MVC Player of the Week

Meredith Hamlet, Sr., G, Valparaiso

Hamlet started her week with a season-high 26-points on Monday against Toledo before upping that season watermark to 28 on Thursday at Chicago State. A week that started with a pregame ceremony honoring Hamlet's 1,000 career point finished with the Valpo senior averaging 22.7 points per game over three games. In addition to coming within one point of a career high, she tied a career watermark with four steals and dished out a season-high five assists on Thursday at Chicago

State. She also knocked down five 3s in the win over the Cougars before hitting four 3s in a 14-point effort to help Valpo past Eastern Illinois. Hamlet's efforts against Chicago State and Eastern Illinois helped Valpo capture back-to-back victories for the first time this season.

MVC Newcomer of the Week

Janae Gonzales, Fr., G, Loyola

Loyola freshman guard Janae Gonzales averaged a team-best 17.5 points in the Ramblers' two home wins last week. Gonzales flirted with a double-double in a 76-40 win over Chicago State last Monday, scoring 13 points and grabbing seven rebounds, before pouring in a game-high 22 points on 7-of-9 shooting in an 81-67 comeback win over Purdue Fort Wayne three days later. The Tolleson, Ariz. product connected on nine of her 13 attempts from beyond the three-point arc between the two contests, operating at a red-hot 69% clip from distance. Gonzales, who has started in all six games this season, averages 12.5 points, a mark that ranks second on the Rambler roster.

NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Chelsea Brackmann (BRAD) - Brackmann averaged 13.0 points on 50 percent shooting to go with 13.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.5 steals in a pair of victories. She finished one point and one rebound short of a double-double in Wednesday's victory against Eastern Illinois, collecting nine points, nine rebounds, two assists and a pair of steals. Brackmann followed it up with her best outing of the season as she scored 17 points and pulled down 17 rebounds for the most boards in the MVC this season in Saturday's home win over Oakland for her second double-double of the year. She also had two assists, one block and one steal against the Golden Grizzlies. Brackmann scored 15 points and collected nine rebounds in the second half, keying a 13-2 third-quarter run with eight points, five rebounds, one assist and one steal in a three-minute span. She has helped Bradley to just the second 6-0 start to a season in program history and the team's longest win streak since 2009-10.

Becca Hittner (DU) - Junior Becca Hittner reached a career milestone in Drake's 85-69 win over Creighton this past week. Hittner, who scored a game-high 23 points, is the 32nd player in program history to surpass 1,000 career points and accomplished the feat on her first three-pointer of the game. She equaled her season-high behind a great shooting day, going 5-of-9 from the floor, 3-of-3 from behind the 3-point line and 10-of-12 from the free throw line. Hittner added four rebounds, three assists and two steals in 28 minutes in the victory over the Bluejays. She has scored 12 or more points in six out of the team's eight games this season and averages 15.9 points per game.

Kerri Gasper (UE) - As one of three seniors on the roster for the Purple Aces, senior guard Kerri Gasper has started her final collegiate season off strong. In a pair of road games, Gasper averaged 19 points, 9 rebounds, 2 assists, and 1.5 steals. Against Marshall, Gasper recorded her second double-double of the season with 17 points and 11 boards as the Aces fell to the Herd in overtime. On Sunday afternoon, Gasper extended her double-figure scoring streak to three games, pouring in a team-high 21 points while grabbing seven boards and tallying three steals.

TeTe Maggett (ILS) - The junior guard led all scorers in Thursday's win and added her second-straight game with 20 or more points. Additionally, she dished out a team-high of three assists and grabbed five boards for the 'Birds. Maggett went 2-for-5 from behind the arc, both of which came in the fourth quarter. Illinois State led by only two possessions, prior to Maggett sinking a 3-pointer with 2:10 left to play in the game.

Ashli O'Neal (INS) - Junior Ashli O'Neal shot 62.5% (5-for-8) from the floor and was one of three players with four steals as Indiana State won at Southeast Missouri, 62-51. O'Neal was 100% from long range (3-for-3) and scored a team-high 15 points in the win, reaching double digits in every game this season to date. The 5-foot-5 guard also grabbed four rebounds, dished out three assists and her four steals helped force 35 SEMO turnovers. She played 30 minutes and hit 2 of 3 free throw attempts.

