GOLFERS OF THE WEEK

MEN'S

Logan Leggett, West Texas A&M University, SR, Amarillo, Texas, Randall HS

Leggett finished tied for 15th at the San Antonio Shootout with a 163 score on rounds of 82 and 81. The conditions were unfavorable for golf with wind, rain and extreme cold temperatures. The tournament was shortened to two rounds from three because of the conditions. Leggett helped lead the Buffs to a seventh-place finish with a 655 score (338-317).

WOMEN'S

Judy Papenfus, West Texas A&M University, SR, Maclear, South Africa, Maclear HS

Finished tied for fifth at the Lady Rattler Invitational as the Lady Buffs finished third as a team. Papenfus fired a pair of 78's for a 156 score as conditions were unfavorable for golf with cold, wind and rain. She tied with Tarleton State's Isabell Jimenez Perea who is ranked No. 3 nationally in Golfstat and St. Mary's Allison Howarth who is No. 13. As a team, the Lady Buffs beat a number of ranked teams in the tournament, including No. 16 Newman and No. 24 Tarleton State who were ranked ahead of the No. 30 Lady Buffs.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Ashley Rivera, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, led the Texas A&M-Kingsville contingent with a fifth place finish at the Jack Brown Memorial. She shot 242 (+26) in the two-day event. It was her third top five finish of the year while coming in second among regional golfers.
