THE GAME: Morgan State, which is off to its best start in 25 years and fresh off its slim 71-70 non-conference win over La Salle on Wednesday night, plays host to state foe Bowie State in a non-conference game at 2 p.m. at Hill Field House on Saturday. The game which is the third of four consecutive games in front of the friendly confines of Hill Field House, will also be the first meeting between the two schools since the 1983-84 season. Morgan State has been led in scoring by Corin Adams (18.6 ppg, 4.1 rpg) and Erin Hawkins (10.3 ppg). Phylcia Jones leads the team in rebounds with 7.0 per contest. Aaries Reed is coming off the bench to average 5.3 points and 3.2 rebounds per outing. Bowie State (3-2) enters the contest winners of three straight games, including an 80-69 victory at Saint Paul's on Nov. 25. Bowie's three wins have all come in CIAA play. The Lady Bulldogs, who scored 60 points in the paint and 24 points off of 24 Saint Paul's turnovers, were led by Bianca Lee, who tied her career high with 27 points, while Teaunsha Robinson added 18 points in the win over the Lady Tigers. Bowie State has been paced by Robinson (17.6 points, 6.6 rebounds), Lee (16.4 ppg, 3.8 rpg) and Denisha Kenion (11 ppg, 5.6 rpg). Kenion also leads the team in steals (21) and assists with 19.

BOWIE STATE SERIES NOTES: Morgan State leads the all-time series, 6-4 and has won the past three games against Bowie State, including an 89-77 victory at home during the 1983-84 season.

THE CIAA: According to available records since the 1977-78 season, Morgan State is 12-9 all-time against current members of the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA). Along with its 6-4 mark against Bowie State, the Lady Bears are 2-1 against Virginia State and 4-4 against Virginia Union.

NEXT UP: The Lady Bears will play the final game of their current four-game homestand on Saturday, Dec. 13, when they play host to Fayetteville State in a non-conference game at Hill Field House at 5:30 p.m.

LAST TIMEOUT: Corin Adams scored a game-high 20 points, Brittany Dodson added 14 points and Theresa Davis notched her first double-double of the season, chipping in with 13 points and a team-high 11 rebounds to help Morgan State to a 71-70 victory over La Salle on Wednesday. Morgan which battled back from a 10-point deficit, then held a 13-point lead with two minutes remaining in the contest, needed a blocked shot by Adams on the final possession of the game in order to secure the win. Trailing 71-58 with 2:04 left, La Salle would not go away, as it scored the game's final 12 points. Jamie Walsh began the comeback with a three-pointer and Morgan would turn the ball over on its next three possessions with the Explorers capitalizing each time. A three-point play by Morgan Robertson was followed by a Jenna Gilbert layup and back-to-back steals and baskets by Margaret Elderton to pull visiting La Salle within a point with 7.5 seconds remaining. Morgan's Stacy Hunt missed the back-end of a one-and-one and Robertson who grabbed the rebound drove the length of the floor only to have her shot attempt blocked by Adams to preserve the win. La Salle would set a school record with 13 three-pointers, surpassing the previous mark of 11.

BEASLEY CLOSING IN ON .500 AND 50: Fourth-year head coach Donald Beasley (48-49) enters the Bowie State contest one win shy of reaching a winning percentage of .500 at Morgan State. Beasley, who compiled a 5-23 mark in his first season at the helm, is just two wins away from reaching 50 career victories.

ADAMS MOVING ON UP: Corin Adams scored a game-high 20 points in Wednesday's win over La Salle, giving her 1,060 points for her career. Adams, who ranks 11th all-time in scoring at Morgan State is 11 points shy of surpassing Sherie Cornish (1,070 from 1998-2002) for ninth.

FALLING SHORT: Morgan State's bid to tie and then set school history for most wins to start a season fell short when the Lady Bears watched an 11-point first half lead turn into a 59-57 loss to the University of Louisiana at Monroe (11/21). Morgan State, which entered the contest with its first 3-0 start since the 1983-84 season was seconds away from its record-tying fourth win, which would have tied the 1983-84 squad for most wins to start a season. However, the Warhawks would score the game's final six points on back-to-back three-pointers by Jesse Carrier in the final 42 seconds to snatch the victory.

ADAMS NAMED TO FIFTH THIRD ALL TOURNAMENT TEAM: Corin Adams was named to the Fifth Third Marshall University Classic All-Tournament Team last weekend, after helping the Lady Bears to a consolation game victory over Tennessee State (11/22). Adams totaled a game-high 23 points on 8-of-12 shooting and added four assists, four steals and four rebounds in the victory.

