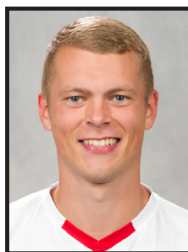

MVC Offensive Player of the Week

Gerit Wintermeyer, So., F, Bradley

Wintermeyer contributed to three of Bradley's four goals last week, capped by his 100th-minute game-winning header Saturday night at Drake. Wintermeyer assisted both of Younes Dayekh's two goals in Tuesday's 3-1 win against Omaha, including the game-winner in the 46th minute. With Bradley facing a must-win situation Saturday at Drake, where the Braves had not won since 2002, Wintermeyer headed home the golden goal from the penalty spot at

99:03 to give Bradley a 1-0 victory. Saturday's goal at Drake was Wintermeyer's fourth game-winning goal of the season. He now leads the Braves with six goals and 15 points.

MVC Defensive Player of the Week

Albert Reinwart, Jr., GK, Bradley

Reinwart came through with nine saves, including a penalty kick stop, helping the Braves to a pair of victories last week. Omaha (16-7) and Drake (20-11) combined to outshoot Bradley 36-18 in the two games last week, but aided by Reinwart's work between the pipes, the Braves won the combined scoring battle, 4-1. With Bradley leading 2-1 in the 76th minute

Tuesday, Omaha was awarded a penalty kick and Reinwart stopped the potential tying goal with a dive to his left and promptly started a scoring sequence with his outlet pass, leading to the final 3-1 margin. With Bradley facing a must-win situation at a place the Braves had not won since 2002, Reinwart came up with six saves Saturday at Drake to record his fourth shutout of the season.

NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's player of the week selections, several conference players had notable performances, and they include:

Moiad Ankir (UCA) - The Central Arkansas freshman played a key role as the Bears rallied from a two-goal deficit with 16 minutes to play. He helped UCA get on the board in the 75th minute, fielding a pass from Christian Ilia and feeding Soren Jensen, who cut the Valpo lead to 2-1. Ankir then found the equalizer in the 78th minute, using his head to finish off a combination from Ilia and Daltyn Knutson to salvage a point for the Bears.

Aidan Megally (LUC) - Megally notched two of the three goals in Loyola's 3-0 victory on Saturday (Oct. 20) to extend his teams' conference unbeaten streak to five games, and overall unbeaten streak to six. The three points for the Ramblers pushed their total to 11 and maintained their first place position in the MVC standings. Megally set season bests in shots (4), and shots on goal (2) in the win over the Purple Aces, while the multi-goal performance was the first of his career. Megally has now tied his single-season career highs in goals (3) and points (6) this year.

Josh Dolling (MSU) - Scoring his ninth goal of the season, Josh Dolling found the back of the net off a double assist by Conor Ingram and Jake Laird, Saturday night against Gonzaga. In the 28th minute of action, Dolling got free from the Bulldog defense to score the decider. Dolling added three shots and marked his fifth game winning goal of the season. Dolling leads the conference in goals (9) and points (20) game winning goals (5).

Adan Garcia (VALPO) - Garcia was involved in both Valpo goals in Saturday's 2-2 draw with Central Arkansas. He provided the assist to set up Michael Marchionna in the 52nd minute before scoring his first goal of the season in the 67th minute. Garcia's three-point match allowed him to boost his career point total to 27. His efforts helped Valpo extend its unbeaten streak to four.

Grant Stoneman (LUC) - Stoneman added another 90 minutes of playing time without allowing a shot on goal on Saturday (Oct. 20). The reigning MVC Defensive Player of the Week turned in another stellar performance by leading a back row that kept Evansville off the scoreboard and didn't allow a shot on goal in the process. The stingy defense increased Loyola's shutout total to seven on the season and extended teammate Josh Lagudah's scoreless stretch in goal to over 400 minutes.

Jake Laird (MSU) - Jake Laird holds down the middle of the Bears crushing defense, starting all 13 matches this season, Laird has helped the Bears to a .62 goals against average. Against Gonzaga on Saturday the Troy, Ill., native added his first assist of the season. Setting up Josh Dolling's game deciding goal in the 28th minute of action. Laird and the Bears midfield and defense held Gonzaga to just five shots in the match, including holding the Bulldogs to just one shot in the second half. Laird led the Bears to their fifth shutout of the season.

