LONE STAR FOOTBALL FESTIVAL

The Lone Star Football Festival returns to AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas for the fourth straight year in 2014, and will feature four games in a single day on Saturday, September 20.

The lineup includes two Lone Star Conference tilts and a pair of non-conference games featuring opponents from the Gulf South Conference. Texas A&M-Commerce faces Texas A&M-Kingsville, and Midwestern State goes against Eastern New Mexico in league action. West Texas A&M plays Shorter (Georgia), and Tarleton State meets Florida Tech in non-conference play. The action starts at 10 a.m. with A&M-C vs. TAMUK, followed by WT-Shorter at 1 p.m., TSU-FIT at 5 p.m., and MSU-ENMU at 8 p.m. to conclude the football-filled day.

A single ticket will be good for admission to all four games at the festival. Advance purchases will be rewarded with rates of \$25 for adults and \$10 for students, whereas game-day pricing at the AT&T Stadium ticket windows will be \$30 for adults and \$12 for students.

The festival has attracted more than 86,000 fans for 16 games in its first three years, making it one of the best-attended football events in all of Division II. Fourteen of those 16 games have been televised, bringing extensive exposure to LSC member institutions and their football teams. The festival also has featured five NFL Draft picks and eight NCAA playoff teams, including the 2012 Division II National Champion Valdosta State.

LSC FOOTBALL

In addition to four games at the Lone Star Football Festival, Angelo State hosts McMurry in league action.

Tarleton State opened the season with a LSC victory at West Texas A&M, while Texas A&M-Kingsville, Eastern New Mexico, Angelo State, and Midwestern State prevailed in non-conference action last week.

LSC football teams are 8-4 overall this season. The squads are 5-1 combined versus the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, Great Lakes Valley Conference and Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, which are also in NCAA Super Regional Four.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Collin Strahan, Tarleton State University, JR, QB, Mesquite, Texas, Horn HS

In his first career start for the Texans, Collin Strahan lifted No. 16 Tarleton State to a 31-27 victory over No. 22 West Texas A&M in Canyon Saturday night. Strahan put together one of the best overall performances by a quarterback in Tarleton's football history en route to guiding the Texans to their first win in Kimbrough Memorial Stadium since 2004. Through the air, Strahan was 16-22 for 123 yards, no interceptions and a 119.7 pass efficiency rating while connecting with five different receivers for completions. The signal caller from Mesquite ran the ball 21 times for 124 yards and a touchdown for a team-high 5.9 yards per carry average. His rushing performance is the best by quarterback in school history and is just the fourth time – the first since 1992 – that a Tarleton quarterback has rushed for over 100 yards. He's also the second quarterback in school history to rush and pass for over 100 yards in the same game, joining Jimmy Hering who did the feat once in 1991 and again in 1992. For the game, Strahan led all Texans in all-purpose yards and his touchdown run was the first score of the second half to break a 10-10 halftime tie and put the Texans on top 17-10.

DEFENSIVE

Clayton Callicutt, Angelo State University, JR, DE, Crosby, Texas, Crosby HS

Callicutt set a career high with three and a half sacks and five tackles for loss in a 38-6 win over Western State. The junior was third on the team with eight total tackles. One of his sacks came on third down in the first half while his other two and half sacks forced a third down. The Rams defense totaled six sacks and 11 tackles for loss during the game while limiting WSCU to just 288 yards of offense.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Dominique Williams, Midwestern State University, JR, PR/KR, Houston, Texas, Clements HS

Williams started the Mustangs comeback from a 14-point first quarter deficit with his return skills in Midwestern State's 40-23 win over Missouri S&T. On the first punt return attempt of the season, the 5-8, 180 pound junior from Houston, Texas/Clements received the punt at the Miners 47, broke a tackle and scored the Mustangs first touchdown of the season with the 47-yard return. Williams finished the night with three punt returns for 52 yards and added two kickoff returns for 67 yards, including a 39-yard return. Williams scoring return was his second career touchdown.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

E'lon Spight, Eastern New Mexico University, paced the Greyhounds against Adams State with 138 rushing yards on 29 carries with a one-yard touchdown run. He helped set the game's tone early on, with 24 first-half carries for 131 yards. His performance allowed Eastern to dominate time of possession and post a 15-1 ratio in first downs in the opening half. Spight is averaging 4.4 yards per carry this season and has had at least 28 carries in both games.

