LOOKING BACK

Ohio is coming off of a 2018 season in which it went 9-4 (6-2 MAC), finishing second in the conference's East Division. The Bobcats earned at least nine wins for the sixth time in 15 years under **Frank Solich**. Ohio capped off the year by shutting out San Diego State, 27-0, in the 2018 DXL Frisco Bowl in Frisco, Texas. The Bobcats accounted for the MAC's lone bowl win in 2018 and earned the distinction of being the conference's first team to pitch a shutout in a bowl win.

BOWLING FOR WINS

Ohio is tied with Toledo for the most bowl wins (4) among MAC programs since **Frank Solich** took over as head coach in 2005. With its win over San Diego State in the 2018 DXL Frisco Bowl that followed a 41-6 triumph over UAB in the 2017 Bahamas Bowl, Ohio recorded back-to-back bowl wins for the second time in program history. In 2011, the Bobcats edged Utah State, 24-23, in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl to pick up their first bowl victory in program history, then rolled to a 45-14 triumph over ULM in the 2012 Advocare V100 Independence Bowl.

HOME IS WHERE THE WINS ARE

The Bobcats went a perfect 6-0 at Peden Stadium in 2018, marking the first time Ohio has won all of its home games since 1968. Ohio went unbeaten at home for the first time since 1988, when the Bobcats finished their home schedule with a record of 3-0-1. Ohio has won its last nine home games dating back to 2017.

LIKE A FINE WINE

Frank Solich enters the 2019 season as the dean of MAC head coaches as he begins his 15th year leading the Bobcats. He is tied with Oklahoma State's Mike Gundy for fourth among active NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) head coaches in terms of longest tenure with their current school. Only Iowa's Kirk Ferentz (21 years), TCU's Gary Patterson (20 years) and Utah's Kyle Whittingham (16 years) have served as head coach at their respective institutions longer. Prior to arriving in Athens, Solich spent six years as head coach at his alma mater, Nebraska. Solich's 21 years of experience tie him with Ferentz (21 years) for the third-most among active NCAA FBS head coaches, ranking behind only North Carolina's Mack Brown (30 years) and Alabama's Nick Saban.

With the retirement of longtime Kansas State head coach Bill Snyder following the 2018 season, Solich enters the 2019 campaign as the leader in life experience among NCAA FBS head coaches at 74 years old.

CHASING WINS WITH THE GOAT

Frank Solich owns a career coaching record of 164-94 heading into the 2019 season. His 164 wins rank as the fourth most among active NCAA FBS head coaches, trailing only North Carolina's Mack Brown (238), Alabama's Nick Saban (238) and TCU's Gary Patterson (167).

Solich is 106-75 during his tenure as head coach of the Bobcats, ranking him third in program history behind Don Peden (121; 1924-46) and Bill Hess (108; 1958-77). With five more wins, Solich will pass Herb Deromedi (110, Central Michigan, 1978-93) for the most by a MAC head coach. Ohio has gone 70-42 in conference play since Solich's arrival in Athens. His 70 MAC wins rank second to Deromedi's 90.-

CONTINUITY AT OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR

Associate head coach/offensive coordinator/running backs coach **Tim Albin** is the longest tenured member of **Frank Solich's** coaching staff, serving under Solich for the last 15 years in Athens.

Nine of the 10 highest-scoring seasons in terms of points scored in program history have been achieved during Albin's time as OC, with the 2017 team setting a new record with 508 points and the '18 squad promptly breaking that record by scoring 521. The 2018 team also set program records in points per game with 40.1 (surpassing the 2017

team's mark of 39.1) and average yards per game of total offense with 466.8. All 10 of Ohio's 10 most productive seasons in terms of yards gained have come under Albin's watch, with the 2018 team ranking second in program history with 6,068 yards.

In addition to Albin, three of Ohio's four other offensive assistant coaches have coached under Solich for at least seven years -- wide receivers coach **Dwayne Dixon** (13 years), tight ends/special teams coach **Brian Haines** (12 years) and quarterbacks coach **Scott Isphording** (7 years). The only new addition to the offensive staff is offensive line coach **Allen Rudolph**, who begins his first year at Ohio after spending the previous three years in the same role at Arkansas State.

CHANGE ON DEFENSE

For the first time since 2005, Ohio will have a new defensive coordinator. Longtime associate head coach/defensive coordinator/safeties coach **Jimmy Burrow** retired following the 2018 campaign after 14 seasons serving at Ohio under **Frank Solich**. During Burrow's tenure at Ohio, the Bobcats tallied 41 All-MAC selections on the defensive side of the ball. The Ohio defense has consistently ranked among the best in the MAC in scoring defense and turnovers and led the nation in turnovers in both 2009 and '18.

