LSC BASEBALL

West Texas A&M swept Angelo State to take over the top spot in the Lone Star Conference standings. The Buffs are off to its best start in school history at 20-4.

This week's schedule includes WT at Tarleton State, Texas A&M-Kingsville at ASU, and Eastern New Mexico at Cameron.

In 2014, LSC teams are playing a 10-week schedule with a four-game series and three-game series against every other team. Each four-game series shall consist of a 9-inning game Friday, a 7x7 doubleheader Saturday and 9-inning contest Sunday, and each three-game series shall consist of a 9-inning game Friday and a 7x9 doubleheader Saturday.

The overall LSC Champion will be the team(s) with the best winning percentage in regular-season conference games, while the winner of the postseason championship will be recognized as LSC Tournament Champion and receive the league's automatic qualification into NCAA postseason. The championship will be played May 8-10, at the No. 1 seed with the top four teams qualifying.

LSC baseball teams are 84-53 overall this season. In the NCAA South Central Region, the teams are currently 17-5 combined versus Heartland Conference teams and 18-5 against the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

HITTERS

Blake Cooper, Eastern New Mexico University, JR, OF, Long Beach, Calif., LB Wilson HS/Golden West College
 The junior outfielder led Eastern New Mexico with a .471 batting average as he had a team-high eight hits in 17 at-bats. Cooper belted four doubles and his fifth home run of the season to tie for the most in the Lone Star Conference. He began the weekend with a walk-off double to end an eight-game winless streak to the Javelinas. Cooper also led ENMU with five RBIs, an .882 slugging percentage and was a perfect 2-for-2 in stealing bases. In the field, he made 15 putouts while not committing an error.

Derrick Walls, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, SR, SS, San Antonio, Texas, Reagan HS

Walls led the Javelinas with a .450 average. The senior was nine of 20 with four walks, seven runs scored and two runs driven in. He scored twice in the win over St. Mary's and twice in the finale with Eastern New Mexico. Walls drove in a run in each of the final two games of the series.

PITCHERS

Scott Cone, West Texas A&M University, SR, LHP, Glenwood, New South Wales, Australia, The Hills Sports HS
 Cone tossed his first complete game shutout of his WT career in a 1-0, walk-off victory for WT over No. 10 Angelo State in the second game of a four-game sweep of the Rams. Cone allowed just three hits and one walk in the seven-inning game, while fanning four. He retired the first 17 in order before a double ended the perfect game in the fifth. An unearned run in the bottom of the seventh gave the Buffs' the walk-off victory. The Rams hit just .136 for the game as it marked the first of two shutouts in the series for WT and the first time the Rams had been shutout all season.

Cody Williams, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, SR, P, Cypress, Texas, Cypress Woods HS

Williams made his first start of the season on Tuesday at St. Mary's and showed little difficulty in making the transition back to a starting role. Williams, who has nine relief appearances on the season, tossed five scoreless innings in the midweek game to earn the victory of the region's top team. He scattered four hits and walked one, while striking out three. He made two relief appearances at Eastern New Mexico going 1-1. For the week, he pitched 6-2/3 innings scattering five hits with two walks and six strikeouts. Williams allowed one earned as the Javelina staff had a combined 2.68 ERA in five games.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

David Goggin, Angelo State University, led the Angelo State offense throughout its weekend in Canyon, going 8-for-16 with four RBI. Goggin delivered a two-run triple in Friday's series opener to tie the game at 2-2 and also had two RBI in Sunday's finale. The sophomore also stole a base and finished the weekend with a .625 slugging percentage.

Nick Chapman, West Texas A&M University, had a solid week for the Buffs as he went 6 of 15 from the plate with four runs scored and 10 total bases to lead the team in each area. He also had his first home run as a Buff and just the fourth of the season for WT in the Buffs' four-game sweep of No. 10 Angelo State. He slugged .667 with a double and reached base at a .471 clip. He has the team's longest hitting streak at nine games.

Jason Zgardowski, Angelo State University, took his first loss of the season, but did everything he could to get the Rams a win in the first game of a Saturday doubleheader at West Texas A&M. Zgardowski struck out four and held WT to only three hits in 6.2 innings before an error gave the Buffs a walk-off 1-0 win. He limited WT hitters to a .125 batting average in the game.

Ben Monticello, Eastern New Mexico University, pitched his second complete game of the season in the series opener against Texas A&M-Kingsville as Eastern New Mexico ended an eight game winless streak to the Javelinas. He struck out a career-high eight batters and allowed the Javelinas to hit just .222 with just one extra-base hit. Monticello became the first Greyhound pitch multiple complete games in a season since 2012 as he improved to 4-1 on the year.

