

MVC Player of the Week

Sara Rhine, So., F, Drake

Drake sophomore forward Sara Rhine averaged 24.5 points, 7.0 rebounds, 1.5 blocks and 1.0 assist per game while shooting 42.8 percent (3-for-7) from the three-point line and 54.2 percent (19-of-35) from the floor during the week. In the win over Iowa State, Rhine scored 24 points behind a 10-for-14 shooting day, and pulled down six rebounds against

the Cyclones. She followed that effort with 25 points, eight rebounds, two assists and two blocks in a four overtime loss to Creighton. Rhine currently sits second in the MVC in scoring at 18.1 points per game.

MVC Newcomer of the Week

Hannah Noe, Gr., G, Evansville

In a pair of road contests against teams with a combined 8-4 record, graduate guard Hannah Noe continued her hot-shooting performance. The Dexter, Missouri native fueled a 12-6 run with back-to-back three-pointers as Noe tallied 13 points on 4-9 shooting from beyond the arc in the Aces' loss at Western Kentucky. On Saturday, Noe recorded the

second-best scoring outing of her career with 29 points, including six triples, in Evansville's 82-73 loss at Austin Peay. Noe leads the MVC in scoring and sits 71st in the nation averaging 18.2 points per game, while also topping The Valley in three-pointers made per game with 3.7 per contest, the 11th-best average in the nation.



NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Chelsea Brackmann (BRAD) - Brackmann averaged 8.5 points, 13.0 rebounds, 2.5 blocks and 2.0 steals per game as she helped Bradley split a pair of games against in-state opponents. She opened the week with her first double-double of the year, finishing with 10 points, 11 rebounds, three blocks and two steals to lead the Braves at Northern Illinois Wednesday. Brackmann followed it up with seven points, two blocks, two steals and a season-high 15 rebounds as she helped Bradley post a 58-48 victory over visiting Illinois-Chicago. The victory against UIC is believed to be the first time Bradley has won a game in which the Braves did not have a single player reach double figures in scoring.

Hannah Green (ILS) - Hannah added 16 points, nine rebounds and four blocks to help the Redbirds capture their third-straight home victory on Thursday. On Sunday she put up 18 points, 8 rebounds and 3 blocks against Butler. Green currently averages 3.2 blocked shots per game which ranks 9th in the nation and first in the Missouri Valley Conference. She has 19 total blocks this season which is the most in the MVC and ties for 22nd in the nation.

Tierra Webb (INS) - Tierra Webb led Indiana State last week as she shot 44 percent from the field and averaged 12 points per game for the Sycamores. She tallied eight rebounds, five steals and three assists in two contests for ISU while her five rebounds and four assists against Missouri S&T marked season highs.

Liza Fruendt (MSU) - Liza Fruendt scored 21 points on 7-of-16 shooting overall and went 7-for-8 from the foul line in MSU's lone game last week at Wichita State. The senior shot 64 percent from inside the arc, and added three rebounds and one assist in 35 minutes

Kennedy Kirkpatrick (UNI) - Kirkpatrick earned a careerhigh 21 points against North Dakota over the week, as the Panthers fell in a slim defeat on the road to the Hawks. The senior guard also dished out six assists, while recording a rebound and block. Kirkpatrick scored seven points against South Dakota State on Thursday, while earning seven rebounds and two assists. Overall this season, Kirkpatrick has scored in double-figures five times, while leading UNI with 13.4 points per contest.

Kylie Giebelhausen (SIU) - Kylie Giebelhausen averaged 16.7 points, 7.0 rebounds, 2.6 assists, 2.3 steals and 1.6 blocks per game in three games last week. The East Peoria, III. native shot 40% (16-of-40) from the floor, including 47.8% (11-of-23) from behind the arc and just missed out on a double-double against SIUE on Monday, as she finished with 13 points, nine rebounds, four assists and two blocks. She followed that effort with her second 20-plus point effort of the season at Morehead St, as she finished with 22 points, eight rebounds and made six three-pointers - a season-best. The Preseason All-MVC selection ended her week with 15 points and a career-high seven steals in SIU's win over Marshall, its first win over the Thundering Herd since 1993.

Meredith Hamlet (VALPO) - Scored a season-high 25 points on Sunday to lift Valpo to an 81-68 win over Longwood. Scored eight points or more in all three of Valpo's games this week. Shot 50 percent for the week from the field and 41.7 percent from beyond the arc.

