LSC BASKETBALL

The Tarleton State men won its school-record 18th consecutive game to maintain its perfect 18-0 overall record including a 7-0 Lone Star Conference mark. The Texans are now just one of two teams left in NCAA Division II with an undefeated record.

On the women's side, West Texas A&M tops the standings with a unblemished 8-0 league mark and 17-1 overall record. The Lady Buffs recorded their 10th-straight victory and tied the best start in school history since the 2009-2010 season.

This week, teams start the second half of the league schedule with eight men's contests and 10 women's games.

The LSC men have an 94-56 overall record so far this season. In the NCAA South Central Region, the men's teams are currently 19-8 combined versus Heartland Conference teams and 1-3 against the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

The LSC women are 90-74 overall. The women's squads are currently 12-10 combined against the Heartland, and 7-6 versus RMAC teams, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

MEN'S OFFENSIVE

Ta'Quan McDew, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, JR, Guard, Wabasso, Fla., Sebastian River HS

McDew's game-high 20 points marked the junior's third 20-point performance of the season. McDew hit 3-of-5 field goals and was 3-of-4 from three. He was an impressive 11-of-15 from the foul line including hitting 7-of-8 in the game's final 90 seconds to help seal the win over Angelo State. He added three assists which were second on the team as well.

MEN'S DEFENSIVE

Rodney Blackmon, Eastern New Mexico University, SR, Guard, Los Angeles, Calif., David Starr HS/W.L.A. College

Blackmon tied his career-high with five steals in a historic win for Eastern New Mexico at their rivals West Texas A&M. For the first time in school history, the Greyhounds have won back-to-back games in Canyon as ENMU was credited with 12 steals in the contest. Also in the game, he contributed with 10 points, a game-high four assists and a block. His block gave him 22 for his career, tied for the 23rd most in school history, even though he is just 5' 11" tall. Against South Dakota School of Mines and Technology, Blackmon tied his career-high for the third time this season with two blocks. He also scored 19 points on 6-of-11 shooting including 5-for-8 from beyond the arc, made both free throw attempts, grabbed three rebounds, dished out four assists and was credited with a steal. In two games, Blackmon averaged 14.5 ppg, 4.0 apg, 3.0 spg, 2.5 rpg, 1.5 bpg, converted 50.0 percent (10-of-20) of his shots, 46.2 percent (6-for-13) of his three-pointers and made 75.0 percent (3-of-4) at the charity stripe.

WOMEN'S OFFENSIVE

Kirsti Degelia, Midwestern State University, SR, Guard, Denton, Texas, Krum HS

Degelia led Midwestern State to a 70-69 Lone Star Conference triumph over Cameron in the Red River Rivalry in the Mustangs only game of the week. The 5-8 senior guard from Denton, Texas/Krum, scored 18 points with five assists leading to 11 more points. Degelia shot 7-of-11 from the floor (63.6 percent), 1-3 from the 3-point arc and 3-of-3 from the free throw line. She also recorded two rebounds, three steals and one blocked shot.

WOMEN'S DEFENSIVE

Chontiquah White, West Texas A&M University, JR, Forward, Dallas, Texas, Life School Oak Cliff

White tallied her team-leading second double-double of the season with 20 points and 10 rebounds in the Lady Buffs' 82-54 win over Eastern New Mexico on Saturday. White was 9 of 12 from the field and 2 of 3 from the line. She helped lead WT to its 10th-straight win and tied the best start at 17-1 since the 2009-2010 season. White and the Lady Buff "D" stymied the Zias holding them to .350 from the field and 54 points, while out-rebounding them 40-29, including 26-15 on the defensive end. The 54 points allowed was the ninth time WT has allowed fewer than 60 points in a game and 10th game of allowing under 40 percent shooting. White now has 510 career rebounds and 894 points as she is closing in on 1,000 career points. She is a career 288 of 517 for a .557 clip.

MEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Monzaigo Williams, Midwestern State University, poured in a game-high 22 points to help Midwestern State overcome a 19-point deficit to claim a 70-67 win in overtime against Cameron Saturday night at D.L. Ligon Coliseum. The senior from Palmdale, Calif. connected on 4-of-8 shots down the stretch as 13 of his points came after intermission. Williams added five assists and three rebounds to help the Mustangs grasp sole possession of second place in the LSC race. He also played a key role in frustrating LSC Preseason Player of the Year Craig Foster into a 3-for-11 shooting night as he netted just seven points before fouling out early in the overtime period. The 20-point effort was Williams' 7th of the season and second-straight as he tallied 20 points last week against Texas A&M-Kingsville. Williams is the LSC's third leading scorer at 17.1 points per game.

