#### UVa-Wise (0-5, 0-4) at #9/10 Shepherd (5-0, 5-0), Noon

Last Year: Shepherd won 42-17

Notes: Shepherd led by just one score in the middle of the 3rd quarter before the Rams scored the game's final 17 points ... Allen Cross had 137 yards rushing and Jeff Ziemba split time in the game and threw for just 56 yards ... SU leads the country in total defense (155.4) ... UVa-Wise features the leader in TFLs (Zack Blair, 11.5) ... SU is +8 in turnover margin this year.

#### Fairmont State (2-3, 2-3) at West Liberty (2-3, 2-2), 1 p.m.

Last Year: West Liberty won 27-21

Notes: The last two games have been decided by less than a touchdown ... West Liberty has won seven of the last nine meetings, but Fairmont State was victorious in its last trip to the hilltop ... WLU's losses have come to teams with a combined record of 13-2 ... FSU QB Cooper Hibbs is third in the MEC with 260 yards per game ... FSU is 2-1 when having more time of possession than its opponent.

#### Charleston (4-1, 3-1) at Glenville State (1-4, 1-4), 1:30 p.m.

Last Year: Charleston won 17-10

Notes: UC's Torie Wagner had a punt return for a TD in last year's matchup ... Charleston held Shepherd to less than 100 yards rushing last week, and faces a Glenville State squad that is averaging 223.4 yards per game on the ground ... Charleston held Rahmann Lee to just 55 yards in last season's matchup ... the Pioneers are averaging 41.4 rushing attempts per game ... UC has not thrown for over 200 yards in a game this year.

## West Virginia Wesleyan (2-3, 2-3) at West Virginia State (2-3, 1-3), 1:30 p.m.

Last Year: West Virginia Wesleyan won 45-30

Notes: WVWC is 0-2 when rushing for less than 100 yards in a game ... the combined record of the teams WVWC has lost to this year is 13-2 ... WR Zach Schademan leads the team in scoring with 30 points (5 TD receptions) ... WVSU RB Tevin Brown is averaging 131 yards per game in the team's two wins, but just 18 in its three losses ... WVSU's 30 points last year against WVWC are the most in the Jon Anderson era.

#### Urbana (1-4, 1-4) at #21/23 Concord (5-0, 4-0)

Last Year: Urbana won 22-10

Notes: Concord leads the league in total offense (531.0), and UU is sixth (392.8) ... CU's defense has broken up 23 passes this year (4.5 per game) ... CU RB Calvinaugh Jones has over 100 yards rushing in each game this year ... Urbana has had more total offense than its opponent in four out of five games ... UU's Cody Schroeder is averaging 298.5 yards passing in the last two games ... Urbana has the league's top tackler in D'Gary Wallace (11.5)

#### Lake Erie College (1-4) at Notre Dame (4-1)

Last Year: Lake Erie won 48-21

<u>Notes</u>: LEC raced out to a 42-0 lead at the half on its way to the win ... two of LEC's losses have come against teams that have been ranked nationally this year ... the Storm are allowing 52.8 points per game this season ... NDC RB Michael Butler is averaging 131 yards rushing per game since entering the starting lineup ... NDC QB Ray Russ' four touchdown passes last week were a season-high.

#### **▲MEC NOTEBOOK**

#### **WEEK 5 PLAYERS OF THE WEEK**

- Tevin Brown, a redshirt freshman from Cincinnati, Ohio, is the Offensive Player of the Week after leading the Yellow Jackets to their first Mountain East Conference win with an 18-13 decision over Urbana.
   Brown rushed 26 times for 132 yards averaging 5.1 yards per carry.
- C.J Davis, a sophomore from Hagerstown, Md., and Kevin Coffie, a sophomore defensive back from Beltsville, Md., share the league's Defensive Player of the Week recognition. Davis helped ninth-ranked Shepherd limit Charleston to just 123 yards of total offense with seven tackles and an interception. Coffie had four tackles on the day but broke up six passes and surrendered just one reception to his receiver on 83 snaps.
- Torie Wagner, a junior from Severn, Md., earned MEC Special Teams Player of the Week honors for his efforts against Shepherd. He returned a kickoff 97 yards for a touchdown against the ninth-ranked Rams -- the longest in the league this season. Wagner also had 26 punt return yards to become UC's single season leader (since re-starting football in 20013) in that category.

#### **NEWS & NOTES**

- This will mark the first week in MEC history that two teams from the league are nationally ranked in both major polls (AFCA/d2football.com) with Shepherd (9th/10th) and Concord (23rd/21st) making it in the top 25.
- Four different MEC quarterbacks have two 300+ yard passing games this season: Cooper Hibbs (FSU), Jeremy Musselman (WVWC), Brian Novak (CU) and Ray Russ (NDC). Six different QBs have thrown for over 300 yards this year.
- Three running backs in the league are averaging over 100 yards per game with Rahmann Lee leading the way with 128.2 yards per game, followed by Calvinaugh Jones (121.4) and Marvin Elam (107.6).
- Shepherd is 14-0 in two seasons of play in the Mountain East Conference.
- SU quarterback Jeff Ziemba has yet to throw an interception in 107 attempts. The Rams are one of just four teams not to throw an interception this season.
- Shepherd is 19-of-23 (83 percent) in third down situations of less than four yards.
- The Rams lead the country in total defense allowing

just 156.4 yards per game. SU has allowed more than 10 points in just two of its five games this season.

