MVC Player of the Week

Becca Hittner, So., G, Drake

Drake sophomore Becca Hittner averaged 19.5 point, 6.5 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 2.0 steals per game as she helped the Bulldogs go 2-0 on its first MVC road trip. In the Missouri State victory, she poured in a gamehigh 24 points behind an efficient shooting performance of 6-of-10 from the floor, including making 3-of-6 from behind the three-point line, while

adding six rebounds, one assist and one steal. In the victory over SIU, she scored a game-high 15 points behind another 6-of-10 shooting performance, adding a career-high seven assists with seven rebounds and three steals.

MVC Newcomer of the Week

Abby O'Connor, Fr., G, Loyola

Loyola freshman Abby O'Connor helped the Ramblers to a split at home this past weekend, averaging 18.5 points, 5.5 rebounds and 1.5 blocks in two contests. Following a 13-point, four-rebound performance against Bradley on Friday night, the South Bend, Ind. product erupted for a season-high 24 points, 17 of which came in the fourth quarter, as the Ramblers picked

up a 62-59 victory over Illinois State on Sunday afternoon. O'Connor, who also added seven rebounds, two assists and two blocks against the Redbirds, currently ranks fourth amongst Valley freshmen in both scoring (10.2 ppg, 19th overall) and rebounding (5.5 rpg, 12th overall).



NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Danielle Brewer (BRAD) - Brewer averaged 19.5 points, 6.5 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.0 steal per game while shooting 60 percent from the field and 87 percent from the free throw line in a pair of road victories. She opened the week with what was a then season-best 17 points as she made a career-best seven free throws to go with six boards, one assist and one steal in a 59-57 road win at Loyola. In the 100th game of her career, the Indiana native had the strongest outing of her career to power Bradley to a convincing 88-69 win at Valparaiso. Brewer was 7-for-8 from the field, including 2-of-3 from three-point range and had a career-best 22 points against the Crusaders. She also added seven rebounds, three assists and a steal as she helped Bradley sweep a three-game MVC road swing for the first time in program history. In addition, Brewer helped the Braves open Valley play with a 3-0 record for just the fourth time in school history and Bradley's four-game win streak is the longest since 2011-12.

Wendi Bibbins (INS) - Her five blocked shots against Evansville were a career high and ties for the most by any Missouri Valley Conference player this year ... Led all players with 16 points in Indiana State's win over Evansville on Friday ... Added eight rebounds, two assists and two steals to her effort ... Was 6-for-15 from the field and 4 of 6 from the line.

Alexa Willard (MSU) - Alexa Willard averaged 13.5 points and shot 50 percent from the floor last week, extending her double-figure scoring streak to eight consecutive games. Friday, Willard scored a team-high 17 points on 8-of-14 shooting, adding two assists and a rebound. Sunday, the sophomore tallied 10 points, two boards and a steal in the win over UNI.

Ellie Howell (UNI) - Howell scored in double-figures twice as the Panthers dropped two tough road decisions to Southern Illinois and Missouri State. Howell scored 10 points against the Salukis, while earning 12 against the Bears to cap the weekend. The redshirt junior has now scored in double-figures seven times this season, with three coming in the last four MVC games.

Mackenzie Silvey (SIU) - Makenzie Silvey shot 50% (12-of-24) from the field, including 46.2% (6-of-13) from three-point range and averaged 15.0 points, 2.5 assists and 2.5 steals per game as SIU split a pair of MVC games over the weekend. In SIU's 60-53 overtime win over UNI, Silvey poured in a career-high 17 points on 7-of-11 shooting, including seven points on 3-of-3 shooting in the overtime frame. The Glen Carbon, III. native scored 13 points to go along with five assists and a career-best five steals against Drake on Sunday, which marked the eighth time this season that she has reached double figures.

Dani Franklin (VALPO) - Averaged 13.5 points per game over two games, reaching double figures for the 11th time in 15 games this year with 10 points against Bradley on Sunday after pouring in 17 points to lift Valpo over Illinois State 56-50 on Friday night.

Shunseere Kent (BRAD) - Kent averaged 10.5 points, 2.5 rebounds, 1.5 assists and 1.5 steals per game in a pair of road victories last week, shooting 50 percent from the field. After battling first-half foul trouble, she had all nine of her points in the second half of Friday's 59-57 victory at Loyola on 4-of-6 shooting, also adding one assist and one steal against the Ramblers. Kent followed up that performance with her teambest seventh double-digit scoring effort of the season in the win at Valparaiso. She had 12 points, five rebounds, two assists and a pair of steals in the convincing 88-69 victory. She helped Bradley sweep a three-game MVC road swing for the first time in program history. In addition, Kent helped the Braves open Valley play with a 3-0 record for just the fourth time in school history and Bradley's four-game win streak is the squad's longest since 2011-12.

Maddy Monahan (DU) - Monahan helped Drake go 2-0 on its first MVC road trip ... in the victory over SIU, Monahan scored nine points, nabbed a career-high three steals and handed out two assists ... two of her steals led directly to layups for her and sparked Bulldogs' defense ... played 26 minutes in the victory ... in her first season, averaging 3.1 assists per game and 5.6 points per game.