Emily Marsh (BRAD) - Marsh was Bradley's top scorer last week, averaging 10.5 points per game off the bench, while shooting 47 percent from the field. She also averaged 1.0 assists, 2,0 blocks and one steal per game. She nearly doubled her season scoring output through the first five games of the season with a season-best 16 points off the bench on 7-for-14 shooting at Northern Illinois. Marsh added four rebounds, two blocks and one steal in the contest. In Saturday's victory Illinois-Chicago, she was 2-for-5 from the field and finished with five points, three boards, two assists, two blocks and a steal as she helped the Braves to a 58-48 victory, which is believed to be the first time Bradley has won a game in which the Braves did not have a single player reach double figures in scoring.

Maddie Monahan (DU) - Averaged 8.0 points and 4.5 assists per game while 50 percent (2-of-4) from the three-point line and 66.7 percent (7-of-9) from the field ... in the win over lowa State converted a four-point play late that tied the game at 80-80 ... finished with six assists to just one turnover against the Cyclones ... scored career-high nine points against Creighton ... ranks second in the MVC in assists at 4.1 per game ... averaging 5.8 points per game ... has started the past six games and played in all eight games this season.

Ty Battle (INS) - True freshman Ty Battle averaged 9.5 points per game last week and shot an impressive 67 percent from beyond the arc. She tallied 19 points in all including 15 points against Missouri S&T while bringing down a total of six rebounds, three assists and three steals over the course of the two-game week for the Sycamores.

Jessica Cerda (LUC) - Loyola graduate transfer Jessica Cerda reached double figures in scoring for the third time in the last four games as the Ramblers picked up their first victory of the season, defeating Chicago State by a final count of 46-28 at the Jones Convocation Center on Friday night. Cerda, who was playing against her former team, knocked down five of her eight attempts from beyond the three-point arc en route to finishing with a game-high 19 points. The Streamwood, Ill. native currently ranks fourth in the Valley in both three-point field goal percentage (0.441) and three-point field goals made per game (2.5).

Makenzie Silvey (SIU) - Makenzie Silvey averaged 11.0 points, 2.3 rebounds and 2.3 assists per game in three contests this past week. She opened her week by tying a career-high with 15 points against SIUE and followed with 14 points at Morehead State. She concluded the week with a career-high six assists in 14 minutes off the bench in SIU's 64-59 win at Marshall. The Glen Carbon, III. native has scored in double figures in five of SIU's seven games this season.

Nicole Konieczny (VALPO) - Has taken over as Valpo's starting point guard after upperclassman PG went down with an injury. Started the week with career highs in both points (13) and assists (8) against Bowling Green. Her eight assists in that game were the most by any Crusader since Hannah Schaub had nine on Dec. 3, 2016 against Eastern Illinois. Konieczny became the first Crusader to have eight or more assists and score double figures in the same game since Jessica Carr posted a double-double of 13 points and 11 assists on Jan. 21, 2015.

Power Five Ahead

The Missouri Valley Conference has two wins over Power Five opponents this season. UNI took down Iowa State, 57-53, in Cedar Falls and Drake claimed an 83-80 win at home over the Cyclones as well.

This week, the MVC schedule features four games against Power Five schools, including #20 Kentucky (Evansville), Nebraska (Drake), Purdue (Valparaiso) and Illinois (Indiana State).

Marathon Matchup

Drake equaled program history in its four-overtime, 108-100 loss to Creighton on Sunday, Dec. 3 at the Knapp Center. It was just the second four-overtime game in Drake history and the third in MVC/Gateway History (see below). The Bulldogs' back-and-forth marathon against the former MVC rival is the longest game in the NCAA this season. The 208 combined points is the fourth most points ever scored in a MVC game.

Elite Defense

Illinois State is ranked eighth nationally in scoring defense, allowing 52.2 points per game, and sits fifth nationally in field-goal percentage defense (31.4%). Only North Texas, Clemson, Green Bay and Illinois State appear in the Top 10 nationally in both categories.

Alone In the Books

Southern Illinois senior Kylie Giebelhausen recorded a career-high seven steals in the win over Marshall and, in doing so, eclipsed the century mark for career steals. She became the first player in program history with 1,000 points, 100 blocks and 100 steals.

Senior Leaders

Seven league seniors are leading their respective teams in scoring, including Evansville's Hannah Noe (18.2 ppg), Valpo's Dani Franklin (16.2 ppg), Missouri State's Liza Fruendt (15.6 ppg), Southern Illinois' Kylie Giebelhausen (14.7 ppg), UNI's Kennedy Kirkpatrick (13.4 ppg), Illinois State's Hannah Green (12.8 ppg) and Indiana State's Ashley Taia (10.2 ppg).

