## **MVC Player of the Week**

### Sara Rhine, Jr., F, Drake

Coming off the bench, Drake's Sara Rhine recorded back-to-back double-doubles in the Bulldogs' first two wins over Nebraska and Western Illinois. Rhine averaged 14.5 points, 10.5 rebounds and 1.5 assists per game while shooting 60.0 percent from the floor. She scored 11 points, grabbed 10 rebounds and handed out two assists in 24 minutes in the win over Nebraska. Rhine, the 2018 MVC Sixth Player of the Year, followed that with an even more impressive performance against the

Leathernecks. She scored 18 points, grabbed 11 rebounds and had one assist in just 18 minutes in the easy win.

## **MVC Newcomer of the Week**

### Lasha Petree, Fr., G, Bradley

Petree had a big impact off the bench in Bradley's season-opening victory over Southeast Missouri State, scoring a team-high 24 points on 10-of-18 shooting in an 85-79 victory. She also had five rebounds, one block and one steal. After an 0-for-4 start from the field and a scoreless first quarter, Petree made six of her next seven shots and 10-of-14 down the stretch as she finished with 24 points for the most by a Bradley freshman in their debut. Bradley Hall of Fame member Judy

Burns previously had the most points by a BU frosh in their debut with 23 points vs. SIU Edwardsville on Nov. 20, 1981. Petree scored nine of her 24 points in the final 8:06 of the contest, giving Bradley a three-point advantage with a breakaway layup with 2:34 to play and her three-point play at the 1:31 mark made it a two-possession game at 83-77 in the eventual 85-79 Bradley victory.

## **NOTEWORTHY**

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

**Simone Goods (ILS)** - In Sunday's 68-61 loss at SIUE, Goods was the driving force behind the Redbird offense. She got on the board early in the first quarter, scoring ISU's first points of the game on a commanding and-one finish. By the second period, Goods could not be stopped, scoring 10 of Illinois State's 17 points in that period. At the half, Goods had already tallied 15 points and secured eight rebounds. She continued to carry the team in the third period, scoring the first eight Redbird points of the second half. Goods would finish the contest with a game-high 25 points and 12 rebounds, capturing the fifth double-double of her career. Goods shot 57.1% from the floor, going 8-for-14. She was also a perfect 9-for-9 from the charity stripe, and tallied one assist, one steal, and one block in 33 minutes of play.

Regan Wentland (INS) - Senior Regan Wentland registered her first career double-double as Indiana State defeated Marshall, 62-53, to give Vicki Hall her first win as a head coach. Tying a career-high 13 rebounds, Wentland added 13 points to her tally as she shot 50 percent from the field, including 50 percent from three-point range. The senior forward added two assists and a steal to her tally while not committing a turnover.

Ellie Rice (LUC) - Loyola sophomore guard Ellie Rice chipped in 13 points as part of a 74-63 setback at Youngstown State this past Friday. Rice finished 6-of-10 from the field and 1-of-3 from beyond the three-point arc. The Austin, Texas native also dished out a team-best four assists, setting a new career high in the category. Rice is coming off a freshman campaign that saw her reach double figures in scoring 10 times.

Shameka Ealy (MSU) - Shameka Ealy scored 11 points and had a career-high nine rebounds in Saturday's season opener, including seven offensive boards to rank sixth nationally through the first week of play. Ealy went 3-for-7 from beyond the arc and added one assist without a turnover in 28 minutes.

Makenzie Silvey (SIU) - Silvey poured in a career-high 29 points on 11-of-23 shooting to go along with five assists, two rebounds and a steal at UT Martin Friday night. The Glen Carbon, Ill. native's 29 points were the most scored by a player in the Valley during the opening weekend of play and were the most scored by a Saluki since Rishonda Napier dropped in 33 points against Western Illinois on March 17, 2016. Her 29 points are tied for the fourth-most scored by an underclassmen in program history.

**Meredith Hamlet (VALP0)** - Hamlet led her team in scoring in both games over the opening week of the season, pouring in 19 points at UIC before turning in 15 against North Dakota. The Valpo senior knocked down 12 free throws against the Flames, establishing a single-game career high. In Sunday's six-point loss, Hamlet was instrumental in a comeback effort late in the game as 12 of her team-high 15 points came in the fourth quarter. Hamlet's strong week allowed her to climb into 16th on the program's all-time scoring list.

