LSC BASEBALL

Lone Star Conference teams posted a combined 17-1 mark last week in non-conference play.

LSC action starts this week with Angelo State at Cameron, Eastern New Mexico at Tarleton State, and Texas A&M-Kingsville at West Texas A&M for a four-game series.

In 2014, LSC teams are playing a 10-week schedule with a four-game series and three-game series against every other team. Each four-game series shall consist of a 9-inning game Friday, a 7x7 doubleheader Saturday and 9-inning contest Sunday, and each three-game series shall consist of a 9-inning game Friday and a 7x9 doubleheader Saturday.

The overall LSC Champion will be the team(s) with the best winning percentage in regular-season conference games, while the winner of the postseason championship will be recognized as LSC Tournament Champion and receive the league's automatic qualification into NCAA postseason. The championship will be played May 8-10, at the No. 1 seed with the top four teams qualifying.

LSC baseball teams are 49-18 overall this season. In the NCAA South Central Region, the teams are currently 16-5 combined versus Heartland Conference teams and 18-5 against the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

HITTERS

David Hebert, West Texas A&M University, SR, 3B, Colleyville, Texas, Colleyville HS

Hebert had a stellar week for WT as the Buffs won four regional games and extended their winning streak to nine games. Hebert went a team-best 8 of 13 from the plate with five runs scored, one double, one triple and five RBI. He tallied 11 total bases and slugged .846, while reaching base at a .625 average. Hebert had one sacrifice fly and walked twice with no strikeouts as he started all four games in three wins over New Mexico Highlands and a single win over Texas A&M-International.

Julian Duran, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, SR, OF, San Antonio, Texas, James Madison HS

Duran hit .714 with a team-best five RBI...Aside from leading the team with a .714 average as he went 5-of-7 on the weekend in three games, Duran drove in a team-high 5-runs. He came off the bench to record 2-run single in Saturday's first game.

PITCHERS

Dylan James, West Texas A&M University, SR, RHP, Las Cruces, N.M., Mayfield HS

James pitched his first WT career one-hitter in a 6-0, complete game shutout of visiting New Mexico Highlands on Friday. James fanned 11 in the contest and walked none as he retired the first 15 batters of the game and allowed a single up the middle to begin the sixth inning. NMHU hit .036 for the game. It was James' second complete game shutout of the season as he improved to 2-0 on the year and lowered his ERA to 0.82 in three starts. He has fanned a team-high 29 and walked just five for the season as opponents are hitting just .107 against him.

Matthew Artalejo, Eastern New Mexico University, JR, RHP, Westminster, Colo., Stanley Lake HS/Northeastern JC

Artalejo pitched eight scoreless innings, striking out four and giving up just two hits and a walk in a 4-1 extra-innings win over Texas-Permian Basin. The Falcons hit just .077 off of him as he pitched six 1-2-3 innings in the contest. Artalejo improved to 2-0 with a miniscule ERA of 0.45 in 20 innings this season.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Rustin Thomas, Tarleton State University, led the Texans in the majority of statistical categories this weekend after going 7-for-11 at the plate with a pair of doubles and a home run. The senior from Mansfield tallied two walks, scored twice and drove in three runs in a three-game home series. He finished the weekend hitting .636 with a 1.091 slugging percentage and a .692 on-base percentage. Thomas was a threat on the base-paths as well, stealing three bases in four attempts.

Blake Cooper, Eastern New Mexico University, led Eastern New Mexico with a .636 batting average over the weekend as he was 7-for-11 at the plate with four RBIs, two runs scored, walked twice, was a perfect 2-of-2 stealing bases, posted a .692 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage. Of his seven hits, three went for extra bases as he had a double, triple and home run. He hit his second homer of the season, tied for the most in the LSC, leading off the top of the ninth to break a 0-0 against Texas-Permian Basin. His solo shot jump started the Greyhounds to a four-run inning and extra-inning victory. Cooper had at least two hits and drove in a run in all three games. In the field, he made four putouts in right field.