ADAMS JOINS 1,000 POINT CLUB: Corin Adams, who entered the Tennessee State game needing two points to reach 1,000 for her career, hit a three-pointer from the left corner to put Morgan State up 8-3 at the 15:57 mark, giving her 1,001 points for her career, thus becoming the 11th Lady Bear player to reach that plateau. The junior guard also collected four steals against the Tigers, moving her past Monique Liddell (208 steals from 1996-2000) for third place all-time with 209 career steals.

ADAMS NAMED TOURNAMENT MVP AT UNC ASHEVILLE: Corin Adams was named MVP of the UNC Asheville Tournament (Nov. 14-15), after totaling 41 points, nine rebounds, eight assists and 10 steals, while helping Morgan State claim the tournament championship. Adams tied her career high with a game-high 27-point performance on 10-of-18 shooting against William & Mary in the opening round (11/14). Adams also connected on 4-of-7 from three-point range and recorded eight steals. She then added a game-high 14 points and finished with six assists and two steals in the title win over Fairfield.

HAWKINS EARNS UNC ASHEVILLE ALL-TOURNAMENT HONORS: Erin Hawkins was named to the UNC Asheville All-Tournament team after totaling 26 points, seven rebounds and five steals in two games. Hawkins's best outing came in her

Morgan debut, as she tallied 16 points on 6-of-16 shooting, including 2-for-5 from three-point range, five rebounds and four steals in the season opener against William & Mary (11/14).

MORGAN THIRD IN PRESEASON MEAC POLL: The Morgan State women's basketball team was picked to finish this season in third-place in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference preseason poll. Last year the Lady Bears were picked to finish fourth and recorded an 19-12 overall mark, including 10-6 in the conference, good for fourth. The 19 wins were the most in school history on the D-I level, surpassing the 18-13 mark set during the 2006-07 season, as Morgan State advanced to its third MEAC championship appearance that season.

ADAMS RECEIVES ALL-MEAC PRESEASON HONOR: Junior guard Corin "Tiny" Adams was named to the preseason All-MEAC first team, as selected by the league's head coaches and sports information directors. A native of Brooklyn, N.Y., Adams led the team in scoring last season with 16.6 points per game, which ranked third in the MEAC last season. Adams led the league in steals (4.0) and assists (4.3), while earning MEAC Defensive Player of the Year and All-MEAC second team honors. She also totaled a team-leading 123 steals and 133 assists and was second in blocks with 11 and was third in total rebounds with 159.

MORGAN IN SEASON OPENERS: The Lady Bears are 8-24 all-time in season openers dating back to 1977, including this season's opening win over William & Mary (11/14). Last season's 77-71 victory at Maryland Eastern Shore (11/10) marked Morgan State's first back-to-back season opening wins since the 1982-83, 1983-84 seasons. Prior to a season opening win in 2006 at New Jersey Institute of Technology, Morgan State had lost 23 straight season openers. Before then, the last season opening victory for the Lady Bears was an 87-64 win at Maryland Eastern Shore to start the 1983-84 campaign.

THREE AND COUNTING: The Lady Bears' 70-48 season opening victory over William & Mary (11/14) in the first round of the UNC Asheville Tournament marked the third consecutive season opening victory for Morgan State, something that has not been done since 1977-79.

ROAD WOES: The Morgan State women's basketball program has been known to struggle on the road, but have made great strides as of late. Last season, the Lady Bears went 11-9 away from Hill Field House, an improvement on its 8-8 road record in 2006-07. However, dating back to the 2001-02 season the Lady Bears have a combined road record of 27-85, including this season's 4-1 mark.

TOURNAMENT BOUND: Morgan State once again take part in two regular season tournaments this season. Morgan opened up the season at the UNC Asheville Tournament (Nov. 14-15), capturing the title with a win over Fairfield and last week traveled to Huntington, W.Va. to take part in the Fifth Third MU Classic, host by Marshall (Nov. 21-22). Morgan came in third-place, following its win over Tennessee State.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Morgan State, which will host 14 home games at Hill Field House this season, will play its first five games on the road and will close out the season playing three of its last four games on the road as well. The Lady Bears host American for their home opener on Nov. 28, while Morgan State's MEAC opener will be against crosstown rival Coppin State on Jan. 3.

THAT'S A FIRST: Morgan State has four opponents on its schedule (Fairfield, Louisiana at Monroe, Tennessee State and Fayetteville State) which it has never faced in the program's history.
