LSC BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

The brackets are set for the Lone Star Conference Men's and Women's Basketball Championship March 4-7 in Allen, Texas.

The top eight men and women's teams have advanced to the LSC Championship Tournament and the postseason begins with games on Wednesday, March 4.

West Texas A&M claimed the LSC women's title with a nearly perfect 15-1 league record. The Lady Buffs picked up their second straight championship and 13th overall

On the men's side, Tarleton State won the LSC title with a 12-2 record. The Texans claimed their second straight championship and fourth overall.

Tickets are available through Ticketmaster outlets and Ticketmaster.com, as well as the Allen Event Center box office. Single-session tickets are \$15 for adults and \$10 for students.

LSC BASKETBALL

The LSC men have a 136-83 overall record so far this season with four teams (TSU, ASU, MSU, A&M-C) eclipsing the 20-win mark. In the NCAA South Central Region, the men's teams are currently 13-6 combined versus Heartland Conference teams and 8-7 against the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

The LSC women are 123-111 overall with a pair of 20-win teams (WT, MSU). The women's squads are currently 13-17 combined against the Heartland, and 6-3 versus RMAC teams, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

MEN'S OFFENSIVE

Miles Gatewood, West Texas A&M University, SR, Guard, Portland, Ore., Westview HS

Gatewood had an outstanding final home game on Saturday during a Senior Day win over rival Eastern New Mexico, 96-86. Gatewood scored 24 points while leading the team in all shooting categories, going an impressive .700 from the field, making a career-high six triples for a .667 shooting percentage, and went .667 as well from the charity stripe, also leading the Buffs. He went on to lead the team in assists with five while adding three rebounds and a steal as well.

MEN'S DEFENSIVE

Nosa Ebomwonyi, Tarleton State University, FR, Guard, Pflugerville, Texas, Pflugerville HS

Ebomwonyi turned in a remarkable defensive performance for the Tarleton State Texans last week to help Tarleton secure the outright Lone Star Conference Championship and No. 1 seed in the LSC Championship Tournament. In addition to grabbing nine rebounds and three steals from the guard position, he starred as a lockdown defender for the Texans. Ebomwonyi drew the assignment of guarding one of the LSC's top-10 scorers, LaDon Carnegie. The true freshman from Pflugerville held Carnegie, who entered the game averaging 15.9 points per game, scoreless on 0-7 shooting from the floor including 0-6 from beyond the arc. Ebomwonyi and the Texan defense held the Lions, who entered the game No. 2 in the LSC in scoring average, to only 48 points. For the week, teams shot .394 and averaged 53.0 points per game against the lockdown Texan defense.

WOMEN'S OFFENSIVE

Andrea Carter, Midwestern State University, SR, Forward, Angleton, Texas, Angleton HS

Carter erupted for a season-high 20 points to lead Midwestern State to an 83-71 win over Cameron Sunday to clinch the No. 2 seed in the Lone Star Conference Postseason Tournament. The senior from Angleton connected on 7-of-13 shots while going 6-of-6 from the charity stripe to finish with 20 points and seven rebounds in just 23 minutes on the floor. Carter became just the second player in Midwestern State history to amass 1,000 career rebounds in the win and ranks sixth on the school's all-time scoring chart with 1,433 points.

WOMEN'S DEFENSIVE

Shambreka Jones, Midwestern State University, SR, Forward, Mesquite, Texas, Poteet HS/Charleston Southern Jones notched her second double-double of the season in a big way while helping Midwestern State clinch the No. 2 seed in the Lone Star Conference Postseason Tournament Sunday with an 83-71 win over Cameron. The 6-foot senior from Mesquite notched career highs with 18 points and 18 rebounds while swatting four shots as MSU held the Aggies to a 38.6-percent shooting night. Jones became the second player in program history to top the 50-block in a single season and continues to lead the LSC with 2.0 blocked shots per game.

MEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Mo Lee, Tarleton State University, continued his run of dominance by averaging 20.5 points over the last week and leading the Texans to an outright Lone Star Conference Championship. The senior from The Bronx, New York recorded his seventh 20-point effort over the last 12 games Sunday night to lift Tarleton State past Texas A&M-Commerce in a 68-48 rout to secure the title and the No. 1 seed in the LSC Championship Tournament. For the week, Lee total 41 points in wins over McMurry and Texas A&M-Commerce to go along with nine rebounds, six assists and two steals. He was also an efficient 16-17 at the free throw line for the week. Antijuan Ball, West Texas A&M University, earned his sixth double-double of the season and 14th of his

career on Senior Day on Saturday, leading the Buffs to a 96-86 victory over rival Eastern New Mexico. Ball would score 17 points on the day and reject five shots to go along with 12 boards, including six on the defensive end, an assist and a steal.

WOMEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Jazzmine Robinson, Cameron University, led the Aggies with 27 points and 40.9 percent shooting from the field at Midwestern State. The game was her second highest scoring effort of the season and Robinson's 12th 20 point game of the year. Robinson went 9-10 at the charity stripe and added a team high eight rebounds. At the end of the regular season, Robinson has averaged 18.1 points and 7.9 rebounds per game.

Diamalises Rivera, Angelo State University, scored 22 points and grabbed a career-high 11 rebounds in a 63-56 win over Texas A&M-Kingsville. It is the junior's first double-double of the season. She hit 10-of-16 (62.5-percent) from the field and grabbed five offensive rebounds. Rivera helped the Belles score 36 points in the paint and hold TAMUK to just six points. It is the Belles third win in their last five games.

Sarah Stinnett, Eastern New Mexico University, poured in 22 points at fourth-ranked West Texas A&M and shot 50 percent from the floor. She also dished out four assists, with just two turnovers. Stinnet's performance marked the first time a Zia scored 20 points against the Lady Buffs, since January 23, 2013.

Chontiquah White, West Texas A&M University, scored 21 points in the regular season finale in which WT won its 15th-straight game for the seventh-longest winning streak in school history. White went 7 of 10 from the field and a perfect 7 of 7 from the line. She moved within two rebounds of tying the school-record of 874 for career rebounding. She also moved into sixth-place all-time in career scoring with 1,612 points. White tallied her 12th game of over 20 points this season.

Deja Pointer, Texas Woman's University, came off the bench and scored a career-high 18 points to help the Pioneers to a 63-53 road win at Texas A&M-Commerce in the Pioneers' final regular season game and secure a fifth seed in the LSC Championship Tournament. Pointer's game-high point total came by shooting 3-for-7 from the floor and 11-for-14 from the free-throw line. She also led the game with four steals. With TWU trailing by two points right before the half, Pointer scored four straight points to give the Pioneers the lead at the break. After the Loins regained the lead early in the second half, Pointer again scored seven of the next nine points to put TWU up for good. She also knocked down 5 of 6 free throws in the final minute to seal the win.

Kathy Thomas, Tarleton State University, turned in a great offensive week to lead Tarleton State to a pair of wins and the No. 4 seed in the LSC Championship Tournament in Allen. Thomas led the way with 23 points, including 16 in the highest-scoring half of the season, in Tarleton's rout of Texas A&M-Commerce Sunday night. For the week, she was 9-15 from the floor, including 6-9 from downtown, and a perfect 5-5 at the free throw line. She also added six assists for the week as she led the Tarleton offense to 91.0 points per game in two games.

Ikpeaku Iwobi, Tarleton State University, led the way defensively for Tarleton last week with an average of 7.0 rebounds per game with a team-high 14 total boards, including 10 on the defensive end. Iwobi also had two steals and averaged 6.5 points per game. She anchored the TexAnn defense that held opponents to .363 shooting from the floor and 57.5 points per game.

Tori Tucker, Eastern New Mexico University, registered the fifth double double of her career, with 19 points and 10 rebounds at fourth-ranked West Texas A&M. Her 10 rebounds accounted for nearly half of Eastern's 22 caroms and 13 of her points came in the second half.

Kenesha Saygo, Texas Woman's University, scored 14 points and cleared a team-high eight rebounds to help the Pioneers to a 63-53 road win at Texas A&M-Commerce in the Pioneers' final regular season game and secure the fifth seed in LSC Championship Tournament. Led by Saygo, TWU held the Lions to 30.2 percent shooting including 25.0 percent in the second half. On the season she leads the team in scoring with 11.3 ppg and second in steals with 30. Saygo is also averaging 4.5 rebounds and has a 80.7 free-throw shooting percentage.

