MVC Player of the Week

Sara Rhine, Jr., F, Drake

Redshirt junior Sara Rhine posted her third double-double to start the season in the victory over South Dakota with 11 points and 10 rebounds behind 5-of-9 shooting, including knocking down one three-pointer. Rhine just missed another double-double in the win over CSUN with 24 points and eight rebounds. She went 10-for-20 against the Matadors, including making another three-pointer and she added one block, one assist and one steal. Rhine is averaging 16.3 points, which

ranks fourth in the MVC and 10.3 rebounds, which ranks second in the Valley behind a 55.1 shooting clip, which also ranks fourth in the league.

MVC Newcomer of the Week

Janae Gonzales, Fr., G, Loyola

Loyola freshman guard Janae Gonzales turned in the top outing of her young career in the Ramblers' 75-60 win at UIC last Saturday. The Tolleson, Ariz. native erupted for a season-high 17 points on 7-of-11 shooting as Loyola capped of a 2-0 week against former Horizon League rivals. She also saw action earlier in the week as part of a 52-43 triumph over Detroit Mercy, collecting a pair of rebounds, dishing out an assist and blocking a shot against the Titans. Gonzales, who has started in

all three games for head coach Kate Achter this season, has reached double figures in scoring in two of her three appearances and is tied for third on the team in scoring (10.3 ppg).

NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Lasha Petree (BRAD) - Petree scored a game-high 21 points on 6-of-10 shooting in just 13 minutes off the bench to help Bradley to an 83-40 victory over Rockhurst. She hit 3-of-5 three-pointers and made 6-of-7 free throw attempts in addition to collecting four rebounds, two blocks and three steals in the win. Petree is the first Bradley player to score 20 or more in the first two games of a season since Michelle Young in 2013-14 and is the first BU freshman with consecutive 20-point games since Bradley Hall of Fame member Heather Best closed out her freshman campaign in 1995-96 with a 31-point effort against Indiana State and 20-point contest vs. Illinois State.

Simone Goods (ILS) - The senior forward had two double digit showings with 19 in win over North Dakota and 13 points in loss to Eastern Michigan. With her strong performance this week she is currently averaging 19.0 points a game and 9.3 rebounds. She is now the second leading scorer in the conference and third in rebounding.

Ashli O'Neal (INS) - Junior Ashli O'Neal led Indiana State to a come-from-behind victory at Saint Louis last week as the Sycamores trailed the 2018 WNIT participants by 10 points in the fourth quarter. O'Neal scored 19 points and hit nine free throws in the game - the most by any Valley player last week. The junior guard set a career-high seven steals in the game, a mark that is the most by any Valley player this season, while also grabbing six rebounds. Her 3.50 steals per game rank her 36th nationally (and first in the MVC) while her 16 free throws made rank 48th nationally. O'Neal scored 13 of her 19 points in the fourth quarter against the Billikens as ISU more than doubled their score in the final quarter, at one point outscoring the host Billikens 23-9 in that final frame.

Tiara Wallace (LUC) - Loyola junior Tiara Wallace continued the strong start to her season, averaging 10.5 points and 6.0 rebounds as the Ramblers picked up a pair of victories this past week. In Monday's 52-43 win over Detroit Mercy, Wallace added nine points, seven rebounds and a game-high four steals. The Berkeley, III. native saved her best for Saturday's 75-60 victory at UIC, pouring in 15 points, just four off her career high, to go along with eight rebounds and five assists. Wallace is currently ranks second on the Rambler roster in scoring (12.0 ppg) and leads the team in rebounding (6.7 rpg), assists (3.0 apg) and steals (2.3 spg).

Danielle Gitzen (MSU) - Danielle Gitzen led the Lady Bears in scoring in both games last week, averaging 14.5 points on 46 percent shooting, 2.0 rebounds and 2.0 assists. The senior made half of her 3-point attempts and went 5-for-5 at the foul line. Tuesday at 16th-ranked Missouri, Gitzen scored all 16 of her points in the fourth quarter to help the Lady Bears overcome a 15-point halftime deficit before a narrow loss. She went 7-for-14 from the floor and 2-for-4 from beyond the arc, adding three rebounds and a steal. Saturday, Gitzen tallied 13 points, including eight straight in the third quarter to push MSU's lead to 21 points against Ball State. She added three assists and a rebound.

Karli Rucker (UNI) - Sophomore Karli Rucker led the Panthers with 22 points on 8-18 (.444) shooting including 4-8 (.500) from the three-point line. She is now 14-14 from the free throw line this season after going 2-2 against NIU. She is averaging 18.0 points and 5.0 assists per game for the Panthers.

