LSC SOFTBALL

Softball season began last week with six of the eight Lone Star Conference teams on the field. Play continues with a full schedule of non-conference games this week.

LSC teams playing a single round-robin schedule with a four games against each league opponent. Teams will face schedule partners in doubleheaders at split sites, and all other opponents in a 3-game series (doubleheader one day and single 7-inning game the other day) plus one game at the LSC Showcase, which will be hosted by MSU in Wichita Falls, March 13-16.

The overall LSC Champion will be the team(s) with the best winning percentage in regular-season conference games, while the winner of the postseason championship will be recognized as LSC Tournament Champion and receive the league's automatic qualification into NCAA postseason. The single-elimination championship will be played May 2-3, at the No. 1 seed.

LSC softball teams are 13-12 overall this season. In the NCAA South Central Region, the group is currently 6-6 combined versus Heartland Conference teams and has yet to play the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

HITTER

Morgan Spearman, Angelo State University, SR, OF, Kennadale, Texas, Kennadale HS

Spearman was named all-tournament at the St. Mary's Classic after averaging .727 over the weekend. The senior went 8-for-11 with five runs scored and one double. She stole four bases and had an on-base percentage of .786.

PITCHER

Randi Fentress, Tarleton State University, SR, Pitcher, North Richland Hills, Birdville HS,

Fentress was superb in the first series of her senior season, earning the win in both of Tarleton's first two victories of the year. Fentress earned the opening day nod and went the distance with a complete game victory over Ouachita Baptist allowing two runs on four hits with seven strikeouts. Fentress followed up in game two with five innings of shutout relief allowing just three hits. The senior totaled 12.0 innings of work and surrendered no walks en route to a 1.17 ERA and a .167 opponent batting average.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Katy Vandewater, Midwestern State University, matched a school single-game record with five hits while helping Midwestern State to a 3-2 showing last weekend at the West Florida Invitational. The 5-11 junior transfer collected a hit in each game including a multiple-hit games against No. 6 Valdosta State (2-for-4) and Southern Arkansas (5-for-5). Vandewater hit .476 (10-for-21) in tournament play with a double and two home runs while driving in six runs.

Kendra Sancet, Texas Woman's University, helped the Pioneers to 3-2 record at the St. Mary's NCAA II College Classic. She was named to the all-tournament team after posting a .438 average and .875 slugging percentage. Sancet went 7-for-14 with five extra base hits including four doubles and a home run. She also posted five RBI and 14 total bases.

Erika Menchaca, Tarleton State University, made quite the impression in her collegiate debut, batting .400 in her first three games as a TexAnn. The freshman first baseman from Burleson led the team in slugging percentage (.800), hits (4) and total bases (8) after Saturday's season-opening tripleheader. After going 2-4 with an RBI in the season opener, Menchaca exploded for a 2-3 outing against Henderson State with three RBIs, a run scored and her first career home run.

Adela Gomez, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, after tying the single-season mark for home runs with 11 last season, she picked up where she left off the senior first baseman hit .333 for the week with a grand slam home run in the win over East Central. She finished the week with a team-best six runs batted in and five runs scored.

Ariel Kellogg, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, with three newcomers getting the work on the mound the first weekend, she emerged as the potential No. 1 starter. She came off the bench as a reliever in the first four games 12-2/3 innings without allowing an earned run while claiming the victory in both contests. She tossed 5-1/3 innings of scoreless softball against A&M International and pitched a hitless seventh in the win over the Dustdevils. In her only start of the weekend, Kellogg pitched a complete game. She allowed her first three earned runs of the season on nine hits and just two walks. She was named to the all-tournament team as a pitcher.

