- The **Missouri State Bears** will travel to Tulsa to take on the **Oral Roberts Golden Eagles** Tuesday (Feb. 21) in a 3 p.m. non-conference contest at J.L. Johnson Stadium
- Oral Roberts holds a 30-21 advantage in the series, including a 20-9 edge in Tulsa; the Golden Eagles have won four of the last six meetings in the series, but the Bears have won two of their last three games with ORU at J.L. Johnson Stadium, however
- Pitching and defense have dominated the series in recent years, with neither club allowing more than five runs in any of the last 10 meetings dating back to 2012; Three shutouts have been posted over the same stretch, with the Bears recording two (March 2, 2016 and March 12, 2012, both in Springfield)
- Missouri State posted its fifth-consecutive opening day win last Friday vs. Rhode Island; the Bears improved to 23-12 in openers under head coach **Keith Guttin** and 35-19 overall in season lid-lifters
- The Bears outscored their three opponents 22-5 in going 2-1 at the Lake Area Classic in Lake Charles, La., over the weekend; MSU hit five home runs as a team and racked up 12 extra-base hits while allowing just two in three games
- Sophomore shortstop **Jeremy Eierman** was named Missouri Valley Conference Player of the Week on Monday after batting .583 (7-for-12) and slugging 1.250 with a pair of homers and six RBIs for the Bears over the weekend
- A total of 12 different Bears made their MSU debuts this past weekend, led by the performance of Friday's starting pitcher **Doug Still**, who earned the win over Rhode Island after allowing just one run in 6.0 innings
- The Bears' bullpen combined to post 9.0 shutout innings in MSU's first three games of the season, allowing just five hits and one walk while striking out nine and holding the opposition to a .179 batting mark; **Jake Fromson** turned in two shutdown relief appearances, including a career-best 4.0 shutout innings in Sunday's tourney finale vs. McNeese
- The Bears have amassed a 52-14 regular-season record against non-conference foes since the beginning of the 2015 season, including a 28-10 mark in road or neutral-field games against non-MVC competition; MSU has also logged a total of 41 come-from-behind wins over the last two seasons

LEADING OFF

After claiming their fifth-consecutive opening day victory as part of a 2-1 weekend in Louisiana, the **Missouri State Bears** look to build on their strong start to the 2017 season Tuesday (Feb. 21), when they travel to Tulsa, Okla., to take on the **Oral Roberts Golden Eagles** in a 3 p.m. non-conference contest at J.L. Johnson Stadium. The Bears picked up wins over Rhode Island (12-1) and Stony Brook (7-0), before coming up just short in their bid for a weekend sweep against host McNeese State at the Lake Area Classic last weekend.

ORU (3-0) capped a perfect opening weekend vs. Little Rock with an 8-3 win Sunday. The Golden Eagles opened the season at home with a 10-4 win Friday, followed by a 4-3 walk-off decision in 13 innings on Saturday.

SERIES HISTORIES

ORU brings a decisive 30-21 edge in its series with the Bears into play Tuesday, including a 20-9 advantage on its home turf. The Golden Eagles have won four of the last six meetings since 2013, despite MSU claiming a 5-0 victory in Springfield last March. The Bears have taken two of the last three from ORU in Tulsa, however, splitting a pair of midweek contests in both 2012 and 2014.

MSU has posted a 60-40 all-time mark against the current membership of the Summit League, thanks in large part to its big edge in its series with Western Illinois (28-5). The Bears went 3-0 versus the conference in 2016, with a pair of March home victories over the Leathernecks in addition to the blanking of ORU.

LIFTING THE LID

With its 12-1 win over Rhode Island, Missouri State is now 23-12 in season openers under head coach **Keith Guttin** and 35-19 overall in such affairs. The Bears' big win over the preseason Atlantic 10 Conference favorite marked their fifth-consecutive opening day victory. Additionally, MSU's 12 runs matched their 2016 opening day offensive output as its best since the 2004 season opener (13 runs vs. Little Rock). The Bears have employed a potent offensive attack in recent years, totaling 41 runs in their last four season debuts.

