MVC Player of the Week

Sara Rhine, So., F, Drake

Drake sophomore Sara Rhine helped the Bulldogs earn home wins over Indiana State and Evansville to sit alone in first place in the MVC. Rhine averaged 23.0 points, 9.0 rebounds, 2.0 blocks and 1.0 steal while shooting 56.2 percent from the floor (18-of-32) and 75 percent from the free throw line (9-of-12). In the win over Indiana State, Rhine scored a game-high 22 points behind a 9-of-17 shooting performance, and she made 6-of-7 free

throws, and added 10 rebounds for her fourth double-double of the season. She followed that effort with another near double-double with 22 points and eight rebounds against Evansville. Rhine made 9-of-14 shots and added two blocks.

Brice Calip, Fr., G, Missouri State

Missouri State freshman Brice Calip averaged 13 points on 63 percent shooting overall and 60 percent from 3-point land, adding 4.0 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 1.5 steals per game in a pair of road wins. Sunday, Calip shot 6-for-9 from the floor for a career-high 16 points, with six boards, two assists and three steals in a victory at Bradley. Friday at Illinois State.

Calip shot 4-for-7 overall and 2-for-4 from long range, finishing with 10 points, three assists, two rebounds and a blocked shot at Illinois State.



NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Anneke Schlueter (BRAD) - Schlueter averaged a team-best 16.0 points per game, while shooting 46% from the field, including 5-of-9 from three-point range and collected 5.0 rebounds and 2.5 steals in Bradley's first two home Valley games of the year. She helped Bradley rally from 15 points down against Southern Illinois to take a lead in the final minute with 14 points and three steals off the bench. Schlueter was 2-for-5 from beyond the arc and a perfect 6-for-6 from the free throw line against the Salukis. Sunday against Missouri State, she tied for game-high honors with a season-best 18 points on 7-of-10 shooting. Schlueter also had a career-best nine rebounds and added a block and two steals against the Bears as she moved into a tie for 23rd in career scoring at Bradley.

Megan Talbot (ILS) - Megan captured her first career double-double of the season in the 49-46 victory over SIU on Sunday with 12 points and 12 rebounds. Over the weekend, Talbot put up a combined 18 points, 21 rebounds and three blocks.

Wendi Bibbins (INS) - Wendi Bibbins averaged 14.0 ppg while averaging 33.0 minutes of action ... Tallied 19 total rebounds, 3 blocks and 4 steals ... Brought down 8 offensive boards against unbeaten Drake ... Also tallied a double-double against Drake (18 points, 10 rebounds).

Abby O'Connor (LUC) - Loyola freshman Abby O'Connor led all scorers in the Ramblers clash with Valparaiso on Friday evening at the Athletics-Recreation Center, pouring in 16 points. Fresh off earning MVC Newcomer of the Week honors last Monday, the South Bend, Ind. product reached double figures in scoring for a team-best nindt time while also collecting six rebounds, the top mark for a Rambler, dishing out an assist and recording a season-high tying three blocks. O'Connor currently leads the Loyola roster in both scoring (10.6 ppg), rebounding (5.5 rpg) and blocks (1.2 bpg).

Megan Maahs (UNI) - Maahs played a crucial role in both UNI wins over the weekend, with the Panthers downing Evansville and Indiana State. Against the Purple Aces, Maahs scored four points and grabbed 14 rebounds, while also earning a career-high five blocks to lead the defensive charge. Against the Sycamores, Maahs earned her eighth double-double of the season after scoring 12 points and earning 13 rebounds, the sophomore also dished out three assists and recorded three steals to fill out the stat sheet. Maahs also came up clutch against Indiana State, by sinking two free throws with under 30 seconds to play, giving the Panthers a three-point cushion. Dani Franklin (VALPO) - Had 14 points in Valpo's only game of the week, a 76-60 home win over Loyola on Friday night. Moved into second on the school's all-time scoring list and became just the second player in program history to reach 1,500 career points. Finished one rebound shy of a double-double with nine boards. Was one of five Valpo players in double figures in the victory.

