MVC Offensive Player of the Week

Pepe San Roman, Sr., M, Central Arkansas

Central Arkansas senior Pepe San Roman had a big week as the Bears earned a pair of wins to push their Missouri Valley Conference winning streak to three straight matches. The senior got the Bears going in their 3-1 win over Drake on Tuesday, firing off a beautiful free kick that curled around the wall and then dove to the right, just out of reach of Drake keeper Caden McCullough from 25 yards out. San Roman delivered again on Saturday, gathering a pass from Blake Stricker and delivering a strike from the edge of the 18-yard box to beat Loyola keeper Aidan Aylward and give the Bears their first-ever win at Loyola since 2012.

MVC Defensive Player of the Week

Brandon Barnes, Sr., GK, Bradley

Bradley senior Brandon Barnes continues to shine between the pipes in his first year with the Braves as a graduate transfer. His shutout streak was snapped at 333-minutes, 50-seconds by an Evansville penalty kick in the 61st minute Wednesday, but he still came through with 10 saves in the eventual 2-2 draw on the road for his second consecutive game posting double-digit saves. Barnes came up with six saves Saturday, leading the Braves to a 1-0 shutout against Drake, his sixth shutout of the season and all in the last eight games. For the season, Barnes has improved to 7-3-1 with six shutouts, a 0.79 goals against average and 0.877 saves percentage.

NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's player of the week selections, several conference players had notable performances, and they include:

Roman Schindler (BRAD) - Schindler retained his position as Bradley's season scoring leader by contributing a game-winning goal and an assist on a go-ahead goal during Bradley's undefeated week ... In Wednesday's 2-2 draw at Evansville, Schindler assisted Younes Dayekh's go-ahead tally in the 70th minute by redirecting a pass from Bryan Dillberg, perfectly leading Dayekh into open space for a wide-open shot from the top of the 18 ... In Saturday's 1-0 win against Drake, Schindler netted his fifth goal of the year by finishing off a rebounded Austin Bell shot from the center of the 6-yard box in the 20th minute ... With his second game-winner of the season, Schindler pushed his team-leading totals in all three offensive categories to 14 points, five goals and four assists.

Ian McGrath (UE) - For the second time this season, senior midfielder Ian McGrath scored multiple goals in a match as the New Lenox, Illinois native scored twice to secure a 2-2 draw with Bradley on Wednesday night. The pair of goals boosted McGrath's season total to seven, tied for tops in the MVC. McGrath leads the MVC in eight statistical categories and sits in the top 10 nationally in game-winning goals, shots on-goal per game, total goals, and total points.

Lucas Imrie (LUC) - Loyola freshman Lucas Imrie opened his collegiate account in Saturday's clash with visiting Central Arkansas. The Auckland, New Zealand native found the back of the net in the early stages of the second half as he directed home a free kick service from junior Fabian Lifka to put the Maroon & Gold on the board. Imrie, who appeared with the New Zealand National Team in the U20 World Cup earlier this summer, finished the night with four attempts, three of which came on target.

Josh Dolling (MSU) - Dolling scored the deciding goal against Valpo Saturday night. The goal was his first of the season and it came off a penalty kick at the 23:59 minute mark. Dolling got the ball around the Valpo goalkeeper to net the score in the left side of the box. Dolling also got off two shots during the game. The game winner helped the Bears extend their winning streak to five games and improve to 3-0 in conference play.

Alex Brown (VALPO) - Scored the match-winner on Tuesday night at IUPUI, the first start of his collegiate career. Had played only seven minutes in his career prior to that match. The goal lifted Valpo to a 1-0 victory.

Liam Priestley (MSU) - Priestly made two saves to help the Bears to a fifth consecutive win and fourth straight shutout against Valpo Saturday night. Priestley held up his sixth shutout of the season. Liam paces the MVC in goals against average (.425), save percentage (.889) and shutouts per game (.667). Priestley also ranks seventh in the nation in goals against average, third in save percentage and tied for seventh in shutouts.

MVC SOCCER NOTES

NCAA RPI Report

The first edition of the NCAA RPI report for the 2017 season has been released and the Valley has three teams featured in the top-70. Missouri State leads the league at No. 41, while Evansville (No. 52), and Bradley (No. 69) are also among the nation's top-70.

MVC in Regional Rankings

The MVC has four teams currently ranked in the United Soccer Coaches West Regional rankings released on Sept. 26. Bradley sits No. 5 in the region, while Missouri State (6th), Evansville (7th) and Loyola (8th) also appear in the poll.

