## MVC Player of the Week

### Simone Goods, Sr., F, Illinois State

The senior forward led the Redbirds to two-straight wins, tallying 41 points and 18 rebounds in this week's contests. Goods tied her career high with 14 boards in the 61-49 victory over Austin Peay and captured her seventh career double-double with 22 points. She went 10-for-11 from the charity stripe Tuesday night and shot 50 percent from the field. She led all scorers in a 58-53 win over Northern Kentucky Friday night, scoring 19 points in 18 minutes of playing time.

## MVC Newcomer of the Week

### TeTe Maggett, Jr., G, Illinois State

The junior guard added double figures in both contests this week, guiding the Redbirds to two-straight wins. The Chicago native scored 17 points with seven rebounds in the win over Austin Peay and added 16 points in a win at Northern Kentucky. Maggett has scored in double digits in all but two games this season and averages 13.5 points per game. Additionally, she dished out seven assists and added 10 boards between the two games and shot 81 percent from the free-throw line.

## NOTEWORTHY

*In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:*

**Nyjah White (BRAD)** - White nearly turned in the first triple-double at Bradley since 1996, finishing with career highs of 23 points and eight assists to go with nine rebounds, two blocks and a pair of steals in a victory over Western Illinois last week. White was 10-for-15 from the field to help Bradley extend its conference-best start to 7-0 on the year. After collecting six points, two boards, four assists and one block in nine first-half minutes, White dominated the second half with 17 points on 7-of-10 shooting and had seven boards, four assists, a block and two steals in the second half.

**Sara Rhine (DU)** - Sara Rhine averaged 22.0 points, 6.5 rebounds and 2.0 steals while shooting a blistering 86.3 from the floor in Drake's two games last week. Rhine, who averaged 23.5 minutes last week, began the week going a perfect 10-of-10 from the field with one three-pointer in addition to four rebounds and three steals in 22 minutes in the team's big win over Clarke. She then followed that with 22 points on 9-of-12 shooting and she pulled down nine rebounds in a hard-fought contest at South Dakota State. This season, Rhine is scoring a league-best 18.6 points per game while shooting a league-high 57.8 percent from the floor. She is also fourth in rebounding average at 8.2 per game, has four doubles and has pulled down a league-leading 82 rebounds.

**Kerri Gasper (UE)** - In a pair of home games last week, senior Kerri Gasper continued to produce for the Purple Aces. Opening the week against UIC, Gasper poured-in a season-high 22 points, adding five rebounds, one assist, and a steal in a narrow 62-54 loss to the Flames. The senior extended her streak of double-figure scoring performances on Saturday against SEMO, scoring 12 points and recording 11 rebounds for her third double-double of the season. In both games, Gasper played all 40 minutes. Through eight games, Gasper leads Evansville in scoring average (13.6), rebounds per game (7.4), and minutes per game (34.4).

**Ashli O'Neal (INS)** - Junior Ashli O'Neal averaged 14.7 points, 5.3 rebounds and 1.5 steals over a three-game week last week. A 5-foot-5 point guard, O'Neal shot 37% from the floor and was 5 of 6 from the charity stripe while dishing out 10 assists.

**Abby O'Connor (LUC)** - Loyola sophomore forward Abby O'Connor averaged 12.0 points, 6.7 rebounds and 1.3 blocks in the Ramblers' three games last week. O'Connor opened the week with a 14-point, six-rebound effort in an impressive 64-53 road victory over Western Michigan last Monday. The South Bend, Ind. native again chipped in 14 points to go along with two blocks just three days later as part of a 56-43 win against SIUE in Rogers Park. She wrapped up the week by finishing just shy of a double-double at Purdue, adding eight points and nine rebounds. O'Connor, who has started in 39 straight games to open her collegiate career, ranks second on the Rambler roster in scoring (12.2 ppg) and leads the team in both rebounding (7.3 rpg) and blocked shots (1.3 bpg).

**Danielle Gitzen (MSU)** - Danielle Gitzen averaged 16.5 points on 52 percent shooting, 2.5 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 1.5 steals per game last week against a pair of teams ranked in the top 20 of the NCAA RPI. The senior tallied 17 points on 7-of-12 shooting Tuesday against South Dakota, adding five assists, two boards and two steals. Sunday at unbeaten Indiana, Gitzen scored 16 points to go with three boards and two assists.

**Mikaela Morgan (UNI)** - Morgan scored a season-high 17 points, just one point shy of her career-high. She went 3-7 from the field, including 2-4 from the three-point line. She was also a perfect 9-9 from the foul line to lead UNI to a 64-60 win over North Dakota Tuesday at home in Cedar Falls.

