MAC WEEKLY NOTES

- Western Michigan senior cornerback Darius Phillips tied the all-time FBS record with his fifth career interception return for a touchdown in a 48-20 win over Kent State on Nov. 8. Phillips' 43-yard interception return for a touchdown was his fifth interception return for a score and he already owns the FBS mark with 12 returns for touchdowns (5 kickoff returns; 5 interception returns; 1 punt return; 1 fumble recovery) during his collegiate career in Kalamazoo.
- Northern Illinois safety Jackson Abresch tied the NCAA record for most touchdowns scored on blocked punts in a game when he scored two touchdowns on blocked punt returns in a 63-17 win over Ball State on Nov. 9. Abresch is just the third player all-time to score two touchdowns in a game off of blocked punts, and the first to do so since Nov. 1, 1997 (by Frank Staine-Pyne, Air Force). With NIU leading in the first quarter, Abresch picked up a Trayshon Foster block at the 13-yard line and ran it in for his first career score. Abresch then scored the final score of the game when he fell on Jauan Wesley's block for his second score. Western Michigan senior running back Jarvion Franklin totaled 191 yards rushing with one touchdown on 22 carries in a 48-20 win over Kent State on Nov. 8. Franklin's 191-yard game was his sixth-straight over 100 yards, pushing him over the 1,000-yard mark (1,061) for the season. Franklin moved into fifth place on the MAC's all-time career rushing yards list with 4,700 yards and tied for fifth on the all-time career rushing touchdowns list with 51 career rushing touchdowns. Franklin also moved into second all-time at Western Michigan for career allpurpose yards with 5,370, passing Corey Davis with 5,212.
- Ohio posted a 38-10 win over Toledo on Nov. 8 as senior linebacker Quentin **Poling** led the defense with 12 tackles, three sacks and a fumble recovery. Poling became the all-time leader at Ohio in tackles for loss (44.0) during his career.
- Buffalo posted its fourth win of the year as quarterback **Tyree Jackson** threw for a career-high 406 yards and three touchdowns. His favorite target was wide receiver Anthony Johnson, who finished with eight catches for 160 yards and two touchdowns. It was his fourth 100-yard receiving game of the season and put him over him 1,000 yards on the year. Johnson became just the fourth Buffalo receiver in school history with 1,000 receiving yards in a single season, joining Drew Haddad, Naaman Roosevelt and Alex Neutz, who all did it twice.
- Eastern Michigan senior quarterback Brogan Roback threw two touchdowns in a 42-30 loss at Central Michigan on Nov. 9. Roback's two touchdown passes gave him 54 for his career to surpass Charlie Batch for the all-time school record. • Toledo sophomore wide receiver **Diontae Johnson** had nine receptions for 144 yards and one touchdown in a 38-10 loss at Ohio on Nov. 8. This marked his fifth 100-yard receiving performance of the season and he became the 11th player in program history to eclipse the 1,000-yard receiving plateau with 1,003 receiving yards this season. Johnson also moved into a tie for sixth place all-time at Toledo in single-season receiving touchdowns with nine scores in 2017.

MAC Storylines

- The top two teams in the East Division meet for the game of the week. Ohio (5-1) can clinch the MAC East title with a win at Akron (4-2) on Tuesday, Nov. 14 at 7:00 pm ET (ESPN2). However, Akron can clinch with a win over Ohio and Kent State on Nov. 24.
- The MAC has five teams bowl eligible -- Toledo (8-2), Ohio (8-2), NIU (7-3), Central Michigan (6-4) and Western Michigan (6-4). Central Michigan defeated Eastern Michigan 42-30 on Nov. 8 to become bowl eligible for the 10th time in the last 12 years. The same night, Western Michigan defeated Kent State 48-20 to become bowl eligible for a program record fourth straight season. Akron (5-5) needs only one more victory to become bowl eligible.
- Week 12 features six Conference games as midweek football continues. On Tuesday, Nov. 14 will feature Ohio at Akron at 7:00 pm ET (ESPN2) and Central Michigan at Kent State at 7:00 pm ET (ESPNU). Three games are set for Wednesday, Nov. 15 with Western Michigan at NIU at 7:00 pm ET/6:00 pm CT (ESPN2), Toledo at Bowling Green at 8:00 pm ET (ESPNU) and Eastern Michigan at Miami at 7:00 pm ET (CBS Sports Network). The football week ends on Thursday, Nov. 16 with Buffalo at Ball State at 7:00 pm ET (CBS Sports Network).