Brandie Lander, Texas Woman's University, posted a 3-0 record with three complete games at the St. Mary's NCAA II College Classic. She struck out 17 batters in 21.1 innings and held the opponents to just .225 batting average. Lander allowed just one run and three hits in the season opener against UT-Permian Basin, two runs and five hits against St. Edward's and two runs and six hits against St. Mary's.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State rolled to a 3-2 mark in the season opening West Florida Spring Invitational... The Mustangs earned a split with No. 6 Valdosta State Friday falling 5-4 in 10 inning before claiming a 6-3 win.... MSU swept host West Florida on Saturday 11-4 and 5-4 before falling 22-17 to Southern Arkansas on Sunday... Fourteen school records fell in MSU's 22-17 loss to Southern Arkansas... Midwestern State hit a program single-game record six home runs while mashing out a new hits standard with 21 safeties, while allowing a record number of runs (21), hits (23) and doubles (7)... Junior shortstop Katy Vandewater became the third player in school history to leg out five hits joining Megan Chartier and Kelley Schaefer... Senior catcher Kim Jerrick launched two homers in a game for the sixth time in her career Sunday against Southern Arkansas, while freshman pitcher Erin Knox slugged two homers in her first appearance in the lineup Saturday against West Florida... Eight different players accounted for 14 home runs for MSU in its five games at the West Florida Invitational in Pensacola... Senior catcher Kim Jerrick became the sixth player in school history to amass 200 career hits Sunday against Southern Arkansas. She stands sixth on MSU's all-time hits list with 202... Junior third baseman Kelley Schaefer drove in 10 runs over the weekend to move past Lauren Craig (112) and Rachael Jackson (116) on the all-time RBI list with 117...

Tarleton State

Tarleton State's season opening tournament was jam-packed and then cut short. In a visit to the Henderson State/Ouachita Baptist Tournament, Tarleton opened the season with a tripleheader after a third game was added to the original schedule in preparation of rain. The rain struck again the next day as the weather cancelled day two and three of the tournament. Tarleton opened the season with two straight wins before letting the third one slip away in a rain-soaked third game. Randi Fentress earned both wins in the circle Saturday while Erika Menchaca hit .400 over her first three college games with her first home run against Henderson State. Freshman Kendra Mendoza also had a home run in her first career at bat in game one against Ouachita Baptist.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

The Javelinas softball team opened the season at the St. Mary's Classic posting a 2-3 record...Kingsville downed East Central 12-6 for its first win of the season scoring the game's final 10 runs on Sunday. On Monday the Javelinas scored the winning run in the bottom of the seventh inning when Adela Gomez crossed the plate after Bailey Offill was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded for an 8-7 win over Texas A&M International...The Javelinas three losses came to 10th-ranked Southeastern Oklahoma 6-2, UTPB 5-3, and St. Edward's, who received votes in the preseason NFCA Poll, 3-1...After tying the single-season mark for home runs with 11 last season, Adela Gomez picked up where she left off the senior first baseman hit .333 for the week with a grand slam home run in the win over East Central. She finished the week with a team-best six runs batted in and five runs scored... Fellow senior Bailey Offill also got off to a fast start. Texas Woman's

A new era of TWU softball began on Saturday, Feb. 1 with Genny Stidham picking up her first win as head coach of the Pioneers. TWU opened its 2014 season with a 9-1 run-rule victory against UT-Permian on the first day of action at the St. Mary's Division II College Classic. St. Mary's defeated the Pioneers, 4-2, in the second game of the day. On the second day of the tournament on Sunday, inclement weather pushed TWU's games from a 2:00 and 4:00 p.m. first pitch to a 7:30 and 9:45 p.m. start. The Pioneers defeated St. Edward's 4-2 before falling to Texas A&M-International 10-5 in eight innings ending the long day little after midnight. TWU regrouped to knock off the host St. Mary's 5-2 on the Monday to finish the tournament with a 3-2 record. Junior Sarah Wittenburg led the team with a .462 batting average while junior Kendra Sancet posted a .438 average with four doubles, one home run, five RBI and .875 slugging percentage. Senior Bailey Vrazel scored seven runs and was perfect 4-for-4 in stolen bases. Senior Brandie Lander went 3-0 with three complete games and 17 strikeouts in 21.1 innings. The Pioneers will return to action when they travel to Las Vegas, NV, to play in the Desert Stinger Tournament on Feb. 7-9. TWU will face Regis and Fort Lewis on Friday, Feb. 7, UT-Permian Basin and Colorado School of Mines on Saturday, Feb. 8 and Adam State on Sunday, Feb. 9.
