

MVC Player of the Week

Ashli O'Neal, So., G, Indiana State

Indiana State sophomore Ashli O'Neal recorded back-to-back 20-plus point performances for the first time in her career and led the Sycamores to a second-straight conference weekend sweep. The sophomore shot 52.0 percent from the field, was an impressive 12-for-12 from the free throw line, and added 10 rebounds in the two wins. She tied a career-high with

22 points in ISU's 67-54 win at Valpo Sunday and had a 21-point performance in a win at Loyola on Friday.

MVC Newcomer of the Week

Abby O'Connor, Fr., G/F, Loyola

Loyola freshman Abby O'Connor continued her impressive debut campaign with the Maroon & Gold over the weekend, averaging 14.5 points and 4.5 rebounds. O'Connor led the Ramblers against Indiana State with 17 points to go along with four rebounds and an assist. The South Bend, Ind. product went on to chip in 12 points, five rebounds, an assist and two

steals as Loyola raced past Evansville in an 82-63 triumph. O'Connor, who has now reached double figures in scoring a team-high 11 times this season, currently ranks as the Ramblers' leading scorer (10.9 ppg) and rebounder (5.5 rpg).



NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including

Anneke Schlueter (BRAD) - Schlueter averaged 10.5 points, 6.5 rebounds, 1.0 assist and 1.5 steals per game in a pair of home contests. She collected six points, five rebounds and one steal Friday against Northern lowa. In her 100th career start Sunday against Drake, Schlueter had 15 points, eight boards, two assists and a pair of steals as she broke the Renaissance Coliseum career scoring record previously held by former teammate Leti Lerma. The fifth player in school history with 100 career starts, Schlueter had 11 points, six rebounds, two assists and a steal in the second half against the Bulldogs to help Bradley rally from as many as 19 points down to pull within three points in the fourth quarter. She also moved up two spots on Bradley's career scoring list into 21st.

Sara Rhine (DU) - Rhine averaged 15.5 points, 5.5 rebounds, 1.0 assists and 1.0 block while shooting 50.0 percent (9-of-18) from the floor and 80.0 percent (12-of-15) from the free throw line, all in just 19.0 average minutes, to help Drake earn wins over Illinois State and Bradley. Friday at Illinois State, she scored 16 points, going 5-of-11 from the floor and making 6-of-8 at the free throw line with four rebounds, two blocks and one assist in just 19 minutes. In Sunday's victory at Bradley, Rhine finished with 15 points, going 4-of-7 from the floor, including knocking down 1-of-2 three-pointers along with making 6-of-7 from the free throw line. She added seven rebounds and one assist in just 19 minutes. This season, Rhine leads the MVC in shooting percentage at 54.9 while averaging 15.6 points and 6.5 rebounds per game while averaging just 21.2 minutes per contest. Her scoring average ranks fourth in the league while her rebounding average is fifth. Rhine is shooting an impressive 81.9 percent from the free throw line and has made the second most free throws (77-of-94) in the MVC, behind her teammate Becca Hittner (85-of-98). She has scored double figures in 16 of the 19 games played for her this season.

Kerri Gasper (UE) - In a pair of conference road games, Kerri Gasper led the Aces, averaging 16.5 points, and stuffing the stat sheet with 5 rebounds and 3.5 assists per game. On Friday night against Valparaiso, Gasper battled foul trouble throughout the contest, finishing with 18 points, tied for the game-high, three boards, and two assists in just 27 minutes in the loss. Gasper followed up Friday's performance with 15 points, seven rebounds, and six assists to lead the Aces in an 82-63 loss at Loyola on Sunday, The Olmsted Township, Ohio native sits first in the MVC in assists (4.0), eighth in scoring average (11.5), and 15th in rebounding (5.3).

Katie Salmon (LUC) - Loyola senior Katie Salmon averaged a team-best 15.5 points in the Ramblers' two games over the weekend. The Wauwatosa, Wis. native scored a season-high 16 points to go along with six rebounds in Friday's tilt with Indiana State. She went on to hit on seven of her nine attempts from the field in Sunday's 82-63 win over Evansville en route to finishing with 15 points, two rebounds and a block. Salmon has averaged 7.7 points since the start of league play, while operating at a blistering 55 percent clip from the field.

Brice Calip (MSU) - Brice Calip threatened a double-double with 10 points, a careerhigh nine rebounds, and four assists in MSU's only game last week. Calip played 34 minutes at Southern Illinois and committed only two turnovers, which allowed her to take over the MVC lead in assist-to-turnover ratio in league contests with 29 helpers against 11 giveaways.