TOLEDO AND BOWLING GREEN 'BATTLE OF I-75' TROPHY

The 'Battle of I-75' will take place for the 82nd time when Toledo travels to Bowling Green on Wednesday, Nov. 15 at 8:00 p.m. ET on ESPNU. The Rockets (8-2, 5-1 MAC) are coming off a 38-10 defeat at Ohio on Nov. 8, while Bowling Green had a 38-28 loss at Buffalo on Nov. 7. Toledo is still in control of its own destiny in its bid for the West Division title. Wins over Bowling Green and Western Michigan on Nov. 24 would send Toledo to the Marathon MAC Football Championship Game for the first time since 2004.

Toledo has had the upper hand lately in the Battle of I-75, but Bowling Green (2-8, 2-4 MAC) still leads the all-time series, 39-38-4. Toledo has won seven straight games in the series, its last defeat coming at Bowling Green in 2009, the first year that second-year Toledo head coach Jason Candle began his career as an assistant with the Rockets.

MIDWEEK MACTION FEATURED IN WEEK 11

Midweek MACtion continues as the Conference will showcase midweek games on national television this week Tuesday, Nov. 14, Wednesday, Nov. 15 and Thursday, Nov. 16. The MAC began midweek football in 1999 and this season marks the 19th year of playing during the week. This season the MAC will have 22 games nationally televised on Tuesday, Wednesday or a Thursday during the last five weeks of the regular season.

MAC TRIO LEADS THE NATION IN QUARTERBACK SACKS

For the last month, a trio of MAC defensive ends continue to lead the nation in defensive sacks. Ball State senior **Anthony Winbush** with 10.5 sacks (1.17 per game), and Northern Illinois sophomore Sutton Smith with 10.5 sacks (1.05 per game) are tied for first in the nation in total sacks. Central Michigan senior **Joe Ostman** ranks second in the country with 10 sacks (1.25 per game). Also, Eastern Michigan sophomore Maxx Crosby is tied for fifth in the country with 8.0 sacks (0.80 per game).

In addition, NIU's Smith leads the nation with 22 tackles for loss for an average of 2.2 per game. Central Michigan's Ostman ranks fifth in the country with 13.5 tackles for loss for 1.7 per game.

TOLEDO WOODSIDE SEMIFINALIST FOR SENIOR CLASS AWARD

Toledo senior quarterback Logan Woodside was named one of 10 national finalists for the NCAA Senior CLASS Award. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I FBS senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition.

Woodside, who graduated last spring with a 3.42 GPA in marketing and is currently pursuing his master's degree in recreation administration, threw for 263 yards and one touchdown in a 38-10 loss at Ohio on Nov. 8. Woodside completed 24-of-35 passes as the Frankfort, Ky., native has set the school record with 9,551 career passing yards, surpassing previous record-holder Bruce Gradkowski (9,225 from 2002-05).

Woodside is also a finalist for the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, which honors the top quarterback from all divisions for accomplishments both on and off the field; the Maxwell Award, which is given to the nation's player of the year; the Davey O'Brien Award, which honors the nation's top quarterback; and the Manning Award, another honor given to the nation's top quarterback following the bowl season.

An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

MAC Players of the Week

East Division



Tyree Jackson, Offensive Player of the Week Buffalo, Sophomore, Quarterback

Buffalo sophomore quarterback Tyree Jackson (North Shores, Mich.) was 23-of-37 passing for a career-high 406 yards and three touchdowns in a 38-28 win over Bowling Green on Oct. 7. He had touchdown passes of 21, 69 and 37 yards. His 406 passing yards were the ninth most in school history for a single game and the fourth highest total in the Bulls' FBS era (since 1999).



Quentin Poling, Defensive Player of the Week; Ohio, Senior, Linebacker

Ohio senior linebacker Quentin Poling (Gomer, Ohio) led with 12 total tackles and five solo stops in a 38-10 win over West Division leader Toledo on Nov. 8. Poling recorded three sacks for 24-yards and had a fumble recovery. Poling ranks second in the MAC with 92 tackles this season, which leads the Bobcats and includes 40 solo stops.



Louie Zervos, Special Teams Player of Week; Ohio, Sophomore, Kicker

Ohio sophomore kicker Louie Zervos (Tarpon Spings, Fla.) connected on his only field goal attempt against Toledo on Nov. 8 draining a 44-yard attempt in a 38-10 win. Zervos also went 5-5 on PAT attempts. Zervos is 12-15 on field goals and 49-50 this season which ranks second in the MAC in scoring by a kicker. Zervos ranks 31st in the NCAA in scoring and 28th in total point scored.

Jarvion Franklin, Offensive Player of the Week Western Michigan, Senior, Running Back



Western Michigan senior running back Jarvion Franklin (Tinley Park, Ill.) totaled 191 yards rushing with one touchdown on 22 carries in the Broncos' win over Kent State last week. Franklin's 191yard game was his sixth-straight over 100 yards, pushing him over the 1,000-yard mark (1,061) for the year. He ripped off a career-long 72-yard touchdown run for a 21-14 lead.