Gabi Haack (BRAD) - Haack averaged 11.5 points, and a team-best 6.0 rebounds in the first two home MVC games of her career. She was 8-for-14 from the field (57.1 percent), including 5-of-9 from three-point range (55.6 percent). Haack was 3-for-5 from beyond the arc against Southern Illinois, finishing with 11 points, three rebounds and two assists in 33 minutes of action as she helped Bradley rally from 15 points down to take a lead in the final minute. She followed it up with 12 points and nine rebounds Sunday against Missouri State. Haack was 5-of-8 from the field and 2-for-4 from three against the Bears, also adding one block and one steal as she scored in double figures for the third consecutive game. Her 29 three-pointers now rank fourth among Bradley freshman records.

Maddy Monahan (DU) - Maddie Monahan continues to play well in her first season as the starting point guard as she committed just one turnover to seven assists in the two wins. In Drake's victories, Monahan averaged 7.5 points, 3.5 assists and 1.5 rebounds per game while shooting 71.4 percent from the floor (5-of-7), 1.000 percent from behind the three-point line (2-of-2) and 1.000 percent from the free throw line (3-of-3). Against Indiana State, she made all three of her shots, handed out three assists with just one turnover and added three rebounds. In the win over the Purple Aces, she scored eight points behind making both of her three-point attempts, and handed out four assists with zero turnovers. In her first season, Monahan is averaging 5.8 points and 3.2 assists per game.

Paige Saylor (ILS) - Paige Saylor led the Redbirds and captured a career high on Friday of 15 points, going 6-for-8 from the field and shooting 100 percent behind the arc. The freshman guard also snuck away with four steals and dished out two assists in the 56-50 loss to Missouri State. Saylor aided the team to their first MVC victory on Sunday adding 10 points, three assists and three rebounds. Saylor sunk a 3-pointer in the last five minutes of the SIU game, that gave the team their first and last lead. Illinois State never looked back and secured a 49-46 victory.

Ty Battle (INS) - Averaged 6.5 points, 4.0 rebounds in two games while making one start ... Shot 54.5 percent from the floor (6-for-11) ... Totaled 3 steals and 1 block.

Karli Rucker (UNI) - Rucker was a key factor coming off the bench in both UNI wins this past weekend, as the Panthers took care of Evansville and Indiana State at home. Against the Purple Aces, Rucker scored nine points, while dishing out four assists and recording a career-high three steals. Rucker followed up Friday's performance with a five-point outing against the Sycamores on Sunday, while grabbing three rebounds and adding two assists.

Bryce Blood (VALPO) - Posted her second double-double of the season and first against a Division I opponent in Friday's home win, becoming the first ever Valpo player to turn in a double-double in Missouri Valley Conference play. Racked up 12 points to go along with a team-high 10 rebounds. Owns two of Valpo's three double-doubles this season.

Valley Streak Continues

Drake has the longest win streak in the MVC era for regular season MVC contests. With the road win at Missouri State, Drake set the new all-time mark at 25, surpassing the Lady Bears record of 24-straight wins set in 2000. The impressive streak started Feb. 26, 2016 with a win over Loyola. The Bulldogs are currently nine wins shy of tying SIU's 37 game streak from 1985-1987 during the Gateway era.

Elite Defense

Illinois State is ranked 8th nationally in scoring defense, allowing 54.6 points per game, and sits 7th nationally in field-goal percentage defense (34.2%). The Redbirds join five other teams that appear in the Top 10 nationally in both categories (Baylor, UConn, Campbell, Duke, Green Bay).

Valley Home Streak

Drake has the longest current home win streak for MVC contests, winning its last 17 at the Knapp Center. The streak began with an 81-59 win over Wichita State on Feb. 5, 2016. The last MVC loss at home for the Bulldogs was a 79-73 setback to UNI on Jan. 24, 2016.

Against the Field

The MVC held a winning record against six leagues during non-conference play, including the Big 12 (2-1), Big South (2-1), Big West (1-0), Colonial (1-0), Southland (1-0) and WAC (4-0). The MVC held at least a .500 mark against four other conferences: American (2-2), Big Sky (1-1), Mountain West (1-1) and SWAC (1-1).

Scheduled Tough

Missouri State leads the league with a non-conference strength of schedule of 16. Two other league schools, including Drake (No. 19) and UNI (No. 30), also have schedules that rank in the top-30. The MVC is one of only four leagues to have at least three teams ranking in the top 30 of non-conference schedule strenghth, joining the Big Ten, Big East and Pac 12.