Christian Summers, Angelo State University, exploded for six RBI on six hits to help lead the Angelo State baseball team to a four-game sweep of Colorado School of Mines last weekend at Foster Field in San Angelo. Summers had three doubles and a triple and led the Rams with a .786 slugging percentage in the first four home games of the season. Summers also scored four runs and walked three times. A 19th round selection by the San Diego Padres last summer, he is currently on a seven-game hitting streak and has 12 RBI in 12 games this season.

Ethan Lenz, Tarleton State University, worked 1.1 innings in two appearances this weekend to pick up his LSC-leading fourth save of the season. He faced the minimum number of batters and did not allow a hit or a walk to opposing hitters in his two mound appearances. Lenz came in and stuck out two of three batters he faced on Friday and then managed to get the only batter he faced on Saturday to fly out.



Jake Feckley, Angelo State University, continued his early-season excellence, allowing only one hit and striking out five for the Rams in a 10-1 win in the series opener against Colorado School of Mines. In complete control, Feckley limited the Orediggers to a .053 batting average in his six innings of work before exiting with a solid lead. Feckley (4-0) has not allowed an earned run in 27.0 innings of work this season and has racked up 24 strikeouts to only three walks.

Dallas Ponder, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, earned his second win of the season tossing six shutout innings in the series finale. He scattered four hits and struck out six. Ponder is the first Javelina with two wins on the year.

LSC NOTES (Submitted by LSC SID's)

Angelo State

The Rams earned a four-game sweep of Colorado School of Mines in their first home games of the season and are now 10-2. ASU outscored the Orediggers 26-10 in the series, and hit .362 as a team. Brett David and David Goggin provided the dramatic moments of the weekend, with Goggin delivering a two-run single with two outs to tie the second game of the series at five. David followed a Christian Summers double with the game-winner through the left side of the infield to score Goggin for the 6-5 win. Summers finished the weekend with six RBI on six hits, David had seven hits and five RBI and Derek Tyner went 6-for-12 with four RBI. ASU pitchers continued to shine, with Jake Feckley (4-0) not allowing an earned run for his fourth straight start, Jason Zgardowski throwing a complete-game with 10 strikeouts and Jake Albert striking out seven in 6.0 innings of relief in the series finale. The Rams travel to San Antonio to face St. Mary's on Tuesday before opening LSC play on the road against Cameron.

Cameron

Did not play last week.

Eastern New Mexico

Eastern New Mexico went 4-0 over the weekend with a doubleheader sweep on the road against Texas-Permian Basin and the University of the Southwest. The Greyhounds won the first game against the Falcons 4-0 with Ben Monticello throwing the complete game shutout, striking out two and allowing five hits. ENMU needed extra-innings in the second game that was scheduled for seven frames on Saturday as Blake Cooper's solo home run in the top of ninth started a four-run inning for the Hounds. Matthew Artalejo picked up the win as he pitched eight scoreless innings, striking out four and surrendering just two hits and a walk. In six of the innings, he put the UTPB batters down in order. Sunday saw Eastern take game one 9-1 over the Mustangs and game two 19-1. The 19 runs were the most for the Greyhounds since put up 20 against Cameron on Mar. 23, 2013. The 18-run margin of victory was ENMU's most since they defeated West Texas A&M by 18 in the first game of a doubleheader on Apr. 25, 2008 on the road. Cooper was 7-for-11 at the dish with a double, triple and home run, 4 RBIs, two runs scored, two stolen bases, a .692 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage. Rafael Romo drove in a team-high five runs while Mark Foley and Sam Hedrick plated four apiece. Foley also hit his first homer in a Greyhound uniform against USW in game two. Keigan Basso did not allow a hit until the sixth inning in the second game versus the Mustangs in his first collegiate start. ENMU hit .356, outscored

their opponents 36-3, out hit them 48-16 and was 8-for-9 in stolen base attempts at the plate. On the mound, all four starters had an ERA of 0.00 as the two runs they allowed were both unearned. The staff posted a 0.30 ERA in 30 innings with 17 strikeouts as opponents had just a .155 batting average. This week the Greyhounds are on the road to open Lone Star Conference play against the defending regular season champions Tarleton State.