**Makenzie Silvey (SIU)** - Makenzie Silvey took home Compass Challenge Tournament MVP honors after she averaged 19.0 points, 6.5 rebounds and 3.0 assists per game in SIU's two wins. The Glen Carbon, Ill. native chipped in 23 points, six rebounds and three assists in SIU's 82-73 win over Northern Illinois, which marked the second time this season she has scored 20-plus points. The 2018 MVC All-Freshman Team selection followed with 15 points and tied a career-best with seven rebounds in Southern's 73-59 win over Eastern Illinois Saturday.

**Lasha Petree (BRAD)** - Petree continued her strong play with 19 points and matched a season-high with five rebounds in a home win against Western Illinois last week. She also added one assist and two steals as she helped the Braves to their seventh consecutive win to open the season. Petree scored 13 of her 19 points in the second half, including eight in the first quarter, to help Bradley open a 41-29 halftime lead in the win. The 19-point effort was her fourth outing this season with 19 or more points and her 16.7 points per game, which ranks sixth among freshmen nationally, is the highest scoring average for a Bradley freshman through seven games since Judy Burns in 1981-82.

**Monica Burich (DU)** - Monica Burich scored 10 points, grabbed two rebounds, handed out two assists and blocked one shot in 18 minutes in the victory over Clarke. Her 10 points is a high for Burich, a transfer from Colorado, as a Bulldog. Burich, who is one of Drake's top bench players, followed that performance with five points and three rebounds in 17 minutes against South Dakota State.

**Makayla Wallace (UE)** - Just eight games into her collegiate career, freshman Makayla Wallace continued to fill the stat sheet. Against UIC on Wednesday, Wallace scored nine points, while adding seven rebounds and four assists, with all nine points coming from the free-throw line. On Saturday, Wallace added to her totals with one rebound, three assists, and three steals in a close 54-50 loss to SEMO. On the season, Wallace leads the Aces in assists per game (3.0) and steals per game (2.1), while leading Evansville's freshmen in scoring (6.6 points per game).

**Tamara Lee (INS)** - Tamara Lee averaged 12.0 points per game last week and scored a career-high 23 points in ISU's win over UIC Saturday. Lee shot 38.5 percent from the field last week, 41 percent from long range, and was 9-for-10 from the free throw stripe. Lee grabbed four steals - more than one per game - while averaging nearly 29 minutes per game.

**Jasmine Franklin (MSU)** - Jasmine Franklin averaged 11 points and six rebounds in two games against top-20 RPI teams, adding four assists, three blocks and two steals. Tuesday, Franklin had 14 points and eight boards versus South Dakota, shooting 5-for-10 and adding two blocks and two steals. Sunday at unbeaten Indiana, Franklin finished with eight points, four rebounds, three assists and a block.

## Power Five Ahead

Drake has three Power Five wins on its resume as the Bulldogs have beaten South Carolina, Rutgers and Nebraska so far this season. The conference sits 3-7 against Power Five opponents with all of the games taking place on the road or a neutral court. This week, the MVC schedule features two games against Power Five schools, including Drake at Iowa State and UNI at #16 Iowa. The MVC earned four wins over members of Power Five conferences a year ago.

## Vs. Top 25

Last season, the MVC went 0-9 against Top 25 opponents, breaking a streak of three-straight years with at least one win over a Top 25 team. Drake earned a 90-85 overtime win over No. 12/13 South Carolina in Vancouver in November. It was the highest ranked win over an opponent in the regular season by a Valley team since Missouri State beat No. 10 LSU on November 24, 2000. The league currently sits 1-4 vs. the Top 25 this year as two more chances to claim a win occur on Sunday. UNI will travel to #16 Iowa, while Missouri State will host #21 Gonzaga.

The last time the MVC recorded two wins against the Top 25 was during the 2002-03 season (Drake vs. No. 18 Iowa State & UNI vs. No. 24 Iowa State).

## Still Perfect

Bradley remained the only undefeated team in the MVC with an 82-68 win over Western Illinois last week. Bradley improved to 7-0 on the year and is one of only 18 teams in the nation with a perfect record. The Braves join UConn, Northeastern, Ohio, Portland State and South Alabama as the only Non-Power Five teams to sit unblemished. The Braves are 7-0 for just the second time in program history, joining the 2001-02 squad (9-0) as the only Bradley teams to win their first seven games of a season.