**Allie Wooldridge (DU)** - Allie Wooldridge made her Drake debut in the victory over Western Illinois. Wooldridge played 12 minutes, scored seven points, grabbed two rebounds and handed out two assists.

Mary Crompton (ILS) - Making her collegiate debut, Crompton showed versatility in the Redbird's 68-61 loss at SIUE on Sunday afternoon. She proved early on that she was a scoring threat, scoring her first basket in the first quarter on a beautiful euro-step move. As the game progressed, Crompton found her rhythm from behind the arc, sinking two threes and scoring eight of her 10 total points in the fourth quarter to give the Redbirds a fighting chance to win the game. Crompton finished the game shooting 40.0% from the field on 4-of-10 shooting and 2-of-7 from long range. She also added four rebounds, one assist, and one steal in 25 minutes of play.

Tamara Lee (INS) - Tamara Lee, a fifth-year transfer from Wichita State that is no stranger to the Valley, scored nine points and grabbed five rebounds in Indiana State's season-opening 62-53 win at Marshall. Lee hit a trio of threes for her scoring and added two assists to her tally in her first game in a Svcamore uniform.

Janae Gonzales (LUC) - Loyola freshman guard Janae Gonzales paced the offensive attack for the Ramblers in a 74-63 season-opening loss at Youngstown State last Friday. Out of Tolleson, Ariz., Gonzales, making her collegiate debut, closed the night with a team-high 14 points. She knocked down a pair of threes and was a perfect 6-of-6 from the free throw line. Gonzales also grabbed two rebounds, handed out an assist and came away with a steal.

Jasmine Franklin (MSU)-Jasmine Franklin scored 10 points and grabbed three rebounds Saturday at Wichita State, shooting 4-for-4 from the field. Franklin is the first MSU freshman in the last 30 seasons to shoot 4-for-4 or better in the season opener, and the fourth Lady Bear in the last eight seasons to debut with a double-figure scoring game.

Payton McCallister (SIU) - McCallister scored 12 points and added five assists, five rebounds and two steals in her first collegiate game at UT Martin Friday night. The Columbia, Mo. native is just the 13th Saluki since 1983 to score 10-plus points in her first collegiate game. Of the 13 Saluki freshmen to score 10-plus points in a season opener, McCallister's 12 points vs. UT Martin are tied for the fourth-most in a debut in program history.

Shay Frederick (VALPO) - Frederick had a strong burst in the second half of Wednesday's season opener at UIC, helping Valpo fight to within five with 4:14 left in regulation after having trailed by as many as 15 early in the fourth. She was the star of that stretch, scoring five points including her first career 3. She came up with an impressive steal and uncorked a nifty bounce pass to Addison Stoller to notch an assist. Frederick made an impact across all areas in her debut, dishing out four assists and swiping three steals to go along with her seven points. The Valpo rookie followed that up as one of two Valpo players to reach double figures in Sunday's home opener, the first double-figure scoring output of her collegiate career.

### **Power Five Up Ahead**

This week, the MVC schedule features two games against Power Five schools, including Missouri State at #16 Missouri and Valparaiso at Illinois. The conference sits 1-0 against Power Five opponents as Drake beat Nebraska in Lincoln in the season opener. Last season, the MVC earned four wins over members of Power Five conferences.

### **MSU vs. Ranked Foes**

The Lady Bears visit a ranked Missouri club on Tuesday evening in search of their 20th all-time victory against top-25 teams. Missouri State owns a 19-46 all-time record against ranked competition, and has six true road wins versus the top 25.

### **Double-Doubles**

During opening week, the MVC had seven players notch double-doubles: Drake's Sara Rhine had a pair, while Drake's Maddy Dean, Evansville's Kerri Gasper, Illinois State's Simone Goods, Indiana State's Regan Wentland, UNI's Megan Maahs and Southern Illinois' Abby Brockmeyer each had one. UNI's Megan Maahs led the league with 12 double-doubles a season ago.

### **Out and Running**

The Salukis scored 94 points in their season opener against UT Martin-their most in an opener since SIU put up 95 points against Murray Stae on Nov. 23, 1996. Southern was especially effective from inside the arc, as they shot 63.2% from 2-point range. According to herhoopsstats.com, SIU's two-point shooting percentage is currently the seventh-best nationally.