Bryan Hammond, Angelo State University, led the Rams with 20 points and five assists last Saturday against Texas A&M-Kingsville in the only game of the week for ASU. Hammond shot 50 percent from the floor on 14 shot attempts and went 5-for-5 from the free-throw line. He is averaging 10.5 points per game and leads the

Cornelius Cammock, Eastern New Mexico University, scored a career-high 21 points including the game-winning buzzer-beater shot to defeat rival West Texas A&M on the road. The win was Eastern New Mexico's second straight in Canyon, a first in school history. Cammock was 7-for-14 from the field and 7-of-8 at the free throw line in the game as he scored 17 of his points in the second half. He also grabbed a team-high five rebounds, blocked two shots and had an assist and a steal. On Thursday against South Dakota School of Mines and Technology, Cammock set a career-high with five assists while contributing eight points on 4-for-4 shooting, two steals and a block. For the week he averaged 14.5 ppg, 4.5 rpg, 3.0 apg, 1.5 bpg, 1.5 spg, made 11-of-18 (61.1 percent) of his shots and went 7-for-8 (87.5 percent) at the free throw line in helping ENMU win both games.

Tashawn Mabry, Tarleton State University, was a perfect 6-for-6 from the field on Saturday as he helped guide the Texans to a school-record 18th consecutive win. The junior forward was perfect from behind the arc as well, nailing a pair of three-pointers and finishing the game with 14 points. He dished out one assist on Saturday as well and pulled down a pair of rebounds.

Tank Mayberry, Cameron University, matched a career high three blocks and helped hold Midwestern State to 31.5% shooting from the floor and this was the lowest shooting percentage that an Aggie team allowed all season. Mayberry provided Cameron with seven rebounds and seven points.

Davene Carter, Tarleton State University, pulled down eight rebounds and registered a game-high two blocks on Saturday to help guide the Texans to an 84-71 win over A&M-Commerce and net Tarleton's school-record 18th straight win on the season. The Duncanville native was a key factor in limiting the Lions to just 38.8 percent shooting and scoring just 71 points, which is nearly 17 points lower than its season average. Carter scored 14 points and shot 66.7 percent from the field as well.

Rashad Basey's, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, defense helped the Javelinas to the win. The senior snared four steals setting a season-best.

WOMEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Jazzmine Robinson, Cameron University, had a season high 23 points and helped rally the Aggies back from a 16 point deficit against Midwestern State on Saturday. Robinson went 9-10 from the charity stripe and chipped in six rebounds. In 18 games this season Robinson has hit double-digits in 12 for CU and has averaged a team high 12.1 points per game.

Rebekah Cluley, Texas Woman's University, scored a career-high 22 points to lead the Pioneers to a 79-68 win at Texas A&M-Commerce last week. The win helped TWU move into a tie for third place in LSC standings. Cluley was perfect 3-for-3 from the three-point range and also recorded six rebounds, three assists and three steals against the Lions. On the season she has been consistent on both offense and defense with 11.8 ppg, 4.4 rpg, 57 assists and 27 steals. Cluley is also shooting LSC best 89.1 percent from the free-throw line against conference foes.

Chontiquah White, West Texas A&M University, tallied 20 points and 10 rebounds for her second double-double of the season in the Lady Buffs' 82-54 win over Eastern New Mexico on Saturday. White was a team-best 9 of 12 from the field (.750) and tallied four offensive rebounds and six defensive. White now has 510 career rebounds and 894 points as she is closing in on 1,000 career points. She is a career 288 of 517 for a .557 clip. White helped lead the Lady Buffs to their 10th-straight win and best start at 17-1 since the 2009-2010 season.

Brianna Bledsoe, Tarleton State University, stepped up in a big way for the Tarleton TexAnns Saturday night as her 18 points led Tarleton past Texas A&M-Commerce 74-64 in Stephenville. In the TexAnns' first game since losing starting guard Morgan Ashmore to injury, Bledsoe picked up the slack by playing a team-high 36 minutes, shooting .412 from the field and a perfect 3-3 at the charity stripe. She also added an assist and a steal.

