MVC Player of the Week

Sara Rhine, Jr., F. Drake

Sara Rhine continued her stellar play at the Vancouver Showcase. In three games, Rhine averaged 20.3 points, 5.0 rebounds and 1.0 steal per game, helped Drake go 2-1 with wins over Power 5 members, Rutgers and No. 12/13 South Carolina with its lone loss to No. 1 Notre Dame, claim third place at the inaugural 8-team event and she was named MVP of the consolation game against South Carolina. In the comeback victory over Rutgers she scored 18 points on 7-of-13 shooting from the floor and 4-of-5 from the free throw line to go with four rebounds and one steal

in 23 minutes. Against No. 1 Notre Dame, which won the tournament, she scored 18 points on 8-of-14 shooting, and pulled down five rebounds in 18 minutes. Rhine had her best game in the win over No. 12/13 South Carolina, she scored a team-high 23 points on 8-of-14 shooting from the floor and 8-of-10 from the free throw line in addition to pulling down six rebounds and grabbing one steal in 29 minutes. Rhine is second in the MVC in scoring at 17.9 points per game, fourth in rebounding at 8.0 per game and fourth in shooting 55.6.

Tamara Lee, Sr., G, Indiana State

Indiana State's Tamara Lee averaged 15.0 points per game and shot 45 percent from the field as the Sycamores rallied from a nine-point deficit for a double-overtime win at Grand Canyon. She tied a career-best 20 points in that win as Lee shot 37.5 percent from three-point range and hit all nine free throws over the weekend.

NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Gabi Haack (BRAD) - Haack was named MVP of the Florida Atlantic Thanksgiving Tournament after helping Bradley to a 2-0 record and tournament title. She averaged 21.0 points on 48 percent shooting, including 9-of-20 (45 percent) three-point shooting, and collected 7.0 rebounds, 4.5 assists and 1.0 steals while boasting a 3.00 assist-to-turnover ratio. Haack had 10 points, three rebounds two steals and tied a career-high with five assists in a 59-47 victory against Delaware, which reached last year's WNIT, to open tournament play. She followed it up with a historic performance in the championship, tossing in a career-high 32 points against tournament-host Florida Atlantic. Haack was 11-for-19 from the field and hit seven three-pointers in addition to tying a career-high with 11 rebounds against the Owls. Her 32 points are the most in the MVC this season and were the most points by a Brave in a game since Michelle Young tied the Bradley single-game scoring record of 38 points nearly four years to the day (11/26/14).

TeTe Maggett (ILS) - The junior guard added a new personal best in points and assists in Sunday's close loss to Butter with 22 and seven, respectively. She added double figures in both of Illinois State's contests with 10 points on Monday. Maggett went 4-for-6 from 3-point range on Sunday and shot 42.8 percent from the field this week. Maggett added a total of 10 assists, 12 rebounds, 32 points and three steals, leading the Redbirds in all four statistical categories.

Ashli O'Neal (INS) - Junior Ashli O'Neal led Indiana State to a come-from-behind double overtime victory at Grand Canyon, despite the Sycamores trailing by nine points, and averaged 19.0 points, 6.0 rebounds and 4.5 steals per game at the Grand Canyon Thanksgiving Classic. She finished the week with 38 points total, including 21 points against Grand Canyon, nine steals and 12 rebounds as a 5-foot-5 point guard.

Ellie Rice (LUC) - Loyola sophomore guard Ellie Rice poured in a season-best 18 points, two points off her career high, to lead the Ramblers in an 88-74 road loss at Bowling Green last Tuesday. The Austin, Texas native connected on six of her 11 attempts from the field and drained a season-best four threes. Rice, who also dished out a career-high five assists against the Falcons, is averaging a team-best 13.5 points, a mark which ranks just outside the top 10 on the MVC leaderboard.

Brice Calip (MSU) - Brice Calip filled the box score in all categories last week, recording 11 points, three rebounds, three assists, three steals and two blocked shots at Santa Clara. Calip need only 23 minutes to reach those numbers and committed only one turnover in the game.

Karli Rucker (UNI) - Karli Rucker averaged 15.0 points to lead UNI to a 2-1 week, including a win over Creighton a 71-64 true road win over Long Beach State and a 61-60 loss to Boise State, the back-to-back Mountain West Champions. She earned Beach Classic All-Tournament Team honors. She shot 15-33 (45.5 percent) from the field and 4-7 (57.1 percent) from the three-point line. She was also 7-8 (87.5 percent) from the free throw line. She also grabbed a total of 10 rebounds and five assists on the weekend. She scored 19 points against Long Beach State and 22 points against Boise State.

