MVC Player of the Week

Kristen Nelson, Jr., G, Southern Illinois

Kristen Nelson averaged 19 points on 66.7% shooting from the floor, including a perfect 7-for-7 from behind the arc, to go along with 2.5 assists, 2.5 steals and 1.5 rebounds in SIU's two wins last week. Nelson poured in a career-high 24 points on a blistering 80% (8-of-10) from the field in Southern's 64-59 win over Murray State on Dec. 18. The Farmington Hills, Mich. native was a perfect 4-fo-4 from behind the arc in the win-becoming

the first Saluki since 2009 to make four-straight treys without a miss. Nelson followed up that performance with her fifth-straight double-digit scoring output in Southern's 78-73 overtime win over IUPUI. She shot 50% from the floor, including 3-of-3 from both three-point range and from the charity stripe, to finish with 14 points, four assists and two rebounds.

MVC Newcomer of the Week

TeTe Maggett, Jr., G, Illinois State

Illinois State's TeTe Maggett added 19 points, four rebounds, two assists and two steals in a 72-67 victory over Saint Louis. The junior guard ignited the squad at halftime after sinking a half-court shot at the buzzer to propel the Redbirds ahead 39-38, with the shot appearing on ESPN's Sports Center Top 10. The junior guard shot 41 percent from the floor, netting 7-for-17 and was perfect at the charity stripe (2-for-2).

NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Chelsea Brackmann (BRAD) - Brackmann turned in a pair of double-doubles, averaging 13.0 points and 11.5 rebounds per game in two road outings. She had 14 points, 11 rebounds and two assists as she helped Bradley rally from 11 points down to pull out a 67-65 win at Cleveland State Wednesday. The victory was Bradley's ninth consecutive win to open the season, matching the best start in program history also accomplished by the 2001-02 squad and the Braves rallied from double digits to win a non-conference road game for the first time since 2013-14. Brackmann followed it up with her fourth double-double in the last five games and team-best fifth double-double of the season at Purdue. The leading rebounder in the MVC, she tallied 12 points, 12 boards, one block and two steals against the Boilermakers, helping the Braves trim a 27-point third quarter deficit to seven points in the opening minutes of the fourth quarter.

Becca Hittner (DU) - Becca Hittner was outstanding for the Bulldogs in the hard-foughtloss. The Urbandale, lowa nativescored Drake's first 11 points of the game and helped the Bulldogs get back into the game after they fell behind by 16 midway through the first quarter. She scored five straight points to end the quarter to pull Drake within three points at 26-23. Hittner had 25 points at halftime and finished with a career-high 32 points on 12-of-21 shooting, including making four three-pointers. She added five rebounds, two assists and one steal in just 29 minutes. Her previous career-high of 27 came at lowa last season. She and Sara Rhine are tied for the team lead in most 20-plus games this season with five each.

Marley Miller (UE) - In Evansville's last two games of 2018, senior Marley Miller put together two of the best performances of her career. On Tuesday, Miller scored a game-high 18 points, hitting four three-pointers, while gathering five rebounds in the Aces' 56-52 win over Austin Peay. Facing Wisconsin on the road on Friday, Miller set a new career-high, pouring in 21 points, including three triples, with four rebounds, three assists, and a pair of steals. On the season, Miller leads Evansville in three-pointers made (25), three-point percentage (43.1), and is second on the team in scoring, averaging 9.5 points per game.

Simone Goods (ILS) - Simone Goods guided the Redbirds to their fifth-straight victory, leading all scorers and capturing a career high with 30 points. Goods is the first Redbird to score 30 points in six years. This is her fifth time scoring 20 + this season, and with today's performance she averages 18.6 ppg. She went 9-for-19, shooting 47 percent from the field and 12-for-18 at the line. The senior forward also grabbed five rebounds in the 72-67 win over Saint Louis.