LSC NOTES (Submitted by LSC SID's)

Angelo State

The Rams were swept in a four-game series at West Texas A&M after struggling at the plate with a .195 batting average and committing 12 errors in the field. ASU's pitching staff held up its end of the deal, limiting WT to a .235 batting average and finishing the weekend with a 1.62 staff ERA. The four losses even ASU's conference record to 6-6 going into this weekend's home series against Texas A&M-Kingsville. David Goggin led the Rams by going 8-for-16 at the plate, while Jason Zgardowski struck out four and didn't allow an earned run in a 6.2 inning 1-0 loss. Jake Feckley was just as strong, going 7.1 innings and allowing just one earned run. In Sunday's finale, starter Dillon Becker went 6.0 innings and allowed only one earned run. WT scored five unanswered runs to force a 13-inning game it won 7-6. In the game, Graylon Brown went 6.2 innings before another error gave the Buffs a walk-off win and the four-game sweep.

Cameron

Cameron fell in both game in a condensed conference series with Tarleton State and they have dropped their last nine games in a row. In the first game, Drew Reidt (2-4) went the distance while giving up five runs, two of which were earned. Brian Schwabe (0-2) was charged for the loss in the nightcap giving up five runs (three earned) while punching out six Texan hitters. Cameron racked up a season high 13 hits in game two with Codey McElory going 3 for 5 with a pair of runs scored; Kas Sanders had a pair of hits and RBI.

Eastern New Mexico

Eastern New Mexico went 2-2 last week as they hosted Texas A&M-Kingsville. The Greyhounds won the first two games of the series on walk-off hits on Friday. Blake Cooper won the first game with a double to end an eight-game losing streak to the Javelinas while Rawley Gomez followed with a bloop single in the second contest. Cooper led the Greyhounds in batting average (.471), hits (8), slugging percentage (.882) and stolen bases (2). Of his eight hits, four were doubles and he blasted his fifth home run of the season to tie for the Lone Star Conference lead. Gomez feasted on TAMUK pitching as he was 6-for-13 (.462) with two runs scored, a RBI and two stolen bases. Both Matthew Burks and Sam Hedrick hit .333 with Hedrick scoring four times, driving in two and recording two triples. Scoring a team-high six times was Colton Sims as he walked four times during the series. Chad Highberger went 3-for-5 including a perfect 3-for-3 performance in the series finale. On the bump, Ben Monticello threw his second complete game of the season to improve to 4-1. He struck out a career-high eight batters while holding TAMUK to a .222 average. Rusty Edwards allowed a run that was unearned in six inning with five strikeouts in game two of the series. Kiegan Basso went 1-1 in two appearances including his third career start in game four. This week the Greyhounds travel to take on Cameron for a four-game series starting Friday afternoon.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

The Javelinas went 3-2 this past week...Kingsville began the week by travelling to St. Mary's and defeating the No. 3 team in the country and top team in the region 12-3. The Hoggies finished the week by going 2-2 at Eastern New Mexico. After dropping a pair of 1-run games in which Eastern scored in their final at bat, Kingsville rebounded to take both games on Saturday 8-4 and 15-4...Javelina lead-off hitter Derrick Walls has been on a tremendous role the last 16 games helping the Hoggies to an 11-5 record in that time. Walls is averaging .421 over the span raising his average to .388 on the season. He has posted a hit in each of those games and reached safely in 18 straight. Walls has crossed the plate 17 times in the span. On the year, the shortstop is third with a .388 average and fourth with 20 runs scored...The Javelinas has shown a discerning eye at the plate this season with three players among the top four hitters in walks. Matt Perez leads the Lone Star Conference with 17, while Taylor Taska is second with 15. Derrick Walls is tied for third with 14 walks this season...Kingsville displayed a balanced attack at the plate. Seven different players drove in at least three runs with Ryan Guedry and Justin Lee each plating four. Four players scored at least five runs...Derrick Walls led the Javelinas with a .450 average. The West Texas A&M baseball team is off to its best start in school history at 20-4 after the first four-game sweep in school history of Angelo State...The Buffs improved to 10-2 in the LSC to lead the league by three games...It marked just the second time the Rams had been swept in a four game series in 10 years (Abilene Christian, 2010)...WT now has won 7 of 9 against ASU...The Buffs had two walk-off wins over the Rams with a 1-0 win on Saturday courtesy of an error plating the lone run and a thrilling 7-6, 13-inning win on Sunday as WT battled back from a 6-1 deficit in the final three innings of regulation...The 13-inning game is the longest of the season for WT...The Buffs again pitched solid as they held ASU to just .195 for the series, allowing just eight runs and six earned...WT fanned 27 and walked 10 in the series...ASU committed 12 errors in the series leading to 10 unearned runs for the Buffs...Junior Nick Chapman belted his first home run as a Buff in a 3-0 win Saturday as it was just the fourth home run for the Buffs this season...WT had its first four game sweep since sweeping Cameron in 2012...The Buffs now have played back-to-back, extra-inning games on Sundays to close series'...WT had just a 1.50 ERA for the series.
