists and had one steal.

Xavier Blackburn, Midwestern State University, JR, Forward, New Iberia, La., St. Thomas More HS (ND Science)

Blackburn dropped in matching career highs of 24 points to lead Midwestern State to wins over Angelo State and Texas A&M-Kingsville to advance the Mustangs' season-best winning streak to eight games. The junior from New Iberia, La. notched his sixth double-double of the season while scoring 24 points and snatching 12 rebounds to lead the Mustangs to a 78-68 over Angelo State Wednesday night. Blackburn hit on 5-of-8 shots from the field with a 3-pointer while knocking down 13 of his 14 free throw attempts against the Rams. The swingman was 9-of-12 with two treys while going 4-for-4 from the charity stripe on his way to a 24-points, 6-rebound effort Saturday at Texas A&M-Kingsville. For the week, Blackburn shot 70 percent from the field (14-of-20) with three 3-pointers and was 17-of-18 from the free throw line to average 24.0 points and 9.0 rebounds per game while throwing in a block and three steals.

MEN'S DEFENSIVE

Jon Cathey-Macklin, Tarleton State University, SR, Forward, Milwaukee, Wis., Washington HS

Cathey-Macklin turned in one of his best defensive efforts this past week, averaging 10.0 rebounds per game and collecting a team-high five blocks. He had what was arguably the best game of his career this past Wednesday, scoring eight points, pulling down a career-high 13 boards and collecting three blocks in Tarleton's home win over West Texas A&M.

WOMEN'S OFFENSIVE**Kiara Wright, Tarleton State University, SR, Center, Pittsburg, Texas, Pittsburg HS**

Wright was dominant for Tarleton last week, lifting the TexAnns to a pair of wins over No. 3 West Texas A&M and on the road at Eastern New Mexico. The senior center began her week with a phenomenal effort against the nation's No. 3 and region's No. 1-seeded Lady Buffs as the All-American rose to the occasion and scored a game-high 26 points to go along with 15 rebounds and three assists to lead Tarleton to victory. She followed up that effort with a 14-point, 11-rebound effort on the road in Portales Saturday night where she was a perfect 6-6 from the floor. For the week, Wright was 16-27 from the floor for a .593 shooting percentage and 8-10 at the free throw line.

WOMEN'S DEFENSIVE**Devin Griffin, West Texas A&M University, SR, Forward, Lubbock, Texas, Coronado HS**

Griffin had a stellar defensive performance this week as she pulled down a season-high average of 9.0 rebounds for the week with two double-doubles. It was her third and fourth double-doubles of the year. She went 15 of 30 from the field and 7 of 10 from the line, while she buried two triples in the 96-66 win over Texas Woman's on Sunday for the first time in her career she has hit two triples in one game. She was all over the court defensively as she had her fifth game of the season with five steals on Sunday against TWU. Griffin and the Lady Buffs held the opposition this week to .412 from the field, .255 from beyond the arc in just 12 triples made in 47 attempts and held the opposition to 30 rebounds per game while WT averaged 38.7. The Lady Buffs averaged 86.7 points per game and allowed just 62.7.

MEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Devondrick Walker, Texas A&M University - Commerce, continued his stellar play this season, averaging 22 points and hitting 53 percent of his shots from the field as the Lions picked up a pair of wins over Eastern New Mexico and West Texas A&M this week. The senior from Garland, Texas, dropped 20 points on 7-for-16 shooting in the win over ENMU on Wednesday, adding four assists and a pair of steals. Then, on Saturday, he led all scorers with 24 points and five triples in an 83-82 road win over West Texas A&M, the Lions' first win in Canyon since the 2004-05 season.

Rodney Blackmon, Eastern New Mexico University, scored a team-high 25 points on 8-of-14 shooting, including two three-pointers, and was 7-for-9 at the free throw line as Eastern New Mexico fell short in their upset bid of third-ranked Tarleton State. In the game he also had two assists, rebounds and steals. Earlier in the week at Texas A&M-Commerce, Blackmon scored a team-high 15 points while grabbing six rebounds, dishing out three assists, getting a block and a steal. For the week he averaged 20.0 ppg, 4.0 rpg, 2.5 apg and 1.5 spg.

Will Cook, Cameron University, averaged 19.5 points and had a career high 29 points at Angelo State on Saturday. Cook shot 12-19 (63.4%) percent from the field and 9-11 (75%) from the arc. Cook scored nearly half of Cameron's 59 points against Angelo State as well. In 24 games this season Cook has averaged a team high 16.3 points.