Ellie Howell (UNI) - Ellie Howell scored in double figures twice to lead UNI past Bradley and Illinois State on the road over the weekend. The redshirt junior scored 16 points against the Braves on Friday night, combining for 18 of UNI's 25 secondhalf points alongside sophomore Megan Maahs. Howell also earned five rebounds and dished out two assists against the Braves. On Sunday, Howell scored 10 points to push the Panthers past the Redbirds, while grabbing three rebounds and handing out three assists. Howell has scored in double figures a team-high 11 times, with seven of those coming in MVC play.

Brittney Patrick (SIU) - Patrick scored a career-high 15 points in SIU's 71-69 overtime win over Missouri State in Southern's only game of the week. Patrick was 4-of-5 from the field in the win, including 7-of-9 from the free throw line to go along with five assists and just two turnovers in 23 minutes off the bench. Patrick was instrumental in the Salukis putting away the game in overtime, as she was 5-of-6 from the charity stripe in the extra period. Patrick set career highs in field goals made (4), free throws made (7), free throws attempted (9) and points (15) in the win over the Lady Bears and it marked the first time in 47 career games that the Bolingbrook, Ill. native has scored in double figures.

Dani Franklin (VALPO) - Averaged a double-double this week with 14.5 points per game and 11.0 rebounds per game over two contests against in-state foes, including Valpo's convincing 101-59 win over Evansville on Friday night. Matched a career-high with 16 rebounds on Sunday against Indiana State, becoming the first player in The Valley to pull down 16 boards in a conference game this season. Also notched her second double-double of the year against the Sycamores and has now scored in double figures 16 times this year. Ranks second in The Valley in scoring at 16.1 points per game and is the only player in the conference averaging 16 or more points and six or more rebounds per game.

Gabi Haack (BRAD) - Haack averaged 10.5 points, 7.0 rebounds and 1.0 assist per game in the first two games of a season-long four-game home stand. She matched a season-best with 10 rebounds Friday against Northern lowa to go with four points and one assist. Sunday against league-leading Drake, Haack connected on five three-pointers and finished with 17 points. She also snagged four boards and had an assist as she helped Bradley rally from 19 points down to pull within three points in the fourth quarter scoring 11 of her 17 points in the second half. The sharp shooter tied the longest streak of consecutive games with a three-pointer by a freshman in school history at 10 and is shooting 52.9 percent from beyond the arc in her last five home games.

Kierra Isaiah (INS)-Kierra Isaiah shot 63.6% from the field and was perfect from behind the arc and from the free throw line ... Led the Sycamores to their first (and second) road wins of the season and a second straight conference weekend sweep ... Credited with four steals and three assists and averaged 8.5 ppg.

Nicole Kroeger (UNI) - Nicole Kroeger played a crucial role in both of UNI's road wins over the weekend, as the Panthers downed Bradley and Illinois State. Kroeger earned a rebound and dished out one assist against Bradley on Friday, before scoring nine points off the bench to propel the Panthers to a win against Illinois State on Sunday. All nine points for Kroeger came in the second half of Sunday's game, helping the Panthers break a halftime tie and extend their lead to 22 points. Kroeger also hauled in one rebound, while swiping a pair of steals against the Redbirds.

Makenzie Silvey (SIU) - Silvey scored nine points and snagged five rebounds in SIU's 71-69 overtime win over Missouri State in Southern's only game of the week. Three of Silvey's five rebounds came on the offensive end, which was a career-high for the Glen Carbon, III. native.

Ella Ellenson (VALPO) - Poured in a careerhigh 13 points on 5-of-9 shooting in Friday's win over Evansville. Also grabbed five rebounds and went 3-for-3 at the free-throw line in that game. Averaging 7.5 points per game this week.

At the Turn...

At the halfway point in the MVC schedule, Drake sits in first-place with a perfect 9-0 mark. Missouri State and Southern Illinois are tied for the second spot at 7-2, while UNI occupies the No. 4 spot in the standings at 6-3 in league play. Indiana State has stormed up the standings with four-straight wins and is the fifth and final team above .500 in Valley play at 5-4.

Winning at Halfway Point

Over the past 15 seasons, teams that have won or shared the regular-season championship in the MVC have reached the halfway point of the league season with at least eight wins 13 times (14 total teams). Four times - DU in 2008, CU in 2003 and MSU in 2012 and 1999 - teams have had as many as three losses and gone on to the regular-season title.

This season, three teams reached the midpoint of Valley play with fewer than three losses, including Drake (9-0), Missouri State (7-2) and Southern IIlinois (7-2).