Maxx Crosby, Defensive Player of the Week; Eastern Michigan, Sophomore, Defensive End

Eastern Michigan sophomore defensive end Maxx Crosby (Colleyville, Texas) finished with a careerhigh three sacks, including one that was stripped away and returned 14 yards for a touchdown on the opening play of the game, in a 42-30 loss at Central Michigan on Nov. 8. It was the first fumble returned for a score for Eastern Michigan since 2013.



Jackson Abresch, Special Teams Player of Week; Northern Illinois, Senior, Safety

Northern Illinois senior safety Jackson Abresch (Hartland, Wisc.) tied the NCAA record for most touchdowns scored on blocked punts in a game when he scored two touchdowns on blocked punt returns in a 63-17 win over Ball State on Nov. 9. Abresch is just the third player all-time to score two touchdowns in a game off of blocked punts, and the first to do so since Nov. 1, 1997.

OFFENSE

- Miami **RB** Kenny Young had a career high 198 all-purpose yards in a 24-14 win over Akron on Nov. 7. He finished with 100 yards rushing on 14 carries and added another nine catches for 98 yards receiving and one touchdown.
- Central Michigan **RB Jonathan Ward** had 186 all-purpose yards and scored twice in a 42-30 win over Eastern Michigan on Nov. 8. Ward scored on a career-long 79-yard run in the first quarter and on a 3-yard run in the third. He also caught a 27-yard pass.
- Ohio **RB Dorian Brown** rushed for a season-high 142 yards on 17 attempts, including a career-long 62-yarder, with two rushing touchdowns in a 38-10 win over Toledo on Nov. 8. Brown eclipsed 100-yards for just the second time this season. He also had three kickoff returns for 87 yards including a long of 33.
- Northern Illinois **QB Marcus Childers** threw a career high four touchdown passes, the most in a game by a NIU QB since Sept. 12, 2015, in a 63-17 win over Ball State on Nov. 9. He finished with 141 passing yards and no interceptions and also recorded a career-long 32-yard run in the game.
- Toledo **QB Logan Woodside** was 24-35 passing for 263 yards and one touchdown in a 38-10 loss at Ohio on Nov. 8.

DEFENSE

- Western Michigan **DB Darius Phillips** tied the all-time FBS record with his fifth career interception return for a touchdown in a 48-20 win over Kent State on Nov. 8. Already the FBS record holder for career runbacks, Phillips added to his overall total, as the 43-yard interception return marked his 12th career runback. He also forced a fumble, had two tackles, one pass break up and recorded 62 yards on three kickoff returns.
- Buffalo **DL** Chuck Harris had five solo tackles, including a careerhigh three tackles for loss, in a 38-28 win over Bowling Green on Nov. 7. He also forced two fumbles that were both recovered by the Bulls. His second forced fumble came off a sack late in the game, allowing Buffalo to ice the game.
- Miami **DL Doug Costin** had a career high six tackles and three sacks in a 24-14 win over Akron on Nov. 7. Costin added two quarterback hurries as the RedHawks held the Zips to just 55 yards rushing on 30 attempts and 273 total yards.
- NIU **LB Jawuan Johnson** made six tackles, a half a tackle for loss and one interception in a 63-17 win over Ball State on Nov. 9. The Huskies held Ball State to 83 yards.
- Central Michigan **DB Sean Bunting** had two interceptions, six tackles and one pass defensed in a 42-30 win over Eastern Michigan on Nov. 8.
- Toledo **DE Olasunkanmi Adeniyi** had 10 tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss, one forced fumble and one recovered fumble in a 38-10 loss at Ohio on Nov. 8.

- Toledo **KR Diontae Johnson** had four kickoff returns for 123 yards, including a long of 50 yards, in a 38-10 loss at Ohio on Nov. 8.
- Western Michigan **P Derrick Mitchell** pinned four of seven punts inside the 20-yard line in a 38-20 win over Kent State on Nov. 8. He boomed one for 61 yards and totaled 368 yards, with an average of 45.4.
- Eastern Michigan **P Jake Julien** punted four times for 204 yards, averaging 51 yards per punt, in a 42-30 loss at Central Michigan on Nov. 8. Three of Julien's four punts went for more than 50 yards, with his longest traveling a career-high 63 yards.

Mid-American Conference Football

MAC Week Eleven Quick Recaps:

Ohio 38, Toledo 10 -- Behind a stifling defense, which saw the Rockets just total 316 yards, the Ohio football team knocked off West Division leader Toledo 38-10 on Nov. 8 at Peden Stadium. The Bobcats improved to 8-2 and 5-1 in MAC play. The loss marked the first loss in conference play for Toledo.

