MVC Offensive Player of the Week

Conor Ingram, Jr., F, Missouri State

Missouri State junior Conor Ingram netted two goals during the week to lead the Bears to a pair of wins. The first came at the 56-minute mark in the opening MVC match against Central Arkansas when Ingram scored off a shot deflection to tie the match. In Saturday's win over Oral Roberts, Ingram scored the game-winner in the 88th minute, scoring off an assist from Harry Lewis. In the two matches this week Ingram led the team with two goals, four shots on goal and six total shots.

On the season Ingram has accumulated eight shots on goal, three goals and 12 shots with a .66 shot on goal percentage.

MVC Defensive Player of the Week

Brandon Barnes, Sr., GK, Bradley

Bradley senior Brandon Barnes posted his third and fourth shutouts of the season, leading the Braves to a pair of wins last week. Barnes made two saves in Bradley's 1-0 win Wednesday against Loyola to open conference play with a win against the defending league champion. Barnes came through with seven more saves in Saturday's 3-0 win against Fort Wayne to secure Bradley's fourth consecutive home shutout. During his four years at Seton Hall, Barnes played just 672 minutes during

eight games in his sophomore season. The graduate transfer now has eclipsed that total by playing all 737 minutes in Bradley's first eight games this season, posting four shutouts, a 0.86 goals against average and a 0.841 saves percentage.

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NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's player of the week selections, several conference players had notable performances, and they include:

Roman Schindler (BRAD) - After firing off three shots in Wednesday's 1-0 win in Bradley's MVC opener versus Loyola Chicago, a 1-0 win, Schindler record points on all three goals in Saturday's 3-0 win against Fort Wayne to reclaim the team's early-season scoring lead ... Schindler's 5-point night included his first career game-winner by heading home a Frank Bak service at 31:48 ... Schindler added insurance with a second header goal at 52:56, then assisted Frank Bak's 64th-minute tally to complete the scoring ... The 6-foot-2 transfer from Indiana Tech leads the Braves and ranks second in The Valley with his four goals and 11 points on the season.

Jonas Engler (VALPO) - Engler's first career goal was a memorable one - a golden goal in the 106th minute to lift the Crusaders to a 3-2 overtime victory over Drake on Saturday and propel Valpo back into sole possession of first place in the Missouri Valley Conference. Engler's goal was an impressive one, as it was shot from 32 yards from the far sideline and found the near corner of the net. Engler had attempted just three shots in his career before Saturday's match-winner.

Frederik Reimer (UE) - After rehabilitating from an injury early in the season, Reimer saw his first two starts in goal. On the road at Butler, Reimer made six saves, allowing one goal, in the 1-0 loss as the Denmark native preserved the one-goal deficit as the Aces had a flurry of chances late but could not convert in the 1-0 loss. Returning home to face Eastern Illinois, Reimer earned his first shutout of the season and sixth of his career, making three saves, in a 2-0 victory for the Aces. In 235 minutes in goal this season, Reimer holds a 0.76 goals-against average with 13 saves.

Liam Priestley (MSU) - Priestly recorded his third shutout of the year against Oral Roberts Saturday night. Priestley marked five saves against ORU and kept the Golden Eagles scoreless. ORU got off nine shots with none finding home. To open MVC play against Central Arkansas, Priestley recorded four saves in the double overtime contest. He gave up one goal in the first half, but kept UCA scoreless the rest of the game to give the Bears. Priestley has only allowed four goals all season though six games. Priestley paces the conference in goals against average (.624) and save percentage (.862).

Chavez Brooks-Robinson (VALPO) - Made an athletic sliding save after a Drake player chipped one past the Valpo goalkeeper that was ticketed for the back of the net in the 21st minute. That play proved to be an important one, as it kept the match scoreless in Valpo's eventual 3-2 overtime victory over Drake. Without that play, the match would not have reached overtime.

MVC SOCCER NOTES

MVC in Regional Rankings

The MVC has four teams currently ranked in the latest NSCAA West Regional rankings released on Tuesday. Evansville sits No. 6 in the region, while Bradley (7th), Missouri State (8th) and Valparaiso (9th) also appear in the poll.

Against the Field

The MVC holds a winning record against four leagues in non-conference play (Atlantic Sun, Conference USA, Horizon and Summit) and at least a .500 mark against another three (American Athletic, Atlantic 10 and Mid-American).