Nicole Martin (SIU) - Martin averaged 18.0 points on 63.6% shooting (14-of-22) and grabbed 6.5 rebounds per game as SIU went 2-0 last week. The 2018 Preseason All-MVC selection led all scorers with 19 points on 8-of-13 shooting and added eight rebounds in Southern's 60-40 win over SEMO on Wednesday. The Jefferson City, Mo. native followed with a game-high 17 points on 6-of-9 shooting to go along with five rebounds in SIU's 58-49 win over Marshall. She has now scored in double-figures in 11-straight games dating back to last season and has reached double-digits in 33 career games.

Addison Stoller (VALPO) - Stoller scored nine points or more in all three games this week while making contributions in a variety of statistical categories. She started the week with a 12-point effort against Power 5 competition at Illinois on an efficient 5-of-10 shooting while playing in front of numerous friends and family members in her return to her hometown area on Wednesday Stoller who has burst into the starting line up this season after being hindered by a knee injury each of the last two years, following the game at Illinois by finishing a point shy of a double-double in the opener of the Vinewood Farm Classic at Morehead State on Friday. Her career-high 10 rebounds marked the first double-figure rebounding effort by any Valpo player this season, while her five assists were also a personal best. The redshirt sophomore again filled the stat sheet on Saturday vs. St. Francis Brooklyn with nine points, a team-high eight rebounds and a team-high three steals. Five of her boards came on the offensive glass in a 78-76 Valpo win.

Tayzha Buck (UE) - In her first regular season home game for Evansville, freshman guard Tayzha Buck continued her strong shooting from beyond the arc. On Wednesday, Buck hit three triples on five attempts from three, including a pair of three-pointers during third-quarter Evansville run. This season, Buck leads the Purple Aces with seven made three-points, shooting 43.8% from outside this year.

Mary Crompton (ILS) - Crompton went 3-for-5 from behind the arc and added a career high of 15 points in win against North Dakota. The freshman guard averages 9.0 points and 4.0 rebounds per game.

Lynn Tamis (INS) - Lynn Tamis, a true freshman from the Netherlands, scored seven points and grabbed five rebounds in Indiana State's come-from-behind win at Saint Louis last week. Tamis was 3-for-4 form the field and blocked a shot and is ranked fourth in the Valley with an average of 1.0 blocks per game.

Sydney Manning (MSU) - Sydney Manning averaged 10.0 points, 4.0 rebounds and 2.0 assists last week, shooting 58 percent from the floor and 63 percent from 3-point range. Manning scored 11 points Tuesday at 16th-ranked Missouri, going 4-for-8 overall and hitting a pair of treys. Saturday against Ball State, the freshman went 3-for-4 from beyond the arc, knocking down triples in the waning seconds of both the first and second quarters. She added five rebounds and three assists against the Cardinals.

Shay Frederick (VALPO) - After being held to four points at Big Ten foe Illinois on Wednesday, the Valpo freshman had a strong weekend in the Vinewood Farm Classic hosted by Morehead State. Frederick started the weekend by knocking down three triples on Friday against the host Eagles, finishing in double figures with 10 points. She followed with a career-high 19 points in Saturday's 78-76 win over St. Francis Brooklyn. Frederick finished as the team's leading scorer for the first time in her young career. She also became the first freshman in the MVC to hit four 3-pointers in a game this season.

Power Five Showdowns

This week, the MVC schedule features two more games against Power Five schools, including Drake vs. Rutgers in Vancouver and Southern Illinois vs. #19 Arizona State in Las Vegas. The conference sits 1-2 against Power Five opponents as Drake beat Nebraska in Lincoln in the season opener. Last season, the MVC earned four wins over members of Power Five conferences

To the Great White North

Drake enjoyed just a brief stay at the Knapp Center as it will now play its next four games on the road or at a neutral site. For their next three games, the Bulldogs make just their second-ever trip to Canada and first since the 1975-76 season for the inaugural Vancouver Showcase in Vancouver, British Columbia. Drake starts the three-day tournament against Rutgers on Thanksgiving Day (Nov. 22) and will play two more games, Nov. 23 and 24, in Vancouver.

2-0 Starts

For the second consecutive year Bradley has opened a season with a 2-0 record, marking the first backto-back 2-0 starts to seasons since 2004-05 (3-0) and 2005-06 (2-0). Bradley travels to Boca Raton, Fla., for the Florida Atlantic Thanksgiving Tournament Friday and Saturday.

Don't Call It A Comeback

Indiana State has found a way to win a pair of tough games after trailing at halftime under new head coach Vicki Hall. ISU has scored 27 points in a single quarter in the second half in both efforts to help push the Trees forward for the win. At Marshall, ISU out-scored the Thundering Herd 27-14 in the third quarter while the Sycamores used a 27-13 fourth quarter to claim the win at Saint Louis.

