Illinois State senior forward Hannah Green set a new career high twice this past week as she racked up 16 points at George Mason and then added 20 points in Sunday's win over UMKC, nearly posting a double-double in both games. The senior forward also added six total blocks this week and 19 total rebounds, bringing her season averages to 6.8 rebounds, 3.0 blocks

and 10.8 points per game. Green earned a double-double in the loss at George Mason with 16 points and 10 rebounds and led the Redbirds in scoring in both games played this week.

The Raymond, III. native finished 6-of-9 (66.7%) from the floor in a career-best 39 minutes in the victory, which marked the third-straight game

in which Brockmeyer has scored in double figures.

# **NOTEWORTHY**

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Vanessa Markert (BRAD) - Markert averaged a team-best 1.1.0 points per game in two games at the SEMO Thanksgiving Classic to go with 5.0 rebounds, 1.5 blocks and 1.5 steals per outing. In her first time coming off the bench this season, she helped the Bradley reserves score 35 points and she tallied five points, two boards and two blocks in 13 minutes in a victory over Nicholls State as the Braves opened a season with a 3-1 record for the first time since 2008-09. In the championship game of the tournament, Markert helped Bradley rally from a 17-point deficit to take a lead in the closing minutes as she finished with team highs of 17 points, eight boards, one assist, one block and a career-best three steals against SEMO. In fact, she had 13 points, five rebounds, one assist and two steals in the second half.

Sara Rhine (DU) - Averaged 17.7 points and 6.3 rebounds per game in three games last week ... poured in career-high 27 points, pulled down season-high 12 rebounds, swatted career-high three shots and added one assist in just 19 minutes in blowout win over Mississippi Valley State ... had 17 points on 7-of-13 shooting, grabbed four rebounds, handed out one assist and snagged one steal against George Mason in 25 minutes ... scored nine points and pulled down three rebounds against Wyoming in 22 minutes ... averaging team-best 16.0 points per game with 5.2 rebounds per game and shooting team-high 60 percent from the floor.

**Brooke Dossett (UE)** - Senior guard Brooke Dossett led the Purple Aces to a 79-53 victory over Westminster on Tuesday evening with a 21-point, 5-rebound, 5-assist performance... Dossett's 21 points are a season-high and second-most in her Evansville career...the win was the Purple Aces' 500th win in program history and helped push Evansville to .500 (2-2) on the season...with the win, UE extended its winning-streak in Meeks Family Fieldhouse to four games.

Ashley Taia (INS) - Senior forward Ashely Taia received Cancun Challenge All-Tournament Team honors after finishing the week shooting 44.4 percent (8-for-18) from the field and was an impressive 45.4 percent (5-for-11) in 3-point shooting. Her explosive shooting from downtown vaulted her to 35th in the nation so far this season in 3-point field goal shooting percentage as she is now hitting shots beyond the arc at a 50 percent rate this year. A native of Brisbane, Australia, Taia also tallied five rebounds, four assists, three steals and a block while scoring 21 points and averaging 28.5 minutes per game.

**Liza Fruendt (MSU)** - Liza Fruendt averaged 16 points, 2.5 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 2.0 steals in two games at the Junkanoo Jam, earning all-tournament honors. She scored 25 points on 10-for-21 shooting Friday against Penn, knocking down a trio of 3-pointers, grabbing five rebounds, and swiping three steals. Against No. 8 Baylor on Thanksgiving Day, Fruendt had seven points, three assists and a steal.

Megan Maahs (UNI) - Maahs earned two double-doubles and came one rebound shy of earning a third in her three outings for the Panthers this past week. Maahs averaged 11.6 points and 11.6 rebounds in last week's three road games, as the Panthers defeated Wyoming and lost two close contests to Creighton and UCF. The sophomore's best game came on the road against Creighton after posting 15 points and 14 rebounds, before UNI fell in double overtime to Creighton. Maahs also added three total assists and a block in the three games this past week.

**Nicole Martin (SIU)** - Martin scored 14 points and added six rebounds in SIU's overtime win over SEMO on Nov. 22. The Jefferson City, Mo. product did her damage at the charity stripe, as she set career-bests in both free throws made (8) and free throws attempted (13) in the victory. She has now reached double figures in scoring in all four of SIU's games this season, and five-straight games dating back to last season.