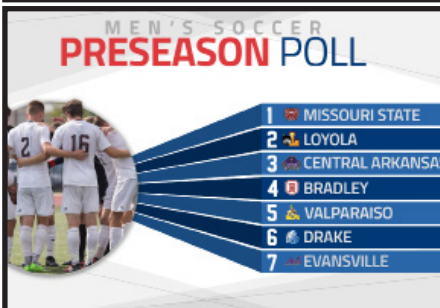

MVC SOCCER NOTES

Red Hot Ramblers

Since starting the season with a 1-3 record, Loyola has posted a 7-1-2 record and holds an RPI of 47 entering this week's action. The Ramblers have four straight wins and are unbeaten in their last six, outscoring opponents 9-0 in the month of October. Loyola can clinch the program's second outright regular season title (2016) with a win at Central Arkansas Saturday.

Strong in Net

Loyola goalkeeper Josh Lagudah is quietly having one of the best seasons in program history. He has logged seven shutouts in his first year to put him in a tie for 7th among single-season leaders in program history and is carrying a scoreless minute streak of 402:11 across his ongoing four straight shutout streaks. Lagudah is tied for 8th nationally in shutouts (7) and is 7th in goals against (.572).

Tourney Spots Secure

Loyola, Missouri State and Central Arkansas have each officially earned a spot in the 2018 Missouri Valley Conference Tournament which will be held November 7, 9 and 11 at the University of Evansville. The top six teams in the standings will advance to the league tournament. The winner of Saturday's Valpo at Evansville match will secure a bid, while a Drake win over Missouri State would lock up a spot for the Bulldogs.

Big Comeback

Trailing 2-0 in the 74th minute, Central Arkansas struck twice in a three-minute span to steal a point on the road and clinch a MVC Tourney spot. The two-goal comeback was the biggest for the Bears in the 70th minute or later since moving to Division I.

Unbeaten Streak

Valpo advanced its unbeaten streak to four with last week's 2-2 draw with Central Arkansas at Brown Field. Valpo is 2-0-2 during a four-game streak that marks the program's longest stretch without a loss since 2016, when Valpo went six straight without a setback from Sept. 24 to Oct. 11.

NCAA RPI Report

The latest NCAA RPI report has been released and The Valley has four teams featured in the top-100. Loyola leads the league at No. 47, while Missouri State (No. 61), Bradley (No. 96) and Drake (No. 99) are also among the nation's top-100. The MVC ranks 12th among 24 conferences.

Earning a Result

Evansville's six draws this season are tied for the most in a season in program history. The Aces also amassed six ties during the 1979 season. Currently, the Aces are tied with Saint Louis and Cal State Fullerton for the national lead.

Perfect in Non-Con

Despite a 1-4-0 record in MVC play, Bradley is a perfect 6-0-3 in non-conference play this season, increasing its win streak to 10-straight against non-league opponents. The Braves last suffered a non-conference defeat back on Oct. 17, 2017 against UIC.

Early and Often

The Missouri State offense has outscored its opponents early and often this season. The Bears hold a 11-1 advantage in goals scored in the first half this season. The only goal MSU has allowed in the first half came in the first minute of a 4-1 win over UMKC in Springfield on Sept. 15.

Against the Field

The MVC holds a winning record against eight leagues in non-conference play (American, Atlantic Sun, Horizon, Ivy, Summit, Sun Belt, West Coast and WAC) and at least a .500 mark against the Big East, Big West and Southern.

Against the 2017 NCAA Field

The Valley has won five matches against 2017 NCAA Tournament teams. Drake beat Butler and UIC, while Missouri State and Bradley beat Omaha and Evansville beat Lipscomb. The MVC sits 5-5-5 against NCAA tourney teams from a year ago with one more chance on the schedule (Loyola at Washington).

Top 25 Success

The Valley holds a 4-3-1 record against Top 25 teams this season. The four Top 25 wins is the most during a season since Valley teams posted a 5-8-1 record vs. the Top 25 during the 2013 season.

MVC in Regional Rankings

The MVC has four teams currently ranked in the latest United Soccer Coaches West Regional rankings released on Tuesday (Oct. 23). Loyola sits No. 5 in the region, while Missouri State (6th), Bradley (8th) and Drake (9th) also appear in the poll.

Climbing the Charts

Central Arkansas junior Niklas Brodacki has 37 goals for his career, which ties him for 9th-most in Valley history. Brodacki is the first player to crack the top 10 since Tulsa's Ryan Pore in 2004. Brodacki has seven goals on the season, ranking second in the conference. He is the current active NCAA leader in goals per game (0.73) and second in points per game (1.55).