Kenny Williams, Angelo State University, continued his strong play last week, recording his 10th double-double of the season with 13 points and 12 rebounds in a win over Cameron after providing 18 points at Midwestern State. Williams averaged 15.5 points during the week and 7.0 rebounds per game. He also had four assists and went 9-for-11 from the free-throw line.

Lawrence Domingo, Eastern New Mexico University, had a career night against No. 3 Tarleton State as he recorded his first career double-double with 14 points and a career-high 13 rebounds, nine coming on the defensive glass, coming off the bench. He also blocked a career-best four shots. Domingo was 6-for-10 from the field in the game. At Texas A&M-Commerce, he scored eight points while making all three of his field goal attempts and was 2-for-3 at the charity stripe. Domingo also grabbed four rebounds, three defensive, had a block, steal and an assist. For the week, he averaged 11.0 ppg, 8.5 rpg, 2.5 bpg and 1.0 apg while making 9-of-13 (69.2%) of his shots.

WOMEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Andrea Carter, Midwestern State University, , , , Carter had another strong performance in helping the Mustangs to a 69-58 victory over Angelo State before a loss at Texas A&M-Kingsville. The 5-10 junior forward from Angleton, Texas equaled her career and season highs with her 25 points at Texas A&M-Kingsville, shooting 72.7 percent from the floor and going 9-of-10 from the free throw line. Carter's scoring performance pushed her past the 1,000-point mark for her career as a junior and into 17th all-time at MSU. She also recorded her 10th double-double of the season against Angelo State with 12 points and 11 rebounds to go with three steals. For the week, Carter averaged 18.5 points, 9.5 rebounds with 3.0 assists and 2.0 steals, while shooting 53.8 percent from the floor and 90.0 percent from the foul line as she led the team by playing an average of 33.5 minutes in the two regulation contests.

Tori Tucker, Eastern New Mexico University, , , , Tori Tucker averaged 18 points, 8.7 rebounds, and 1.6 steals during a week which saw Eastern play contests against Tarleton State, Texas Woman's and Texas A&M-Commerce. Despite playing three games over four days, she wrapped up the week with a career-high 29-point outburst against the TexAnns. In that contest, she hit five-of-nine from outside the three-point arc, grabbed seven rebounds and had a steal. At Texas Woman's, Tucker poured in 12 points and grabbed six board. She opened the week with her third double double of the season, with 13 points, 13 rebounds and three steals at Texas A&M-Commerce.

Rosalie Cutri, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, , , , Rosalie Cutri led Kingsville with 25 points against the Mustangs. She hit 9-of-12 shots from the floor and was 7-of-7 from the foul line. Cutri, who has played the last half of the season injured, also tied her personal-best as a Javelina with five assists. For the week, Cutri, who had five steals in the Cameron game, averaged 16.5 points. 3.5 steals and 2.5 rebounds.

Casey Land, West Texas A&M University, , , , Senior Casey Land led the team in scoring as WT went 2-1 on the week clinching the outright Lone Star Conference regular season championship. Land was terrific from long range, going 15 of 21 from deep for a .714 average and was 15 of 27 from the field overall for a .556 clip. All of her field goal makes were from beyond the arc...She had 12 assists on the week with five steals. Land ranks fifth

all-time in school history in triples made with 155 and her 55 so far this season set a career season-best.

Breanna Harris, Texas A&M University - Commerce, recorded her fifth and sixth straight games in double figures for A&M-C ... The 19 points versus WT is the most for Harris since scoring 21 versus Texas Woman's back on 1/29 ... Harris also extends her streak of shooting at least .500 from the field to five after hitting that percentage in both games this past week.

Chelsea Stamp, Cameron University, broke the Cameron record for three-pointers of the season on Wednesday after nailing five straight shots from downtown against Texas A&M Kingsville. She shot 71.4% from the field and 72.7 from the arc in a 2-0 week for Cameron. Stamp went 6-7 overall and 17 points against the Javelinas. She helped the Aggies earned their first win at Angelo State since 2006 with 11 points with 4-7 shooting from the field. For the season Stamp is averaging just over 10 points per game and he has 71 three-pointers.

Ria Pateraki, Texas Woman's University, helped the Pioneers to 1-1 record after averaging a team-best 13.0 points and 6.5 rebounds while shooting 57.1 percent. She scored a game-high 18 points and cleared a game-high nine rebounds against Eastern New Mexico and helped TWU to its 7th straight win on Thursday. Pateraki also scored eight points and grabbed four boards at No. 3 West Texas A&M on Sunday. On the season is second on the team in scoring with 10.9 points per game and first in rebounding with 6.0 rebounds per game.

Karli Kellermeier, Angelo State University, led the Belles with 11.5 points per game last week. She recorded a double-double with 19 points and 10 rebounds in the home finale against Cameron. It is the second double-double of the season for Kellermeier.