Abby O'Connor (LUC) - Loyola sophomore forward Abby O'Connor erupted for a career-high 31 points in the Ramblers' 102-76 loss to No. 20/18 DePaul on Thursday night in Rogers Park. O'Connor finished 12-of-19 from the field and connected on a career-best five three-point field goal attempts. The South Bend, Ind. native narrowly missed out on a double-double, collecting eight rebounds to go along with three assists, a block and a steal. O'Connor, who reached double figures in scoring in nine of the Maroon & Gold's 11 non-conference games, currently sits atop the team's scoring chart at 14.0 ppg, a mark that 12th in the MVC.

Danielle Gitzen (MSU) - Danielle Gitzen averaged 19.5 points, 6.0 rebounds, 2.5 steals and 2.0 assists in a pair of wins at the Roo Holiday Classic, shooting 50 percent both overall and from 3-point land. Thursday against Louisiana Tech, the senior guard had 22 points and 10 rebounds for her second career double-double, shooting 9-for-16 overall and 4-for-4 from the foul line. She added two assists and two steals against the Lady Techsters. Friday, Gitzen tallied a game-high 17 points in 23 minutes, adding three steals, two assists and two rebounds in a victory against SIU Edwardsville, earning all-tournament honors at the event.

Karli Rucker (UNI) - Karli Rucker shot 50 percent from the field and averaged 16.5 points, five assists and 2.5 steals in two UNIvictories over the week. She scored 23 points on 8-16 shooting against Minnesota State and again scored double figures with 11 point on 4-8 shooting in a win against Omaha. The Panthers closed the non-conference schedule undefeated at home.

Grace Hales (VALPO) - Hales knocked down the biggest shot of the game in a 68-64 victory at Purdue Fort Wayne on Wednesday night. She released a 3-point attempt a fraction of a second before the shot clock expired with Valpo leading by one with 38 seconds to go. That try swished in to build the lead to four and cap a 17-point performance by Hales in her return to her hometown area. She grabbed five rebounds, went5-of-7 from the floor and knocked down all five of her free-throw attempts against the Mastodons. That gave way to Friday's performance against Bowling Green, when Hales hit a team-high five 3-pointers to help Valpo match a school record for 3s in a single game with 17. She shared the team lead with 15 points.

Tatum Koenig (BRAD) - Koenig averaged 8.0 points, 2.5 rebounds and 1.0 assist per game in a pair of road outings. After scoring a total of 15 points in the first eight games of the season, Koenig provided a big spark off the bench in a comeback victory at Cleveland State Wednesday. She scored 11 of her team-high 16 points in the fourth quarter to help the Braves rally from an 11-point deficit to top the Vikings 67-65. Koenig, who was 6-for-8 from the field in the victory including 3-for-4 from three-point range, also had five rebounds, two assists and one steal against the Vikings. She was a perfect 4-for-4 from the field and also had two assists during the fourth quarter to help spearhead Bradley's largest comeback victory in a non-conference road game since 2013-14 as she accounted scored or assisted 16 of Bradlev's 27 fourth-quarter points. The victory improved the Brayes to 9-0 on the year to match the best start in program history (2001-02). Koenig also played three minutes off the bench in Friday's outing at Purdue.

Jasmine Franklin (MSU) - Jasmine Franklin averaged 9.5 points and 6.0 points, shooting 58 percent in just 14.5 minutes per game. Franklin needed only 10 minutes to pile up nine points and seven boards in Thursday's win against Louisiana Tech, and followed that with 10 points, five rebounds and a block Friday versus SIU Edwardsville.

Cynthia Wolf (UNI) - Cynthia Wolf scored a total of 11 points on 5-8 shooting from the field in two wins for UNI this week. She scored nine points and added five rebounds in the 79-50 win over Omaha Friday at the McLeod Center. The Panthers closed the non-conference schedule undefeated at home.

Shay Frederick (VALPO) - Frederick was a key part of Valpo's 3-point barrage on Friday vs. Bowling Green as the freshman knocked down four triples on her way to 15 points, tied for the team lead. She also dished out three assists and had two steals against the Falcons.