Tatiana Haynes, Angelo State University, scored a season-high 16 points in a 63-47 win over Texas A&M-Kingsville. The senior hit four-of-five 3-pointers and shot 60-percent from the field. It is her fourth-straight game in double figures. The Pontiac, Mich., native played 27 minutes and dished out two assists in the win. Devin Oliver, Texas A&M University - Commerce, Oliver recorded her seventh and eighth games in double figures this past week for the Lions ... The 5.5 rpg is her best for any week this season ... The junior is now back to averaging over 10 points per game (10.2) ... Oliver continues to lead the Lions in steals with 21 after her one versus TWU.

Jasmine Johnson, Eastern New Mexico University, poured in 15 points and grabbed four rebounds at sixth-ranked West Texas A&M. She shot .636 (7-11) from the floor and hit her only free throw attempt. Johnson has reached double figures in four of her last six games.

Kiara Wright, Tarleton State University, was once again the centerpiece to a strong Tarleton defensive performance as the senior All-American held Texas A&M-Commerce's leading scorer to half of her season average in scoring as the TexAnns defeated the Lions 74-64 Saturday night. Wright was limited to just 18 minutes due to foul trouble, but made a difference when she was on the floor. The senior scored 15 points, grabbed nine rebounds and had a team-high five steals in the lone Tarleton game last week.

Andrea Carter, Midwestern State University, paced the Mustangs defense in Midwestern State's 70-69 Red River Rivalry win over Cameron. Carter led the Mustangs 20 points and eight rebounds (all defensive) along with a steal. Carter shot 6-of-13 from the floor and 8-of-11 from the foul line, while helping the Mustangs hold the Aggies to 33.9 percent shooting from the floor.

Ria Pateraki, Texas Woman's University, was key on defense to help the Pioneers to a 79-68 win at Texas A&M-Commerce last week. She led the team with eight rebounds against the Lions including seven defensive boards. With TWU leading by seven points, Pateraki drew two charges in the final three minutes and helped the Pioneers extend their lead to 11 points. In the nine conference games this season she leads the team with 6.1 rebounds per game and second with 10.3 points per game.

Angelo State

The Rams took their first loss at home this season with a 79-69 defeat to Texas A&M-Kingsville in their only game of the week. ASU (14-5, 4-3 LSC) had started the season 9-0 at the Junell Center before the Javelinas came into town and hit 10 of 13 shots from beyond the arc and earned the win. ASU was limited to 39 percent shooting in the game and couldn't recover from a 35-22 halftime deficit. The Rams return to action this week with a midweek game at West Texas A&M on Wednesday before hosting ENMU on Saturday.

Cameron

Eastern New Mexico

Eastern New Mexico went 2-0 last week with a win at home over South Dakota School of Mines and Technology (86-72) and on the road against rival West Texas A&M (58-57). The Greyhounds have won five of their last six games with the lone loss coming at nationally-ranked Tarleton State. For the week, Rodney Blackmon and Cornelius Cammock led the team in scoring at 14.5 points per game apiece while Rafael Love was right behind them at 14.0 ppg. Love paced the squad with 5.0 assists a game, including a career-high seven versus the Hardrockers, while Phil Henry grabbed 5.0 rebounds per contest. Love scored 21 points against SDSMT, Blackmon contributed with 19 points as he made five three-pointers and Henry added 10 points. Along with Love, Jordan Romero also dished out seven assists to tying his career-high that he set last season at Lubbock Christian while Cammock set a career-best with five assists as well. In the victory against the Buffaloes, Cammock led all scorers with a career-high 21 points as he made 7-of-14 field goal attempts and was 7-for-8 at the free throw line. 17 of his points were scored in the second half including the game-winning shot at the buzzer on a pass from Romero. Blackmon was the only other Greyhound to reach double-figures in the game with 10 points. He also tied his career-best for the third time this season with five steals. The win versus WT was ENMU's second straight in Canyon, a first in school history. It was also head coach Andrew Helton's 60th win at ENMU and for his career. This week the Greyhounds begin the second half of LSC play on Wednesday when they host Texas A&M-Kingsville. Eastern then faces Angelo State on the road on Saturday.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State claimed sole possession of the second-place in the Lone Star Conference race by claiming a 70-67 win against Cameron in overtime Saturday night in Wichita Falls... The Mustangs overcame their largest deficit of the season as they trailed the Aggies by 19 at 40-21 just 54 seconds before overtime... It was the third time the Mustangs overcame a double-figure deficit to win this season -- MSU trailed Northwest Missouri State by 10 before taking a 78-71 win and trailed West Texas A&M by 14 before claiming a 76-70 victory... Midwestern State improved to 28-2 against Cameron at D.L.Ligon Coliseum and hasn't lost to the Aggies on its home floor since Dec. 15, 1990 (75-68) -- a span of 16 games... MSU continues to lead the LSC in rebounding margin (+7.3), offensive rebounds per game (15.4), offensive rebound percentage (.388) and defensive rebound percentage (.719)... The Mustangs ranked 23rd in NCAA Division II in rebound margin and

