2018 MVC Women's Soccer All-Conference Teams Announced

CHICAGO, IL. – Regular-season champ Loyola has claimed the majority of the league's top individual honors, with senior forward Jenna Szczesny taking the league's Player of the Year honors. while her freshman teammate, Abby Swanson has been tabbed the Valley's Freshman of the Year. Drake's Elaine Gorom and Loyola's Madison Laudeman share the Defensive Player of the Year Title. Missouri State goalkeeper Kaitlin Maxwell was named Goalkeeper of the Year. The five headline a list of 32 student-athletes named to the 2018 MVC All-Conference teams, selected by the coaches, and announced by the league office Thursday.

Loyola's senior forward, Jenna Szczesny, leads the Ramblers in goals (9), overall points (24), shots (56) and shots on goal (26). Szczesny is currently second all-time at Loyola with 30 goals and 79 career points. Her current career points total also ranks her in the top 15 All-Time in the Valley record books. She is a four-time All-MVC honoree, who made second team in her freshman and sophomore seasons and first team in 2017. Szczesny is the first Loyola player to win the Valley's top honor in program history.

Drake's Elaine Gorom and Loyola's Madison Laudeman have both earned the honor of 2018 MVC Defensive Player of the Year. Senior Elaine Gorom started in every game for the Bulldogs. The Drake defense, with Gorom's help, only allowed four goals during conference play and 17 the entire season, the lowest in the Valley this season. Junior defender, Madison Laudeman has been a fixture in the Loyola lineup, starting in all 16 games this season. Laudeman contributed to five shutouts, including four in MVC play. In addition to her contributions on defense, Laudeman tallied eight points after finding the back of the goal twice and adding four assists.

The MVC Goalkeeper of the year is Missouri State's Kaitlin Maxwell. The sophomore was a force to be reckoned with in cage, totaling 114 saves during the season. The total ranked her second in the conference and is currently fifth nationally. Her single season save efforts tie for fourth best in program history alongside Jackie Jasper in 2006. Maxwell tallied six shutouts and logged double-digit saves four times. Her efforts earned her MVC defensive player of the week honors after collecting 10 grabs and shutting-out Northern Iowa. Maxwell's goals against average is third best in MVC and is sixth best in Bears' history.

The 2018 Freshman of the Year — Abby Swanson of Loyola — played in 15 matches in her first season. Swanson had nine points, scoring four times, including one game-winner, and added one assist. Swanson was part of a much-improved Loyola defensive unit that boasted an impressive 0.86 goals against average during Valley play.

Loyola's coaching staff has earned the MVC's Coaching Staff of the Year honor. Loyola won the league with a 6-1 record, two points ahead of second-place Drake. The Ramblers lead the league with 35 goals in 16 games. Loyola head coach Barry Bimbi is in his eighth season at helm. He's assisted by Franky Pelaez, Katie Berkopec, and Chris Brown.

Northern lowa earned the Valley's Fair Play Award, which is structured after the FIFA Fair Play honor. It is awarded to the Valley squad(s) that have the fewest penalty cards during all MVC matches. Northern lowa did not receive a single card during league play. This is the second season in a row that the Panthers earned this nod.

All the award winners were recognized this evening at an awards reception in Chicago, III., prior to the semifinal games on Friday.