New Valley Streak

Drake has the longest win streak in the history of the Gateway/MVC for regular season contests. The impressive streak started Feb. 26, 2016 with a win over Loyola. The Bulldogs broke SIU's 37 game streak from 1985-1987 during the Gateway era with a win over Illinois State Feb. 25. The Bulldogs will enter the 2018-19 season with back-to-back 18-0 league seasons.



Rhine on McClain Watch List

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA announced that Drake junior Sara Rhine is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2019 Katrina McClain Award. Named after the two-time All-American and 1987 National Player of the Year, the annual award in its second year recognizes the top power forwards in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2019 Katrina McClain Award will be narrowed to just 10.

Senior CLASS Award Candidate

Drake's Sammie Bachrodt has been named a candidate for the 2018-19 Senior CLASS Award. Bachrodt is among 30 NCAA Division I candidates in women's basketball for the award which recognizes notable achievements in four areas of excellence – community, classroom, character and competition.



Postseason League

The MVC has seen an average of four league teams participate in postseason play in the last 20 seasons, including three teams reaching postseason play in 2017-18. Drake fell at Texas A&M in the NCAA Tournament, while Missouri State and UNI each received bids into the WNIT. The Valley has earned multiple NCAA Tournament bids in 11 different seasons, including a pair of bids in the 2017 NCAA Tournament (Drake and UNI).

Hoops In the Heartland

The 2019 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxSlayer Center in Moline, Ill., for the fourth-straight season.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event (Mar. 14-17) will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.


The MVC extended an agreement with the Quad Cities Convention & Visitors Bureau to conduct the MVC Women's Basketball Championship in TaxSlayer Center through at least 2021.

The 2019 tournament will mark the 12th-consecutive season in its 37-year history that the event will take place at a neutral site.

The Missouri Valley Conference is one of only seven conferences (out of 32 nationally) where the women's basketball tournament is played at a neutral site, separate from the men's championship (AAC, ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, MVC, Pac-12 and SEC are the others).

Starters Returning

The Missouri Valley Conference will see 37 of 50 starters return (74%) for the 2018-19 season. Defending champion Drake returns all five starters next season, while Illinois State, Indiana State, UNI, Southern Illinois and Valparaiso will see four starters return. Bradley, Evansville, Loyola and Missouri State will each see three starters return to the court.

Top Start

Bradley's 67-65 comeback victory at Cleveland State (Dec. 19) improved the Braves to 9-0 and matched the best start in program history, also accomplished by the 2001-02 squad. The nine-game win streak, which was snapped at Purdue (Dec. 21), also tied the



longest win streak in school history. Bradley's nine non-conference wins are the squad's most since 2011-12 and match the school mark for non-conference victories with one non-conference contest remaining on the slate (Friday vs. Chicago St.). In addition, the Braves have four nonconference road wins (4-1) for the first time since going 5-0 on the road during the non-conference schedule in 2011-12.

Grinding Out A Win

Bradley overcame a poor shooting night in Wednesday's victory at Cleveland State, recovering from a 16-for-60 (26.7 percent) shooting effort over the first 31 minutes to make 8-of-16 from the field in the final nine minutes. The Braves shot 31.6% from the field for the night, marking the lowest field goal percentage in a road win in school history. Bradley's 27 points matched its highest scoring quarter of the season, while BU's 40 points heading to the fourth was its lowest point total through three quarters since the final regular-season game of the 2017-18 season.

Doubling Up

Junior Chelsea Brackmann snagged her 500th career rebound Friday at Purdue, collecting her team-best fifth double-double of the year. The leading rebounder in the MVC at 10.8 rebounds per outing, Brackmann is the second fastest player in school history to reach 500 career rebounds (70 games). She has turned in double-doubles in four of the last five games, averaging 13.0 points, 12.6 rebounds and 2.4 assists per game during that stretch while boasting a 3.00 assist-to-turnover ratio during that stretch. Her 16 career double-digit rebounding games is currently 10th in Bradley history.

