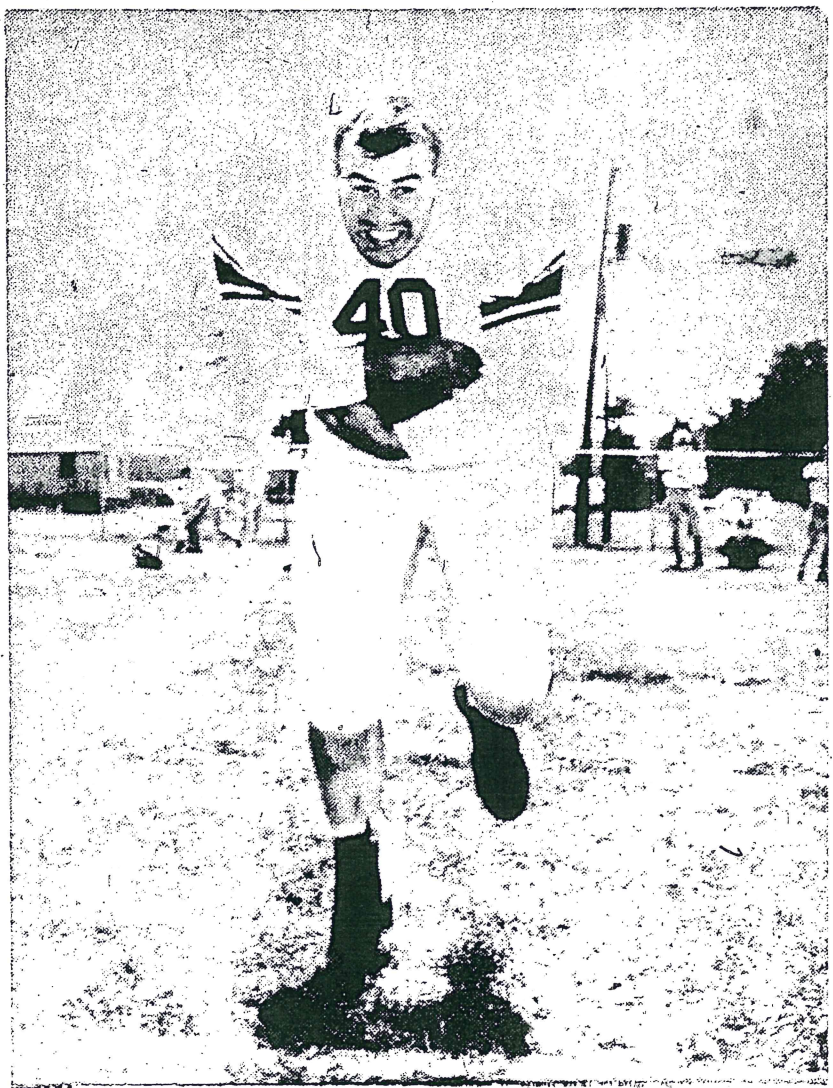
The Coe Kohawks, who won the conference with a perfect 8-0 record, had only one player on the first team while Ripon (4-4) landed three on the elite eleven.
