

MVC Player of the Week

Kennedy Kirkpatrick, Sr., G, UNI

UNI senior guard Kennedy Kirkpatrick scored a career-high 24 points off the bench to lead the Panthers to a road win over Power-Five foe Kansas State, 72-71 on Thursday night. The senior also made a career-high seven three-pointers, which was only one shy of tying the school record for a game. Kirkpatrick scored the go-ahead basket with 2:11 remaining in the

game, before adding seven points in the final two minutes to lead the Panthers to victory. Kirkpatrick also added five assists and two rebounds. Kirkpatrick has now scored in double-figures six times this season.

Simone Goods, Jr., F, Illinois State

Illinois State junior Simone Goods was named the Beach Classic MVP following the Redbirds' championship win on Thursday. Goods led the Redbirds to their first pair of road wins this season as she racked up a double-double of 18 points and 11 rebounds against Long Beach State and led all scorers on Thursday with 23 points. Goods also added eight

rebounds and one assist in Thursday's win.



NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Vanessa Markert (BRAD) - Markert scored a season-high 24 points on 10-for-14 shooting as she helped highlight Bradley's rally attempt against Cleveland State. She added eight rebounds, one assist and two blocks against the Vikings. With Bradley trailing by 14 points early in the second half, Markert scored 10 of Bradley's next 11 points to highlight an 11-2 run which would pull the Braves within two points with 4:25 to play. Markert tallied 18 of her 24 points in the second half and added seven boards and two blocks in the final 20 minutes after playing just eight first-half minutes due to foul trouble.

Becca Hittner (DU) - Poured in a career-high 27 points in 79-66 loss at No. 25/25 lowa in team's only game of the week ... 21 points scored in the final two quarters ... added six rebounds, one assist, one block and on steal ... in two career games against the Hawkeyes, averaging 20.5 points, 8.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.0 steal per game ... this season is averaging 15.3 points, ranks 5th in MVC ... also averaging 4.7 rebounds per game.

Hannah Green (ILS) - Green shined in her home state as she led all scorers with 19 points and captured a career-high, netting three 3-pointers in the win over Long Beach on Wednesday. She added 13 points in the championship game on Thursday and was named to the Long Beach Classic All-Tournament team.

Wendi Bibbins (INS) - Wendi Bibbins averaged 14.5 points per game last week, shooting 54.2 percent from the field and bringing down 16 rebounds over a pair of non-conference games at the Hulman Center. She was credited with two blocked shots and one steal while playing a total of 66 minutes, including playing all 40 minutes against Miami (Ohio).

Katie Salmon (LUC) - Loyola senior Katie Salmon averaged 12.0 points and 8.0 rebounds as the Ramblers split a pair of games last week. In Tuesday's clash with Butler, the Wauwatosa, Wis. native finished only a rebound shy of a double-double, chipping in 12 points to go along with nine rebounds, two assists and a block. Salmon paced the Loyola attack in Friday's thrilling 57-55 win over UIC, finishing with 12 points, seven rebounds, two assists and a block. She has now reached double figures in scoring in three of Loyola's last five games.

Alexa Willard (MSU) - Alexa Willard continued her recent hot-shooting in Tuesday's game at Alabama, scoring 17 points on 7-for-12 from the floor, including 3-for-3 from beyond the arc. She added two assists, a rebound and a steal against the Crimson Tide as the Lady Bears nearly knocked off the SEC school in its home floor.

Nicole Martin (SIU) - Martin averaged 17.0 points and 4.5 rebounds against a pair of teams that made the NCAA Tournament a year ago at the Puerto Rico Classic. The Jefferson City, Mo. native was particularly effective at the charity stripe, as she shot 82.4% (14-of-17) from the free throw line. Martin scored a career-high 20 points in 22 minutes off the bench against the University of Albany on Dec. 19, and followed with 14 points on 5-of-6 shooting against the University of Miami on Dec. 20. It marked the 14th time in her career that the MVC All-Freshman Team selection from a year ago has scored in double figures.

Dani Franklin (VALPO) - Averaged 23.5 points per game during the week, helping Valpo secure a pair of important victories with wins over Eastern Illinois and Fort Wayne to close the nonconference season on a four-game winning streak. In addition to displaying her scoring prowess, Franklin made contributions in other areas, setting career highs in steals (five) and assists (five) in Monday's road win over Eastern Illinois while also leading the team in rebounds (eight) and setting a season high in points (28) in that contest.