Double Your Pleasure

UNI's Megan Maahs is the only MVC player averaging a double-double this season. The sophomore is averaging 10.4 points and 11.0 rebounds per game (20th nationally). Maahs has a league-best three double-doubles on the season. Below are players with multiple double-doubles this season.

Home Sweet Home

Currently three MVC teams remain perfect at home: Bradley (3-0), Evansville (2-0) and Valparaiso (2-0) have unblemished records on their home courts this season. Evansville and Valparaiso will look to improve to 3-0 at home on Saturday (UE vs. Morehead State and Valpo vs. Chicago State).

Road Warriors

Southern Illinois claimed its third road win of the season over the weekend, beating Marshall 64-59. The win was the Salukis' first win at Marshall since 1993 and was the program's first win against a Conference USA opponent since 1996. SIU is the lone MVC team with a winning record on the road this season and holds three of the conference's five road wins.

Mid-Major Top-25 Poll

Drake appears in the latest (Nov. 28) CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25. The Bulldogs currently sit 13th in the poll, while UNI is receiving votes (25) in the poll.

Home Court Streak Snapped

Drake's 21-game home winning streak was snapped in Sunday's four overtime loss to Creighton. The impressive streak started on Feb. 5, 2016 with a win over Wichita State, included a 13-0 mark during the 2016-17 season and wins over Milwaukee, Liberty and lowa State this season. The streak was the third longest active streak in the NCAA behind UConn and Montana and the fourth longest in MVC history.

Non-Conference

The Valley currently holds a combined non-conference record of 26-42 (.382), but has finished at or above .500 in non-conference action in 17 of the past 25 seasons, including six of the last 10.

Against the Field

The MVC holds a winning record against four leagues in non-conference play, including the Big 12 (2-1), Big South (2-1), Southland (1-0) and WAC (3-0). The MVC holds at least a .500 mark against two other conferences: Big Sky (1-1) and Mountain West (1-1).

Warren Climbing Charts

UNI's Tanya Warren is the longest tenured coach in the MVC and is climbing the career wins chart for both MVC-only wins and all-game victories. Warren is two wins shy of tying Creighton's Jim Flanery for fifth in MVC history.

Starters Returning

The MVC returns over 60% of its collective starting lineups, which includes seven All-MVC players from a season ago. Seven of the league's 10 teams return three or more starters from last year's team, led by Loyola (5), Missouri State (4) and Valparaiso (4).

Fruendt on Miller Watch List

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA announced that Missouri State senior Liza Fruendt is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2018 Cheryl Miller Award. Named after the three-time Naismith Player of the Year, the annual award in its inaugural year recognizes the top small forwards in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2018 Cheryl Miller Award will be narrowed to just 10.

Hoops In the Heartland

The 2018 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxSlayer Center in Moline, Ill., for the third year of a three-year contract with the Quad Cities Convention and Visitors Bureau.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

Finals Break

Tuesday's game at Eastern Illinois will be Bradley's final contest before semester finals. The Braves are 19-11 in the last game before the finals break since 1987-88. During that stretch, the Braves have posted a 7-6 road record in the last game before finals. In fact, Bradley is



6-2 when playing a road game at an in-state opponent right before finals and boasts a 16-7 record over that same stretch when playing the last game before finals in the state of Illinois. In addition, BU has a 10-5 mark when facing an in-state opponent in the game before the finals break.

Crashing the Boards

Sophomore Chelsea Brackmann pulled down a season-best 15 rebounds in Saturday's victory against Illinois-Chicago and ranks third in the Missouri Valley Conference in rebounding at 8.3 boards per game. Brackmann has averaged 9.4 rebounds per game over the last five outings and has helped Bradley average a league-best 43.4 boards per game as a team. The Braves are perfect 4-0 on the year when owning an advantage on the glass, winning six consecutive games dating back to last season when outrebounding opponents.

Hitting the Century Mark

Saturday's game against Illinois-Chicago marked Bradley's 100th game at Renaissance Coliseum with the Braves extending their home win streak to four games. Bradley has won eight of its last nine home games dating back to last season and is 10-7 at home under head coach Andrea Gorski. The Braves have their most non-league home wins since 2012-13 (6) and have matched the longest win streak in Renaissance Coliseum history at four games. The Braves are 3-0 at home to start a season for the first time since 2008-09 (7-0 start). After the win against UIC, Bradley is 17-6 all-time on Saturdays at Renaissance Coliseum, which includes a 7-1 record in the last eight Saturday home contests.