Ron Collins, who had served as linebackers coach for the previous eight seasons, was promoted to associate head coach/defensive coordinator/safeties coach following Burrow's departure. Under the tutelage of Collins, the linebackers have helped the Ohio defense rank among the best in the conference

at stopping the run. He has previous defensive coordinator experience, having served in the role at Washington University in St. Louis (1988-2000), Boise State (2001-05) and Colorado (2006-10). He has served as Ohio's co-defensive coordinator since 2017.

Nate Faanes was named Ohio's new linebackers coach in March. Faanes spent the previous three seasons as a graduate assistant. He assisted Collins in coaching Ohio's linebackers the last two seasons after working with the running backs in 2016.

Pete Germano, who begins the third year of his second stint on Solich's staff, was promoted to co-defensive coordinator/defensive ends coach. Prior to his return to Athens, he spent five years as the defensive line coach at Fresno State after spending the previous 11 on the Ohio staff.

Ohio returns cornerbacks coach **De'Angelo Smith** for a third season and defensive tackles coach **Tremayne Scott** for a second season in 2019.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

QUARTERBACK

- Air Canada is back for his senior season. Read more about him on pages 14-17.
- Backing up senior QB **Nathan Rourke** once again will be redshirt freshmen **Joe Mischler** and **Naylan Yates**. New to the quarterback room this year is Nathan's younger brother, Kurtis Rourke, who begins his freshman season at Ohio.

RUNNING BACK

- Ohio lost its top two running

backs in 2018 to graduation in **A.J. Ouellette** and **Maleek Irons**. Ouellette, an All-MAC First Team pick last season, departed Athens ranked third in program history in career rushing yards (3,829) and fourth in career rushing touchdowns (32). Irons ranked second on the team with a career-high 831 rushing yards in 2018. He was selected with the 22nd overall pick in the third round of the 2019 Canadian Football League Draft by the Hamilton Tiger-Cats, becoming the first Bobcat to be picked in the 68-year history of the CFL Draft.

• **Julian Ross** is Ohio's top returning running back. He played in four games in 2018 before redshirting. Ross played in eight games as a true freshman in 2017, running for 250 yards and three touchdowns on 60 carries.

• Also back for 2018 are redshirt sophomore **Jake Neatherton**, redshirt freshman **O'Shaan Allison** and redshirt junior **Ja'Vahri Portis**. Neatherton picked up 81 yards on 19 carries last year while Allison saw action in one game before redshirting.

• Newcomers at running back include junior **De'Montre Tuggle** and freshman **Walter Wilbon III**.

WIDE RECEIVER

• Ohio will be forced to replace one of its most prolific wide receivers in program history in 2018 All-MAC First Team selection **Papi White**. White finished his career as the Bobcats' all-time leader in receiving yards (2,620) and ranks second in career touchdown receptions (19) and fourth in career receptions (161). Also gone is **Andrew Meyer**, who ranked second on the team in receptions (36), receiving yards (505) and touchdown receptions (5) in 2018.

• Redshirt junior **Cameron Odom** is Ohio's top returning receiver. He

ranked third on the team with 30 receptions and 418 receiving yards a year ago. **Isiah Cox** returns as a redshirt sophomore in 2018 after ranking third on the team with three touchdown receptions in 2018. **Jerome Buckner** scored his first career touchdown as a true freshman last year.

TIGHT END

- The Bobcats lost their top tight end in 2018 to graduation, as Connor Brown led the position in receptions (8) and receiving yards (84).
- The twin tight ends from Athens, redshirt sophomores **Adam Luehrman** and **Ryan Luehrman**, return for their redshirt junior seasons.

OFFENSIVE LINE

Ohio loses three All-MAC selections from last year's offensive line in left tackle **Joe Lowery**, left guard **Joe Anderson** and right guard **Durrell Wood**.

- Despite those losses, Ohio still returns a fair amount of experience on the line. **Steven Hayes** made four starts at center a year. **Brett Kitrell** started nine games at center and will move to left guard in 2019. **Austen Pleasants** started every game at right tackle last year and will move over to left tackle this season. **Hagen Meservy** is back for his junior season and will start at right guard. He started 11 games as a freshman in 2017. Redshirt senior **Marques Grimes** is slated to start at right tackle in 2019.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

DEFENSIVE ENDS

- Ohio brings back both its starting defensive ends in 2019, with redshirt junior **Will Evans** on the left side and redshirt sophomore

Amos Ogun-Semore on the right. Evans collected 29 total tackles, two sacks and two fumble recoveries while Ogun-Semore tallied 34 total tackles and ranked third on the squad with three sacks. Redshirt junior Austin Conrad and redshirt senior Sam McKnight are back in reserve roles.