## Rambler Run

Loyola saw its four-game winning streak brought to an end in a 65-41 loss to Purdue on Sunday in West Lafayette. The Ramblers shot just over 45 percent from the field during the tear, outscoring opponents by an average of 18.5 points as they clinched the program's first winning record through non-conference play since the 2011-12 campaign.

## The New Girl Can Score

Bradley's Lasha Petree is the league's top scoring freshman, averaging 16.7 points per game to rank third overall in the MVC. Through games of Dec. 9, she currently ranks 4th nationally among all NCAA Division I freshmen.

The last MVC freshman to average over 16.0 points per game was Drake's Lizzy Wednell and Evansville's Sara Dickey during the 2013-14 season.

## Road Success

Indiana State joins California, South Alabama, Miami (OH), UCF, Cal State Fullerton and Toledo as the only teams with four road wins so far this season. The Valley posted a 9-41 record on the road in non-league action last season and has already secured 15 road wins this year.

## Home Sweet Home

Currently six MVC teams remain unbeaten at home: Bradley (5-0), Loyola (4-0), Southern Illinois (4-0), Drake (3-0), Illinois State (3-0) and UNI (3-0) have unblemished records on their home courts this season. The Valley currently holds a 25-9 mark at home this season.

## Poll Position

Drake dropped out of the latest Associated Press women's Top 25 poll. The Bulldogs fell on the road at South Dakota State and are currently sitting as the first team in the receiving votes list with 39 points. Drake's next game is at Iowa State on Sunday who is also receiving votes in the poll this week.

## Maahs Injury

The Panthers will be without preseason All-Conference honoree Megan Maahs who was injured early in UNI's 64-60 win over North Dakota. Maahs led the Panthers in rebounds, blocks and double-doubles and was tied for the top spot in field goal percentage. She was a First-Team All-MVC selection a season ago after averaging 10.4 points and 9.8 rebounds per game.

## 1,000 Point Club

Currently five MVC players are in the 1,000 Point Club. Drake's Sammie Bachrodt is 29 points away from joining the club and would become the fourth active Bulldog player to eclipse 1,000 career points.

## Against the Field

The MVC holds a winning record against eight leagues in non-conference play, including the America East (1-0), Big West (2-1), Colonial (2-0), Horizon (7-5), NEC (1-0), Ohio Valley (8-7), Summitt (6-4) and WAC (4-0). The MVC holds at least a .500 mark against the A-10 (1-1), Big East (2-2), Conference USA (3-3) and SEC (1-1).

## Triple Twenty

Indiana State notched what might be a program first (easily accessible records only date back to 2003-04 season) in its double-overtime win at Grand Canyon on Nov. 23 - three players reached the 20-point mark. Not only is that a rare feat in Terre Haute, but it is a rare feat in the Valley. Current research shows that this is a rare occurrence among Valley teams. The most recent was Drake in 2017 but the last time any other Valley team hit this mark was Bradley in 1998.

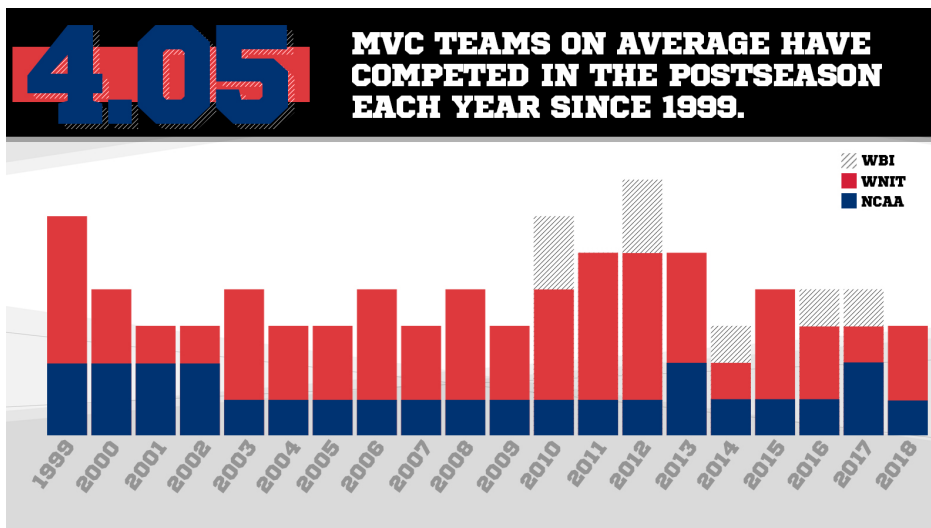

## Rhine on McClain Watch List

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA announced that Drake junior Sara Rhine is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2019 Katrina McClain Award. Named after the two-time All-American and 1987 National Player of the Year, the annual award in its second year recognizes the top power forwards in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2019 Katrina McClain Award will be narrowed to just 10.