## **Sharing the Rock**

Drake racked up 32 assists on 40 field goals in a 98-71 win at Western illinois Saturday, which ranks as the third highest total in a Division I game this season (Baylor, 36; Iowa, 33). The 32 assists are tied for the sixth-highest single game total in MVC history, equaling the Bulldogs' season high from a year ago.

Southern Illinois dished out 23 assists on 34 field goals in the season opener at UT Martin, which is the most in a season opener since the Salukis dished out 29 in a win over Murray State on Nov. 23, 1996.

### **Preseason WNIT**

The Panthers won the opening round of the Preseason WNIT and advanced to the second round after a win against Delaware where they fell on the road at No. 19 Marquette. UNI travels to Northern Illinois in its final game of the WNIT on Sunday, Nov. 18.

### **Poll Position**

Drake continues to receive votes in this week's AP Top 25 Poll, receiving three votes this week (Nov. 12).

### **Mid-Major Top-25 Poll**

Drake appeared in the preseason (Nov. 1) CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 earlier this fall. The Bulldogs sit fifth in the poll, while UNI is receiving votes.

### 1,000 Point Club

UNI senior guard Ellie Howell became the 24th member of the Panther 1,000-point club. She scored 15 points in each of her first games to advance her career mark of 1,005. Howell is one of three active MVC players in the 1,000 point club.

### **Milestone Watch**

Valpo senior Meredith Hamlet has moved to within striking distance of the 1,000 point club as she enters Wednesday's game with 983 career points. She would become just the 15th player in program history to score over 1,000 points.

## **New Valley Streak**

Drake has the longest win streak in the history of the Gateway/MVC for regular season contests. The impressive streak started Feb. 26, 2016 with a win over Loyola. The Bulldogs broke SIU's 37 game streak from 1985-1987 during the Gateway era with a win over Illinois State Feb. 25. The Bulldogs will enter the 2018-19 season with back-to-back 18-0 league seasons.



### **Rhine on McClain Watch List**

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA announced that Drake junior Sara Rhine is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2019 Katrina McClain Award. Named after the two-time All-American and 1987 National Player of the Year, the annual award in its second year recognizes the top power forwards in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2019 Katrina McClain Award will be narrowed to just 10.

## **Starters Returning**

The Missouri Valley Conference will see 37 of 50 starters return (74%) for the 2018-19 season. Defending champion Drake returns all five starters next season, while Illinois State, Indiana State, UNI, Southern Illinois and Valparaiso will see four starters return. Bradley, Evansville, Loyola and Missouri State will each see three starters return to the court.

### **Postseason League**

The MVC has seen an average of four league teams participate in postseason play in the last 20 seasons, including three teams reaching postseason play in 2017-18. Drake fell at Texas A&M in the NCAA Tournament, while Missouri State and UNI each received bids into the WNIT. The Valley has earned multiple NCAA Tournament bids in 11 different seasons, including a pair of bids in the 2017 NCAA Tournament (Drake and UNI).




The 2019 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxSlayer Center in Moline, III., for the fourth-straight season.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event (Mar. 14-17) will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

The MVC extended an agreement with the Quad Cities Convention & Visitors Bureau to conduct the MVC Women's Basketball Championship in TaxSlayer Center through at least 2021.

The 2019 tournament will mark the 12th-consecutive season in its 37-year history that the event will take place at a neutral site.

The Missouri Valley Conference is one of only seven conferences (out of 32 nationally) where the women's basketball tournament is played at a neutral site, separate from the men's championship (AAC, ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, MVC, Pac-12 and SEC are the others).

## **Big Debut**

Freshman Lasha Petree made a big impression in her debut, with the 6-0 guard scoring a team-high 24 points off the bench to help Bradley to an 85-79 victory over Southeast Missouri State. The 13th Bradley freshman to score in double figures in their BU debut, Petree



scored the most points by a Bradley frosh in their debut. She is just the third freshman in program history to top 20 points in their first outing and she broke the school record of 23 points in a freshman debut set by Bradley Hall of Fame member Judy Burns on Nov. 20, 1981.