38th in total rebounds (753)... Midwestern State had controlled an edge on the boards in each of its last nine games and in 15 of 19 games this season... MSU committed just two post-halftime turnovers Saturday against Cameron to finish the game with eight turnovers. It was the seventh time this season the Mustangs committed 10-or-fewer turns... The Mustangs limited Cameron to 6-of-28 shooting (21.4 percent) after halftime... MSU ranks 31st nationally in field goal percentage defense (40.7) and are 34th in points allowed per game (67.7)... Senior guard Monzaigo Williams ranks third in the LSC in scoring (17.1 ppg), third in assists per game (4.4), second in steals per game (1.9), sixth in 3-point field goal percentage (.442), fifth in made 3-pointers per game (2.0) and is second in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.0)... Williams splashed in a game-high 22 points Saturday against Cameron. It was his fifth game with at least 20 points this season... Williams has recorded consecutive 20-point efforts this season including 20 against Texas A&M-Kingsville and 22 against Cameron... Junior forward Xavier Blackburn notched third double-double of the season Saturday finishing with 11 points and 12 rebounds against the Aggies... Blackburn tops the LSC with 8.7 rebounds a game during conference play... Senior guard JaMichael Rivers scored 10 of his 13 points during the final minute of regulation and overtime to help the Mustangs pull out a 70-67 overtime win against Cameron Saturday night at D.L. Ligon Coliseum... Rivers is averaging 8.3 points, 2.0 rebounds and 2.0 assists in 23 minutes in three games since his return from a broken foot... Senior guard Cam Adderley notched his seventh double-figure scoring night of the season with 11 points and seven rebounds Saturday night against Cameron... Adderley has hit a 3-pointer in each of his last five games shooting 7-of-15 (.467) from the arc during that span...

Tarleton State

The Texans won its school-record 18th consecutive game this past Saturday with an 84-71 victory over A&M-Commerce in Stephenville ... The victory marked Tarleton's 20th straight win at home as well, which tied the third longest streak in school history ... The win also gave head coach Lonn Reisman his 548th career victory as he now is just two more wins shy of recording his 550th career win ... Tarleton is now just one of two teams left in NCAA Division II with an undefeated record ... Tarleton's +27.1 scoring margin currently ranks first in all of D2 ... Tarleton is ranked among the nation's top 50 team in 19 statistical categories ... Chuck Guy headed into this past weekend's game ranked eighth in the nation in free throw percentage ... The Texans open the second half of LSC play with a home game against Midwestern State on Wednesday ... Tip-off between the Texans and Mustangs is set for 8 p.m. in Stephenville.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

In their one game last week, the Javelinas claimed a 79-69 win over Angelo State to pick up its second LSC win of the season...The game pitted the LSC's top two scorers against each other. ASU's Kenny Williams came into the game leading the league and was just ahead of Rashad Basey. In the Basey outscored Williams 15 to 12, but neither led their team in scoring. Ta'Quan McDew led the Javelinas with 20 points while Bryan Hammond had 20 for the hosts... The Javelinas were on fire in Saturday's game. The Javelinas hit over 57% in the first half and finished

at 52.4% for the game. In the process the Javelinas hit 10-of-13 3-point baskets for 76.9% which is the highest mark in the LSC this season. Irvin Hollinger led the way with four treys; while Ta'Quan McDew and Jordan Jahr each had three...Ta'Quan McDew's game-high 20 points marked the junior's third 20-point game of the season. McDew hit 3-of-5 field goals and was 3-of-4 from three. He was an impressive 11-of-15 from the foul line including hitting 7-of-8 in the game's final 90 seconds to help seal the win. Midwestern State