Ellie Rice (LUC) - Loyola sophomore guard Ellie Rice continued the fast start to her second campaign in Rogers Park last week, averaging 15.0 points in a pair of home victories. Following an 11-point showing in Monday's 76-40 rout of Chicago State, Rice erupted for 19 points, all of which came in the second half, as the Maroon & Gold came from behind to defeat Purdue Fort Wayne, 81-67. The Austin, Texas native, who also dished out a career-high tying five assists in the win over the Mastodons, currently leads the Rambler roster in scoring, averaging 14.0 points.

Brice Calip (MSU) - Brice Calip scored a career-high 18 points Saturday at North Texas, adding three rebounds and two steals in 29 minutes. Calip scored 10 points in the fourth quarter and overtime to help MSU rally from a five-point deficit entering the final 10 minutes, shooting 5-for-13 overall and 7-for-9 from the foul line.

Karli Rucker (UNI) - Karli Rucker led the Panthers in points, rebounds and assists and recorded her first career block to help UNI earn a 53-40 true road win over a tough IUPUI team Friday in Indianapolis. Entering the game, IUPUI's only loss was an overtime setback to Wisconsin. Rucker leads UNI at 16.1 points per game.

Nicole Martin (SIU) - Nicole Martin poured in a team-high 21 points and shot 50% (8-of-16) from the floor in SIU's lone game last week. The Jefferson City, Mo. native also snagged five rebounds and added a steal in 30 minutes of play. It marked the fifth time in her career that the 2018 All-MVC First Team selection has scored 20 or more points.

Lasha Petree (BRAD) - Petree scored in double figures in a pair of home wins, averaging a team-best 19.5 points per game and collected 2.0 rebounds and 2.0 steals per outing. She came off the bench against Eastern Illinois to score 10 points and had three rebounds and one block in the victory against the Panthers. In her first career start, Petree scored 17 points in the first half of Saturday's win over Oakland and finished with a season-best 29 points. She hit 5-of-8 three-pointers and was a perfect 6-for-6 from the free throw line in addition to coming away with a season-best four steals. Petree's 29 points were the most by a Bradley freshman since Heather Best scored 31 points against Indiana State on Feb. 29, 1996. She scored nine points during the third quarter to help the Braves pull away down the stretch. Petree has helped Bradley to just the second 6-0 start to a season in program history and the team's longest win streak since 2009-10.

Tamara Lee (INS) - Tamara Lee scored 12 points and was one of three Sycamores with four steals in Indiana State's 62-51 win at Southeast Missouri last week. A redshirt senior, Lee shot 57.1 percent (4-for-7) from the floor and was 3 of 4 from the free throw line.

Jasmine Franklin (MSU) - Jasmine Franklin tallied 16 points, six rebounds, two steals and two blocked shots Saturday at North Texas. The rookie went 5-for-9 from the floor, shooting above 50 percent for the fourth time in five games this season, and recorded multiple stuffs for the third consecutive game, the first Lady Bear to do that since Tia Mays in 2011.

MVC Players and Newcomers of the Week are selected each week during the women's basketball season. The players are announced on Monday afternoon and appear in a weekly press release. Nominees are provided by each school's sports information contact and voted on by a panel appointed by the league office.

Poll Position

Drake moved up to No. 21 in Monday's Associated Press' women's Top 25 poll. The Bulldogs went 1-0 last week with a road win at Creighton. This is the highest ranking for the Bulldogs since it closed the 2016-17 season at No. 20 in the final regular season AP poll.

Power Five Wins

Drake has three Power Five wins on its resume as the Bulldogs have beaten South Carolina, Rutgers and Nebraska so far this season. The conference sits 3-4 against Power Five opponents. This week, the MVC schedule features three games against Big Ten schools, including Illinois (Indiana State), Indiana (Missouri State) and Purdue (Loyola). Last season, the MVC earned four wins over members of Power Five conferences.