GUTTIN CRACKS TOP 25

Bears head coach **Keith Guttin** cracked the NCAA's top 25 coaching wins list over the weekend, moving past Andy Lopez with Saturday's victories over Stony Brook and Rhode Island. With a career record of 1,178-740 (.614), Guttin is the second-winningest coach in MVC history, while his win total ranks seventh among all active Division I head coaches.

DOING IT WITH 'D'

MSU rode a familiar formula of pitching and defense to victories in its first two games at the Lake Area Classic over the weekend. The Bears turned a total of six double plays in their three games in Louisiana, including five of the inning-ending variety. The Bears, which fielded .983 with just two miscues in 117 total chances in their three games, also got a big boost from their outfield defense. **Hunter Steinmetz** turned in three diving catches to rob opponents of runs, and **Blake Graham** added a highlight-reel grab of his own.

On the mound, the Bears yielded just four earned runs over the weekend, getting a pair of quality starts from **Doug Still** and **Jordan Knutson**, as well as solid work from all four relievers who saw action. Still earned the win vs. Rhode Island after allowing just one earned run on five hits over 6.0 innings, before Knutson and **Dylan Coleman** combined on a five-hit shutout of Stony Brook.

NON-CON DOMINATION

A key factor in Missouri State's success over the past two seasons has been its dominance against non-conference competition. Since the beginning of the 2015 season, the Bears have compiled a 52-14 record in regular-season games versus non-league foes. They have won 24 of their last 28 regular-season non-conference home games, but have been nearly as potent on the road, going 28-10 in true road and neutral-field contests over the same stretch.

EIERMAN HONORED

Sophomore shortstop **Jeremy Eierman** cashed in on a strong opening weekend by picking up Missouri Valley Conference Player of the Week honors, the league office announced Monday.

Eierman powered the Missouri State offense over the weekend at the Lake Area Classic, batting .583 (7-for-12) with a pair of homers and six RBIs. The Warsaw, Mo., product slugged 1.250, totaled four extra-base hits and recorded at least two hits in all three contests, including a 3-for-4 effort in MSU's opener with Rhode Island. He reached base four times in the 12-1 win, singling home a run and belting a two-run homer. He also went 2-for-4 in the Bears' win over Stony Brook, before clubbing a three-run homer and doubling in game three vs. McNeese on Sunday.

The MVC weekly honor is the second of Eierman's career, after the MSU shortstop earned the same award on May 23, 2016, en route to garnering Freshman All-America honors from both *Collegiate Baseball* and the National Collegiate Baseball Writer's Association.

MMM...THIS IS A TASTY BURGER!

The preseason conversation surrounding the Bears has centered on the man at the hot corner with the chance to become the latest in Missouri State's long line of premium professional prospects as the 2017 MLB Draft moves into focus. Adding to an already impressive list of accolades, junior third baseman **Jake Burger** was one of 15 players selected by *Baseball America* for 2017 first-team preseason All-America honors, which are selected by big league scouting directors based on performance, talent and professional potential.

Burger, a consensus All-America choice in 2016, was named to USA Baseball's Golden Spikes Award watch list prior to the start of the season. He led the Bears in batting (.349) and RBIs (72) last spring and ranked second nationally in home runs (21) to earn a spot on USA Baseball's Collegiate National Team over the summer. The Chesterfield, Mo., native was also named the top defensive third baseman in the country last year as one of nine NCAA Division I standouts selected for the ABCA/Rawlings NCAA Division I Gold Glove Team.

The Bears' Big Kahuna checked in at No. 27 on BA's College Top 100 Prospects list prior to the start of the season and claimed 2017 preseason All-America recognition from *Collegiate Baseball*, the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association, *Perfect Game USA* and *D1Baseball* as well.

HOLDING SERVE AT HAMMONS

Missouri State's recent success has been fueled by a home-field advantage like no other encountered throughout the 53-year history of the program. The Bears logged a Hammons Field record 22 victories at home last spring after piling up 19 home wins in 2015. MSU posted its best-ever showing at Hammons with a 19-3 (.864) mark in 2015, giving the Bears a combined 41-11 (.788) home record over the last two years.