Abby Brockmeyer (SIU) - Brockmeyer averaged 11.3 points on 50% (12-of-24) shooting from the floor to go along with 7.0 rebounds and 2.7 assists in SIU's three games last week. The sophomore forward from Raymond, III. tallied eight points, eight rebounds, two assists, a block and a steal at Western Kentucky and followed with her fourth double-double of the season in SIU's 72-50 win over Hartford. The 2018 MVC Freshman of the Year poured in 17 points, grabbed 10 boards and dished out a career-best five assists in the win- SIU's first-ever versus an American East Conference foe. She followed with nine points on 3-of-3 shooting and added three boards against No. 19 Arizona State on Saturday. Brockmeyer leads the Valley, and ranks eighth nationally, with four double-doubles.

Lasha Petree (BRAD) - Petree averaged 7.0 points, 2.5 rebounds and 1.5 steals per game, helping Bradley to a 2-0 record and title at the Florida Atlantic Thanksgiving Tournament in Boca Raton, Fla. Petree tallied seven points, five rebounds and one block in 16 minutes off the bench in a 59-47 victory against 2018 WNIT participant Delaware to help the Braves reach the championship game. She had all seven of her points and three rebounds in the second half against the Blue Hens. In the championship game, Petree collected points, one assist and three steals in 18 minutes. She had five points, an assist and two steals in the second half, helping Bradley pull away from Florida Atlantic in the second half.

Tayzha Buck (UE) - For the third-straight game, freshman guard Tayzha Buck found her rhythm from beyond the arc. Hosting Purdue Fort Wayne on Tuesday, Buck finished with nine or more points for the third game in-a-row, scoring 12 points on four-of-eight shooting from three and collected five rebounds. Buck's four triples marked the third-straight game in which she hit three or more three-pointers. The freshman leads the Purple Aces in threes made (11) and three-point percentage (45.8%).

TeTe Maggett (ILS) - The junior guard added a new personal best in points and assists in Sunday's close loss to Butler with 22 and seven, respectively. She added double figures in both of Illinois State's contests with 10 points on Monday. Maggett went 4-for-6 from 3-point range on Sunday and shot 42.8 percent from the field this week. Allison Day (LUC) - Loyola freshman forward Allison Day provided a lift off the bench for the Ramblers in last Tuesday's 88-74 loss at Bowling Green. Out of Winchester, Ohio, she added 10 points, reaching double figures in scoring for the second time in the Maroon & Gold's last three games. Day currently ranks third amongst Valley freshmen in field goal percentage, operating at a 50 percent clip from the field.

Jasmine Franklin (MSU) - Jasmine Franklin had six points, six rebounds, four blocks, two steals and two assists Saturday at Santa Clara in MSU's only game last week. Franklin's four blocks were the most for an MSU freshman since Christiana Shorter had four against UNI on Jan. 2, 2010.

Payton McCallister (SIU) - McCallister averaged 9.7 points, 2.3 assists and 1.7 rebounds in SIU's three games over Thanksgiving break. The freshman guard from Columbia, Mo. poured in a career-best 15 points against Western Kentucky on Nov. 20 and followed with her third double-digit scoring output of the season with 11 points, five assists and three rebounds in Southern's 72-50 win over Hartford on Nov. 23.

Poll Position

Drake moved to No. 24 in Monday's Associated Press' women's Top 25 poll. The Bulldogs went 2-1 last week at the Vancouver Showcase with wins over Rutgers and then No. 13 South Carolina and a loss to No. 1 Notre Dame. This is the first ranking for the program since it closed the 2016-17 season at No. 20 in the final AP poll. It is the earliest a MVC team has appeared in the AP poll since Missouri State sat 21st on Nov. 13, 2000.

Upset Up North

Drake closed the Vancouver Showcase with a 90-85 overtime victory over No. 12/13 South Carolina in the third place game. It is the highest ranked win over an opponent for the Bulldogs since the 2002 team defeated No. 7 Baylor in the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

It is the highest ranked win over an opponent in the regular season by a Valley team since Missouri State beat No. 10 LSU on November 24, 2000.

Another Power Five Win

Saturday saw Drake notch another Power Five win to its resume as the Bulldogs beat No. 13 ranked South Carolina. The conference sits 3-4 against Power Five opponents as Drake also beat Nebraska and Rutgers. The MVC has nine more opportunities against teams from the Big Ten and Big 12 during non-conference play. Last season, the MVC earned four wins over members of Power Five conferences.