Shunseere Kent (BRAD) - Kent had her highest scoring output since the season opener with 15 points to help lead Bradley against Cleveland State. Scoring in double figures for the second consecutive game, she notched her team-best fifth double-digit scoring output of the year as she made 5-of-8 from the field, including both of her three-point attempts. Kent also dished out a season-high three assists and had a steal in 24 minutes.

Alexis Delgado (INS) - Alexis Delgado sank five 3-pointers and scored 15 points against Butler last Thursday. The Phoenix was 5-for-7 from beyond the arc while nabbing three rebounds and being credited with a steal and an assist. Over the course of the week she was 39.1 percent from the field including 50 percent from 3-point land, averaging 12.0 points per game.

Abby O'Connor (LUC) - Loyola freshman Abby O'Connor continued her impressive debut campaign with a pair of strong outings last week, averaging 11.5 points and 6.5 rebounds in a pair of contests. O'Connor opened the week with a 12-point, eight-rebound performance in her home state as the Ramblers battled Butler in Indianapolis, Ind. last Tuesday. The South Bend, Ind. product overcame early foul trouble in Friday's 57-55 win over UIC to close the day with 11 points, five rebounds and a block. O'Connor, who has reached double figures in scoring in four of Loyola's last five games, currently ranks second on the team in scoring at 9.0 points per game and leads the Rambler roster in rebounding at 5.4 rebounds per game.

Brice Calip (MSU) - Brice Calip tallied nine points, five rebounds, two assists and a steal in Tuesday's narrow loss at Alabama. Calip played 31 minutes, finishing 3-for-9 from the floor and hitting a 30-footer at the halftime buzzer to help MSU's cause.

Nicole Konieczny (VALPO) - After missing last week's game due to illness, bounced back to play a key role while coming off the bench in a pair of wins this week. Averaged 7.5 points per game while doing a strong job taking care of the basketball as the Crusaders made just eight turnovers on Thursday, their lowest total against a Division I team since Dec. 12, 2015. Konieczny reached double figures for the second time in her career with 12 points against the Mastodons, one shy of a career best.

Quick Starts Crucial

Since 1982-83, just three teams (Missouri State, champions in 1998-99, 1994-95 and 1990-91; Drake, champions in 1996-97 and co-champions in 1987-88; and Evansville, a 2007-08 co-champion) have won at least a share of the regular-season title without winning its regular-season opener. In fact, 12 of the last 17 regular-season champs (or co-champs) have opened 2-0 or better in MVC play, with Evansville in 2007-08, Missouri State in 2004-05, UNI in 2010-11, Missouri State in 2011-12 and UNI in 2015-16 serving as the only five exceptions.

Title Town

The league has had nine different regular-season champions in the past 11 seasons (SIU-2007, DU/UE/ILS-2008, ILS-2009, ILS-2010, UNI-2011; MSU-2012; WSU/CU-2013; INS/WSU-2014; WSU-2015; UNI-2016; DU-2017). Bradley, Loyola and Valparaiso are the only league teams not to have won a regular-season MVC championship.

Bite Out of Little Apple

UNI claimed its second-straight win over Kansas State with a 72-71 win in Manhattan. The Panthers have now won two games against Big 12 opponents and currently have the 18th ranked strength of schedule according to WarrenNolan.com. UNI's non-conference opponents currently have an overall record of 65-33 (.663), which ranks 15th nationally.

Another Power Five Win

The Missouri Valley Conference recorded four wins over Power Five opponents during non-conference play this season. Last season, the MVC finished the non-conference schedule with six wins over members of Power Five conferences.

Beach Classic Champs

Illinois State captured the title at the Beach Classic with a win over Northeastern Thursday. The win gave the Redbirds a winning non-conference season for the first time since 2012-13 (8-4). Simone Goods was named the tournament MVP, scoring 23 points with eight rebounds in the win over the Huskies.

Perfect at the ARC

Valparaiso (5-0) remains the only team in the MVC with an unblemished record on its home court this season. It's the first 5-0 start at home for the Crusaders since 2007-08.