Ohio's defense held Toledo quarterback Logan Woodside to just 263 yards and two touchdowns, while the Rockets running game struggled with just 53 yards. Senior linebacker Quentin Poling finished with 12 tackles and three tackles for loss, setting the program career record with 44.0 tackles for loss. As a team, Ohio played its most well-rounded game of the year. Despite three turnovers, the offense totaled 532 yards, led by sophomore quarterback Nathan Rourke 139 passing yards and two total touchdowns. He finished rushing for 115 yards and was 7 of 15 passing.

Central Michigan 42, Eastern Michigan 30 -- Central Michigan defensive back Amari Coleman's interception returned 34 yards for a touchdown with 48 seconds left in regulation secured a 42-30 win over Eastern Michigan on Nov. 8 at Kelly/Shorts Stadium. Central Michigan running back Jonathan Ward ran for a careerhigh 159 yards and scored two touchdowns. The win lifted Central Michigan to 6-4, 4-2 in the MAC, making it bowl eligible for the 10th time in the last 12 seasons. Eastern Michigan falls to 3-7 overall, 1-5 in the MAC.

It was the second-consecutive big game for Ward, who also caught one pass for 27 yards to finish with 186 yards on 20 touches from scrimmage. Last week, he sparked the offense to a 35-28 win over Western Michigan with 213 all-purpose yards. Chippewa quarterback Shane Morris was 11-18 passing for 155 yards and three touchdowns. Corey Willis led with six receptions for 71 yards and two touchdowns.

Western Michigan 48, Kent State 20 -- Western Michigan scored three defensive touchdowns to become bowl eligible for a program record fourth straight year in a 48-20 win over Kent State on Nov. 8 at Waldo Stadium. Western Michigan forced four turnovers scoring 21 points off those turnovers with two interception returns and a fumble recovery and had 11 tackles for loss and three sacks.

Senior linebacker Robert Spillane corralled his third career interception and returned it 35 yards for a touchdown on Kent State's first series of the game to score the first defensive touchdown of the night. Senior Darius Phillips recorded his fifth career interception return for a touchdown late in the second quarter to tie the FBS record, returning it 43 yards. Phillips now has 12 runbacks for touchdowns and is the FBS record holder. This season, Phillips has four runbacks in the form of two kick returns, an interception and a fumble recovery.

NIU 63, Ball State 17 -- Northern Illinois scored 63 points, including two touchdowns by senior Jackson Abresch on a pair of blocked punt returns, and the Huskie defense broke the school record for tackles for loss in a game with 18 as NIU retained the Bronze Stalk Trophy for the ninth consecutive year with a 63-17 victory over Ball State on Nov. 9 at Huskie Stadium.

The Huskies improved to 7-3 overall, 5-1 in the MAC while Ball State fell to 2-8, 0-6. NIU's 63 points were the most since Nov. 2, 2013 when NIU totaled 63 points in a 63-19 victory over UMass.

The Huskie defense held Ball State to 83 rushing yards and set the school-record with 18 tackles for loss compiled by 14 different players, including seven quarterback sacks by seven different Huskies. NIU's total is the highest in a single game by an FBS team this year. Defensive end Sutton Smith's two TFLs gave him the individual school record for tackles for loss in a season with 22, breaking the tie with Scott Kellar (1984).

MAC Week Eleven Quick Recaps:

Miami 24, Akron 14 -- Miami running back Kenny Young's versatile display helped lift the Miami football team to a crucial 24-14 victory over Akron at Yager Stadium on Nov. 7. Young rushed for 100 yards and gained 98 more along with a touchdown through the air as Miami (4-6, 3-3 MAC) moved to .500 in conference play and kept its bowl hopes alive.

Young finished with 198 total yards on 23 touches, falling just two yards shy of becoming the first Miami player with 100 yards rushing and receiving in the same game. Ragland ended 19-32 passing with three touchdowns and two interceptions. Miami held Akron to just 273 yards of offense while gaining 420 of its own.

Buffalo 38, Bowling Green 28 -- Buffalo quarterback Tyree Jackson threw for a career-high 406 yards and three touchdowns to lead a 38-28 win over Bowling Green at UB Stadium on Nov. 7. The Bulls rolled up 582 yards of total offense.

It was another big game for Jackson's favorite target, Anthony Johnson, who finished with eight catches for 160 yards and two touchdowns. It was his fourth 100-yard receiving game of the season and put him over him 1,000 yards on the year. He became just the fourth Buffalo receiver in school history with 1,000 receiving yards in a single season, joining Drew Haddad, Naaman Roosevelt and Alex Neutz, who all did it twice.

Solich continues to rise up the MAC career head coaching win list with 96 wins, which ranks third most in MAC history.