The Mustangs are 13-7 overall, 5-4 in Lone Star Conference play ... The Mustangs won their only game of the week on Saturday with a 70-69 triumph over Cameron at Ligon Coliseum ... The Mustangs have won three straight contests for the first time not only in 2014, but the first time since a six-game winning streak earlier this season ... The Mustangs got the win on a driving layup from Diana Jones with one second left for MSU's first one-point triumph of the season ... MSU held Cameron to just 33.9 percent shooting from the floor (20-of-59), marking the second straight contest and fourth in the last six games that the Mustangs have held their opponents below 40.0 percent from the floor ... Midwestern has limited opponents' scoring over the last six games, holding their opponents to an average of 59.7 points over the span ... The Mustangs have held 10 of their last 12 opponents under 70 points, with those two each scoring 71 ... MSU continues to do well at the free throw line the last six games, going 95-of-121 for a 78.5 percentage, with three games over 80 percent ... MSU was outrebounded by Cameron 40-34, marking the sixth straight game where MSU was either behind or tied on the boards. MSU is now 4-4 when being outrebounded by opponents and 2-2 when both teams have an equal number of rebounds. The Mustangs are 7-1 when having a rebounding advantage ... Junior forward Andrea Carter of Angleton, Texas is once again third in the Lone Star Conference in scoring and rebounding and fourth in steals, averaging 14.9 points, 8.7 rebounds and 2.1 steals a game. She also ranks fifth in field goal percentage (52.8 percent), sixth in free throw percentage (73.9 percent) and 11th in blocked shots (0.4) ... Carter is eighth at MSU in career rebounds with 663 she needs five boards to pass Rulinda Vogtsberger (1978-81) with 666 in seventh ... Carter is also 12th in career steals at MSU, with 163 and needs four more to pass Jennifer Butler (1994-99) with 166 in 11th ... Senior Kirsti Degelia of Denton, Texas/Krum is seventh on MSU's career scoring list with 1,290 points and needs just 10 points to join the 1300 point club. She is 105 points away from Lounette Adkins Decker (1978-79, 80-81, 93-95) with 1,395 points in sixth ... Degelia also ranks eighth at MSU win 301 career assists and needs three more to pass J.J. Anderson (1997-2001) with 303 in seventh ... Degelia is 15th on the MSU career steal's list with 146 and needs two to pass the 147 of J.J. Anderson (1997-2001) and Stacey Staten (2004-08) ... Junior Diana Jones leads the Lone Star Conference with a 1.94 assist/turnover ratio and is second in the LSC with 4.8 assists per game. Jones is fourth in the LSC with a 77.1 free throw percentage (64-of-83) and ninth in steals (1.5 per game) ...

Tarleton State

Tarleton played just one game last week after Sunday's trip to Texas Woman's was postponed due to weather. The TexAnns defeated Texas A&M-Commerce 74-64 Saturday night with the help of double-figure scoring efforts from four of the five starters. Tarleton was supposed to visit TWU at 2 p.m. on Sunday, but winter weather conditions forced the game to be rescheduled for Monday night at 7 p.m.

Texas A&M-Commerce

The Lions dropped their third and fourth straight losses this past week to Texas Woman's at home and at Tarleton State. A&M-C has now lost four straight for the second time this season, started the season 0-7. Senior forward, Breanna Harris scored her 1,000 career point versus Texas Woman's with a layup in the

second half. Harris is now the ninth Lion to reach 1,000 points and Harris sits ninth on the all-time scoring list. Harris is also 41 rebounds shy of becoming the all-time rebounding leader for the Lions. A&M-C is now just one loss away from matching last season's total.

Her sister Leah LeMaire is also on the roster at ASU...Lauren Jay led the Javelinas in scoring with ten points it was her fourth double-digit performance of the season. It was the second time in four games that the junior led the Javelinas in scoring...Lindsey Mahone posted her seventh game with at least three steals on Saturday. She now has posted 40 steals in 17 games and is tied for second in the conference with 2.2 a game. As a team, the Hoggies continue to lead the LSC in steals with 11.3 a game. TWU basketball team improved its record to 9-9 overall and 5-4 in the Lone Star Conference with a 79-68 win at Texas A&M-Commerce last week.