## Senior CLASS Award Candidate

Drake's Sammie Bachrodt has been named a candidate for the 2018-19 Senior CLASS Award. Bachrodt is among 30 NCAA Division I candidates in women's basketball for the award which recognizes notable achievements in four areas of excellence – community, classroom, character and competition.



## Postseason League

The MVC has seen an average of four league teams participate in postseason play in the last 20 seasons, including three teams reaching postseason play in 2017-18. Drake fell at Texas A&M in the NCAA Tournament, while Missouri State and UNI each received bids into the WNIT. The Valley has earned multiple NCAA Tournament bids in 11 different seasons, including a pair of bids in the 2017 NCAA Tournament (Drake and UNI).

## Hoops in the Heartland

The 2019 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxSlayer Center in Moline, Ill., for the fourth-straight season.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event (Mar. 14-17) will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

The MVC extended an agreement with the Quad Cities Convention & Visitors Bureau to conduct the MVC Women's Basketball Championship in TaxSlayer Center through at least 2021.

The 2019 tournament will mark the 12th-consecutive season in its 37-year history that the event will take place at a neutral site.

The Missouri Valley Conference is one of only seven conferences (out of 32 nationally) where the women's basketball tournament is played at a neutral site, separate from the men's championship (AAC, ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, MVC, Pac-12 and SEC are the others).

## Starters Returning

The Missouri Valley Conference will see 37 of 50 starters return (74%) for the 2018-19 season. Defending champion Drake returns all five starters next season, while Illinois State, Indiana State, UNI, Southern Illinois and Valparaiso will see four starters return. Bradley, Evansville, Loyola and Missouri State will each see three starters return to the court.

## BRADLEY (7-0)

### On A Roll

The only undefeated team in the Missouri Valley Conference, Bradley is one of 18 teams in the nation with an unblemished record through games of Dec. 9. The Braves are 7-0 for just the second time in program history, joining the 2001-02 squad (9-0) as the only Bradley teams to win their first seven games of a season. In fact, the seven-game win streak is tied for the third longest in program history. Each of the previous four times Bradley had a win streak of at least seven games, the Braves went on to win at least 16 contests with the last seven-game win streak in 2008-09 part of a 21-10 campaign in which BU finished fourth in the final MVC standings.



### Non-Conference Success

In addition to matching the best start in program history through seven games, the Braves have already assured themselves of their best non-conference record since posting a 9-3 non-conference mark in 2011-12. The 2018-19 campaign marks the sixth season in which Bradley has posted at least seven non-conference victories and is tied for the fourth most non-conference wins in a season in school history.

## SOUTHERN ILLINOIS (5-4)

### Compass Challenge Champs

The Salukis defeated Eastern and Northern Illinois en route to being crowned the inaugural Compass Challenge champions. SIU shot a season-best 46.7% (14-of-30) from three-point range in the win over Northern- which were the most treys in a game in the Cindy Stein era and SIU's most since a January 5, 2013 win over Drake. Southern followed with a wire-to-wire win over Eastern to improve to 4-0 at home this season. Makenzie Silvey, who averaged 19.0 points, 6.5 rebounds and 3.0 assists in SIU's two wins, was named Tournament MVP while Abby Brockmeyer and Kristen Nelson earned spots on the Compass Challenge All-Tournament Team.



### Dishing Out Helpers

Brittney Patrick set a career-high with 11 assists and did not record a turnover in 33 minutes of work. Patrick became the first Saluki in nearly 33 years to record 10-plus assists without recording a turnover. Marialice Jenkins last accomplished the feat with 12 assists and zero turnovers in a 72-51 win over Indiana State on March 6, 1985. Patrick leads the Valley in assist-to-turnover ratio (3.19), assists (51) and assists per game (5.7) while her 3.19 assist-to-turnover ratio ranks 19th nationally.

### Sharp Shooting

Kristen Nelson shot 57.1% from three-point range in SIU's two wins over the weekend, including 6-of-8 (75%) from downtown in Southern's victory over Northern Illinois. Of the 35 times in which a Saluki has made at least six three-pointers in a single game, Nelson's eight attempts to net that many are tied for the fewest needed in program history while her 75% shooting percentage was tied for the third-best in school history for a player that made at least six threes.
