GOLFERS OF THE WEEK

MEN'S

Oscar Spolander, West Texas A&M University, FR, Sollentuna, Sweeden, Korrespondens Gymnasiet Skola
Spolander finished tied for first in the WT Ryan Palmer Foundation Invitational of 90 players and lost a one-hole playoff to Jose Hernandez of St. Edward's. Despite losing the playoff, Spolander still earned medalist honors and finished with an impressive 9-under 207 on rounds of 68, 68 and 71 in his first collegiate tournament. Spolander was 3-over with three to play Tuesday and went eagle, birdie to end the tournament and tie for first after beginning the final round leading by one stroke. The Buffs, as a team, finished seventh in the 17-team field.

WOMEN'S

Casey Wild, Tarleton State University, FR, Wodonga, Australia, Wodonga Senior Secondary School
Wild made herself known at the Concho River Classic as well as to the rest of the Lone Star Conference as the new addition to Tarleton State guided the TexAnns to a second-place finish in San Angelo and finished in a tie for the top individual score in her collegiate debut. Wild shot the lowest round of the entire tournament in her first day on the course with a 70 to lead the pack at two-under after Monday's round. In the first round, Wild recorded two birdies and shot par on every other hole. She came back to shoot a 75, which was tied for the second-lowest score among all competitors, in the second round to finish at the top of the leaderboard with a 145 for the tournament. She tied with her TexAnn teammate and the two-time LSC Player of the Year, Isabel Jimenez-Perez.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Zander Winston, Cameron University, in his first tournament as an Aggie, carded a 214 after shooting a 68 in round one, a 74 in round two, and a 72 in the final round of the Ryan Palmer Invitational this week. His two under par performance earned him an 11th place finish individually, and powered his team to a fourth place finish.

Emily White, Texas A&M University - Commerce, finished tied for eighth place at the Angelo State Concho River Classic on Tuesday. She had a combined two day total of 154. White shot a 76 on day one and a 78 on day 2.

Erin Hess, Cameron University, led the Aggies with an 18th place finish and a score of 158 in just her second collegiate tournament at the Point Loma Fall Preview this week. After a slow start in round one, shooting an 81, she bounced back by shooting a 77 in round two, thanks to three birdies and a two under par score through her first nine holes. Cameron finished in ninth place as a team.

Avery Struck, West Texas A&M University, playing as an individual, finished tied for fifth at the Point Loma Nazarene Fall Preview on historic Torrey Pines North Course in La Jolla, Calif. Struck finished 5-over for the event on rounds of 75 and 78 for a 153 score on the par 74 course. The Lady Buffs as a team finished fourth of 12 teams.

The Aggie men's golf team finished in fourth place at the Ryan Palmer Invitational with a score of 862, two strokes under par. After starting out with a 281 in round one, Cameron followed that up with a 298 in round two and a bounce back 283 in round three. Zander Winston led the way for CU, carding a 214 and finishing in 11th place individually. Cullen Stahl powered the Aggies in round three, shooting a career low 66 to finish with a 216 and in 21st place. Justin Jang and Corey Bounds both finished in 36th with a pair of 220s and K.C. Colvin rounded out the group with a 223 and a 53rd place finish. The Cameron women finished in ninth place at the Point Loma Fall Preview at Torrey Pines this week, carding a 649. Freshman Erin Hess led the way with a score of 158 and a 18th place finish

individually. Alexis Thompson finished in 26th place with a 162, and three strokes behind her was Jaqueline Strickland with a 43rd place finish. Candice Swartz and Katie Johnston rounded out the CU five finishing in 58th and 60th place with a 171 and 172 respectively. Both teams will be off next week as the men will return to action on Sept. 29-30 at the Western New Mexico Invitational, while the women won't return until the Dallas Baptist Classic on Oct. 13-14.

The Midwestern State women finished fourth at the season opening Concho River Classic played at the Par 72, 5,960-yard Bentwood Country Club Course... Senior Brenna Moore and sophomore Sierra Campbell finished tied for eighth with a two-round total of 154 (+10)... The MSU open the season at the Western New Mexico Mustangs Fall Intercollegiate on Sept. 29-30 at The Golf Club at Estrella in Goodyear, Ariz... The women are next in action at the GolfWeek Fall Invitational at the Sunriver (Ore.) Resort from Oct. 3-5...

Tarleton State opened the fall season with its annual visit to San Angelo Monday and Tuesday for the Concho River Classic, where they finished in second-place after dropping a tiebreaker with Newman for the top spot. Tarleton returned three players from last year's squad that advanced to the National Championship Tournament and finished third.