Ty Battle (INS) - Brought down a career-best 10 rebounds in Indiana State's win over Evansville ... Also dished out two assists and swiped one steal as ISU claimed its first conference win of the year.

Brice Calip (MSU) - Brice Calip averaged 7.5 points, 3.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists, 2.5 steals and 1.5 blocks per game last week, shooting 43 percent from the field in a team-high 30 minutes per contest. Calip filled the stat sheet Friday against Drake with 11 points, two boards, two assists, three blocks and three steals, becoming the first Lady Bear with three or more blocks and steals in a game since 2016 MVC Player of the Year Tyonna Snow. Sunday, Calip had four points, four boards, two assists and two steals in a win against UNI.

Nicole Konieczny (VALPO) - Scored a careerhigh 18 points on Sunday against Bradley, shattering her previous personal best of 13. Knocked down six field goals, three of which came from beyond the arc. Also dished out five assists and pulled down two rebounds. Chipped in six points and four assists in Friday's win over Illinois State.

Top of the Heap

Drake and Bradley are the only two remaining teams perfect in MVC action. The Bulldogs sit 4-0 in league play, while the Braves are off to a 3-0 league start. Drake will play host to Evansville and Indiana State this weekend, while Bradley will welcome Southern Illinois and Missouri State.

New Valley Record

Drake now has the longest win streak in MVC history for regular season MVC contests. With the road win at Missouri State Friday, Drake set the new alltime mark at 25, surpassing the Lady Bears record of 24-straight wins set in 2000. The impressive streak started Feb. 26, 2016 with a win over Loyola.

Home Sweet Home

Since 2002, home teams have won at least 55 (.611) of the 90 league contests in all but six seasons (2003-04, 2006-07, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2015-16, 2016-17). The most wins by home teams in league play came in 2008 (61-29 at home in conference play). The league was 51-39 (.567) at home in league play last year, and has compiled a 9-9 (.500) mark so far in 2017-18.

Quick Starts Crucial

Since 1982-83, just three teams (Missouri State, champions in 1998-99, 1994-95 and 1990-91; Drake, champions in 1996-97 and co-champions in 1987-88; and Evansville, a 2007-08 co-champion) have won at least a share of the regular-season title without winning its regular-season opener. In fact, 12 of the last 17 regular-season champs (or co-champs) have opened 2-0 or better in MVC play, with Evansville in 2007-08, Missouri State in 2004-05, UNI in 2010-11. Missouri State in 2011-12 and UNI in 2015-16 serving as the only five exceptions.

Title Town

The league has had nine different regular-season champions in the past 11 seasons (SIU-2007, DU/ UE/ILS-2008, ILS-2009, ILS-2010, UNI-2011; MSU-2012; WSU/CU-2013; INS/WSU-2014; WSU-2015; UNI-2016; DU-2017). Bradley, Loyola and Valparaiso are the only league teams not to have won a regularseason MVC championship.

Another Power Five Win

The Missouri Valley Conference recorded four wins over Power Five opponents during non-conference play this season. Last season, the MVC finished the non-conference schedule with six wins over members of Power Five conferences.

Against the Field

The MVC held a winning record against six leagues during non-conference play, including the Big 12 (2-1), Big South (2-1), Big West (1-0), Colonial (1-0), Southland (1-0) and WAC (4-0). The MVC held at least a .500 mark against four other conferences: American (2-2), Big Sky (1-1), Mountain West (1-1) and SWAC (1-1).

Strength of Schedule

UNI leads the league with a non-conference strength of schedule of 24. Two other league schools, including Drake (No. 29) and Missouri State (No. 34), also have schedules that rank in the top-35.

Senior CLASS

Southern Illinois' Kylie Giebelhausen was named a candidate for the 2017-18 Senior CLASS Award. Giebelhausen is among 30 NCAA Division I candidates in women's basketball for the award which recognizes notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition.

1,000 Point Club

Currently, three players in the MVC have achieved 1,000 career points. Valpo's Dani Franklin will look to join the 1,500-point club on Friday. Franklin will look to become the second Crusader to surpass the mark (Debbie Bolen).

Knocking Down Freebies

After going 11-12 (91.7%) from the free-throw line on Friday, Evansville continues to lead the nation in free-throw shooting percentage, shooting 84.0% from the charity stripe this season. Evansville is one of just four teams in the nation shooting better than 80% this season. The Aces are on pace to set the MVC record set by Illinois State during the 2010 season (80.5%)

Fruendt on Miller Watch List

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA announced that Missouri State senior Liza Fruendt is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2018 Cheryl Miller Award. Named after the three-time Naismith Player of the Year, the annual award in its inaugural year recognizes the top small forwards in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2018 Cheryl Miller Award will be narrowed to just 10.