Caitlin Morrison (VALPO) - Pulled down a career-high 10 rebounds to go along with eight points in Valpo's first game of the week on Tuesday at Miami (Ohio). Followed with a strong defensive performance in Saturday's 80-75 win over Grand Canyon, reaching a career-high five blocks, the fifth of which came on a 3-point attempt that could have tied the game with less than 10 seconds remaining.

**Gabi Haack (BRAD)** - Haack came off the bench to average 6.5 points and 4.5 rebounds while shooting 50 percent from the field, including 60 percent from three-point range in a pair of outing at the SEMO Thanksgiving Classic. She provided a boost off the bench by connecting on 3-of-4 three-pointers in Friday's victory over Nicholls State as she matched a season-best with 11 points for the second straight contest. Haack also had five rebounds and one assist against the Colonels. In the championship game of the SEMO Classic, Haack had two points, four rebounds one steal.

Maddie Monahan (DU) - Scored seven points, handed out four assists and grabbed one steal ... had seven points and six assists against George Mason in 25 minutes ... scored three points, nabbed two steals, handed out two assists and pulled down one rebound against Wyoming in 26 minutes ... averaging 5.0 points and 4.0 assists per game in her first season.

Paige Saylor (ILS) - The freshman guard added 12 points, seven steals and four assists to guide the Redbirds to a 64-53 victory over UMKC on Sunday. Which is a personal best for her in every stat category this season. Her seven steals, ties for sixth most in ISU history. Saylor continues to put the most time on the court finishing this week with 73 minutes in two games.

Alexis Delgado (INS) - Alexis Delgado shot 45.5 percent (5-for-11) from the floor and averaged 6.5 points per game at the Cancun Challenge for Indiana State last week. A junior from Phoenix, Delgado added two rebounds, two assists and a steal while scoring 11 points in Indiana State's 57-45 win over Montana on Thursday.

**Jessica Cerda (LUC)** - Loyola graduate transfer Jessica Cerda finished with a team-high 12 points in the Ramblers' pre-Thanksgiving clash with Milwaukee this past Tuesday. The Streamwood, III., product came off the bench to knock down four of her eight attempts from beyond the three-point arc en route to leading the Maroon & Gold for a second time in as many games. Cerda currently ranks third on the team in scoring (7.0 ppg) and is operating at just over a 41% clip (7-of-17) from distance.

**Brice Calip (MSU)** - Brice Calip averaged 6.0 points, 3.5 rebounds and 2.5 assists in two games at the Junkanoo Jam in the Bahamas, adding two steals and a block. She shot 46 percent overall and 50 percent from 3-point land. Against eighth-ranked Baylor, Calip had five points, two rebounds and an assist. The next day against Penn, the redshirt freshman finished with seven points, five rebounds, four assists, two steals and a blocked shot.

**Nicole Konieczny (VALPO)** - Took over as the primary point guard when starter Hannah Schaub went down with an injury early in the game against Miami (Ohio) and did not return for Saturday's game against Grand Canyon. Konieczny dished out six assists on Tuesday before setting a season watermark with seven in her first career start on Saturday. Also went 6-for-6 at the free-throw line and scored eight points in Saturday's win over the Antelopes. Helped Valpo finish with just 10 turnovers as a team, its lowest total against a Division I opponent since December 2015.

#### **Power Five Up Ahead**

UNI's win over Iowa State is currently the MVC's only win over a Power Five opponent this season. This week, the MVC schedule features one game against a Power Five school as Drake will host Iowa State at the Knapp Center on Thursday.

#### **1,000 Career Points**

Kylie Giebelhausen scored 13 points against SIUE to eclipse the 1,000 career point plateau on Monday, Nov. 27. She became the 25th Saluki to reach the career milestone, and the East Peoria, III. native joins Valparaiso's Dani Franklin and Missouri State's Liza Fruendt as the only active players in the Missouri Valley Conference in the 1,000-point club.

## **Record Rebounding**

Drake pulled down 72 rebounds in the 96-60 blowout win over Mississippi Valley State. The 72 boards is a new Missouri Valley Conference and program record. The previous top rebounding total in the MVC was 68 by Missouri State in 2012 while the program record stood for 38 years with the 1979 team hauling in 67 against Iowa. In the win over Devillettes, three Bulldogs had 12 or more rebounds. Sara Rhine and Becca Jonas pulled down season-highs of 12 and 13, respectively, while Nicole Miller recorded her first career double-double with 11 points and 12 rebounds (career high).