Power Five Wins

The Missouri Valley Conference recorded four wins over Power Five opponents during non-conference play this season. Last season, the MVC finished the non-conference schedule with six wins over members of Power Five conferences.

Home Sweet Home

Since 2002, home teams have won at least 55 (.611) of the 90 league contests in all but six seasons (2003-04, 2006-07, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2015-16, 2016-17). The most wins by home teams in league play came in 2008 (61-29 at home in conference play). The league was 51-39 (.567) at home in league play last year, and has compiled a 15-12 (.556) mark so far in 2017-18.

Quick Starts Crucial

Since 1982-83, just three teams (Missouri State, champions in 1998-99, 1994-95 and 1990-91; Drake, champions in 1996-97 and co-champions in 1987-88; and Evansville, a 2007-08 co-champion) have won at least a share of the regular-season title without winning its regular-season opener. In fact, 12 of the last 17 regular-season champs (or co-champs) have opened 2-0 or better in MVC play, with Evansville in 2007-08, Missouri State in 2004-05, UNI in 2010-11, Missouri State in 2011-12 and UNI in 2015-16 serving as the only five exceptions.

Title Town

The league has had nine different regular-season champions in the past 11 seasons (SIU-2007, DU/UE/ILS-2008, ILS-2009, ILS-2010, UNI-2011; MSU-2012; WSU/CU-2013; INS/WSU-2014; WSU-2015; UNI-2016; DU-2017). Bradley, Loyola and Valparaiso are the only league teams not to have won a regular-season MVC championship.

Milestone Win for Warren

UNI's Tanya Warren is the longest tenured coach in the MVC and is climbing the career wins chart for both MVC-only wins and all-game victories. Warren took sole possession of fifth place on the list with a win over Loyola, passing Creighton's Jim Flanery.

Fruendt on Miller Watch List

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA announced that Missouri State senior Liza Fruendt is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2018 Cheryl Miller Award. Named after the three-time Naismith Player of the Year, the annual award in its inaugural year recognizes the top small forwards in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2018 Cheryl Miller Award will be narrowed to just 10.

Senior CLASS

Southern Illinois' Kylie Giebelhausen was named a candidate for the 2017-18 Senior CLASS Award. Giebelhausen is among 30 NCAA Division I candidates in women's basketball for the award which recognizes notable achievements in four areas of excellence – community, classroom, character and competition.

Hoops In the Heartland

The 2018 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxSlayer Center in Moline, Ill., for the third year of a three-year contract with the Quad Cities Convention and Visitors Bureau.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

Valley History

One of the premier women's basketball leagues in the country, the MVC has seen an average of four league teams participate in postseason play in the last 20 seasons. The Valley has earned multiple NCAA Tournament bids in 11 different seasons, including a pair of bids to last season's NCAA Tournament. The league has also had two Final Foureams (Missouri State, in both 1992 and 2001), a WNIT champion (Missouri State, 2005) and three WNIT semifinal appearances (Illinois State, in 2011, 2010 and 2009).

Road Streak

Bradley will put a three-game road win streak on the line Friday at Indiana State as the Braves look to win four consecutive road games for the first time since winning eight consecutive road games between the end of the 2010-11 season and 2011-12 campaign. With four road wins on the year, Bradley could surpass last



year's road win total with a victory this weekend at either Indiana State or Evansville. The last BU season with five or more road wins was 2012-13 and Bradley has not had four road league wins since 2009-10 (4).

Close Calls

Three of Bradley's last four games have been decided by six points or less and the Braves have had a total of five games with a final margin of six points or fewer. Bradley has made a habit of coming back from double digit deficits in 2017-18 and Friday's MVC home opener against Southern Illinois was no different with the Braves erasing a 15-point deficit to take a lead in the final minute. In fact, BU has trailed by at least 14 points in three of the last four home games only to pull within one point in the final minute or win the contest. In four of the seven losses this season Bradley has come back from 14 points down to either own a lead in the final two minutes twice (at SEMO & vs. SIU) or cut it to a one-possession contest in the final six minutes two times (at Illinois & vs. Cleveland State). The lone exceptions have been at then 21st-ranked Green Bay, Missouri State and at Northern Illinois. In the Missouri State loss Sunday, Bradley had a two-point lead at the midway point of the fourth quarter.