Mary Kovtun, Texas Woman's University, helped the Pioneers to 1-1 record after recording 8 total blocks, 5.5 rebounds per game and 5.5 points per game. She recorded a career-high six blocks and a team-high eight rebounds at No. 3 West Texas A&M on Sunday. Kovtun also added 10 points, while shooting 57.1 percent (4-for-7) from the floor against the Lady Buffs. On the season she has 5.5 ppg, 5.1 rpg and 41 total blocks. Kovtun's 36 of the 41 blocks are against conference foes.

Lauren Jay, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, posted her second double-double of the season with 12 points and 10 rebounds despite being limited to 22 minutes by fouls in the Javelinas win over the Mustangs. She had seven defensive boards and tied her career-high with four steals as Kingsville had nine in the win. Jay, who hit 6-of-8 field goals in the MSU win, has scored double figures seven times in the last eight games.

Shanae Lowrance, Tarleton State University, came up with the biggest defensive play of the season Wednesday night to secure the win for Tarleton over No. 3 West Texas A&M in Wisdom Gym Wednesday. With 10 seconds on the clock and Tarleton leading WT by one, Lowrance tipped the Lady Buff pass away and into the waiting arms of Kiara Wright, who was fouled and sent to the free throw line. For the week, Lowrance was 9-12 from the floor and averaged 10.5 points per game, including a season-high 16 against Eastern New Mexico Saturday night. She grabbed seven rebounds – six of which came against West Texas A&M - and blocked two shots in addition to hitting the game-winning layup and making the game-saving defensive play against West Texas A&M.

Jasmine Johnson, Eastern New Mexico University, turned in a strong defensive performance last week, in games against Texas A&M-Commerce, Texas Woman's and Tarleton State. Her top game came

against the Pioneers, with 17 points, five rebounds, five steals and a blocked shot.

Ashlee Johnson, Texas A&M University - Commerce, recorded four steals for the straight game versus Eastern New Mexico and posted another three thefts versus the Lady Buffs ... The Carson, Calif. native helped the Lion defense to hold the Zias to under 40 percent from the field and from three-point line.

Angelo State

The Rams split a pair of LSC games last week after dropping a road game at Midwestern State before dropping Cameron at the Junell Center on Saturday. The Rams finished the regular season with an 11-2 record at home this season after their win over the Aggies. Kenny Williams recorded his 10th double-double of the season with 13 points and 12 rebounds against Cameron, while Bryan Hammond went for 21 points against the Aggies. Hammond averaged 14 points per game and had 11 assists in the two games. Chris Talkington added 10 points and 4.5 rebounds per game and Omari Gudul averaged 8.5 points and 4.5 rebounds per game. ASU finishes off the regular season with a road game at Texas A&M-Kingsville on Saturday.

Cameron

Cameron went 1-1 last week and took down Texas A&M Kingsville 63-58 earlier in the week and fell at Angelo State 70-59. Will Cook the Aggies with 19.5 points last week with 5 rebounds per game. Cook had a career high 29 points as well against the Rams. Craig Foster climbed to second place all-time in assists at Cameron with 341 career assists. The Aggies will close out the regular season at home hosting Midwestern State on Saturday.

Eastern New Mexico

Eastern New Mexico dropped both games they played this week to Tarleton State (92-82) at home and Texas A&M-Commerce (78-71) on the road. Four players scored in double-figures against the Lions led by Rodney Blackmon's 15 points. Devone Davis and Phil Henry both had 14 points while Rafael Love added 12. Blackmon and Davis both had six rebounds and three assists to pace the team in each category. Against the third-ranked Texans, the Greyhounds nearly came back from a 15-point halftime deficit but fell short. Blackmon scored 25 points, the most for him in a LSC game this season, while Cornelius Cammock tied his career-high with 21 points as he went 7-for-14 from the field and 7-of-11 at the free throw line. Lawrence Domingo recorded his first career double-double with 14 points and a career-high 13 rebounds while also blocking a career-best four shots. Davis contributed with 10 points and dished out a game-high four assists as well. This week ENMU hosts rival West Texas A&M Saturday night with an opportunity to clinch their first winning season since 2003-04.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State extended its season-best winning streak to eight games with wins over Angelo State and Texas A&M-Kingsville last week to improve 19-6 on the season going to 11-2 in Lone Star Conference... The Mustangs can claim a share of their eighth LSC title with a win over Cameron on Saturday and if Texas A&M-Commerce defeats Tarleton State... The Mustangs can be the No. 1 seed if they beat Cameron, A&M-C beats Tarleton State, Texas A&M-