Dante Taylor, Midwestern State University, opened the season as Midwestern State's top running back and rushed for a career-high in leading the Mustangs to a 40-23 victory over Missouri S&T. Taylor rushed for 128 yards on 15 carries, including a 58-yard touchdown run that gave the Mustangs the lead to stay in the second quarter. Taylor also caught two passes for 39 yards. Taylor recorded 10-plus yards on five of the 17 plays he

touched the football.

Trey Mitchell, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, ran for two touchdowns to lead the Javelinas to a 17-14 victory over Colorado Mesa... the junior led off TAMUK's opening drive with a 67-yard rush for a touchdown and followed with a three-yard carry to end the first quarter with two TDs... the two rushing touchdowns mark the first time that a Javelina runs for two touchdowns since Sept. 21 of last season... Mitchell was not sacked and did not throw an interception all evening.

Joe Bergeron, Texas A&M University - Commerce, had 16 touches for 125 all-purpose yards in the loss at SFA.

Kyle Washington, Angelo State University, opened the season with a bang throwing for two touchdowns and a career high 362 yards in a 38-6 win over Western State Colorado. The junior quarterback led a Rams offense that racked up 607 yards of total offense. The Humble native went 27-of-34 (79.4-percent) and carried the ball for 60 yards and two touchdowns. The 362 passing yards by Washington is the ninth most in a single game in ASU history and the Humble native moved into No. 8 on the ASU career total offense yards list with 4,159 yards.

Anthony Johnson, West Texas A&M University, tallied a season-high 138 yards on nine receptions and one touchdown against No. 16 Tarleton State Saturday. Scored the first passing touchdown of the season for the Buffs. His nine receptions tied his season-high set last week. It was his seventh career game of over 100 yards receiving and 15th career touchdown. His touchdown retied the game in the third quarter.

Charles Woods, Texas A&M University - Commerce, was the anchor for the Lion defense as he was all over the field against SFA. He racked up 16 total tackles including seven solo tackles and two tackles for a loss. He also recovered a fumbled and picked off a pass following a tip at the line of scrimmage. In coverage Woods had one pass break up.

Marc Martinez, Tarleton State University, had a dominant game in the middle of the Texan defense as No. 16 Tarleton earned its first victory over West Texas A&M in Canyon since 2004 and second consecutive game against the Buffs dating back to last season. Martinez recorded a team-high 14 tackles and his second career interception at crucial time in the game. On the fourth WT drive of the game and the Buffs leading 3-0 in the second quarter, West Texas A&M drove the ball 77 yards in 15 plays to the Tarleton three-yard line before Martinez stepped in front of the Buffalo tight end in the end zone to give the ball back to the Texan offense, who in turn drove the length of the field for a touchdown and the Texans' first lead of the game.

Carter James, West Texas A&M University, had another outstanding week defensively for the Buffs as he was second on the team in tackles with 13 and five solo stops along with 1.5 tackles for loss for 13 yards and his first career sack for 11 yards. James ranks third nationally in total tackles at 14.5 per game and 12th in solo tackles at 7.5 per game which both are tops in the LSC.

Henry Greathouse, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, paced a defense that recorded 97 tackles, 14 for a loss... the Javelinas recorded five sacks and forced six fumbles to limit the Mavericks to 14 points in a 17-14 victory... Greathouse finished with seven solo tackles and recovered a fumble... The Mavericks were limited to 6-of-17 on third-down conversions and 0-of-4 on fourth-down opportunities.

Marqui Christian, Midwestern State University, led the defensive attack in Midwestern State's season opening 40-23 victory over Missouri S&T. The 6-1, 200

pound junior from Spring, Texas, equaled his career-high with 11 tackles for the Mustangs, including a tackle for loss for four yards. Christian snared the first MSU interception of the season late in the second quarter that set up a score for Midwestern just before the half.

Elliot Peters, Eastern New Mexico University, paced Eastern with seven tackles, which included two for a loss and a sack. Two of his tackles prevented third and fourth-down conversions, in addition to a third-down quarterback pressure which forced a punt in the fourth quarter. Peters also registered a 12-yard sack in the fourth quarter. The 186 yards of total offense given up by Eastern was the lowest total since Southwestern Oklahoma State managed 180 yards on September 5, 2009.