Comeback Kids

For the second time in a six-day span, Loyola erased a double-digit deficit to pick up a victory over a former Horizon League rival, as it defeated UIC, 75-60, on Saturday. The Ramblers outscored their rivals from the West Side by a final margin of 29-13 during the fourth quarter, shooting 70 percent (7-of-10) from the field and an impressive 94 percent (15-of-16) from the free throw line over the final 10 minutes of play.

Sharing the Rock

Drake enters the week averaging 23.0 assists per game, which ranks fourth nationally. The Bulldogs sit behind three teams currently ranked in the AP Top 15. Drake dished out 32 assists in a win over Western Illinois. The effort ranks as the fifth most in an NCAA game this season.

Just 47 players in all of NCAA DI have made every free throw attempt this season.

1,000 Point Club

Valparaiso senior guard Meredith Hamlet became the 15th member of the Valpo 1,000-point club. She scored 18 points in a win over St. Francis (NY) to advance her career mark of 1,013. Hamlet is one of four active MVC players in the 1,000 point club.

New Valley Streak

Drake has the longest win streak in the history of the Gateway/MVC for regular season contests. The impressive streak started Feb. 26, 2016 with a win over Loyola. The Bulldogs broke SIU's 37 game streak from 1985-1987 during the Gateway era with a win over Illinois State Feb. 25. The Bulldogs will enter the 2018-19 season with backto-back 18-0 league seasons.



Extends Home Streak

Missouri State won its ninth consecutive home game in impressive fashion Saturday, a 74-54 triumph against a Ball State team that has advanced to postseason play six consecutive seasons. The Lady Bears have won nine straight games at JQH Arena, doing so by an average score of 76.4-53.6. No opponent has scored more than 61 points during the streak, which is the second-longest for MSU at The Q.

Double-Doubles

Drake's Sara Rhine and Southern Illinois' Abby Brockmeyer have each posted three doubledoubles on the season. The duo ranks second nationally behind four players who have four double-doubles on the season. The rest of the MVC has combined to post six double-doubles so far this season, equaling the two players output. Brockmeyer is the first player in SIU history to open a season with three-straight double-doubles

Rhine on McClain Watch List


The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA announced that Drake junior Sara Rhine is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2019 Katrina McClain Award. Named after the two-time All-American and 1987 National Player of the Year, the annual award in its second year recognizes the top power forwards in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2019 Katrina McClain Award will be narrowed to just 10.

Starters Returning

The Missouri Valley Conference will see 37 of 50 starters return (74%) for the 2018-19 season. Defending champion Drake returns all five starters next season, while Illinois State, Indiana State, UNI, Southern Illinois and Valparaiso will see four starters return. Bradley, Evansville, Loyola and Missouri State will each see three starters return to the court.

Postseason League

The MVC has seen an average of four league teams participate in postseason play in the last 20 seasons, including three teams reaching postseason play in 2017-18. Drake fell at Texas A&M in the NCAA Tournament, while Missouri State and UNI each received bids into the WNIT. The Valley has earned multiple NCAA Tournament bids in 11 different seasons, including a pair of bids in the 2017 NCAA Tournament (Drake and UNI).



Hoops In the Heartland

The 2019 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxS-layer Center in Moline, Ill., for the fourth-straight season.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event (Mar. 14-17) will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

The MVC extended an agreement with the Quad Cities Convention & Visitors Bureau to conduct the MVC Women's Basketball Championship in TaxSlayer Center through at least 2021.

The 2019 tournament will mark the 12th-consecutive season in its 37-year history that the event will take place at a neutral site.

The Missouri Valley Conference is one of only seven conferences (out of 32 nationally) where the women's basketball tournament is played at a neutral site, separate from the men's championship (AAC, ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, MVC, Pac-12 and SEC are the others).

Fresh Impact

Early on this season, the Purple Aces have seen their freshmen step-up and contribute on both sides of the floor. Of Evansville's top five scorers, three of them are freshman, led by Makayla Wallace, who is averaging 9.7 points per game. Along with Wallace, Anna Newman



(7.7 points per game) and Tayzha Buck (7.3) are also amongst the top five scorers for Evansville. Three Aces also sit in the top five in rebounding average for the Aces (Tayzha Buck, A'Niah Griffin, and Anna Newman) while Makayla Wallace leads UE in assists and steals.

Coffman Moves Up List

After recording nine blocks through three games, junior center Kaylan Coffman is poised to make another move up the record book. Coffman has 67 blocks in her career, just one away from placing her in a tie for sixth in the Purple Aces' program record book. To enter the top five all-time in career blocks, Coffman needs just 10 blocks to put her alone in fifth.

Strong From the Line

After capturing the NCAA Division I statistical championship for team free-throw shooting percentage in 2017-18, the Aces have started the 2018-19 campaign much like they ended last season. In each of Evansville's first three games, the Aces have shot 75% or better from the charity stripe. Since the start of last season, UE has shot lower than 70% from the free-throw line just five times, while shooting 90% or better from the line seven times.