Valley Streak Continues

Drake has the longest win streak in the MVC era for regular season MVC contests. With the road win at Missouri State on Jan. 5, Drake set the new all-time MVC era mark at 25, surpassing the Lady Bears record of 24-straight wins set in 2000. The impressive streak started Feb. 26, 2016 with a win over Loyola. The Bulldogs are currently six wins shy of tying SIU's 37 game streak from 1985-1987 during the Gateway era.

UNI is the only Valley team to have finished in the top-five of the league standings for the past eight seasons. The Panthers won the MVC in 2010-11 (17-1) and 2015-16 (15-3), finished in second place once (2016-17, 15-3), finished in third place once (2013-14, 13-5), had two fourth-place finishes (2014-15, 12-6; 2012-13, 10-8) and two fifth-place finishes (2011-12, 9-9; 2009-10, 10-8).

Knocking Down Freebies

Evansville continues to lead the nation in free-throw shooting percentage, shooting 83.2% from the charity stripe this season. Evansville is one of just three teams in the nation shooting better than 80% this season (Northern Colorado & Central Michigan). The Aces are on pace to set the MVC record set by Illinois State during the 2010 season (80.5%).

Over the past 19 seasons (since 1999-2000), 16 MVC teams have registered a double-digit advantage in scoring margin for a season. Drake currently has a +11.2 scoring margin, which is the 12th best among any team in that span. Last year the Bulldogs finished with a +17.8 ppg margin, second in MVC history.

Sweep Part II

Indiana State registered its second consecutive sweep in Missouri Valley Conference play last weekend with a pair of wins at Loyola (73-65) and Valparaiso (67-54). That marks the first time since the 2013-14 season that the Sycamores have claimed consecutive weekend sweeps in MVC play.

Scheduled Tough

Missouri State leads the league with a non-conference strength of schedule of 12. Two other league schools, including Drake (No. 16) and UNI (No. 35), also have schedules that rank in the top-35. The Valley is one of six leagues to have at least three teams appearing in the Top 35, joining the Big East, Big Ten, Pac 12, SEC and Southland.

Power Five Wins

The Missouri Valley Conference recorded four wins over Power Five opponents during non-conference play this season. Last season, the MVC finished the non-conference schedule with six wins over members of Power Five conferences.

Seven league seniors are leading their respective teams in scoring, including Missouri State's Liza Fruendt (16.9 ppg), Valpo's Dani Franklin (16.1 ppg), Evansville's Hannah Noe (14.8 ppg), Illinois State's Hannah Green (13.3 ppg), Southern Illinois' Kylie Giebelhausen (11.4 ppg), Indiana State's Wendi Bibbins (11.0 ppg), and UNI's Kennedy Kirkpatrick (10.7 ppg).

Home Sweet Home

Since 2002, home teams have won at least 55 (.611) of the 90 league contests in all but six seasons (2003-04, 2006-07, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2015-16, 2016-17). The most wins by home teams in league play came in 2008 (61-29 at home in conference play). The league was 51-39 (.567) at home in league play last year, and has compiled a 25-20 (.556) mark so far in 2017-18.

BRADLEY (10-10, 4-5 MVC)

Dialed In

Bradley followed up its first game without a made three-pointer Friday against Northern Iowa by shooting 13-of-28 (46.4 percent) from beyond the arc Sunday against Drake. Despite an 0-for-8 three-point shooting night against the Panthers, the Braves have averaged 10 three-point makes over the last three games, while



shooting 48.4 percent from beyond the arc. In fact, over the last five games Bradley has averaged 7.6 triples on 45.8 percent shooting (38-for-83) after averaging 5.3 trey's on 30.4 percent shooting (80-of-263). The Braves are 34-for-87 (39.1 percent) from three-point territory in the last five home games compared to 24.2 percent (15-of-62) in the first four home contests of the year. Bradley's 5.90 three-pointers per game this season would be the team's best average since the school record 6.96 trey's per game in 1994-95 and the squad's 34.1 three-point percentage would rank fifth among season marks.

Second Half Team

Date Onnonent

While Bradley's 4-5 first half record in the first half of conference play was the best for the Braves since a 6-3 start to the league slate in 2009-10, head coach Andrea Gorski and her squad hope history repeats itself. Bradley has posted a better record the second time through the conference in seven consecutive years and 13 of the last 15 seasons. In fact, over the last 15 years the only seasons the Braves did not have better second half of Valley play were the 2009-10 (6-3 both halves) and 2004-05 (4-5 both halves) campaigns in which the team matched its record from the first half. Bradley is 14-10 in February home games over the last six seasons.

Drake, which was the first team to ever go undefeated during the MVC regular season in 2016-17 at 18-0, completed the first half of the 2017-18 MVC season a perfect 9-0 after its road wins at Illinois State and Bradley. The Bulldogs' unblemished record in MVC play this season is the third time the program has accomplished



the feat in the past five seasons. The 2014-15 Drake team also went 9-0 during the first part of the MVC slate. Drake, which has won an MVC-best 31-consecutive MVC regular season games, begins the second half of the 2017-18 MVC schedule against SIU on Friday at the Knapp Center.

