

# Monmouth, Coe Dominate 1952 Midwest Squad

CHICAGO (AP) — Champion Coe and third-place Monmouth each won six berths to dominate the 1952 All-Midwest Conference football squad announced today by the league coaches.

Lawrence, beaten by Coe for the title in a season finale, was awarded four spots on the offensive-defensive honor platoon. Ripon gained two positions and Cornell, Grinnell, Knox and Carleton one apiece.

Three players won double laurels. Coe's Wayne Fisher was named at offensive end and defensive halfback. Joe Cooper of Monmouth was honored at offensive and defensive tackle. Another Monmouth star, Tom Hoffman, got the call at offensive center and linebacker.
