LSC BASEBALL

After two weeks of Lone Star Conference play West Texas A&M and Angelo State top the standings at 6-2. This week's schedule includes the Rams at Buffs along with Tarleton State at Cameron, and Texas A&M-Kingsville at Eastern New Mexico.

In 2014, LSC teams are playing a 10-week schedule with a four-game series and three-game series against every other team. Each four-game series shall consist of a 9-inning game Friday, a 7x7 doubleheader Saturday and 9-inning contest Sunday, and each three-game series shall consist of a 9-inning game Friday and a 7x9 doubleheader Saturday.

The overall LSC Champion will be the team(s) with the best winning percentage in regular-season conference games, while the winner of the postseason championship will be recognized as LSC Tournament Champion and receive the league's automatic qualification into NCAA postseason. The championship will be played May 8-10, at the No. 1 seed with the top four teams qualifying.

LSC baseball teams are 92-43 overall this season. In the NCAA South Central Region, the teams are currently 16-5 combined versus Heartland Conference teams and 18-5 against the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

HITTERS

Matt Redfearn, West Texas A&M University, SR, INF, Upland, Calif., Upland HS

Redfearn hit .500 for the Buffs in the 3-1 series win at Eastern New Mexico this weekend. He was 9 of 18 from the plate with two doubles to tie the team-high and three RBI. Redfearn scored a team-high eight of the 35 runs by WT in the series. He tallied 11 total bases and slugged .611, while reaching base at a .526 clip. He extended his team-high five game hitting streak with at least one hit in each game and three games of multiple hits. He has seven multi-hit games this season which is tied for fourth-most on the team.

Hunter Choate, Angelo State University, SO, 3B, Athens, Texas, Athens HS

Choate continued his strong start to the season by going 8-for-16 with four RBI last weekend against Tarleton State at Foster Field. Choate hit the first home run of his career in the series-opener and then delivered a two-run single in the series finale. Choate is now hitting .385 on the season with 30 hits and 12 RBI through the first 21 games of the season. He is currently on an 11-game hitting streak going into this week's road series at West Texas A&M.

PITCHERS

Josh Weyker, West Texas A&M University, SR, RHP, Tucson, AZ, Sahuaro HS

Weyker threw a complete game, one-hit shutout at Eastern New Mexico on Sunday as he dominated the Greyhound lineup. It was Weyker's first one-hitter and second of the season for the Buffs. The offense gave Weyker a season-high 13 runs of support in the win and banded out 17 hits. After a walk and a single in the first, Weyker retired all but one batter the rest of the way in the final six innings. Weyker retired ENMU in order in five of the final six innings. It was Weyker's third win of the season (3-2), third complete game and second shutout as he lowered his ERA to 1.41.

Blake Bass, Angelo State University, JR, RHP, Lubbock, Texas, Coronado HS

Bass recorded his second straight complete-game win, shutting out Tarleton State last Saturday by going 9.0 innings with six strikeouts in a 1-0 extra-inning victory for the Rams. Bass scattered six hits over the game, walking only two and limiting the Texans to a .207 batting average. Bass (2-0) was making his third start and fourth appearance of the season in the game and now has a 0.42 ERA with 18 strikeouts and only two walks in 21.2 innings of work. Throughout the season, Bass has limited the opposition to a .184 batting average.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Jared Musgrove, Tarleton State University, led the Texans with eight hits over the weekend, driving in a pair of runs and scoring two runs as well. The Houston native recorded a pair of doubles and collected a team-high 10 total bases on the weekend. Musgrove walked twice and finished the four-game series with a .625 on-base percentage.

James Black, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, hit .455 on the weekend with eight RBI. In the first game of Saturday's doubleheader, the Javelina third baseman was 3-for-3 with five runs batted in. He had two home runs in the game joining Taylor Taska as the only Javelinas to belt two in a game this season. He had a slugging percentage of 1.000. Black recorded a hit in 3-of-4 games going hitless in two at bats in the series opener. He did have a sacrifice fly in that game and struck out just once on the week.

Matthew Burks, Eastern New Mexico University, led Eastern New Mexico with a .333 average and three RBIs in a series against West Texas A&M. He had two games with two hits and recorded a double in the first two contests of the series. Burks plated two runs in the series opener and scored a run. In the Greyhounds 6-5 extra-inning victory, he had two hits, was plunked twice and scored two times. Burks also came around to score on a failed pick off attempt to put ENMU up 5-4 in the eighth inning. In the field, he made 11 putouts and threw out a runner at home in game one.

Taylor Taska, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, pitched seven shutout innings in the series opener against Cameron for his first complete game of the season. Taska scattered five hits and walked just one. He fanned nine batters in the game. He is now 2-0 on the season with a 0.89 earned run average.