Against the 2016 NCAA Field

The Valley has won one match against 2016 NCAA Tournament teams. Missouri State earned a 2-0 win in Springfield over Tulsa. The MVC sits 1-3 against NCAA tourney teams from a year ago with five more chances on the non-league schedule. This week Loyola hosts SIUE on Saturday.

High Scoring Aces

Evansville ranks in the Top 10 nationally in seven different categories and leads the nation in shots on goal per game (8.7), while ranking second nationally in total goals with 19. Wake Forest currently leads the nation with 22 goals scored.

Hermann Trophy Watch List

Evansville's Ian McGrath and Loyola's Grant Stoneman represent the MVC on the watch list for the 2017 Missouri Athletic Club's (MAC) Hermann Trophy, presented to the top player in collegiate soccer. The Valley is one of six conferences nationally to have two or more players represented, joining the ACC (7), Big East (2), Big Ten (4), Pac-12 (3) and Western Athletic (3). A total of 31 NCAA Division I men's soccer players appear on the list.

More Preseason Accolades

Evansville's Ian McGrath and Loyola's Grant Stoneman also earned preseason honors from College Soccer News. The Valley tandem earned spots on the publication's Preseason All-America Second Team. Stoneman also earned honors as a Third-Team Preseason Best XI selection by TopDrawerSoccer.com.

Four-Straight Home Shutouts

Bradley has won its last four home games in shutout fashion, including three of the four games by 3-0 scores ... The home shutout streak is Bradley's longest since winning the first four home games of the 2015 season by 1-0 scores ... When the Braves host Drake Sept. 30, they will seek a fifth consecutive home shutout for the first time since setting the program record with five straight clean sheets at Becker Park to open the 1997 season.



DeRose's 100th vs. In-State

By dropping Loyola Chicago, 1-0, this past Wednesday at Shea Stadium, Bradley improved to 3-0-0 versus in-state competition this season ... In his 22nd year as Braves head coach, Jim DeRose is 64-28-7 (.682) all time against 11 teams from Illinois ... DeRose will coach his 100th game versus an in-state rival Wednesday when the Braves visit DePaul ... DeRose is 3-0-0 in his career against the Blue Demons, though all three games were played at Shea Stadium ... Including Wednesday's trip to Chicago, Bradley has at least five games remaining versus in-state competition this season.

SportsCenter Moment

Bradley freshman forward Younes Dayekh scored the game-winning goal with a 20-yard, left-footed laser to beat Loyola Chicago Wednesday night at Shea Stadium ... Dayekh's third game-winner of the young season was featured on Thursday morning's ESPN SportsCenter as a "Near Top 10" play ... Dayekh added his first career assist in Saturday's 3-0 win against Fort Wayne and is second on the team with seven points in through his first eight college games.

Tough In Net

Sophomore Marc Olsen proved once again that he is one of the best keepers in the league on Wednesday night. Though the Bears lost 2-1, Olsen made the initial save on both of Missouri State's goals, including stopping Conor Ingram's penalty shot in the second overtime period. Since taking over as UCA's starter last season, Olsen has faced four penalty kicks and allowed the goal on just one of them, limiting UCA's opponents to a conversion rate of just 25%. In the same time frame, all MVC keepers have allowed 13 makes on 20 attempts, for a rate of 65%.



OT Struggles

With Wednesday's overtime loss to Missouri State, the Bears dropped to 0-2 in overtime matches this season. Since moving to Division I for the 2006 season, the Bears are 7-19-16, for a winning percentage of .357.

Valley Play

Central Arkansas will head to Valparaiso, Indiana for its only match this week, taking on new Missouri Valley member Valparaiso for the first time in program history. The Bears enter the match with a 1-4 record all-time in the state of Indiana, with their lone win coming at Butler (Indianapolis, Ind.) in 2012.

Drake earned its first win of the season with its 1-0 victory at Green Bay last week. Paul Ciszewski, who is from Germantown, Wis., scored his first goal of the year in the 51st minute as the Bulldogs held off the Phoenix.



First Time Finding the Net

Freshman Leroy Enzugusi, who scored a team-leading three goals in the preseason, recorded his first career goal in Saturday's 3-2 loss to Valparaiso. His goal was impressive as he took a deflected Crusaders' corner kick and went the distance of the field to score the match's first goal.