Historic Start

Bradley claimed their first in-season tournament title since 2008-09 along with the first 4-0 start to a season in nearly two decades with a win at Florida Atlantic Saturday. The last time Bradley opened a season with four consecutive victories came in 2001-02 when BU went a perfect 9-0 in non-conference action. Gabi Haack's 32 points were the most by a Brave almost four years to the day from when Michelle Young tied the Bradley single-game scoring record of 38 points in a contest at Columbia on Nov. 26, 2014.

Queens of the Comeback

Give them a crown because the 2018-19 Sycamores have quickly become the Queens of the Comeback. All three victories early on this season for Indiana State have been come-from-behind wins. ISU trailed Marshall by seven, Saint Louis by 14 and the Sycamores erased a nine-point deficit to come back and beat Grand Canyon in double overtime.

Double-Doubles

Southern Illinois' Abby Brockmeyer leads the MVC with four double-doubles, while Drake's Sara Rhine has posted three double-doubles on the season. UNI's Megan Maahs is the only other player with multiple double-doubles as the senior has two so far on the season.

Triple Twenty

Indiana State notched what might be a program first (easily accessible records only date back to 2003-04 season) in its double-overtime win at Grand Canyon on Nov. 23 - three players (Alexis Delgado (22), Ashli O'Neal (21), Tamara Lee (20)) reached the 20-point mark. Not only is that a rare feat in Terre Haute, but it is a rare feat in the Valley. Current research (and it is still on-going) shows that the last time a Valley team achieved this mark it was Southern Illinois on Feb. 18, 1981 - but that predates the Missouri Valley Conference itself. It even predates the Gateway Conference, the MVC's women's sports predecessor.

Improved on the Road

Last season, The Valley posted a 9-41 record on the road in non-league action. So far this season, the conference has already secured nine road wins. The conference can surpass last year's win total on the road Wednesday as Drake faces Creighton.

Sharing the Rock

Drake enters the week averaging 22.4 assists per game, which ranks fourth nationally. The Bulldogs lead the nation in total assists this season, racking up 157 over seven contests.



New Valley Streak

Drake has the longest win streak in the history of the Gateway/MVC for regular season contests. The impressive streak started Feb. 26, 2016 with a win over Loyola. The Bulldogs broke SIU's 37 game streak from 1985-1987 during the Gateway era with a win over Illinois State Feb. 25. The Bulldogs will enter the 2018-19 season with back-to-back 18-0 league seasons.



Rhine on McClain Watch List

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA announced that Drake junior Sara Rhine is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2019 Katrina McClain Award. Named after the two-time All-American and 1987 National Player of the Year, the annual award in its second year recognizes the top power forwards in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2019 Katrina McClain Award will be narrowed to just 10.

Starters Returning

The Missouri Valley Conference will see 37 of 50 starters return (74%) for the 2018-19 season. Defending champion Drake returns all five starters next season, while Illinois State, Indiana State, UNI, Southern Illinois and Valparaiso will see four starters return. Bradley, Evansville, Loyola and Missouri State will each see three starters return to the court.



Postseason League

The MVC has seen an average of four league teams participate in postseason play in the last 20 seasons, including three teams reaching postseason play in 2017-18. Drake fell at Texas A&M in the NCAA Tournament, while Missouri State and UNI each received bids into the WNIT. The Valley has earned multiple NCAA Tournament bids in 11 different seasons, including a pair of bids in the 2017 NCAA Tournament (Drake and UNI).

Hoops In the Heartland

The 2019 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxS-layer Center in Moline, III., for the fourth-straight season.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event (Mar. 14-17) will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

The MVC extended an agreement with the Quad Cities Convention & Visitors Bureau to conduct the MVC Women's Basketball Championship in TaxSlayer Center through at least 2021.

The 2019 tournament will mark the 12th-consecutive season in its 37-year history that the event will take place at a neutral site.

The Missouri Valley Conference is one of only seven conferences (out of 32 nationally) where the women's basketball tournament is played at a neutral site, separate from the men's championship (AAC, ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, MVC, Pac-12 and SEC are the others).

Coaches Teleconferences

Hot Start

Bradley went 2-0 at the Florida Athletic Thanksgiving Tournament in Boca Raton, Fla., to claim the tournament title, posting victories over 2018 WNIT participant Delaware and tournament-host FAU. The tournament title was the first for the Braves since winning the North-



ern Arizona Thanksgiving Classic during the 2008-09 season and Bradley is the lone undefeated team in the MVC at 4-0. BU's 4-0 start is its best since a 9-0 start to the 2001-02 campaign. The four-game win streak for the Braves matches the longest for Bradley dating back to a five-game win streak to close the 2011-12 non-conference slate.