Ariel Robertson, West Texas A&M University, closed the regular season with 18 points on a perfect 7 of 7 from the field and 4 of 6 from the line against Eastern New Mexico for the Lady Buffs' 15th-straight win. Robertson had three offensive rebounds, along with a team-high four defensive boards. Her 18 points were a season-high and 14th time in double figures this season. The seven rebounds marked the fourth time this season she has led the team in rebounding.

McNeal notched a season-high five steals against the Aggies... Junior guard Hershell Grant scored in double figures for the fourth straight Sunday against Cameron going for 11 points. The Mustangs take on 7th-seeded Eastern New Mexico Wednesday at the Allen Event Center with a noon tipoff time... MSU improved to 21-0 in games in which it scores more than 60 points... Sixteen of Midwestern's 21 wins this season have been by at least 10 points... Senior forward Shambreka Jones notched her second double-double of the season notching career highs with 18 points and 18 rebounds against Cameron... Jones swatted at least four shots for the fifth time this season to move past Jel-Ani Armstrong (75 blocks/2002-04) into fourth on MSU's all-time blocked shots list with 78... Jones became just the second player in MSU program history to swat 50 shots in a season and needs five more to match Rulinda Vogtsberger's total of 56 set during the 1979-80 season... Senior forward Andrea Carter splashed in a season-high 20 points and grabbed seven rebounds Sunday against Cameron... Carter became the second player in program history to amass 1,000 career rebounds and is 11 behind all-time leader Alice Edwards, who grabbed 1,014 from 1981-85... Carter's 1,433 points are 19 shy of former MSU great Lindy Lombard, who stands fifth with 1,452 from 1998-02... Senior guard Lisa Hampton drilled four 3-pointers to finish with 16 points Sunday against Cameron and now stands second on MSU's all-time single season list with 66 and needs eight more to match Lynn Buckmaster, who had 74 made triples in 1993-94... Hampton tops MSU's all-time 3-point makes list with 149... Senior guard Shatoia Gober matched a career high with nine assists originally set on March 1, 2014 -- exactly a year earlier -- at Cameron... Senior guard Dianna Jones finished with nine points, six assists and five rebounds Sunday against Cameron... Jones notched her 100th assist of the season which marked the second consecutive season she passed the century mark in helpers...



TWU closed out the regular season with a 63-53 win on the road at Texas A&M-Commerce to improve its record to 15-12 on the season and 8-8 in the Lone Star Conference. With the win the Pioneers secured a fifth seed in the LSC Championship Tournament. Sophomore Deja Pointer came off the bench and scored a career-high and a game-high 18 points by shooting 3-for-7 from the floor and 11-for-14 from the free-throw line. She also led the game with four steals. Sophomore Kenesha Saygo also reached double digits in scoring with 14 points and added a team-best eight rebounds. Sophomore Erin Maxwell also cleared eight rebounds for the Pioneers. On the season Saygo leads the team in scoring with 11.3 points while sophomore Emily Spector is the leader in rebounding with 6.0 rpg. Senior Ashley Salazar had a team-best 55 steals and Maxwell has blocked 44 shots. Senior Ria Pateraki has shot 47.4 percent from the floor to lead the Pioneers while Salazar (81.6) and Saygo (80.7) are shooting over 80.0 percent from the free-throw line. Senior Toree Mason is the biggest threat from outside with a 34.4 three-point shooting percentage. The Pioneers have advanced to their 12th overall LSC Championship Tournament and fifth in the last six year.

West Texas A&M

The 24-2 Lady Buffs matched their regular season record from a year ago and finished 15-1 in Lone Star Conference play for the second consecutive season... WT has won 36 of 38 regular season conference games over the last three years...The Lady Buffs have won 15-straight games which is tied for second nationally and is the seventh-longest winning streak in school history...WT senior Chontiquah White moved into sixth all-time in scoring with 1,612 career points and is within two rebounds of tying the schoolrecord of 874 career rebounds...WT head coach Mark Kellogg improved to 56-5 at WT in two seasons... 