Last season, the Bears hit .320 as a team, averaged 8.8 runs per game and out-homered the opposition by a 39-11 margin at Hammons. Over the last two years combined, MSU has nearly doubled the run production of its 52 opponents at home with a 404-226 scoring advantage.

COMEBACK KIDS

Missouri State has made a habit of eliminating opposition leads over the last two seasons, totaling 41 come-from-behind victories out of 87 total wins. Last year, the Bears posted 17 comeback wins, on the heels of a 2015 season that saw them claim victory in 24 such contests.

MSU rallied from its biggest deficit in nearly six years last March vs. Arkansas State, coming all the way back from a 5-0 hole to defeat the Red Wolves by a 15-11 final tally. The Bears' last come-from-behind win after trailing by five runs occurred on May 26, 2010, when MSU overcame a 7-2 deficit against Southern Illinois at the Missouri Valley Conference Championship in Wichita. MSU was particularly resilient in MVC play in 2015, capturing eight of their 18 conference victories in comeback fashion.

VALLEY FORECAST

With 15 letterwinners returning from last year's 38-21 squad, the Bears were tabbed third in the Missouri Valley Conference's 2017 preseason poll of the league's head coaches. Defending Valley champion Dallas Baptist garnered five of the eight first-place votes and finished with 59 points overall to claim the top spot in the poll. The Patriots narrowly edged second-place pick Southern Illinois (53 points), which received the remaining three first-place votes.

The Bears gained 51 points to place third, out-distancing Indiana State and Wichita State, which tied for the fourth spot with 36 points. Bradley (25 points) earned the sixth position in the poll, followed by Evansville (20) and Illinois State (8).

BEARS IN THE PRO RANKS

Former Missouri State baseball standout **Buddy Baumann** became the 17th Bear to receive a call up to big leagues last July, when the San Diego Padres made the move official by promoting the Rogersville, Mo., product to their 25-man Major League roster.

Prior to being selected by Kansas City in the seventh round of the 2009 MLB Draft, Baumann went 18-8 with a 4.09 ERA over his three-year Missouri State career, striking out 215 batters innings to rank among the school's all-time leaders. He earned second-team All-America honors from the ABCA and *Collegiate Baseball* after going 11-1 with a 3.23 ERA as a junior in 2009. Baumann is one of four former Bears currently in big league spring training camps, joining **Ross Detwiler** (A's), **Pierce Johnson** (Cubs) and **Brad Ziegler** (Marlins), while 11 additional former MSU standouts remain active in the minor league ranks.

Last summer, two MSU seniors — **Spencer Johnson** and **Sam Perez** — were among those taken in the 2016 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Perez was the first Missouri Valley Conference player to be chosen in the draft, as the Miami Marlins selected the right-hander in the fifth round with the 143rd overall pick on the second day of the 40-round amateur draft. The following day, Johnson heard his name called by the Houston Astros in the 16th round with the 487th overall pick.

With the selections of Johnson and Perez, Missouri State extended an impressive string of talent production that has resulted in at least one Bear being picked in 30 of the last 31 MLB Drafts dating back to 1986. Overall, the Bears have produced 136 players who have gone on to sign professional contracts over their 53 years as a varsity program, including 116 during **Keith Guttin's** 34-year tenure as head coach.

YOUNG TOPS MSU SAVES LIST

Missouri State closer **Bryan Young** was one of 60 players named to the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association's initial watch list for its 2017 Stopper of the Year Award, given annually to the top relief pitchers in NCAA Division I baseball.

A 2017 preseason All-Missouri Valley Conference selection, Young is coming off one of the more dominant top-year stretches ever produced by a Bears reliever. He became Missouri State's 10th first-team All-American after setting a school record with 16 saves in 2015. The right-hander led the MVC and ranked third nationally in saves, while logging a perfect 7-0 record and a 1.30 earned run average. The MSU closer earned first-team All-America recognition from the NCBWA, as well as third-team honors from both *Perfect Game* and *Collegiate Baseball* at the conclusion of the season.