Against the Field

The MVC holds a winning record against five leagues in non-conference play (Atlantic Sun, Conference USA, Horizon, Mid-American and Summit) and at least a .500 mark against another three (American Athletic, Atlantic 10 and Big East).

Against the 2016 NCAA Field

The Valley has won two matches against 2016 NCAA Tournament teams. Missouri State earned a 2-0 win in Springfield over Tulsa and Loyola beat SIUE 1-0 on Saturday. The MVC sits 2-3 against NCAA tourney teams from a year ago. Evansville faces #1 Indiana and Loyola welcomes crosstown rival UIC on Tuesday.

Streaks

After another win last week, Missouri State currently has the fifth longest win streak in the NCAA, sitting at five-straight. The Bears also have the sixth-best conference win streak in the country.

Hermann Trophy Watch List

Evansville's Ian McGrath and Loyola's Grant Stoneman represent the MVC on the watch list for the 2017 Missouri Athletic Club's (MAC) Hermann Trophy, presented to the top player in collegiate soccer. The Valley is one of six conferences nationally to have two or more players represented, joining the ACC (7), Big East (2), Big Ten (4), Pac-12 (3) and Western Athletic (3). A total of 31 NCAA Division I men's soccer players appear on the list.

More Preseason Accolades

Evansville's Ian McGrath and Loyola's Grant Stoneman also earned preseason honors from College Soccer News. The Valley tandem earned spots on the publication's Preseason All-America Second Team. Stoneman also earned honors as a Third-Team Preseason Best XI selection by TopDrawerSoccer.com.

Midseason Showdown

Bradley will continue its season-long, 3-game home stand with a midseason showdown against Missouri Valley Conference rival Missouri State Saturday night at Shea Stadium ... Although the Braves (7-3-1, 2-0-1 MVC) begin the week third in the MVC standings with seven points, Bradley and Missouri State (6-2-1, 3-0-0 MVC) are the only two unbeaten teams in Valley play ... With league co-leader Central Arkansas (3-1-0 MVC) playing a pair of non-conference games this week, Saturday's Bradley-Missouri State winner will take over sole possession of first place in the MVC standings at the halfway point of the league race (a draw would put Missouri State alone in first).



Winning September

Saturday's 1-0 win against Drake on the final day of September gave Bradley a 7-2-1 during the calendar month, matching the most wins the Braves have ever accumulated in a single calendar month ... Bradley also posted a 7-2-1 record during September 2000 ... September 2017 is the 10th month in program history in which the Braves have won at least six games ... In the last seven seasons that have included a 6-win month, Bradley has played in the NCAA Tournament, while the 6-0-2 record in September 1998 started a conference championship season: September 2000 (7-2-1, NCAA); November 2013 (6-2-0, MVC Tourney champion and NCAA); October 2011 (6-3-0, NCAA); October 2005 (6-3-0, MVC champion & NCAA); September 2005 (6-3-0, MVC champion & NCAA); September 2002 (6-0-2, NCAA); October 2000 (6-2-1, NCAA); September 1998 (6-0-2, MVC champion); October 1992 (6-3-1).

Home Shutout Streak

For the second time in program history, Bradley has posted five consecutive home shutouts ... The Braves have recovered from a 2-1, double overtime loss to Gonzaga Aug. 27 at Shea Stadium by blanking their last five home opponents ... The only other time Bradley has posted five consecutive home shutouts came 20 years ago in the first five games of the 1997 season ... The sixth home game in 1997 was a 3-1 win against Northwestern and the Braves managed only one more shutout in its final six home games of 1997, a 1-0 victory against Western Kentucky Nov. 9, 1997.

Three Goals=Win

With a pair 3-1 win over Drake on Tuesday and a 3-2 defeat of Loyola on Saturday, the Bears improved to 4-0 in matches where they have scored at least three times this season. Since head coach Ross Duncan took over the program in 2012, the Bears have scored at least three goals in 14 matches, compiling a record of 12-2-0, good for an .857 winning percentage. The Bears will host cross-town rival Central Baptist for the third-annual Conway Derby on Tuesday night, looking to push their record to 3-0 all-time against the Mustangs, before heading to Birmingham, Alabama on Saturday to take on the UAB Blazers for the first time since 2009. UCA dropped that match, falling 2-1 in a neutral-site match in Memphis, Tennessee.
