Lawrence gained 2,405 yards on offense, of which 1,549 was U on the ground. This gave the fo Vikes an average of 300 per dr igh game and only Beloit with 320 gi ing and St. Olaf with 342 averaged, ac 68 better than the Vikings.

On defense Ripon allowed ce opponents an average of 208 se to yards per game to pace the St ing, conference and Lawrence was n ell, right behind with 211. The Vikes th phr had the second best defense er nt, against rushing, allowing foes a be total of 780 yards in eight le hig games, an average of a little bu ors over 87 per game.

In the individual scoring race, fi 19, Rick Schimmel, of Cornell, led re ell, the way with 62 points and Doug or 6, Bradley, of Ripon, placed sec to 1-1 ond with 54 points. Chuck w McKee, of Lawrence, had eight ar 18 touchdowns for 48 points and 1-2 ranked fourth.