Angelo State

The Rams moved to 6-2 in Lone Star Conference play with a 3-1 series win over Tarleton State last weekend at Foster Field. The series win took ASU's home record to 7-1. ASU continues to get strong pitching this season, with its pitching staff combining for a 2.83 ERA with 28 strikeouts and limiting the Texans to 11 runs in the four-game series. Blake Bass (2-0) threw a complete-game, striking out six in a 9-inning extra-inning game, while Dillon Becker (3-1) earned his first win as a starter after recording his first two wins in relief. Graylon Brown (1-1) earned the win in the series finale in relief and then secured his fourth save of the season in the finale. At the plate, Hunter Choate hit .500 with eight hits, while Cameron Massengill had three hits and drove in the game-winning runs in each of the three wins. Reggie Rodriguez finished the weekend with five hits, while David Goggin and Derek Tyner had four hits.

Eastern New Mexico

Eastern New Mexico went 1-3 last week as they hosted West Texas A&M. The Greyhounds dropped the first three games of the series before winning the final game 6-5 in 11 innings on a walk-off sacrifice fly by Rafael Romo. Matthew Burks had a team-high .333 batting average with five hits, two doubles and three RBIs. He was also hit twice, stole a base and had 11 putouts with an assist as he threw a runner out at the plate. Sam Hedrick was the only other player to drive in multiple runners (2). He and Colton Sims both had four hits in the series. Sims also became the first ENMU player in over two years to steal home as he swiped the base in the second game versus the Buffaloes. Jackson Gaskins pitched two scoreless innings in relief to pick up the victory in the fourth contest while Keigan Basso struck out five in five innings in the game as he got the start. This week, the Greyhounds host Texas A&M-Kingsville in a four-game series starting Friday at 5 p.m. MT with a single game. Saturday will feature a doubleheader while Sunday's finale is another single game.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

The Javelinas went 4-0 last week sweeping Cameron at Nolan Ryan Field. It was the Javelinas first Lone Star Conference sweep of the season and first since finishing last year with back-to-back sweeps of Eastern New Mexico and Incarnate Word to close out the regular season...With the sweep, the Hoggies have climbed back into the South Central Region poll at No. 8...The Javelinas face No. 4 St. Mary's in a key regional battle. Kingsville will then head to Portales for a 4-game series this weekend...James Black hit .455 on the weekend with eight RBI. In the first game of Saturday's doubleheader, the Javelina third baseman was 3-for-3 with five runs batted in. He had two home runs in the game joining Taylor Taska as the only Javelinas to belt two in a game this season. He had a slugging percentage of 1.000. Black recorded a hit in 3-of-4 games going hitless in two at bats in the series opener. He did have a sacrifice fly in that game and struck out just once on the week...Taylor Taska pitched seven shutout innings in the series opener for his first complete game of the season. Taska scattered

five hits and walked just one. He fanned nine batters in the game. He is now 2-0 on the season with a 0.89 earned run average...Justin Lee is off to a tremendous start in his senior season. This past weekend, Lee hit .600 with two RBI and five runs scored. On the season, Lee is averaging a team-best .356 with 12 runs scored, six RBI and three steals. He has walked seven times with striking out just six times...The Javelinas are sharing the wealth in the RBI category. Three players – Taylor Taska, James Black, and Clint Wallace – share the lead with 12, while Ryan Guedry has 10...Kingsville's starting rotation has accounted for all 10 wins. Denver Diefenbach and Dallas Ponder lead the way with three victories each, while Taylor Taska and Matt Rhodes both have two.

West Texas A&M

The Buffs won their second conference series of the season with a 3-1 series win at Eastern New Mexico this weekend...WT improved to 16-4 on the year and is tied for the LSC lead at 6-2 with Angelo State...The Rams visit Wilder Park for a critical four-game series this weekend...The Buffs moved into the national rankings for the first time this season last week at No. 18...Senior Josh Weyker threw a complete game, one-hit shutout on Sunday in a 13-0 win...It was his first one-hitter and second of the season for WT...The 13 runs were the most scored this season thus far and the 17 hits tied a season-high in that game...In the nightcap on Sunday, the Buffs held a 3-1 lead in the seventh, but couldn't hold on as ENMU won 6-5 with a walk-off sacrifice fly in the 11th...The 11-inning game was the longest of the season for WT...Junior Jacob Caples has reached base in 13-straight games, while senior Tyler McKnight and junior Justin Hargrove have reached base in 12 straight games...Senior Matt Redfearn scored eight of the Buffs' 35 runs this weekend which was the most of any player...WT hit .380 for the series, scoring 35 runs with 54 hits, including 10 doubles, two triples and 30 RBI...The staff tallied a 3.24 ERA as teams hit just .207 against it and the opposition had a 7.68 ERA.