Stringing Wins Together

The Crusaders own a four-game winning streak, matching the program's longest of the last 11 seasons. It's the team's second four-game winning streak in the last decade as Valparaiso also won four in a row in 2015-16. A win over Drake would give Valpo five straight for the first time since the 2006-07 season. Valpo, which finished the non-conference portion of the year undefeated at home for the first time since 2007-08, has already nailed down a winning record in December, the team's first winning month during the regular season since December 2015. At 7-4, Valpo has its best record through 11 games since 2001 and its highest nonconference win total since 2006.

Leaders from Behind the Arc

Valpo sophomore guard Grace Hales currently ranks second nationally in three-point field-goal percentage (54.1%), connecting on 20 of her 37 attempts. Hales trails UConn's Kia Nurse (55.8%; 29-of-52).

Knocking Down Freebies

Evansville is among the best in the nation in converting opportunities at the charity stripe. On the year, the Aces currently sit third in the nation in free-throw shooting percentage, hitting 82.1% of its attempts from the line with seven players shooting 80% or better individually.

Dialin' From Distance

SIU senior Kylie Giebelhausen is continuing her climb up the Missouri Valley Conference three-point field goals made list. Napier has connected 25 times from behind the arc this season and sits No. 25 on the all-time Valley list.

Hoops In the Heartland

The 2018 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxSlayer Center in Moline, Ill., for the third year of a three-year contract with the Quad Cities Convention and Visitors Bureau.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

Valley History

One of the premier women's basketball leagues in the country, the MVC has seen an average of four league teams participate in postseason play in the last 20 seasons. The Valley has earned multiple NCAA Tournament bids in 11 different seasons, including a pair of bids to last season's NCAA Tournament. The league has also had two Final Four teams (Missouri State, in both 1992 and 2001), a WNIT champion (Missouri State, 2005) and three WNIT semifinal appearances (Illinois State, in 2011, 2010 and 2009).

Closing Non-Conference Slate

Bradley snapped a four-game losing streak in the final non-conference game of the year with last season's 65-56 victory at Illinois-Chicago to conclude the 2016-17 non-conference slate and will look to snap another streak when the Braves are the last Missouri Valley Conference team to finish its non-conference schedule



Dec. 28 against Western Illinois. The Braves will be shooting for their first home win to finish the non-MVC schedule since a home win against Western Illinois in 2011-12. Overall, Bradley is 23-11 all-time in the final non-conference game of the year, which includes an impressive 14-4 (.778) mark at home. The Braves are 13-7 when finishing the non-conference schedule after Christmas.

Filling It Up

Junior Vanessa Markert broke out of a small scoring slump in a big way with a season-best 24 points on 10-for-14 shooting last time out against Cleveland State. Markert had scored five points or less in four consecutive games and six of the last seven contests before her outburst. Dating back to last season, Markert owns Bradley's last three outings of 20 or more points. Her 10-for-14 shooting performance against Cleveland State marked the second time in her career she had 10 field goals and shot better than 70 percent in a game (vs. Loyola on 2/3/17). In fact, she is the seventh Bradley player to have two career outings with at least 10 field goals while shooting 70 percent from the field and the first Brave to do so twice since Kelsey Budd (2011-12 & 2013-14).

at the ARC in the program's first Horizon League game. The Crusaders will be tested right away, going on the road to play two teams that reached the NCAA Tournament last year to start Valley action.

Home Sweet Home

This weekend's destination will provide an experience that is simultaneously new and familiar for Valpo senior Dani Franklin. One of the most accomplished players in program history, Franklin will return to a place where she's played plenty of basketball games in the past – her home state of lowa – as Valpo matches up with Drake and UNI. While she is entering familiar territory, this will also mark the first time Franklin has played a college game in her home state. She'll be closest to home on Sunday against UNI, as Cedar Falls is located about 60 miles from Franklin's hometown of Cedar Rapids.

Stringing Wins Together

The Crusaders own a four-game winning streak, matching the program's longest of the last 11 seasons. It's the team's second four-game winning streak in the last decade as the Crusaders also won four in a row in 2015-16. A win over Drake would give Valpo five straight for the first time since the 2006-07 season. Valpo, which finished the nonconference portion of the year undefeated at home for the first time since 2007-08, has already nailed down a winning record in December, the team's first winning month during the regular season since December 2015. At 7-4, Valpo has its best record through 11 games since 2001 and its highest nonconference win total since 2006.