- Shepherd's C.J. Davis is the only MEC player to earn Defensive Player of the Week and Special Teams Player of the Week honors this season. He leads the Rams with 412 all-purpose yards despite not playing any snaps on offense.
- SU is out-scoring opponents 127-17 in the first half and has yet to allow a point in the third quarter this season.
- Concord is one of only five teams in NCAA Division II to average more than 50 points a game this season.
- CU's Ryan Stewart has at least one touchdown reception in each of his last four games. He has been on the receiving end of nine of Brian Novak's 14 TD tosses.
- Concord's offensive line has allowed only three sacks in 143 passing attempts.
- CU uses team defense with six players recording over 20 total tackles this year and 13 players have at least one tackle for a loss.
- Charleston's defense held Shepherd to under 100 yards rushing for the first time in 28 games. Prior to week five's game against UC that saw Shepherd rush for 83 yards, the last time it was held to under 100 was the first week of the 2012 season against Shippensburg.
- UC's Torie Wagner became the school's single-season leader for punt return yards against Shepherd. He has 197 punt return yards on 12 attempts and one touchdown. Wagner also ranks sixth in the country in combined kick and punt return yardage with 505.
- Wagner is averaging over 107.6 all-purpose yards per game (10th in the league) despite not playing on offense.
- Notre Dame's Ray Russ went 121 pass attempts without being intercepted before surrendering one in week four against Charleston, establishing a new league mark.
- Russ leads the MEC with 15 touchdown passes this year. He has thrown at least two touchdown passes in every game this season.
- 26 of Mitchel Shegos' 35 receptions have gone for first downs
- West Liberty continues to lead the league in fewest penalties (14) and penalty yardage (150).

- West Virginia Wesleyan is 0-2 in games that it rushes for less than 100 yards.
- Tyler Bolen played well in relief of an injured Jeremy Musselman last week in a narrow 38-35 win over Glenville State. He was 18-of-25 for 187 yards with two scores and no interceptions.
- Fairmont State's Fabian Guerra made national headlines with his acrobatic one-handed catch against Concord. The clip went viral on social media and was aired on ESPN's SportsCenter and the NFL Network's show "Total Access."
- Guerra was not just a one-handed wonder, though, finishing the game against Concord with 12 catches for 136 yards. He leads the league in in receptions per game (7.8) and is the only wide receiver in the league to average more than 100 yards receiving per game (109.0)
- Austin White became the first Falcon to rush for over 100 yards in a game with 108 last week against Concord.
- GSC's Rahmann Lee ranks third among active players in all-purpose yards per game (153.89), sixth in rushing yards per game (126.1) and fifth for rushing yards (3.405).
- Each of Glenville State's last four games have been decided by four points or less. The Pioneers are 1-3 in those games.
- GSC quarterback Sean Steele has already thrown more touchdown passes this season (10) than he did all of last season (seven).
- West Virginia State picked up its first MEC win and first league road win in the same week. It was the first road win for coach Jon Anderson.
- WVSU's Tevin Brown accounts for 54 percent of the team's rushing yards this season.

- WVSU's Kevin Coffie had five pass breakups heading into last week's game against Urbana where he notched six against the Blue Knights.
- UU's D'Gary Wallace is the only player in the league to average more than 10 total tackles per game with 11.2. He also leads the conference in total solo tackles with 31.
- Urbana quarterback Cale Burdyshaw is the only Blue Knight player to rush for over 100 yards in a game this season.
- UVa-Wise's Zack Blair leads the Mountain East Conference with 11.5 tackles for a loss (2.30 per game).
- Cavs punter Trent Martin has six punts of over 50 yards this season.

#### **POLL POSITIONS**

- Shepherd remained ninth in the most recent AFCA poll and to 10th in the D2Football.com poll.
- Concord is making its first-ever appearance in the AFCA poll checking in at 23rd. The Mountain Lions are also ranked 21st by d2foobtall.com.
- This week marks the first time in MEC history that two teams have been nationally ranked in both polls.
- Despite losing to Shepherd last week, Charleston is also receiving votes in the AFCA poll.
- This is the fifth-straight week that three MEC teams have been listed in the AFCA poll.

#### WELCOME BACK

- Seventeen players who earned first team All-Mountain East Conference honors last season are back for 2014.
- Shepherd has six players that earned first team All-MEC honors returning, including the league's De-

fensive Freshman of the Year in linebacker Octavius Thomas and All-America return man C.J. Davis.

 The league's leader in rushing (Rahmann Lee, GSC), scorer (Jabre Lolley, SU), tackles (Hayden Davis, NDC) and tackles for a loss (D'Gary Wallace, UU) return to the field this year.

#### PRESEASON HONORS

- Shepherd's C.J. Davis earned preseason All-America honors from D2Football.com and Beyond-SportsNetwork.com. He was a first team returner on the BSN team, and a third team honoree by D2Football com
- Four other players were named to the Beyond-SportsNetwork.com preseason All-America teams: Concord safety Davon Marion (2nd team), Shepherd's Jonathan Hammer (3rd team) and Isaiah Shelton (3rd team) and Urbana linebacker D'Gary Wallace (3rd team).

#### **POLL POSITION PART II**

- The Shepherd Rams have been picked to repeat as Mountain East Conference football champions after a vote conducted by the league's coaches. Shepherd collected 95 points in the poll and was picked to finish first on seven ballots.
- Concord was picked second with 91 points and collected three first-place votes. Charleston was chosen third with 84 points and received the remaining first-place vote. Glenville State placed fourth (67), followed by West Virginia Wesleyan (60) and Urbana (58). Notre Dame and West Liberty were predicted to finish in a tie for seventh with 44 points, and Fairmont State (33), UVa-Wise (15) and West Virginia State (14) rounded out the poll.