Young, who was one of five finalists for the 2015 NCBWA Stopper of the Year Award, picked up right where he left off as a sophomore, logging a 1.31 earned run average, while saving 11 games in his 24 mound appearances last season. The Kansas City, Mo., native owns the MSU career saves record with 27 and entered the 2017 campaign third on the NCAA's saves list for active pitchers and fourth on the active ERA list (1.74).

BEARS ON THE AIR

Once again in 2017, Meyer Communications is slated to provide live radio coverage of all 55 Missouri State regular-season games, plus all Bears' games in the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament and any 2017 postseason play. The broadcasts can be heard primarily on **KBFL 1060 AM** and **96.9 FM** in Springfield with Art Hains, Rob Evans and Corey Riggs describing the action. An online audio stream is available through KBFL's website via RadioSpringfield.com.

Additionally, fans can keep tabs on the Bears through **The Valley on ESPN3**, under the MVC's media rights agreement that will provide increased coverage of conference events across ESPN platforms through the 2023-24 academic year. This spring, nine different MSU home baseball games will be broadcast on ESPN3, beginning with MSU's April 2 game vs. Bradley.

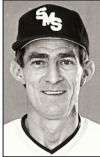

RETIRED NUMBERS



Bill Rowe

On Saturday, May 8, 2004, former head baseball coach and director of athletics **Bill Rowe** became the first person in the 48-year history of the MSU baseball program to have his number retired.

Rowe guided the baseball Bears as head coach for 19 years from the start of the program in 1964 through its final season in NCAA Division II in 1982. He led the Bears to a 394-230-1 record and four Division II College World Series appearances. Under Rowe, the Bears finished as national runners-up in 1969 and finished third nationally in 1970 (just the sixth and seventh years of the program). As athletic director, Rowe guided the Bears from

Division II to Division I and saw the Bears change leagues from the MIAA and Mid-Continent Conferences to a current membership in the Missouri Valley Conference.

The retirement ceremony for Rowe's jersey was held prior to the Bears' doubleheader against Illinois State.

The indoor practice facility at Hammons Field also bears Rowe's name as of January 30, 2010.



Ryan Howard

On Dec. 18, 2010, Missouri State retired the No. 6 jersey of former Bear and 2006 National League Most Valuable Player **Ryan Howard** at JQH Arena.

A St. Louis native who played at Missouri State from 1999-2001, Howard finished his collegiate career with 50 home runs, 183 RBIs and a .335 career average in 172 games. He was the 1999 Missouri Valley Conference Freshman of the Year and MSU's A.E. "Ted" Willis Most Valuable Player in 2000.

Since being drafted by Philadelphia in the fifth round of the 2001 draft, Howard has enjoyed a standout professional career. His long list of accomplishments as a member of

the Phillies includes 2005 National League Rookie of the Year, 2006 NL MVP, 2006 Home Run Derby champion, 2008 World Series champion, 2009 NLCS MVP and three All-Star selections.

Howard debuted with the Phillies in 2004, accumulating a career batting average of .258 with 382 homers and 1,194 RBIs in 1,572 MLB games over 13 seasons.

KEITH GUTTIN Head Coach

35th Season
Alma mater: UMSL (1978)

One of the most successful baseball coaches in Missouri Valley Conference history, Keith Guttin began his MSU head coaching career in 1983, and has spent the past 34 seasons building the Bears into one of the top programs in the country. Under Guttin, the Bears have won 61 percent of their games, averaging 35 victories a year and racking up nine 40-win seasons.

Guttin, who entered the 2017 season seventh among active Division I head coaches in career victories, has been a part of the MSU baseball program as a player, assistant coach and head coach for 40 of the program's 54 years. He took the helm of Bears baseball at the start of the 1983 season, coinciding with the move of Missouri State athletics to Division I status. He inherited the reins of the program from its only previous head baseball coach, former Missouri State Director of Athletics Bill Rowe. Guttin ultimately helped stretch MSU's string of consecutive winning seasons to 32 in a row, easily the longest of any Missouri State athletics team. His 1,178 career wins are the most recorded by any head coach in the 108-year history of Missouri State athletics, and the Bears have finished in the top half of the conference race in all but four of his 34 seasons.

