MVC Offensive Player of the Week

Josh Dolling, Fr., F, Missouri State

Missouri State freshman Josh Dolling scored two goals during last week's action. The first came against Valparaiso Tuesday afternoon. Dolling opened the scoring for the Bears in the 39th minute, for his third goal of the season. The pass came from the corner from Stuart Wilkin and Dolling netted it in from 10 yards out. In the eighth minute against Loyola on Saturday Dolling made a quick move around a defender to score from 12 yards out. It was

Dolling's fourth goal of the season and came off an assist from Conor Ingram. This week was the second time this season Dolling has scored in consecutive matches.

NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's player of the week selections, several conference players had notable performances, and they include:

Younes Dayekh (BRAD) - Dayekh kick-started Bradley's 3-0 win Saturday against Central Arkansas by scoring what proved to be the game-winning goal in the 25th minute ... Rushing through the center of the park, Dayekh toe-poked Falk Dennert's flank service in mid-air to beat UCA keeper Marc Olsen for his fifth goal of the season ... All five of Dayekh's goals this season have given Bradley a lead, including four that have stood as game-winning strikes ... Dayekh's four game winners are tied for the seventh-most in a season in program history and equal the second-best total by a Bradley freshman ... Dayekh's club coach, Gavin Glinton, still owns the single-season record for game-winning goals with seven during his freshman season in 1998.

Alex Peterson (DU) - Scored the game winner in 1-0 road win at Evansville ... first career goal ... came in the 79th minute ... has started all 16 matches this season ... fourth in minutes with 1,309 ... first season of action after missing his first two seasons due to injury.

Fabian Lifka (LUC) - Loyola junior Fabian Lifka found the back of the net during the first half of the Ramblers' 2-1 road win over Missouri State this past Saturday. Lifka directed home a pass from senior Elliot Collier to cancel out Josh Dolling's opening goal. The tally was the fourth of the season for the Kelkheim, Germany product, a mark that ties him for the team lead in the category with Collier.

Alex Ciaramitaro (BRAD) - Ciaramitaro continues to anchor Bradley's back line from his center back position and he directed a defensive effort Saturday that limited Central Arkansas to just five shots on goal in a 3-0 victory ... Ciaramitaro's primary responsibility was tracking Valley over-all and conference-only scoring leader Niklas Brodacki and the junior defender helped limit Brodacki to just two shots and only one on goal in his full 90 minutes of action ... Ciaramitaro has started 16 games this season, missing only the Sept. 6 match versus NCAA Division III Aurora University, and he has remained on the field for all but five minutes in his 16 games.

Kyle Hiebert (MSU) - The sophomore defender scored his first career goal against Valparaiso Tuesday afternoon. Hiebert headed in the ball from nine yards out off a serve from Stuart Wilkin. In addition to scoring a goal Hiebert was a defensive leader in the Bears two matches this week. Against Valpo the Bears gave up just one shot to the Crusaders, which Kyle played all 90 minutes of the match and was in the middle of the action. Against Loyola on Saturday evening, Hiebert recorded a career high three shots as well as keeping his leadership role on the defensive end. The Bears gave up 11 shots against Loyola, but showed a strong defensive front to keep the offensive in the game.

MVC SOCCER NOTES

Top Two Seeds Locked In

Missouri State and Central Arkansas have each secured a bye into the semifinals of the upcoming MVC Tournament in Peoria and will open play on Friday, November 10. Missouri State secured the top seed with Central Arkansas' 3-0 loss to Bradley on Saturday. MSU can earn an outright MVC title with a win or draw at Drake Saturday.

Seed Ranges

Entering the final week of MVC regular-season play, just three league matches remain on the calendar, each with seeding implications for the 2017 MVC Men's Soccer Championship, Nov. 7, 8, 10 & 12 in Peoria, Illinois. NCAA RPI Report

The latest edition of the NCAA RPI report for the 2017 season has been released (Oct. 30) and the Valley has three teams featured in the top-125. Missouri State leads the league at No. 65, while Evansville sits 114th and Loyola sits 119th nationally.

MVC in Regional Rankings

The MVC has four teams currently ranked in the latest United Soccer Coaches West Region rankings released on Tuesday (Oct. 31). Missouri State sits No. 4 in the region, while Loyola (7th), Bradley (8th) and Valparaiso (9th) also appear in the poll.

Game Winning Machine

Evansville's Ian McGrath notched his fifth game-winning goal in a 2-1 overtime win over Central Arkansas Tuesday, finding the back of the net in the 100th minute. The five game-winning goals ranks second nationally behind Garrett McLaughlin of SMU (6).

Elite Defense

Missouri State goalkeeper Liam Priestley has posted nine shutouts this season and 23 in his career, which ranks him tied for second overall in school history. Missouri State sits second nationally in save percentage (.864) and third in shutout percentage (0.643) this season.

Against the Field

The MVC holds a winning record against three leagues in non-conference play (Horizon, Mid-American and Summit) and at least a .500 mark against another three (Atlantic Sun, Atlantic 10 and Conference USA).

Against the 2016 NCAA Field

The Valley won two matches and earned a draw against 2016 NCAA Tournament teams. Missouri State earned a 2-0 win in Springfield over Tulsa and Loyola beat SIUE 1-0. The Ramblers also earned a 0-0 draw vs. UIC. The MVC finished the non-conference season 2-6-1 against NCAA tourney teams from a year ago, going 2-1-1 at home.

Team Academic Honors

United Soccer Coaches announced on Oct. 5 the Team Academic Award Winners at the high school and college levels to recognize exemplary performance in the classroom during the 2016-17 academic year. College Team Academic Award recipients have a composite grade point of average of 3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale for all players on the roster.

Evansville's Ian McGrath and Loyola's Grant Stoneman represent the MVC on the watch list for the 2017 Missouri Athletic Club's (MAC) Hermann Trophy, presented to the top player in collegiate soccer. Double Digits In Sight

Tied for the distinction of most-improved team in the nation by W-L record, Bradley takes a 9-7-1 record into the final week of the regular season and the Braves have at least three chances at their 10th win ... The nine wins to date equals the most for the Braves since the 2013 squad finished a 14-7-2 campaign in the second round of the NCAA Tournament ... With one more win, Bradley will reach double-digits in the victory column for the 16th time in the program's 31-year history and the 15th time in Jim DeRose's 22 years as head coach.



Home Shutouts

Bradley has won seven of its 10 home games by shutout this season ... The Braves have allowed only three regulation goals in the 10 home games, a 29th-minute tally by Gonzaga Aug. 27 and two strikes by UIC Oct. 17 ... The five total goals allowed through 10 games represent the second fewest Bradley has surrendered at home for a season ... The Braves have completed their regular-season home schedule, but will return to the Shea Stadium pitch at least one more time when they host the MVC Men's Soccer Championship Nov. 7-12.

Illinois Six

Bradley will play its eighth game against an in-state rival Tuesday when the Braves visit Western Illinois ... A win would give the Braves a 6-2-0 record against in-state competition this season, which would equal the 2011 (6-0-0) team for the most wins against state rivals in program history ... With a 16-10-1 all-time record against Western Illinois, Bradley also will be trying to equal the most wins against any opponent (Eastern Illinois, 17-8-2) against a single opponent in program history.
