

NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Vanessa Markert (BRAD) - Markert scored a teamhigh 19 points on 8-for-14 shooting and led the Braves with seven rebounds and three blocks in 25 minutes as she helped Bradley to a 69-56 season-opening victory over Omaha. She was limited four points and three rebounds in seven minutes in the first half due to foul trouble as Bradley held a slim 23-22 lead at the break. In the second half, Markert made six of her final eight shots from the field and collected 15 points, four boards and three blocks over the final 20 minutes to help the Braves pull away down the stretch for the victory.

Sara Rhine (DU) - Poured in a team-high 19 points on 9-of-11 shooting and added eight rebounds in season opening win over Milwaukee ... first action for the Bulldogs since December 2017 after missing most of 2016-17 season due to injury ... added one steal against the Panthers ... scored a team-high 14 points in loss at No. 11/11 Oregon ... made 6-of-14 from the field ... added career-high three steals against the Ducks ... 2015-16 MVC Freshman of the Year ... 2015-16 All-MVC First Team.

Simone Goods (ILS) - Simone added a double-double in her first official game as an ISU Redbird with 22 points and 11 rebounds. She went 8-for-16 in the field and 6-for-9 at the free throw line. Despite Goods' efforts the Redbirds dropped to Oakland 64-43.

Ashley Taia (INS) - Taia paced the Sycamores in their season-opening game against Saint Louis with 22 points on just 6-of-9 shooting. The Brisbane, Australia product drained 3-of-4 shots from behind the arc in the game and collected two rebounds, two assists and a steal in the loss.

Kylie Giebelhausen (SIU) - Kylie Giebelhausen scored a game-high 25 points to lead SIU to an 84-72 season opening win over UT Martin on Friday, Nov. 10. Giebelhausen shot an efficient 10-of-14 (71.4%) from the field, including 3-of-5 from three-point range in the win, and added four steals, three assists and a blocked shot in 38 minutes. Her 10 field goals tied a career-best, while it marked the sixth time in her career that the Preseason All-MVC selection has scored 20-plus points. All told, it was the third-highest scoring output of her career.

Shunseere Kent (BRAD) - Kent had a big impact in her Bradley debut with the junior college transfer helping highlight Bradley's 69-56 season-opening victory over Omaha with 17 points, six boards and one assist. With the Braves holding a slim one-point lead at the half, Kent made 6-of-8 from the field in the final 20 minutes and scored 13 of her 17 points in the second half. She also had four rebounds and one assist after halftime. Kent's 17 points were the most by a Brave in their debut since Kelly Krumwiede had 22 points in the 2005-06 season opener against Illinois-Chicago.

Katie Van Scyoc (DU) - Scored a career-high 11 points on 4-of-6 shooting in just 10 minutes against No. 11/11 Oregon ... knocked down a career-best three three-pointers ... added one rebound and one assist ... had two points against Milwaukee.

Kailyn Strawbridge (LUC) - Loyola freshman guard Kailyn Strawbridge turned heads in her collegiate debut as the Ramblers opened the 2017-18 campaign on the road at Fort Wayne on Sunday afternoon. Strawbridge poured in a game-high 32 points, the most by a Rambler since 2015, on 12-of-22 shooting. The Rockford, Ill. native, who also grabbed three rebounds, knocked down four shots from beyond the three-point arc.

Makenzie Silvey (SIU) - Makenzie Silvey scored 15 points in her collegiate debut to help the Salukis earn an 84-72 win over UT Martin on Friday, Nov. 10. The Glen Carbon, III. native shot 50% (5-of-10) from the floor and 57% (4-of-7) from behind the arc. She also added an assist and a steal in 21 minutes of work.

Back on Campus

In its first game on campus since 2000, Evansville posted an 89-81 season-opening victory over Murray State on Sunday in Meeks Family Fieldhouse. The win is the Aces seventh seasonopening win in the past 11 years.

Noes How to Score

The New Girls Can Play

Evansville's Hannah Noe and Loyola's Kailyn Strawbridge each scored over 30 points in their respective season openers. MVC players topped 30 points on only seven occasions last season with four of those belonging to Jackie Stiles Player of the Year Lizzy Wendell. Strawbridge's 32 points against Fort Wayne is the top mark by a freshman nationally this season.

During opening weekend, the MVC had four players notch double-doubles their first time out on the court this season: Evansville's Kelsi Scott, Illinois State's Simone Goods, UNI's Megan Maahs and Southern Illinois' Abby Brockmeyer.

Looking for 2-0 Start

Bradley heads into Wednesday's matchup with Lincoln University with a 1-0 record after posting a 69-56 victory over Omaha to open the season. The Braves have not opened a season with backto-back wins since 2013-14 and the last time Bradley started a season with consecutive home victories was 2008-09 (21-10 overall).

20+ Assists in Opener

Southern Illinois dished out 20 assists in an 84-72 season opening win over UT-Martin, which marked the first time since the 1996-97 season that SIU has opened a season with that many assists. The Salukis notched 29 assists in a 95-63 win over Murray State on Nov. 23, 1996.

Mid-Major Top-25 Poll

Drake and UNI appeared in the preseason (Oct. 31) CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 earlier this fall. The Bulldogs sit third in the poll, while the Panthers are slotted 23rd. Drake and UNI are joined by Missouri State (77), which is receiving votes in the poll.

Home Court Streaks

Drake currently holds the longest active home winning streak in the Valley at 19, following a 77-73 win over Milwaukee Friday. The streak currently ranks fifth nationally.

Starters Returning

The MVC returns over 60% of its collective starting lineups, which includes seven All-MVC players from a season ago. Seven of the league's 10 teams return three or more starters from last year's team, led by Loyola (5), Missouri State (4) and Valparaiso (4).

Fruendt on Miller Watch List

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA announced that Missouri State senior Liza Fruendt is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2018 Cheryl Miller Award. Named after the three-time Naismith Player of the Year, the annual award in its inaugural year recognizes the top small forwards in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2018 Cheryl Miller Award will be narrowed to just 10.

Hoops In the Heartland

The 2018 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxSlayer Center in Moline, III., for the third year of a three-year contract with the Quad Cities Convention and Visitors Bureau.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

Looking for 2-0 Start

Bradley heads into Wednesday's matchup with Lincoln University with a 1-0 record after posting a 69-56 victory over Omaha to open the season. The Braves have not opened a season with back-to-back wins since 2013-14 and the last time Bradley started a season with consecutive home victories was 2008-09 (21-10 overall).



Home Court Advantage

Last week's season-opening home victory against Omaha improved Bradley to 30-13 (.698) all-time in home openers, which includes a 7-3 record in home openers over the last 10 years. The Braves have won six of their last seven games at Renaissance Coliseum dating back to last season and Wednesday's game will mark the 99th contest for Bradley in the facility. During that seven-game stretch, the Braves are 6-0 when committing 15 or fewer turnovers after just 11 turnovers against Omaha.

Strong Debut

Junior college transfer Shunseere Kent had a strong debut, making 6-of-8 from the field in the second half as she helped highlight the 69-56 victory over Omaha to start the season with 17 points. Kent's 17 points were the most by a Brave in a debut since Kelly Krumwiede tallied 22 points against Illinois-Chicago as a freshman to start the 2005-06 season. Kent also added six rebounds and one assist in the victory.