### Spreading it Around

While freshman Lasha Petree scored a team-high 24 points in the seasonopening win over Southeast Missouri State, she was far from the only Brave to have a big game. Sophomore Nyjah White added a career-high 20 points on 8-of-10 shooting and fellow sophomore Gabi Haack added 19 points of her own. The last time Bradley had three individuals score at least 19 points in the same contest was a 93-82 victory at Western Illinois on Dec. 4, 1998. Bradley's underclassmen combined for 66 of 85 points on 23-of-39 shooting (59.0 percent) against SEMO.

The Lady Bears visit a ranked Missouri club on Tuesday evening in search of their 20th all-time victory against top-25 teams. Missouri State owns a 19-46 all-time record against ranked competition, and has six true road wins versus the top 25.



### **Impressive Debut**

Missouri State's Jasmine Franklin scored 10 points on 4-for-4 shooting in the season's first game, joining Alexa Willard, Liza Fruendt and Tyonna Snow as Lady Bears to debut with a double-figure scoring game in the last eight seasons. Additionally, Franklin is the first MSU freshman in the last 30 seasons to shoot 4-for-4 or better from the field in the season opener.

## **Opener Doesn't Predict the Ending**

With Saturday's setback at Wichita State, Missouri State has now lost seven consecutive season openers. Those losses have not foreshadowed the rest of the season, however, as the Lady Bears have gone on to the postseason four consecutive seasons after dropping their season debut.

Makenzie Silvey poured in a career-high 29 points on 11-of-23 shooting in SIU's season opener at UT Martin, which including six three-pointers and five assists. Silvey's 29 points were the most scored by a Saluki since Rishonda Napier netted 33 vs. Western



Illinois on March 17, 2016 and it was tied for the fourth-most points by an underclassmen in a single game in program history.

### Out and Running

The Salukis scored 94 points in their season opener against UT Martintheir most in an opener since SIU put up 95 points against Murray Stae on Nov. 23, 1996. Southern was especially effective from inside the arc, as they shot 63.2% from 2-point range. According to herhoopsstats. com, SIU's two-point shooting percentage is currently the seventh-best nationally.

### 20+ Assists in Opener

The Salukis dished out 23 assists on 34 field goals in the season opener at UT Martin, which marked the second-straight season in which Southern notched 20-plus assists in its opener. SIU's 23 assists were the most in a season opener since the Salukis dished out 29 in a 95-63 win over Murray State on Nov. 23, 1996.

## **VALPARAISO (0-2)**

### **Milestone Watch**

Valpo senior Meredith Hamlet has moved to within striking distance of a noteworthy milestone as she enters Wednesday's game with 983 career points, needing 17 to hit the 1,000-point threshold for her collegiate career. She would become just the 15th player



in program history to score over 1,000 points. It doesn't take much of a journey into the Valpo women's basketball history books to find the last 1,000-point scorer, as Dani Franklin reached the milestone on Jan. 17, 2017 at Green Bay. With her 15-point effort on Sunday against North Dakota, Hamlet climbed to 16th in program history in career scoring, surpassing both Agnieszka Kulaga (2005-2009, 971) and Cheryl Wilbrandt (1989-1993, 978). Hamlet is 10 points away from overtaking Shari Toelke (1990-1994, 992) for a spot in the Top 15. In addition, Hamlet has 155 made 3s, a total that ranks seventh in program history. She is 17 away from entering the Top 5.

### **Battling the Big Ten**

Valpo enters Wednesday night seeking its first win against a Big Ten team since topping Indiana 64-52 at the ARC on Nov. 9, 2012. Although Valpo has never beaten Illinois, the program does have wins over four Big Ten schools - Indiana, Purdue, Northwestern and Michigan. Valpo bested Northwestern 57-51 on Nov. 30, 2005, beat Michigan 62-49 in the first round of the WNIT on March 13, 2002 and most notably upset No. 21 Purdue on Dec. 10, 2008 by a score of 71-60. This will mark the fifth power conference venue that Valpo's seniors have had the opportunity to play in during their time on campus. Valpo went to Louisville in 2015-16, Notre Dame and Indiana in 2016-17 and Purdue in 2017-18. Valpo's last Big Ten game saw Meredith Hamlet go off for 19 first-half points and knock down five 3s prior to halftime last year at Purdue.