Chase Thrasher, Texas A&M University - Commerce, connected on a career-long 41 yard field goal at the time cutting the lead down to 7-3 early in the first quarter against SFA. He also had eight punts, two landing inside the 20 yard line, for an average of 36.25 yards per punt.

Blake Barnes, Tarleton State University, was perfect on all of his attempted field goals, which including a 34-yarder and four extra points, to lift No. 16 Tarleton past No. 22 West Texas A&M 31-27 Saturday night. Barnes hit the game-tying field goal from 34 yards out and 38 seconds left on the clock heading into halftime. He also had five kickoffs, which totaled 286 yards and an average of 57.2 yards per kickoff with one touchback. The junior from Stephenville also served as the team's punter for the first time in his career and found success with five punts for 194 yards for an average of 38.8 and a long of 46. Barnes had one punt land inside the 20-yard line. Barnes also saved a West Texas A&M touchdown on a 48-yard kickoff return when he stepped in front of the Buffalo returner and made the stop at the 50-yard line.

Mitchell Cox, Eastern New Mexico University, did a little of everything for the Greyhounds last week. He registered 12 points, made three tackles, kicked off nine times and punted once. Cox's two-point conversion pass was the first of his career and he converted on all four point-after touchdown attempts. His 47-yard field goal in the third quarter, was just one yard shy of his career best, set against Incarnate Word, last season.

Venric Mark, West Texas A&M University, had an outstanding game in the return game setting the Buffs up with great field position throughout the game against No. 16 Tarleton State. Had four kick returns for 90 yards and a long of 48, while returning two punts for 35 yards and a long of 32. He also had 20 carries for 88 yards rushing. Mark ranks 30th nationally in combined kicks which is tops in the conference with 179 return yards and is 35th nationally in all-purpose yards at 165.0 per game.

The Rams defeated Western State Colorado 38-6 in the inaugural game at LeGrand Stadium at 1st Community Credit Union Field ... It is the sixth-straight season opening win and 10th-straight home opening win for ASU ... The Rams 607 yards of total offense is the most since recording 650 against Incarnate Word in October of 2010 ... Kyle Washington threw for a career high 362 yards on 27-of-34 passing and two touchdowns ... The 362 passing yards in the ninth most in a single game in ASU history ... ASU is currently on a five-game winning streak for the first time since 2009 ... Dakarai Pecikonis set a career high with 163 receiving yards on nine catches ... Pecikonis made an acrobatic catch in the third quarter that was

Eastern New Mexico

The Greyhounds set the tone early against Adams State, with an 11-play, 81-yard drive after taking the opening kickoff and never let up. After the first half was completed, Eastern had 15 first downs, while the Grizzlies had just one. The domination didn't cease until the clock ran out on ENMU's 42-14 win and the Hounds were 2-0 for the first time since the 2007 season. E'lon Spight rushed for 138 yards, with over 120 coming in the opening half of play. Mitchell Cox accounted for 12 points and three tackles, while Elliot Peters had a big sack for the defense. This week, the Greyhounds will take on Midwestern State at the Lone Star Conference Football Festival.