Hoops In the Heartland

The 2018 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxSlayer Center in Moline, Ill., for the third year of a three-year contract with the Quad Cities Convention and Visitors Bureau.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

Valley History

One of the premier women's basketball leagues in the country, the MVC has seen an average of four league teams participate in postseason play in the last 20 seasons. The Valley has earned multiple NCAA Tournament bids in 11 different seasons, including a pair of bids to last season's NCAA Tournament. The league has also had two Final Four teams (Missouri State, in both 1992 and 2001), a WNIT champion (Missouri State, 2005) and three WNIT semifinal appearances (Illinois State, in 2011, 2010 and 2009).

BRADLEY (9-5, 3-0 MVC)

3-0 MVC Start

One of two unbeaten teams in Missouri Valley Conference play, Bradley is 3-0 in league action after opening Valley action with three consecutive road wins. The Braves are 3-0 to open the MVC schedule for the first time since 2008-09 (4-0) and just the fourth time in program history. A victory Friday at home against



Southern Illinois would match the best start to Valley play in school history (4-0 - 2008-09). Second-year Bradley head coach Andrea Gorski has been involved in three of the four 3-0 conference starts in program history, with both her freshman (1988-89 - 3-0) & junior (1990-91 - 3-0) seasons featuring 3-0 starts to conference action. In addition, BU's 9-5 overall start to the year is the teams best since 2011-12 (9-5).

Streaking

In addition to improving Bradley to 3-0 in Valley play, Sunday's 88-69 road win at Valparaiso gave the Braves their longest win streak in six seasons. Bradley's current four-game win streak is tied for the longest in the Missouri Valley Conference this season and is BU's longest win streak since winning the final five non-conference games of the 2011-12 season. In fact, the Braves swept a three-game MVC road swing for the first time in program history and the three Valley road wins equals the team's MVC road win total from the last two seasons combined. Only Friday's opponent (Southern Illinois) has more road wins than Bradley's four true road victories this season. BU's three MVC road wins are most for the Braves since 2012-13 (3) and one more road win would give Bradley its most true road victories since that same year (6) in addition to the first season with four or more league road wins since 2009-10 (4).

More History

Drake, which set numerous program and MVC records during the 2016-17 historic season, added one more record that was helped by last season's success. With Friday's road win at Missouri State, Drake won its 25th consecutive Valley game to set a new league record. The Bulldogs had been tied with Missouri State, which



won 24 MVC games from 1999-2000. Drake's impressive streak started back on Feb. 26, 2016, and included last season's 18-0 mark in MVC play.

Assist You

Over the past four seasons, Drake has ranked in the top 10 every season in the NCAA in assists per game. The Bulldogs are once again sharing the basketball as they entered Sunday No. 4 in the country. In the win over SIU, Drake recorded 23 assists on 28 baskets. In the Bulldogs first two MVC road wins, junior Sammie Bachrodt and sophomore Becca Hittner established their new career-highs in assists. Bachrodt handed out a career-high seven assists in the victory over Missouri State while Hittner handed out her new career-high of 7 assists in the SIU win.

Milestone Point Totals

During the 2-0 road trip, several Bulldogs surpassed career point milestone numbers or moved closer to landmark totals. Sammie Bachrodt and Becca Jonas both surpassed 700 career points while Hittner surpassed 600 career points. Nicole Miller is now just nine points away from 500, Sara Rhine is five points from scoring 750 and Paige Greiner needs three more points for 400 in her career. Maddy Dean is just 24 points away from 1.000 career points.

On Record Pace

The Purple Aces have shown a propensity for hitting free throws this season, leading the nation shooting 84% from the charity stripe. If the season were to end today, Evansville would be the first team in NCAA men's or women's basketball history across all divisions to shoot better than 84% from the free-throw line.



Youth Movement

Having to deal with a string of injuries early in the season, the Aces have had to rely on underclassmen to step up. Sophomore Macie Lively has made 10 starts this season, averaging 6.7 points per game and sitting second on the team in assists with 2.9 per contest. True freshman Kayla Casteel has played in eight games, averaging 11.9 minutes per game and averaging 4.1 points per game.

Fast Starts

tant coach at TCU, was named the interim coach by Director of Athletics Sherard Clinkscales. Wells completed his tenure at Indiana State with a record of 44-59. A national search for the eighth head coach in program history begins immediately.

First League Win

With a 56-48 win over Evansville on Jan. 5 at the Hulman Center, Indiana State won its first conference game of the season and ended a streak of eight consecutive conference games lost, nine straight against MVC teams (that includes the one game in the MVC Tournament last season). 3-0 Valley Start

The Salukis' 3-0 start in MVC play marked the second time in three seasons, and the third time since the MVC began play in 1992, that SIU has started Valley play with three-straight wins. The Salukis, meanwhile, won their second-straight over the UNI Panthers at home, which marks the first time since the 1995-96 and 1996-97 seasons that the Salukis have posted back-to-back home wins over UNI.

Tied School Record

SIU recorded a season-high 11 blocks in the 64-45 win over Indiana State on Dec. 31, with six different Salukis tallying at least one block. SIU's 11 blocked shots tied the school record for most blocks in a game, set just over 18 years ago on Dec. 29, 1999 at Indiana State when Southern also recorded 11 blocks. It's the most blocked shots by a Valley team this season, and marks just the fourth time in program history that SIU has turned aside 10-plus shots, all of which have come during league play.