Still Perfect

Bradley remained the only undefeated team in the MVC with a 73-64 win over Oakland. The six-game win streak is the longest for the Braves since winning six consecutive games during the 2009-10 season. The Braves have won seven consecutive non-conference games dating back to last season for the longest non-conference win streak for Bradley since winning 11 consecutive regular-season non-conference contests between the 2000-01 and 2002-03 campaigns. The 6-0 start to the year is the second-best in program history behind only the 9-0 start to the 2001-02 campaign.

Rollin' Ramblers

Loyola extended its winning streak to three games on Monday night, picking up a hard-fought 64-53 victory over Western Michigan. The win brings the Ramblers' record to 5-2, marking the program's best start through seven games since the 2001-02 team posted an identical mark en route to a 6-2 start.

Road Success

Indiana State leads the nation with a 4-0 road record this season, while Drake sits in a tie for second with a 3-0 road mark. Only 10 NCAA Division I teams have three or more road wins this season (as of Dec. 4). The Valley posted a 9-41 record on the road in non-league action last season and has already secured 14 road wins this year.

Home Sweet Home

Currently seven MVC teams remain unbeaten at home: Bradley (4-0), Drake (2-0), Illinois State (2-0), Loyola (3-0), UNI (2-0), Missouri State (1-0) and Southern Illinois (2-0) have unblemished records on their home courts this season. The Valley currently holds a 17-5 mark at home this season with 12 of the 17 games this week at home.

Double Your Pleasure

Bradley's Chelsea Brackmann is the only MVC player averaging a double-double this season. The junior is averaging 10.3 points and 10.3 rebounds per game (41st nationally). Brackmann has two double-doubles on the season. Below are players with multiple double-doubles this season.

Triple Twenty

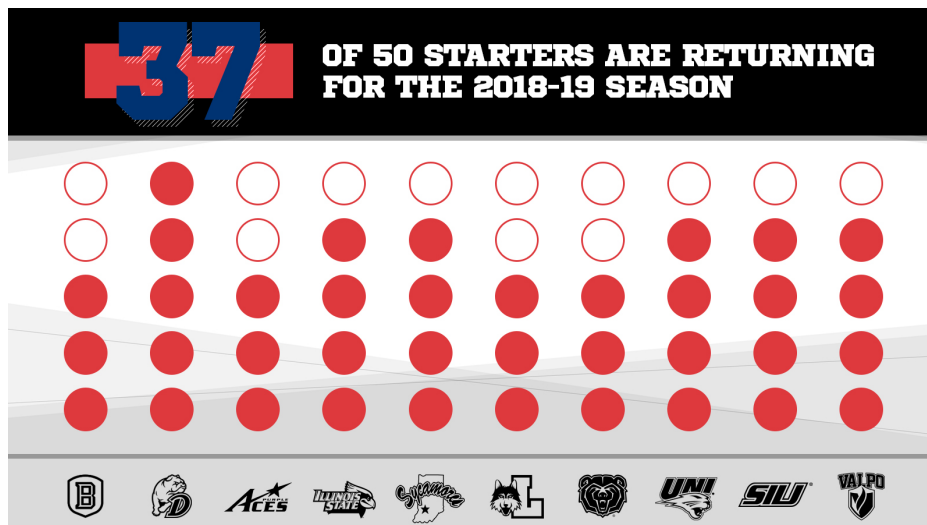
The RPI Ratings Game

The MVC holds at least a .500 mark against the A-10 (1-1), Big East (2-2), Conference USA (3-3) and SEC (1-1).



New Valley Streak

Drake has the longest win streak in the history of the Gateway/MVC for regular season contests. The impressive streak started Feb. 26, 2016 with a win over Loyola. The Bulldogs broke SIU's 37 game streak from 1985-1987 during the Gateway era with a win over Illinois State Feb. 25. The Bulldogs will enter the 2018-19 season with back-to-back 18-0 league seasons.