#### **Senior Leaders**

Six league seniors are leading their respective teams in scoring, including Valpo's Dani Franklin (19.3 ppg), Evansville's Hannah Noe (16.8 ppg), Missouri State's Liza Fruendt (16.6 ppg), UNI's Kennedy Kirkpatrick (13.2 ppg), Indiana State's Ashley Taia (11.8 ppg) and Illinois State's Hannah Green (10.8 ppg). One other senior, Evansville's Brooke Dossett (15.5 ppg), also ranks amongst the Valley's top-5 in scoring.

# **Rivalry Renewed**

Wichita State may not be in the MVC anymore, but the Lady Bears will continue their annual home-and-home series with the Shockers over the next two weeks, beginning Wednesday in Wichita and ending Dec. 7 at JQH Arena. It's the first time since the 2009-10 season that MSU will play the same non-conference opponent twice. Missouri State won at Oral Roberts in December of that year and then defeated the Golden Eagles at home in the WNIT.

#### **Double Trouble**

UNI sophomore Megan Maahs turned in quite the performance to open the season, as she averages 10.6 points and 12.8 rebounds per game for the Panthers. Maahs has earned three double-doubles this season, which is tied for the 24th in the NCAA. For her career, Maahs has earned four double-doubles as a Panther. The sophomore has earned the last four double-doubles for UNI. The sophomore is second in the nation for her 9.0 defensive rebounds per game, while ranking seventh in the NCAA for total rebounds per contest with 12.8.

## **Mid-Major Top-25 Poll**

Drake and UNI appeared in the latest (Nov. 21) CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25. The Bull-dogs currently sit fourth in the poll, while UNI sits No. 24. Drake and UNI are joined by Missouri State (4), which is receiving votes in the poll.

#### **Home Court Streaks**

Drake currently holds the longest active home winning streak in the Valley at 20. The streak currently ranks third nationally.

#### **Power Five Win For Panthers**

Northern lowa claimed the MVC's first win over a Power Five opponent, beating lowa State 57-53 in Cedar Falls on Nov. 14. The win for UNI was its first over lowa State since 2002, as the victory snapped a 15-game streak for the Cyclones.

#### **Non-Conference**

The Valley currently holds a combined nonconference record of 19-27 (.413), but has finished at or above .500 in non-conference action in 17 of the past 25 seasons, including six of the last 10.

# **Against the Field**

The MVC holds a winning record and is unbeaten against four leagues in non-conference play, including the Big Sky (1-0), Big South (1-0), Southland (1-0) and WAC (2-0). The MVC holds at least a .500 mark against five other conferences: American Athletic (1-1), Big 12 (1-1), Mountain West (1-1), OVC (3-3) and SWAC (1-1).

## **Bulldogs Favored**

Drake was tabbed as the preseason favorite in the MVC Women's Basketball race in the annual survey of the league's coaches, SIDs and media.

#### **Fruendt on Miller Watch List**

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA announced that Missouri State senior Liza Fruendt is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2018 Cheryl Miller Award. Named after the three-time Naismith Player of the Year, the annual award in its inaugural year recognizes the top small forwards in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2018 Cheryl Miller Award will be narrowed to just 10.

## **Hoops In the Heartland**

The 2018 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxSlayer Center in Moline, Ill., for the third year of a three-year contract with the Quad Cities Convention and Visitors Bureau.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament

# **BRADLEY (3-2)**

#### **Good Start**

Friday's victory against Nicholls State gave Bradley its first 3-1 start to a season since 2008-09 and the last time the Braves posted at least three victories in the month of November was 2012-13. Despite Saturday's narrow setback at Southeast Missouri State, the Braves



are 3-2 to start a season for the first time since 2011-12. While the 3-1 start to the year marked the 15th time in 43 years Bradley started a season 3-1 or better, the Braves have done so just five times over the last 20 seasons including 2017-18.

## Turning Up the D

Date Onnonent

Bradley ranks fourth in the Missouri Valley Conference in scoring at 69.4 points per game, but it has been the defense that has been key to the early season success for the Braves. Through games of Nov. 26, Bradley ranks second in the nation in three-point field goal percentage defense with the Braves limiting opponents to just 19 percent shooting from beyond the arc. In fact, Southeast Missouri State was the first BU opponent to shoot better than 30 percent from three-point range this season, but SEMO attempted just eight three-pointers in the game. Only two of Bradley's last 10 regular-season opponents dating back to last season have shot better than 35 percent from three-point range with the Braves holding those foes to 23.9 percent shooting from long range and just 3.9 triples per outing.