DEFENSIVE TACKLES

- The Bobcats lose starting defensive tackle **Kent Berger**, but redshirt senior **Cole Baker** will assume the role after backing him up last year. Redshirt senior **Brian Arp** moves into the starting nose tackle spot, replacing **Andrew Payne**.

LINEBACKERS

- Redshirt junior **Dylan Conner** made seven starts at the SAM linebacker spot, splitting starts with **Tyler Gullett**, who graduated. Conner finished the year with 36 total tackles while Gullett finished fifth on the team with 50. Redshirt junior **Jared Dorsa** started all but one game at MIKE, ranking third on the squad with 59 total tackles and tying for the team lead with two interceptions. His backup, redshirt senior **Austin Clack**, also returns in 2019. Ohio will have to replace leading tackler **Evan Croutch** (90 total tackles, team-high 5.5 sacks, two interceptions) at WILL. Senior **Eric Popp**, who collected 20 total tackles as a reserve a year ago, will take over as starter.

CORNERBACKS

- Ohio returns two experienced starting corners, with junior **Jamal Hudson** on the left side and junior **Marlin Brooks** on the right. Brooks finished last season with 41 total tackles, a team-high three forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries and an interception. Hudson was

right behind him with 39 total tackles and recorded one interception. The Bobcats have a great deal of depth at corner, with redshirt sophomores **Tariq Drake**, **Alvin Floyd**, **De'Vante Mitchell**, **Ilyaas Motley** and **Xavier Motley** all back.

SAFETIES

- **Javon Hagan** is back for his redshirt senior season as the starting free safety. See his full bio on pages 18-20. Redshirt junior **Jarren Hampton** takes over as the starting strong safety, taking over for **Kylan Nelson**, who graduated after tying for third on the team with 59 tackles, tying for the team lead with two interceptions and forcing a fumble. Hampton tied for the team lead with two interceptions and collected 25 total tackles a year ago.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- **Louie Zervos** is back for his redshirt senior season as placekicker. He enters the year ranked first in program history with 164 career extra points made, second with 57 career field goals made and second with 335 career points scored. Frank Solich enters his 15th season as the head coach of the Ohio football program in 2019.

Solich has turned the Bobcats into one of the Mid-American Conference's premier programs since his arrival in Athens in 2005.

Ohio is 106-75 during the Solich era. His 106 victories rank him third in program history behind Don Peden (121; 1924-46) and Bill Hess (108; 1958-77). With five more wins, Solich will pass Herb Deromedi (110, Central Michigan, 1978-93) for the most by a MAC head coach. Ohio has gone 70-42 in conference play since Solich's arrival in Athens. His 70 MAC wins rank second to Deromedi's 90.

Solich enters the 2019 season as the dean of MAC head coaches. He is tied with Oklahoma State's Mike Gundy for fourth among active NCAA FBS head coaches in terms of longest tenure with their current school. Only Iowa's Kirk Ferentz (21 years), TCU's Gary Patterson (20 years) and Utah's Kyle Whittingham (16 years) have served as head coach at their respective institutions longer. Prior to arriving in Athens, Solich spent six years as head coach at his alma mater, Nebraska. Solich's 21 years of experience tie him with Ferentz (21 years) for the third-most among active NCAA FBS head coaches, ranking behind North Carolina's Mack Brown (30 years) and Alabama's Nick Saban.

Solich owns a career coaching record of 164-94 heading into the 2019 season. His 164 wins rank as the fourth most among active NCAA FBS head coaches, trailing only North Carolina's Mack Brown (238), Alabama's Nick Saban (238) and TCU's Gary Patterson (167).

Prior to Solich's arrival in Athens, the Bobcats had enjoyed only two winning seasons in the previous 22 years. The tone was set for his tenure at Ohio in his first home game as head coach of the Bobcats on Sept. 9, 2005 -- a 16-10 upset of Pitt in overtime on national television. The following year, Solich guided the Bobcats to a nine-win season, a MAC East Division title and the program's first bowl game appearance since 1968.