In-State Battle

Drake and No. 16/15 lowa have had some classic games the past few seasons and Friday night in the Knapp Center was another one in the all-time series that started in 1974 and lowa now holds a slight edge, 26-25, all-time. The Hawkeyes ultimately prevailed



in a wild back-and-forth 91-82 game that featured 11 ties and 10 lead changes. Senior All-American Megan Gustafson scored 44 points for Iowa while junior and reigning MVC Player of the Year Becca Hittner poured in a career-high 32 points for the Bulldogs. Gustafson and Hittner were top scorers as the two teams each had four players score 10 or more points. Iowa's starting five scored all 91 of its points while Drake's scored 77 of its 82.

What A Night

Hittner was outstanding for the Bulldogs in the hard-fought loss. The Urbandale, Iowa native scored Drake's first 11 points of the game and helped the Bulldogs get back into the game after they fell behind by 16 midway through the first quarter. She scored five straight points to end the quarter to pull Drake within three points at 26-23. Hittner had 25 points at halftime. Her previous career-high of 27 points came at lowa last season. She and Sara Rhine are tied for the team lead in most 20-plus games this season with five each.

Pack the Knapp

What A Difference A Year Makes

Loyola closed non-conference play with a final record of 6-5, a four-win improvement from a year ago, in which the Maroon & Gold finished at 2-9. 5th-Straight at Home

The Salukis improved to 5-0 at home this season with a 78-73 overtime win over IUPUI. It marks the first time since the 1996-97 season in which SIU has opened a season with five-straight home wins. The victory also marked the first for Southern over a Horizon League



foe since 2000. The Jaguars, who were picked to finish second in the Horizon League Preseason Poll, came into the contest ranked No. 23 in the most recent College Insider Mid-Major Poll.

Double-Double Machine

Abby Brockmeyer recorded her sixth double-double of the season with 25 points and 10 rebounds in SIU's 78-73 win over IUPUI on Dec. 21. Her six double-doubles this season are already the fourth-most in a sophomore season in school history and are the most in the Valley thus far this season. Her six double-doubles rank 20th nationally, and she ranks fifth among underclassmen nationally in the category.

Protecting the Pill

Brittney Patrick currently leads the Valley, and ranks 15th nationally, in assist-to-turnover ratio (3.15). Patrick's 5.7 assists per game also leads the MVC, and ranks 25th nationally while she also is tops in the league in total assists (63). Southern has only once had a player finish a season with a 2.0 or higher assist-to-turnover ratio- Rishonda Napier set a program record with 145 assists to just 67 turnovers (2.16) during the 2017 season. In fact, only 13 players from the Valley have finished with a 2.0 or higher assist-to-turnover ratio since the 2002-03 season.

Valpo drained 17 3-pointers on Friday vs. Bowling Green, matching a school record that was set in 2004. The 17 triples tied for the fourth most in the history of the Missouri Valley Conference. Valpo fired off 38 3-point attempts, the most second most in program



history and the most since 1992. Bowling Green also hit 14 3s, so the two teams combined to knock down 31 shots from beyond the arc.

Down to the Wire

Valpo's trend of close games continued this week with two games that were decided by seven points or fewer and were still up for grabs in the final minute. Of the team's 12 games this season, 10 have been decided by 10 points or fewer and nine of those by seven points or fewer.

Triple Threat

In Wednesday's 68-64 win over Purdue Fort Wayne, Valpo had three players finish with 15 points or more: Addison Stoller (20), Grace Hales (17) and Ella Ellenson (15). Stoller and Ellenson both established career highs in scoring. That marked the first time Valpo had three players score 15 points or more in a single game since Feb. 2, 2017, when Amber Lindfors (22), Dani Franklin (17) and Georgi Donchetz (15) did it against Youngstown State.