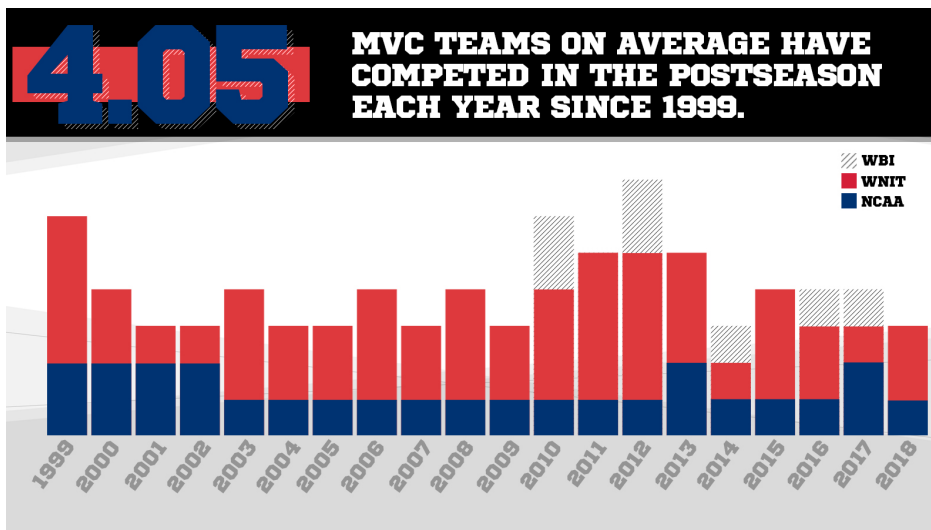

Rhine on McClain Watch List

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA announced that Drake junior Sara Rhine is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2019 Katrina McClain Award. Named after the two-time All-American and 1987 National Player of the Year, the annual award in its second year recognizes the top power forwards in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2019 Katrina McClain Award will be narrowed to just 10.

Starters Returning

The Missouri Valley Conference will see 37 of 50 starters return (74%) for the 2018-19 season. Defending champion Drake returns all five starters next season, while Illinois State, Indiana State, UNI, Southern Illinois and Valparaiso will see four starters return. Bradley, Evansville, Loyola and Missouri State will each see three starters return to the court.



Postseason League

The MVC has seen an average of four league teams participate in postseason play in the last 20 seasons, including three teams reaching postseason play in 2017-18. Drake fell at Texas A&M in the NCAA Tournament, while Missouri State and UNI each received bids into the WNIT. The Valley has earned multiple NCAA Tournament bids in 11 different seasons, including a pair of bids in the 2017 NCAA Tournament (Drake and UNI).

Hoops In the Heartland

The 2019 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxSlayer Center in Moline, Ill., for the fourth-straight season.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event (Mar. 14-17) will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

The MVC extended an agreement with the Quad Cities Convention & Visitors Bureau to conduct the MVC Women's Basketball Championship in TaxSlayer Center through at least 2021.

The 2019 tournament will mark the 12th-consecutive season in its 37-year history that the event will take place at a neutral site.

The Missouri Valley Conference is one of only seven conferences (out of 32 nationally) where the women's basketball tournament is played at a neutral site, separate from the men's championship (AAC, ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, MVC, Pac-12 and SEC are the others).

Put Me In Coach

Freshman Lasha Petree made her first career start Saturday against Oakland and responded by scoring a season-best 29 points. Petree, who ranks seventh in the nation among freshman in points per game (16.3 ppg), is fifth in the MVC in scoring after her outburst. Her 29 points were the most by a Bradley freshman since Heather Best had 31 points against Indiana State on Feb. 29, 1996. Only three freshmen in program history have topped Petree's 29-point performance with Judy Burns (30 points vs. Piedmont on Dec. 2, 1981) and Connie Griffith (31 points at Monmouth on Feb. 7, 1978) joining Best in the group. Petree's 98 points through six games are the most for a Bradley freshman to that point in a season since Burns scored 137 points (22.8 ppg) after six games in 1981-82.