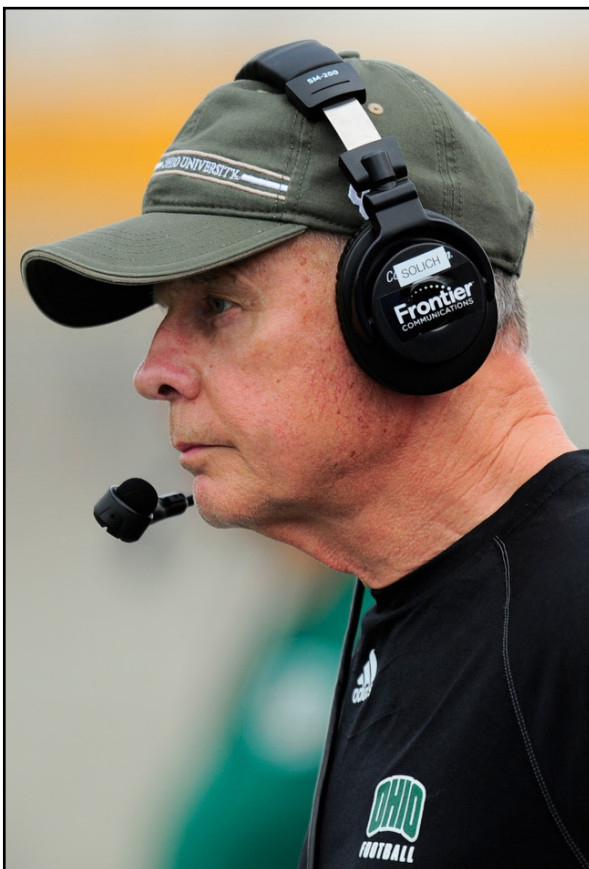

Solich guided the Bobcats to a nine-win season, a MAC East Division title and the program's first bowl game appearance since 1968.

The 2009 season kicked off a run of 10-straight non-losing seasons that has included nine winning campaigns and six years with at least nine victories -- including a 10-win campaign in 2011. The 2012 season began with the Bobcats earning a signature win at Penn State, upsetting the Nittany Lions by a score of 24-14. Ohio captured division titles in 2009, '11. Solich has led the Bobcats to the first four bowl victories in program history, with back-to-back wins in the 2011 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl and '12 Independence Bowl and back-to-back victories in the 2017 Bahamas Bowl and '18 DXL Frisco Bowl.

Solich has coached four All-America honorees and nine NFL Draft Picks during his time at Ohio. The Bobcats have tallied 103 All-MAC selections over the last 15 years.

Solich arrived in Athens after six seasons as the

head coach at the University of Nebraska. Solich spent nearly 30 years as part of the Nebraska program as a player, assistant coach and head coach. A Big 12 Coach of the Year in 1999 and 2001, Solich produced nine-win seasons in five of his six years as head coach of the Huskers. In 1999, 2000 and 2001, he generated 12, 10 and 11 win seasons, respectively. He also generated six-consecutive bowl appearances including a 2001 run at the national championship against Miami in the Rose Bowl.

Coming from his native Cleveland to Lincoln back in 1962, he was recruited to play fullback for the Cornhuskers as a part of Bob Devaney's first class of freshmen. During his time in the Husker program, Nebraska went 9-2, 10-1, 9-2 and 10-1. He earned All-Big Eight honors in 1965 and was the first Husker to rush for 200 yards in a game. His place in the Nebraska tradition was formalized with his induction into the Nebraska Football Hall of Fame in 1992. On Jan. 9, 2019, Solich received the Tom Osborne Legacy Award.

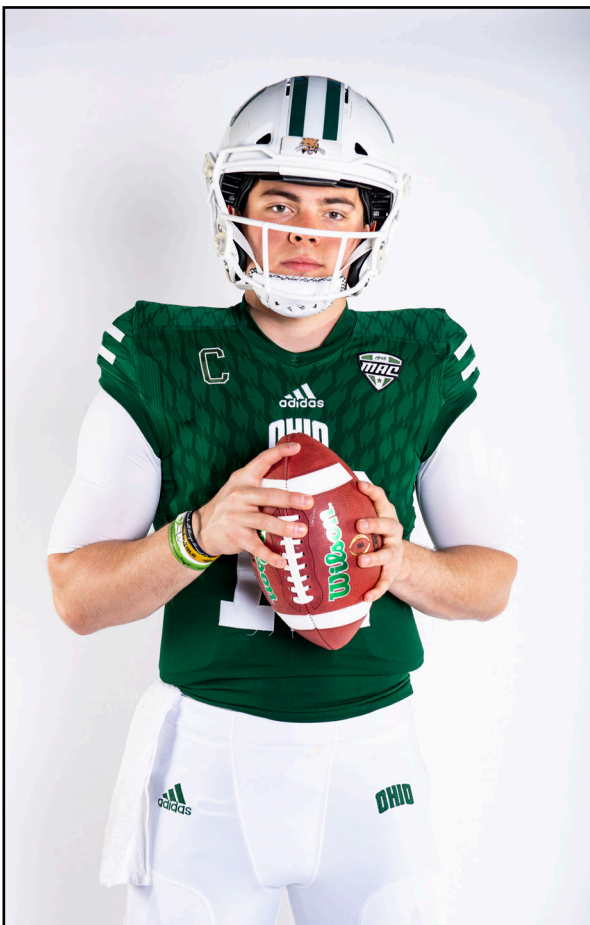