### **Record Rebounding**

Drake pulled down 72 rebounds in the 96-60 blowout win over Mississippi Valley State. The 72 boards is a new Missouri Valley Conference and program record. The previous top rebounding total in the MVC was 68 by Missouri State in 2012 while the program record



stood for 38 years with the 1979 team hauling in 67 against lowa. In the win over Devillettes, three Bulldogs had 12 or more rebounds. Sara Rhine and Becca Jonas pulled down season-highs of 12 and 13, respectively, while Nicole Miller recorded her first career double-double with 11 points and 12 rebounds (career high).

#### **All Tournament Honors**

Rhine earned Rocky Mountain Hoops Classic All-Tournament honors with her impressive play in the two games. She started the tournament with 17 points, four rebounds, one assist and one steal against George Mason in 25 minutes. Rhine topped that performance in the big win over MVSU with a career-high 27 points on 9-of-16 shooting to go with a season-high 12 rebounds, career-tying three blocks and one assist in just 19 minutes.

#### **Home Sweet Home**

After playing four of their past five games on the road, the Bulldogs return to the Knapp Center on Thursday, Nov. 30 to host lowa State. The in-state rivalry game against the Cyclones is the first of five straight home games and seven of the next eight games that will be played at the Knapp Center. Drake's only road game during that time will be at lowa on Dec. 21. The team will then open Missouri Valley Conference play at home against Valparaiso (Dec. 29) and Loyola (Dec. 31).

The 21-point scoring performance was just three points shy of her career high with the Aces. Aside from scoring, Dossett has also added 3.8 rebounds per game and a team-best 3.8 assists per contest.

## **Hot From Long Range**

Missouri State made at least eight 3-pointers in each of the first four games of the season, including 11 versus No. 8 Baylor on Thanksgiving Day. The last time the Lady Bears hit eight or more treys in four straight games was Jan. 22-Feb. 5, 2016, tying for MSU's longest such streak since 2005.



### **Rivalry Renewed**

Wichita State may not be in the MVC anymore, but the Lady Bears will continue their annual home-and-home series with the Shockers over the next two weeks, beginning Wednesday in Wichita and ending Dec. 7 at JQH Arena. It's the first time since the 2009-10 season that MSU will play the same non-conference opponent twice. Missouri State won at Oral Roberts in December of that year and then defeated the Golden Eagles at home in the WNIT.

#### Rare Number On the Scoreboard

Thursday's game against No. 8 Baylor marked the first time in nearly 1,000 games that an MSU opponent scored 100 points in regulation. The last team to achieve the feat was Vanderbilt with 102 points on Dec. 29, 1985. In fact, not since 1989 had MSU allowed 100 points under any circumstance, with that coming in a Jan. 28, 1989 quadruple overtime loss to Indiana State.

# **UNI (2-3)**

#### **Double Trouble**

Sophomore Megan Maahs turned in quite the performance to open the season, as she averages 10.6 points and 12.8 rebounds per game for the Panthers. Maahs has earned three double-doubles this season, which is tied for the 24th in the NCAA. For her career,



Maahs has earned four double-doubles as a Panther. The sophomore has earned the last four double-doubles for UNI. The sophomore is second in the nation for her 9.0 defensive rebounds per game, while ranking seventh in the NCAA for total rebounds per contest with 12.8.

#### **Defenders of Warren**

UNI is 134-19 under the direction of head coach Tanya Warren when holding an opponent to 60 points or less. Five of UNI's top-10 scoring defense averages in school history have come during the Warren era, while the Panthers ranked second in the Valley last season after holding opponents to 58.3 points per game. UNI was 19-0 in 2016-17 when holding foes to 60 points or less, so far this season the Panthers are 2-2.

### Panther Sharp Shooters

UNI has knocked down 29-of-104 (27.9%) from 3-point land this season. The Panthers are averaging 5.8 made 3-pointers a game. Last season, the Panthers shot 250-848 (29.5%) from beyond the arc to average 7.6 made 3-pointers a game. Kennedy Kirkpatrick and Ellie Howell are tied for the most made 3-pointers on the team this season, while six shots knocked down.

#### **Two from 200**

Kylie Giebelhausen needs two three-pointers to reach 200 for her career. She will be just the third Saluki to make 200-plus three-pointers, joining Teri Oliver (2009-12; 235) and Rishonda Napier (2012-17; 277) as the only in program history to have accomplished the feat.