Kingsville beats Angelo State and it wins a coin toss to determine the top seed... MSU will go into the LSC Postseason Tournament as no worse than the No. 2 seed... MSU's eight-game winning streak is the longest since winning the 13 games at the start of the 2011-12 season... The Mustangs carried the No. 3 ranking in the NCAA Division II South Central Region rankings last week and looking for their sixth consecutive postseason appearance... MSU can clinch its sixth consecutive 20-win season with a win at Cameron on Saturday which is the longest since Gerald Stockton posted eight-straight 20-win seasons from 1973-81... Midwestern claimed its 13th consecutive win over Texas A&M-Kingsville on Saturday... The Mustangs have beaten the Hoggies by 20-or-more points in each of their last three meetings and in four of the last five... Midwestern has won four its last five games by 10-or-more points, but worked overtime to claim three victories during the eight-game winning streak... MSU has out-rebounded its last 15 opponents by an average margin of 10.2 boards a game... The Mustangs lead the league in rebounding margin (+8.4), offensive rebounds per game (15.0), defensive rebound percentage (.722) and offensive rebound percentage (.391)... Junior forward Xavier Blackburn matched a season high by scoring 24 points against Angelo State then again at Texas A&M-Kingsville last week... Blackburn recorded his sixth double-double with 24 points and 12 rebounds Wednesday night against Angelo State... Blackburn is averaging 13.7 points and leading the LSC with 9.2 rebounds a game during league play... Senior guard Monzaigo Williams scored a season-low seven points, but dished out five assists Saturday at Texas A&M-Kingsville... Williams has scored in double figures in 23 of 25 games this season... Williams is shooting 52.2 percent from the field during LSC play... Senior forward Eddie D'Haiti poured in a career high scoring 21 points on 9-of-10 shooting with three treys Saturday at Texas A&M-Kingsville... D'Haiti is averaging 10.8 points per game while shooting 60.2 percent from the field and 52.9 percent from the arc during LSC play... Nelson Haggerty has won more games (70) in his first three seasons than any other coach in storied MSU basketball history...

Tarleton State

The Texans clinched at least a share of the LSC title this past Saturday with a 92-82 win over Eastern New Mexico ... Tarleton now has three LSC titles in school history, with two of them coming in the past three seasons ... A win on Saturday against A&M-Commerce would give Tarleton its first outright LSC title since 2004 ... Tarleton has won five consecutive games since dropping its first and only loss of the season back on Feb. 5 ... The Texans can earn no-less than the No. 2 seed in the upcoming LSC Championship Tournament, that will take place Wednesday through Saturday, Mar. 5-8, at the Allen Event Center ... Saturday's win was highlighted by De'Andre Upchurch's double-double that included the senior scoring a career-high 38 points ... By allowing 83 points, it was 10th time that a team has posted more than 70 on MSU and the fourth time an MSU opponent has scored 80-plus. MSU is 3-7 when allowing 70 points or more, and 1-3 when opponents get 80 or higher ... The loss was the first non-overtime loss for the Mustangs in since the 66-65 loss to Texas Woman's on Jan. 19, 2014 ... The Mustangs did outrebound the Javelinas 32-31, to record the fifth straight contest MSU has had the advantage on the glass. MSU is 10-3 when having a rebounding advantage (two losses to WT, one to TAMUK), 4-5 when being outrebounded by opponents and 2-2 when both teams have an equal number of rebounds ... Senior Kirsti Degelia of Denton, Texas/Krum continues to add to her career scoring total as she has amassed 1,356 points – seventh all-time at MSU. She is 39 points away from Lounette Adkins Decker (1978-79, 80-81, 93-95) with 1,395 points in sixth ... Degelia moved to sixth at MSU with 322 career assists passing Mandy Clueley (1994-98) with 315 in sixth. She is three away tying and four from passing from Glenda Washington (1981-86) in fifth with 325 ... Degelia is eighth in MSU career 3-point field goals made with 107 and needs one to tie for seventh at 108 with Lynn Buckmaster (1992-94) and J.J. Anderson (1997-2001) ... Degelia is 13th on the MSU career steal's list with 150 ... Junior forward Andrea Carter of Angleton, Texas is second in the Lone Star Conference in scoring, third in rebounding and fifth in steals, averaging 16.0 points, 9.0 rebounds and 2.0 steals a game. She is also fifth

in field goal percentage (53.2 percent), eighth in free throw percentage (75.0 percent) and 12th in blocked shots (0.4) ... Carter became the 19th MSU woman to score 1000 points with her 25 points at Texas A&M-Kingsville. She is now 18th in MSU career scoring with 1,008 points passing Savannah Carver (2008-12) with 1,002 ...