During Guttin's tenure, 116 Bears have signed professional contracts, including five first-round draft picks and 15 players who have advanced to the Major Leagues. Additionally, MSU has won 13 regular-season or conference tournament championships and made nine Division I NCAA Tournament appearances, including eight in the last two decades.

In 2003, Guttin led the Bears to the NCAA Division I College World Series for the first time in school history, marking the only trip to Omaha by a Division I team from the state of Missouri since 1965. He has been a conference coach of the year 10 times and was selected the American Baseball Coaches Association Division I Midwest Region Coach of the Year in 1997 and again in 2003.

Guttin's pupils have produced results off the diamond as well. Missouri State baseball players have been recognized on the Valley's all-academic team 60 times since the inception of the honor in 1992. Additionally, seven Bears have garnered academic All-America honors on 12 different occasions under Guttin, including three-time selection Brian Mahaffey.

The 2015 season will go down as one of the more memorable campaigns for Guttin, who was inducted into both the Missouri Sports Hall of Fame and Springfield Area Sports Hall of Fame this past year. He also surpassed the 1,100 career victory mark early in MSU's record-setting season en route to earning his fifth MVC Coach of the Year nod. Under Guttin's guidance, the 2015 Bears set a program record with 49 victories and were ranked as high as No. 6

(Baseball America) in the nation while sweeping the Valley's regular-season and postseason tournament titles. MSU went on to earn its ninth NCAA Division I postseason berth, sweeping the Springfield Regional at Hammons Field to advance to its second Super Regional appearance, where the Bears came up just one win shy of punching their ticket to the College World Series.

While the accomplishments of Guttin's teams on the field speak volumes about the success of his program, another dream came true in April 2004 when the Bears opened a sparkling 8,000-seat stadium just four blocks north of the Missouri State campus. The Bears finished the year ninth among NCAA Division I teams in attendance, playing only a portion of their home schedule at Hammons Field.

It was merely a coincidence that the crown jewel of the Missouri State baseball program came one year after the Bears exploded onto the national college baseball radar in the College World Series. But both events show the growth of college baseball in the Ozarks and the amount of community and administrative support the program had received in the last several years.

With the continued support of the MSU community, Guttin has led the Bears' efforts in numerous charitable endeavors, including the program's annual Price Cutter Celebrity Golf Classic, proceeds from which have been committed to Champion Athletes of the Ozarks in each of the last 20 years. MSU's popular First Pitch and Reunion Night has also been a positive force for both the Bears and a variety of local charitable organizations. The annual preseason kickoff event has benefitted entities such as the Miracle League Ball Field, Care to Learn, Boys and Girls Clubs and the Wounded Warrior Project.

The Bears have finished lower than third in the league standings just nine times since Guttin took over. Guttin directed Missouri State to six straight league titles in Mid-Continent play from 1984 through 1989. He gave MSU its first two Valley postseason tournament championships in 1996 and 1997. He was voted the MVC Coach of the Year in 1993, 2001, 2003 and 2008 and was selected the American Baseball Coaches Association Division I Midwest Region Coach of the Year in 1997 and again in 2003.

Guttin had two notable seasons as the Missouri State second baseman, coming from Mineral Area College. He earned MIAA all-conference honorable mention in 1977 as the Bears made their first NCAA Division II tournament appearance in seven years.

A University City native, Guttin finished his undergraduate degree at the University of Missouri-St. Louis in 1978, and earned his master's degree in 1984 from Truman State.

Guttin was a Missouri State assistant under Rowe from 1979 to 1981, as Missouri State won its last MIAA title and made two NCAA appearances. Guttin returned to Missouri State in 1982 after a year at Rend Lake College where he served as assistant coach to former Bear Kirk Champion as RLC claimed an Illinois JUCO sectional crown.

Guttin and his wife, Marianne, have three daughters; Lauren, Lindsey and Samantha.