Century Mark...Again

Drake blitzed Evansville, 107-66, in its last victory. The 107 points are the most scored against an MVC opponent since the 1996-97 Drake team dropped 106 on Creighton on Jan. 27, 1997. This season, Drake hit 100 points in the tough four-overtime loss to the Bluejays on Dec. 3 and then surpassed it in the next game, a 102-25 blowout win, over lowa Wesleyan on Dec. 5.



Sharing the Ball

Under head coach Jennie Baranczyk, Drake has ranked in the top 10 in team assists per game in each of the past four seasons. After the Jan. 14 win over Evansville when the Bulldogs handed out 32 assists, the Bulldogs jumped from fourth to second in the nation in team assists at 22.8. Drake now only trails UConn, who is has the top mark at 22.9 assists per game. In Drake's wins versus Indiana State and Evansville over the weekend, the team recorded 58 assists on 72 field goals.

Jack of All Trades

Junior Sammie Bachrodt, a preseason All-MVC selection, has helped share the basketball all season for the Bulldogs and to a bit of everything else. Bachrodt ranks second in the MVC in assists per game at 4.1 and leads the league in assists/turnover ratio at 2.5. She nearly recorded a triple-double in the win over Indiana State on Jan. 12 with nine points, nine rebounds and seven assists. Bachrodt's name is also found among the MVC leaders in scoring (10.9, 13th), steals (1.9, 3rd), field goal percentage (44.3, 7th), three-point percentage (34.7, 13th), three-pointers per game (1.8, 6th) and is just outside the leaders in rebounding at 4.2 boards per game.

Stein, a Peoria, III. native, moved to 14-1 all-time in her coaching career against the Braves. Stein's next win will mark the 350th of her coaching career.



Double-Doubles

Abby Brockmeyer recorded her fourth career double-double in the win at Bradley on Jan. 12 with 12 points and 13 rebounds. It is tied for the third-most double-doubles by a freshman in school history, as Alexus Patterson and Bridgett Bonds each tallied four during their respective freshman seasons.

Limiting Turnovers

The Salukis recorded eight turnovers in the win over Bradley and tallied just nine turnovers against Illinois State on Sunday. In doing so, it marked the first time since the 1992-93 season that SIU has recorded less than 10 turnovers in back-to-back games. Southern last accomplished the feat against Bradley and Illinois State ironically, as SIU recorded just nine turnovers against Bradley on Jan. 14, 1993 and only nine turnovers two days later in a 73-64 win over Illinois State on Jan. 16, 1993.

1,500 Point Club

Dani Franklin reached her most noteworthy milestone yet last weekend against Loyola. The senior forward scored 14 points in that contest, adding to her ever-growing Valpo legacy by usurping Sarrah Stricklett (1,498) for second on the program's all-time scoring



list. In the process, she hit the 1,500 career point milestone, joining only Valpo legend Debbie Bolen in that elite club. Franklin is the Missouri Valley Conference's active career leading scorer and one of three active players in the conference with over 1,000 career points, joining Missouri State's Liza Fruendt (1,392) and Southern Illinois' Kylie Giebelhausen (1,127).

Five In Double Figures

Perhaps the most impressive aspect of last week's 76-60 win over Loyola was that five Crusaders finished in double figures for the first time this season. In fact, you have to go all the way back to March 10, 2016, a memorable 94-91 overtime win over Detroit Mercy in the first round of the Horizon League Tournament, for the last time a Crusader team had five players finish in double figures in a single game. The last time it occurred in a regulation game was Dec. 21, 2015, an 88-22 win over IU Kokomo. That last time it happened in a regulation game against a Division I opponent was Feb. 25, 2015, a 77-70 loss to Cleveland State. None of the five who scored in double figures that game against the Vikings are still with the program.

Season Checkpoint

Valpo owns a winning record through 16 games for the first time since 2008-09, when Valpo also held a 9-7 mark at this point in the year. Coincidentally, the 16th game of that season was also against Loyola, with the Crusaders beating the Ramblers 69-52 to improve to 9-7, very similar to Valpo's 76-60 win over Loyola to go to 9-7 last week. A win on Friday at Missouri State would allow the Crusaders to reach a double-figure win total just 17 games into the season for the first time since 2005-06, when Valpo was 11-6 through 17 games. Valpo is already just one win away from matching its win total from last season.
