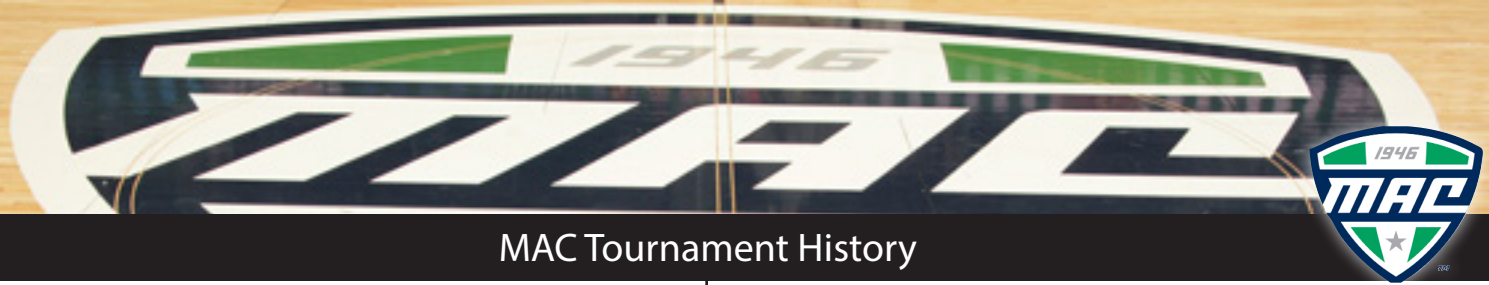

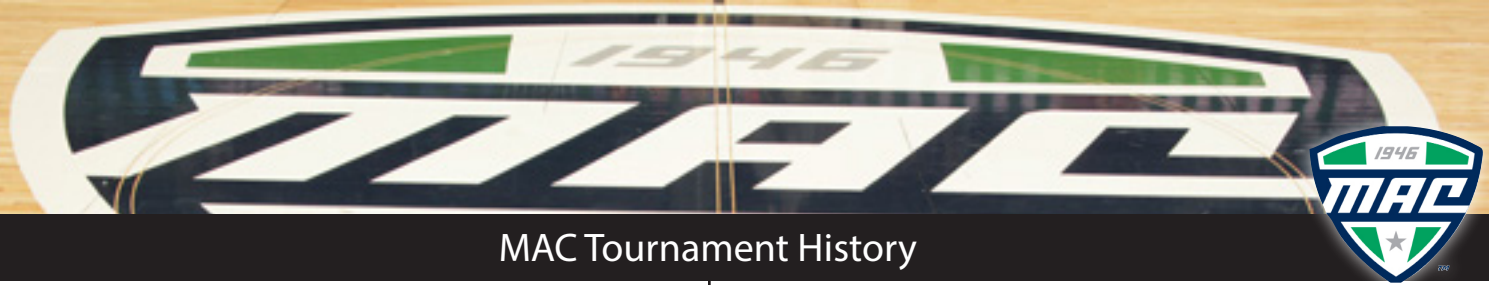

Ohio won the 1993 Preseason NIT, the only MAC team in history to capture the event. The Bobcats defeated Ohio State (78-67) in Columbus, Virginia (94-83) in Charlottesville, and both George Washington (82-76) and New Mexico State, 84-80 in overtime, at Madison Square Garden. The four wins propelled Ohio to a No. 14 national ranking and helped fuel the national prominence of forward Gary Trent, who declared early for the NBA Draft at the end of the season. Trent was named Tournament MVP for his 103 points in four games, an average of 25.8 ppg. He peaked with 33 points in the title game vs. the Aggies.

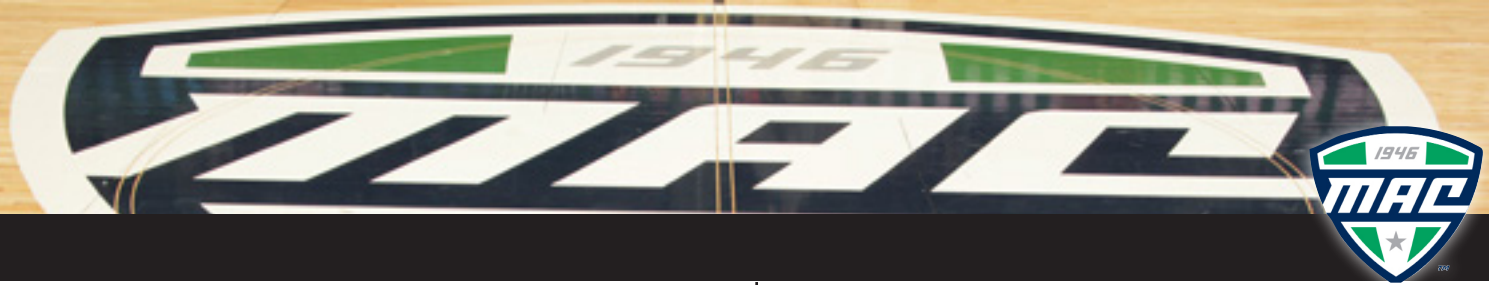