From Dometown

Sophomore Gabi Haack hit 5-of-10 three-pointers and scored a game-high 23 points in the Nov. 28 victory against Eastern Illinois. Haack, who is second in the MVC in scoring at 17.2 points per game, is 26th in the nation in three-point field goals per game (3.17) to lead the MVC. Haack has hit five three-pointers or more in five of her last eight games dating back to last year's MVC Tournament, shooting 29-for-64 (45 percent) from beyond the arc.

The Bulldogs used a big fourth quarter to pull away from their former Missouri Valley Conference rival, Creighton, for an 85-69 road victory that snapped a two-game losing streak to the Bluejays. The win is the 40th all-time for the Bulldogs in the series that started in 1977, featured multiple games for many seasons when the teams were conference mates, has continued every year since Creighton left the MVC for the BIG EAST in 2013, including last season's four-overtime back-and-forth game at the Knapp Center.



Welcome to the Club

Junior Becca Hittner reached a career milestone in Drake's win over Creighton. Hittner, who scored a game-high 23 points, is the 32nd player in program history to surpass 1,000 career points and accomplished the feat on her first three-pointer of the game. She equaled her season-high and four away from her career-best behind a great shooting day, going 5-of-9 from the floor, 3-of-3 from behind the 3-point line and 10-of-12 from the free throw line. Hittner added four rebounds, three assists and two steals in 28 minutes in the victory over the Bluejays. She has scored 12 or more points in six out of the team's eight games this season.

Exclusive Company

Hittner is one of five current MVC players who have scored 1,000 or more points in a career. Two of her teammates, Maddy Dean and Sara Rhine, surpassed the mark last season and two more of her teammates are working towards the impressive accomplishment as well. Sammie Bachrodt and Becca Jonas have 945 and 879, points respectively, as they work to join the group.

WNIT Champions Week

Missouri State will play two of the last three WNIT champions this week, with 2016 winner South Dakota coming to JQH Arena on Tuesday before MSU heads to defending champ Indiana on Sunday. The Lady Bears, who won the event themselves in 2005, have plenty of history with WNIT champions. In 2012, MSU lost to Oklahoma State in the third round of the tournament as the Cowgirls won the title, and fell 74-71 in a rematch with the defending champs to open the next season. Missouri State defeated Creighton twice in 2003-04 during the Bluejays' championship season, and twice more the following year. The Lady Bears also beat Arkansas the year the Razorbacks won the title in 1998, then lost the rematch a season later.



Spread Out Strong

While Missouri State does not have a player averaging more than 11 points per game, the Lady Bears have been able to score nearly 70 points per contest thanks to a balanced offensive attack. Through five games, MSU has seen at least eight players score in every contest, with 10-plus players scoring three times and at least 12 players scoring once.

Bonus Basketball

Missouri State has already played two overtime games this season, its most since 2015-16, and one shy of the school record. The Lady Bears have played multiple overtime games in a season nine times, with three such games in 1994-95 being the most in school history.

Strong Start

Brittney Patrick has started all eight games at point guard for the Salukis and leads the league in assists per game (5.0), assists (35) and assist-to-turnover ratio (2.69). SIU has only once had a player lead the league in assists per game (Cartaesha Macklin, 2013) and Patrick's 2.69 assist-to-turnover ratio would be a school record. Southern has only once had a player finish a season with a 2.0 or higher assist-to-turnover ratio- Rishonda Napier set a program record with 145 assists to just 67 turnovers (2.16) during the 2017 season.



Double-Double Machine

Abby Brockmeyer recorded her fourth double-double of the season with 17 points, 10 rebounds and a career-best five assists in SIU's win over Hartford on Nov. 23. In doing so, she became the fastest sophomore to reach four double-doubles in a single-season in program history. Meanwhile, her four double-doubles this season are already tied for the fourth-most in a sophomore season in school history and are tied with Drake's Sara Rhine for the most in the MVC this season.

Making Them Count

Nicole Martin is shooting at a 56.8% clip to open the season- which leads the MVC. Martin has been particularly effective this season at finishing at the rim, as all 46 of her baskets have come from two-point range. The 2018 Preseason All-MVC selection scored a team-high 21 points vs. St. Louis- which marked the fifth time in her career that she has reached the 20-point plateau.