McMurry

Did not play last week.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State opened the season 1-0 with the Mustangs 40-23 victory over Missouri S&T...The win was the first season opening victory since MSU beat MST 41-0 on Sept. 10, 2011...The game was the first season opener at home for MSU since 2009, when Midwestern beat New Mexico Highlands 41-0 on Aug. 29, 2009...The Mustangs won their 10th straight home opener, and are now 12-1 in home openers under Coach Bill Maskill...The win was the 96th of Coach Bill Maskill at Midwestern State, running his record to 96-37, with a 72.1 winning percentage, as he started his 13th season at MSU...Maskill has an overall record of 109-45, a 70.8 winning percentage, starting his 15th season as a collegiate head coach...The Mustangs ran their record in pre-October games to 42-9 (.823) under Coach Bill Maskill. Since 2006, that record is now 31-3 (.912)...MSU ran its record against regular season Division II non-conference opponents to 15-1...Midwestern won its 110th game since the start of the 2000 season with the win over Missouri S&T, bring the Mustangs record in the millennium to a Lone Star Conference best 110-44 (.714)...Sophomore Dante Taylor rushed for a career-high 128 yards on 15 carries against the Miners, including a 58-yard touchdown run...Junior Levy Wilson caught two passes for 100 yards and a touchdown, marking the Mustangs third straight game of having a receiver post a 100-yard game dating back to the 2013 campaign, all by different receivers...Midwestern State gave up a 91-yard touchdown return on the season-opening kickoff. It marked the first time the Mustangs gave up a kickoff return touchdown since Angelo State's Quinn Reels posted a 100-yard return on Oct. 26, 2013. It was the first opening kickoff return since Abilene Christian's Dennis Campbell raced 97 yards to open the NCAA Division II playoffs on Nov. 14, 2009...Midwestern State returns to AT&T Stadium for the Lone Star Football Festival for the fourth time, with MSU holding a 2-1 record at the home of the Dallas Cowboys...The Mustangs face a Lone Star Conference opponent for the fourth time as well in Eastern New Mexico. MSU is the only LSC team to face a conference opponent in the four Lone Star Football Festivals...

Tarleton State

After weeks of waiting for the season to begin, No. 16 Tarleton State got the season started with a 31-27 win over No. 22 West Texas A&M at Kimbrough Memorial Stadium in Canyon. For the Texans, this is the first win in Canyon since 2004 and second straight win over

the Buffs dating back to last season's 31-27 comeback victory in Stephenville. This is the third straight season Tarleton State has started the season with a win, all three of those wins against ranked opponents in the season opener. It is also the first road win over a ranked opponent since the first round of the 2009 NCAA Playoffs when Tarleton defeated then-No. 13 Texas A&M-Kingsville in double overtime. After running onto the field for the first time, Tarleton State got an emotional lift when teammate Chance Wallace welcomed the Texans to the field. Wallace suffered a career-ending injury in March and is currently undergoing rehabilitation to regain the use of his legs.

Texas A&M-Commerce

Texas A&M-Commerce 17, Stephen F. Austin 38

Texas A&M-Kingsville

Trey Mitchell jump-started Texas A&M University-Kingsville (1-1) to a 7-3 lead with a 67-yard run on the Javelinas' opening drive and the defense finished with 97 total tackles as Kingsville defeated Colorado Mesa University (1-1), 17-14, on Saturday evening at Javelina Stadium. The defense, highlighted by seniors Henry Greathouse and Trevor Pesek's combined 21 tackles, was locked in all evening, registering six forced fumbles and four quarterback hits. The Javelinas added five sacks for 35 yards and limited the fast paced offense of the Mavericks to 6-of-17 on third-down conversions and 0-of-4 on fourth-down opportunities.

West Texas A&M

The Buffs showed great improvement Saturday falling 31-27 to No. 16 Tarleton State which was the exact same score as the game last year in Stephenville...The Buffs scored their first touchdown of the season in the second quarter on one of two junior Jeremy Alridge-Mitchell touchdown carries...Junior quarterback Preston Rabb went 21 of 34 with his first career touchdown pass and a career-high 249 yards passing as he looked more comfortable this week...The Buffs had a season-high 88 yards rushing from senior Venric Mark and senior Anthony Johnson had nine receptions on a season-high 138 yards and one touchdown...Junior punter Elliot Moore continues to impress as he punted five times for 43.0 yards with a long of 51 and two inside the 20...Sophomore kicker Connor Hollabaugh kicked two field goals and remained perfect on the year (4-4) including a career-high 48-yarder giving the Buffs' their first lead of the season in the first quarter...Moore is 27th nationally in punting at 41.4 yards per punt...Johnson leads the conference and is 10th nationally in receptions per game at 9.0...Defensively redshirt junior Carter James continues to be impressive as he is third nationally in total tackles at 14.5 per game and 12th in solo tackles at 7.5 per game...Sophomore Patric Youngman is 7th nationally in total tackles at 13.5 per game after a career-high 16 stops against Tarleton State Saturday...Senior return specialist and running back Venric Mark is 35th nationally in all-purpose yards at 165.0 per game...He also is 30th in combined kick returns with 179 return yards which leads the conference.