On Fire

Sophomore Gabi Haack was named MVP of the Florida Atlantic Thanksgiving Tournament after scoring a career-best 32 points in an 80-59 victory over tournament-host FAU in the championship game Saturday. Haack, who hit seven three-pointers in the victory, was the first Bradley player to score 30 points in a game since Michelle Young tied the Bradley singlegame scoring record of 38 points almost four years to the day on Nov. 26, 2014 at Columbia. Haack also tied a career-high 11 rebounds to turn in the first double-double for a Brave in a 30-point performance going back to Nov. 21, 2000 when Sara Bailey had 31 points and 11 rebounds against Eastern Illinois. Haack joined Erika Nelson (2003-07) and head coach Andrea Gorski (1988-92) as the only players in program history to hit seven or more three's in two different contests.

Give them a crown because the 2018-19 Sycamores have quickly become the Queens of the Comeback. All three victories early on this season for Indiana State have been come-from-behind wins. ISU trailed Marshall by seven, Saint Louis by 14 and the Sycamores erased a



nine-point deficit to come back and beat Grand Canyon in double overtime.

Triple Twenty

Date

Indiana State set a program first (at least in recent years) in the doubleovertime win at Grand Canyon on Nov. 23 as the Sycamores had three different players score 20-plus points in the 88-81 come-from-behind victory. Alexis Delgado (22), Ashli O'Neal (21) and Tamara Lee (20) all scored 20 or more points and that marked the first time this feat has happened for the Sycamores dating at least back to the 2003-04 season.

No Home November

Opponent

Due to planned renovations to the Hulman Center, Indiana State will be road warriors for the month of November this season. The Sycamores will open the 2018-19 season with five straight games away from home (four true road games and one neutral contest) and will not play a home game in the Wabash Valley until hosting IUPUI on Dec. 3. This marks the first time since the 1982-83 season that the Sycamores will not have a home game in the month of November. That year was also the last time ISU opened the year with five straight games away from home. But that also marked a different schedule in the world of college basketball. Indiana State's opener that season came on Nov. 26 and ISU played in two neutral site challenges before hosting Ball State on Dec. 7, 1982.

Fortunes Turn with Calendar

After facing a difficult schedule and finishing 1-3 in November, the Lady Bears look to continue a positive trend from Kellie Harper's first five seasons. Under Harper, MSU boasts winning percentages of .621 in December, .675 in January and .722 in February, while the defense drops its scoring average from 70.5 in the season's first month to 64.3 for the rest of the year.

More Franklin Superlatives

Jasmine Franklin continues to impress for the Lady Bears, as her four blocked shots on Saturday were the most for an MSU freshman since Christiana Shorter had four against UNI on Jan. 2, 2010. Franklin's seven blocks through four games are the most to begin a career since Tia Mays had eight through four games as a sophomore transfer on the way to a school-record 107 stuffs in the 2010-11 season.

Double-Double Machine

Abby Brockmeyer poured in 17 points, grabbed 10 boards and dished out a career-best five assists in SIU's 72-50 win over Hartford on Black Friday. The sophomore forward from Raymond, III. leads the Valley, and ranks eighth nationally, with four double-



doubles and is currently first in rebounds per game (9.2). She also ranks second in the league in blocked shots (9) and third in blocks per game (1.5).

Distribution Point

Brittney Patrick has started all six games at point guard for the Salukis and is averaging a Valley-best 5.0 assists per contest. The junior from Bolingbrook, Ill. has recorded at least four assists in five of SIU's six games this season and tied her season-bests in points (10) and assists (7) at Western Kentucky on Nov. 20. Patrick is also currently second in the league in both assist-to-turnover ratio (2.31) and total assists (30).

America East Win

The Salukis led from start to finish in a 72-50 win over the Hartford Hawks at the South Point Shootout on Black Friday. It was SIU's first win in Las Vegas since 1990, and Southern's first-ever victory over an America East Conference foe. It also marked the first coaching win for head coach Cindy Stein over a AEC foe, and she has now recorded at least one victory over schools from 29 of the 32 DI conferences.

Hamlet Honored

After becoming the 15th member of Valpo's 1,000 point club on Nov. 17, senior Meredith Hamlet was honored before Monday's game against Toledo. She followed that with her highest scoring output of the season – 26 points against a quality MAC foe. That effort was three points shy of matching a career high. She hit a pair of 3-pointers in the final 35 seconds to allow Valpo to close to within four and eventually fall by six in a game the team had trailed by as many as 14.

Winning the Turnover Battle

Valpo has won the turnover battle in all six games so far this season. This is Valpo's first such streak since the 2008-09 campaign, when the team had fewer turnovers than its opponent in six straight games. Defense has been a big part of that as Valpo has 59 steals through six games.