Drake equaled program history in its four-overtime, 108-100 loss, to Creighton on Sunday, Dec. 3 at the Knapp Center. It is just the second-ever four-overtime game in Drake history with the first taking place on Jan. 23, 1993 against UNI at the Knapp Center. The Bulldogs won that game by a score of 112-06. The



Bulldogs' back-and-forth marathon against the former MVC rival is the longest game in the NCAA this season. The 208 combined points is the fourth most points ever scored in a MVC game.

Streak Snapped

One of the nation's most impressive home court winning streak ended with the loss to the Bluejays as Drake's 21-game home winning streak was snapped. The impressive streak started on Feb. 5, 2016 with a win over Wichita State, included a 13-0 mark during the 2016-17 season and wins over Milwaukee, Liberty and lowa State this season. The streak was the third longest active streak in the NCAA behind UConn and Montana and the fourth longest in MVC history.

In-State Win

Drake started last week with a thrilling 83-80 comeback win over lowa State. The Bulldogs led by as many as 11 points in the fourth quarter before the Cyclones stormed back to lead by four, 80-76, with just over two minutes left. Freshman Maddie Monahan converted a four-point play to tie the game at 80, Drake then forced a miss by lowa State and later with just two seconds left sophomore Becca Hittner converted her own three-point play to put Drake up 83-80. The Cyclones had one final chance to tie the game, but Hittner blocked Bridget Carlton's three-point attempt as the Bulldogs won for just the third time in the series since 2003. ISU holds a narrow lead, 29-28, in the all-time series.

Noe has twice record games of 29 points or more and currently leads the MVC in scoring with 18.2 points per game, good enough for 76th best in the nation. Noe has gotten it done primarily from beyond the arc where the Dexter, Mo. native leads the MVC in three-pointers per game (3.7), total three-pointers made (22), and three-pointers attempted (53) while ranking ninth nationally in three-pointers per game. Noe has been named conference player of the week once and newcomer of the week twice this season.

Accurate From Deep

It hasn't been just Noe knocking-down three-pointers for the Aces. Evansville ranks 34th nationally in three-point percentage (38.9%) and 83rd in the nation in three-pointers per game (7.3), sitting in the top three in the MVC in both categories.

ing from the field, as they held Chicago State to the fifth lowest single-game total for an opponent in program history.

Dialing In From Distance

Jessica Cerda continued the impressive start to her graduate year with the Ramblers in Loyola's convincing win over Chicago State. Cerda, playing against her former team, poured in a game-high 19 points and connected on five of her eight tries from beyond the three-point arc. The Streamwood, III. native currently leads the Ramblers in three-point field goal percentage (0.395) and ranks fourth in the Valley in three-point field goals made per game (2.4).

Hold On We Are Going Home

After making the trip west to DeKalb, III. for a Wednesday afternoon tilt with Northern Illinois, Loyola will return to the friendly confines of Gentile Arena for the first time since Nov. 18 when it hosts perennial Horizon League power Green Bay. Scouting the Mavericks

UNO finished last season with a 16-15 mark and 8-8 in league play. So far this season, the Mavericks are 6-2 and are riding a six-game winning streak. UNO began the season with losses to Bradley and Kansas State on the road before reeling off six-straight wins.



Wednesday's game will mark the first meeting between the Panthers and Mavericks since 1982.

Defenders of Warren

UNI is 134-20 under the direction of head coach Tanya Warren when holding an opponent to 60 points or less. Five of UNI's top-10 scoring defense averages in school history have come during the Warren era, while the Panthers ranked second in the Valley last season after holding opponents to 58.3 points per game. UNI was 19-0 in 2016-17 when holding foes to 60 points or less, so far this season the Panthers are 2-3.

UNI Controls the Glass

This season, the Panthers rank third in the MVC with 3.1 rebounding margin over opponents. UNI has out rebounded five foes this season, with the highest margin of 18 coming against Wyoming earlier in November. The Panthers are averaging 40.7 rebounds per contest, which ranks second in the MVC.

Kylie Giebelhausen recorded a career-high seven steals in the win over the Thundering Herd and, in doing so, eclipsed the century mark for career steals. She became the first player in program history with 1,000 points, 100 blocks and 100 steals.
