MVC Offensive Player of the Week

Kasper Andersen, So., F, Central Arkansas

Central Arkansas sophomore forward Kasper Andersen was key for a UCA attack that struck three times in the first half on Saturday, picking up his third assist and first goal of the season as the Bears defeated Evansville 3-2. He notched his first mark on the scoresheet in the 41st minute, playing a ball to Soren Jensen, who whipped a pass off of an Evansville defender to Chris Holmes for the equalizer, before receiving a pass from Jensen and firing inside the left post for the game-winner in the 43rd minute.

MVC Defensive Player of the Week

Ben Stroud, Jr., D, Missouri State

Ben Stroud and the Bears defense held up a pair of 1-0 shutouts on the week, first against Western Illinois (Oct. 2) and then Bradley (Oct. 6). Stroud is a staple in the Bears middle back line, where he held opponents to a combined nine shots in two matches. The Bears defense leads the MVC in goals-against-average (.70) and top-20 in the country. Stroud was a key to the Bears success defensively, winning key headers and directing the crushing protection for the squad. Stroud added an assist and two shot attempts on the week.

NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's player of the week selections, several conference players had notable performances, and they include:

Filip Johansson (UE) - In two matches this week, sophomore Filip Johansson was a vital part of Evansville's offense. Against Butler on Tuesday, Johansson came in as a substitute and provided an assist on freshman Ryan Harris' game-tying goal that forced overtime in UE's 2-2 double-overtime draw with the Bulldogs. On Saturday, Johansson scored his first goal of the season, providing the Aces with a 2-1 lead in the 35th minute before falling on the road to Central Arkansas, 3-2. This season, Johansson has played in 11 matches, making nine starts and has scored once and assisted on a pair of goals.

Nicolo Mulatero (MSU) - Just six minutes into the match against Western Illinois, Nicolo Mulatero recorded his first goal in a Bears uniform, off a corner kick by MSU. The corner was served by Jake Buckle, headed by Ben Stroud before finding Mulatero for what would become the deciding score. Mulatero recorded three shots on the week with two on goal.

Mathias Nors (UE) - Consistently playing in Evansville's central defense, freshman Mathias Nors helped contribute to Evansville's offense this past week. Facing Butler on Tuesday, Nors received a rebounded shot from Logan Muck and found the back of the net in the 36th minute for his first collegiate goal to provide the Aces with a 1-0 advantage. Nors' was back in the scoring column on Saturday at Central Arkansas as junior Simon Waever sent a cross into the box that Nors headed past the keeper to tie the match at one. In his freshman campaign, Nors has played and started in 10 of 11 matches, seeing 885 minutes of action, the most of any Evansville freshman and fourth-most on the team among non-goalkeepers.

Josh Lagudah (LUC) - Lagudah kept up the strong play this season by noticing his fourth shutout of the season and help guide his squad to another point earned in MVC play. The 0-0 shutout got the Ramblers a point in conference play to increase their total to five and remain unbeaten. Lagudah is now tied for the conference leads in shutouts (4) and has entered the top-10 with 21 saves this season to his credit.

MVC SOCCER NOTES

Unbeaten Bears

Missouri State is undefeated though 10 matches following Saturday's win over Bradley. The Bears are one of three teams in NCAA Division I to remain unbeaten, joining St. Mary's (CA), and Portland.

Home Success

In league play, the home team has posted a 5-1-3 mark on their own pitch. The lone home defeat was Bradley falling in overtime to Loyola by a 2-1 decision on September 29.

Score & Lockdown

Drake and Missouri State are the MVC's top teams offensively and defensively this season, ranking as the top two in goals scored and goals allowed. Drake and MSU each have 18 goals this season, while MSU leads in goals allowed (7). Only nine times in the league's history has a team finished the season with the most goals scored and least amount of goals allowed. All nine of those teams finished the season ranked in the Top 25.

NCAA RPI Report

The latest NCAA RPI report for the 2018 season has been released and The Valley has four teams featured in the top-100. Missouri State leads the league at No. 50, while Loyola (No. 64), Drake (No. 78) and Bradley (No. 85) are also among the nation's top-100. The MVC ranks 12th among 24 conferences.

Earning a Result

Evansville's five draws this season are the second-most in a season in program history. The program record is six when the Aces amassed a 9-5-6 record in 1979. Currently, the Aces are tied with Colgate and Xavier for the second most ties nationally with five, Cal State Fullerton leads the nation with six draws (4-3-6).

Improved Offense

MSU has scored 18 goals this season, already beating the goal total from a season ago. Missouri State is currently tied for the league lead with 18 goals scored this season. The last time the Bears led the MVC in goals scored was during the 1999 season. MSU finished that year 17-1-3, dropping its only game in the first round of the NCAA Tournament to UAB.

Early and Often

The Missouri State offense has outscored its opponents early and often this season. The Bears hold a 10-1 advantage in goals scored in the first half this season. The only goal MSU has allowed in the first half came in the first minute of a 4-1 win over UMKC in Springfield on Sept. 15.

Against the Field

The MVC holds a winning record against seven leagues in non-conference play (American, Horizon, Ivy, Summit, Sun Belt, West Coast and WAC) and at least a .500 mark against the Big West and Southern.

Against the 2017 NCAA Field

The Valley has won three matches against 2017 NCAA Tournament teams. Drake beat Butler and UIC, while Missouri State beat Omaha. The MVC sits 3-5-5 against NCAA tourney teams from a year ago with three more chances on the schedule.

Top 25 Success

The Valley holds a 4-3 record against Top 25 teams this season. The four Top 25 wins is the most during a season since Valley teams posted a 5-8-1 record vs. the Top 25 during the 2013 season.

Climbing the Charts

Central Arkansas junior Niklas Brodacki has 37 goals for his career, which ties him for 9th-most in Valley history. Brodacki is the first player to crack the top 10 since Tulsa's Ryan Pore in 2004. Even Stats

As the Braves prepare to host Valparaiso, Bradley's stats comparison with its opponents through 11 games is remarkably similar ... Both Bradley and its opponents have scored 33 points on 11 goals and 11 assists through 11 games ... The Braves have been slightly more efficient with their offensive effort, putting 52-of-131 (.084) of their shots on target, while their opponents have 51 shots on goal in 145 attempts (.076) ... Based on the even nature of the stats, it should come as no surprise that 10 of Bradley's 11 matches have been decided by no more than one goal.



Accurate Attack

Bradley's roster currently features two players that rank among the program's top five for accuracy with their shot attempts ... Among players with at least 50 career shots, sophomore Younes Dayekh (31-61) and senior Richard Olson (32-63) both have placed 50.8 percent of their attempts on target ... Dayekh and Olson are tied for third for Percentage of Shots on Goal and are the only players since 2007 MVC Player of the Year Joe Donoho graduated to put at least 50 percent of their shots on target.

Home Stretch

Having played four of its last five matches on the road, Bradley will close the regular season by playing four of its final six matches at home ... The Braves start the home stretch by hosting Missouri Valley Conference rival Valparaiso Saturday night at Shea Stadium, then will step out of league to host Omaha Tuesday night at Shea Stadium ... Bradley is 3-1-2 at home this season and 11-4-3 (.694) at Shea Stadium since the start of the 2017 season.