Tarleton State

The No. 18 Texans went 2-1 over the weekend and improved to 9-3 overall on the season ... Tarleton hit .330 as a team with 29 hits that went for five doubles, two triples and six home runs ... The Texans outscored the Patriots 18-16, but the pitching staff did give up a season-high 5.04 earned run average on the weekend ... Rustin Thomas hit .636 on the weekend and Evan Robinson hit .500 in his one-game appearance on Friday ... Noel Nevarez hit a pair of home runs this weekend and led the team with four runs batted in ... Ethan Lenz picked up his league-leading fourth save of the season, working 1.1 innings in a pair of appearances ... He struck out two of the four batters he faced ... The Texans snapped a 10-game winning streak at Cecil Ballow Baseball Complex with Saturday's loss, marking the first defeat at home since falling to ACU back on Apr. 21, 2013 ... Jacob French gave up a season-high four runs in his win on Friday, but he settled down to strike out five hitters in his eight full innings of work ... The Texans will open LSC play this weekend, with a home series against Eastern New Mexico.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

The Texas A&M-Kingsville baseball team swept Texas College this past weekend to snap a 4-game losing streak and move to 5-4 on the season. The Javelinas won the opener 9-2 and the second game 8-2. They went on to win the finale 14-0...Kingsville batted .350 as a team over the weekend. The Javelinas were hitting .242 as a team entering the weekend. Four Javelinas with at least eight at bats hit over .500 on the weekend. Julian Duran hit .714 with a team-best five RBI, Derrick Walls hit .545, while Ryan Guedry and Justin Lee each hit .500...Aside from leading the team with a .714 average as he went 5-of-7 on the weekend in three games, Julian Duran drove in 5-runs. He came off the bench to record 2-run single in Saturday's first game. He was hitting just .125 entering the weekend... Dallas Ponder earned his second win of the season tossing six shutout innings in the series finale. He scattered four hits and struckout six. Ponder is the first Javelina with two wins on the year...The Javelina bullpen had a tremendous weekend. Eight relievers tossed at least one inning of work with Mitchell Bro tossing two innings. The bullpen allowed six hits and only two runs on the weekend for a 2.00 ERA. They had eight strikeouts and seven base on balls...The Javelina pitching staff as a unit had 1.00 ERA on the weekend allowing four runs with just three earned in 27 innings. The staff lowered its combined ERA to 2.67 a game...By opening Lone Star Conference play at West Texas A&M, the Javelinas are returning to the site where they won their most recent LSC Championship back in May...Taylor Taska belted his third home run of the season and first since opening day on Saturday. He hit a 3-run shot to left-center field. He also made his first start of the season allowing one run in six innings for a win...Entering LSC play seven Javelinas with at least 15 at bats are hitting .344 or better. Utility player Justin Lee and Julian Duran lead the team with a .400 average. Derrick Walls (.382), Blake Johnson (.375), Dustin

Aguilar (.368), Ryan Guedry (.360), and Taylor Taska (.344) are each at the top of the list...Three Javelinas have been named to the 2014 Tino Martinez Watch List. Seniors Dallas Ponder, Taylor Taska, and Derrick Walls were all named to the list. The award honors the Most Outstanding Player in Division II baseball.

West Texas A&M

The West Texas A&M baseball team improved to 10-2 on the year with three wins over New Mexico Highlands in a series sweep and won a single game over Texas A&M-International this week...WT extended its winning streak to a season-high nine games...It is the second-longest winning streak under head coach Matt Vanderburg as he won 10-straight during the 2011 season...After a slow start, the offense is starting to come alive as WT hit .360 for the weekend with 49 hits in 136 at bats...The Buffs scored 30 runs and allowed just seven, while hitting 13 extra-base hits with 10 doubles and three triples... WT drove in 23 and slugged .478, while reaching base at a .404 average...The staff tallied a 1.85 ERA for the weekend as it struck out 38 and walked just six with the opposition hitting just .205.