Assisting from Down Low

Drake, which came into Sunday's game at Bradley tied for the national lead in team assists per game with UConn at 22.4, handed out 26 assists on 30 field goals in the win. Redshirt junior forward Becca Jonas tied with Brenni Rose for the most individual assists with four. It was the second-straight game, Jonas led the Bulldogs in assists after dishing out four in Friday's win at Illinois State. In the past seven games, Jonas has handed out 24 assists, and twice tied her career-best for a game with six. In MVC play, she is averaging 2.7 assists per contest, which ranks tied for 15th.

Bulldog Bench Crew

Drake's bench played a key role in the team's two road wins over the weekend. Friday at Illinois State, the reserves scored a combined 30 points and Sunday at Bradley, the bench finished with 37. Illinois State's bench scored just seven points while Bradley's finished with 17.

would set a single-season record for free-throw percentage as Gasper is 38-40 (95%) from the charity stripe which would best Mallory Ladd's 94.9% in the 2012-13 season. Sophomore guard Kaylan Coffman has amassed 28 blocks on the year, two away from tying Jamie Gray for 10th in single-season rejections.

Efficient Evansville

This season, the Aces are one of the more efficient shooting teams in the Missouri Valley Conference. Evansville leads the conference in three-point field goal percentage (36.4%) and free-throw percentage (83.2%) while sitting sixth in the MVC in field goal percentage (39.7%).

Back Home Again

Evansville enters a three-game homestand over the next two weeks, its longest homestand of the season. the league this season in rebounds per game (10.5), defensive rebounds per game (7.4) and most double-doubles (8).

Howell Heating Up

This season, redshirt junior Ellie Howell has scored in double figures a team-high 11 times, with seven of those coming in conference play. Howell scored a season-high 21 points against Loyola. During MVC play, Howell is averaging a team-best 11.4 points per outing.

Defenders of Warren

UNI is 140-21 under the direction of head coach Tanya Warren when holding an opponent to 60 points or less. Five of UNI's top-10 scoring defense averages in school history have come during the Warren era, while the Panthers ranked second in the Valley last season after holding opponents to 58.3 points per game. UNI was 19-0 in 2016-17 when holding foes to 60 points or less, so far this season the Panthers are 8-4.

The Salukis defeated the Missouri State Lady Bears in overtime, 71-69 on Friday, Jan. 26. Southern improved to 3-0 this season in overtime games and SIU's three overtime wins are it's most in a single season in program history. Southern is 6-3 (.667) in overtime



games under fifth-year head coach Cindy Stein and 26-18 (.590) all-time in overtime games since the 1974-75 season.

Sharing the Load

Brittney Patrick scored a career-high 15 points in the win over Missouri State and led the Salukis in scoring for the first time in her career. She is the sixth different Saluki to lead the team in scoring this season, which are the most for SIU in a single-season since the 2013-14 season in which Southern had seven different players lead the team in scoring.

Rank in the Top Three

The Salukis rank in the top- $\bar{3}$ of the Missouri Valley Conference in both steals and blocked shots, as Southern is currently second in blocks and third in steals. SIU has never finished in the top-5 of both categories in the same season since the NCAA began recording steals and blocks during the 1987-88 season. The Salukis have only finished in the top-five of the conference in steals four times in the past 30 years, most recently when they finished third in 2007-08. Southern has finished in the top-five of the league in blocks in three of Coach Stein's four full seasons and 17 times in the past 30 years.

100 Happened

The Crusaders surpassed the 100-point plateau for the first time this season on last week against Evansville. In fact, it marked the first time the Crusaders hit triple digits against a Division I foe since Jan. 14, 1997, a 100-75 victory over Chicago State. In addition, the 101



points against a Division I team was Valpo's most since before any player on the current roster was born - Jan. 6, 1994, when a Crusader squad coached by Dave Wolter beat Western Illinois 102-95.

Pulling Away

The Crusaders enjoyed a 42-point margin of victory last week against Evansville, their largest in any game since Nov. 21, 2016, a 102-47 win over IU Kokomo. The lopsided win over the Purple Aces marked Valpo's largest margin of victory against a Division I opponent since an 80-28 win over Youngstown State on Feb. 13, 2010.

10 Win Mark

The win last week over Evansville allowed Valpo to gain its 10th victory of the year, matching the program's win total of each of the last two seasons. With their next triumph, the Crusaders will secure the program's highest win total since 2012-13.
