



NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Vanessa Markert (BRAD) - Markert averaged team highs of 18.5 points and 6.5 rebounds to go with 1.0 assists and 2.5 blocks per game, while shooting 61.5 percent from the field in a pair of home contests. In just 20 minutes against Evansville, she scored 21 points on 9-for-11 shooting and had four boards, one assist and four blocks as she posted just the third back-to-back 20-point scoring efforts by a Brave in the last five seasons. Markert came a rebound short of her second double-double in three outings with 16 points and nine rebounds Sunday against Indiana State. She added one assist and a block against the Sycamores as she moved into 10th in career blocked shots at Bradley.

Sammie Bachrodt (DU) - Sammie Bachrodt helped lead Drake to a 72-67 win at UNI Friday night in the team's lone game of the week. Bachrodt poured in a game and season high 20 points on a 6-of-11 shooting performance, including making three-of-five behind the three-point line. She added four rebounds, two assists and one block. This season, Bachrodt is averaging 10.6 points, 4.2 rebounds, 3.8 assists and 1.9 steals per game and has made a team-best 49 three-pointers.

Kerri Gasper (UE) - Junior guard Kerri Gasper averaged 19.0 points, 5.5 rebounds, 3.5 assists, and a steal per game, while shooting 46.7% (14-30) from the field and 44.4% (4-9) from three in two road contests. Against Bradley on Friday night, Gasper led the Aces with 17 points, adding five rebounds, two assists, and a pair of steals in the 92-47 loss to the Braves. On Sunday afternoon at Illinois State, the Olmsted Township, Ohio native scored a team-high 21 points, 16 of which came in the second half, while chipping-in six rebounds and two assists.

Ashli O'Neal (INS) - Averaged 17.5 points per game and was a nearly perfect 12-for-13 from the free throw line ... A 5-5 point guard that still averaged 5.5 rebounds per game ... Dished out five assists, swiped four steals ... Shot 37.0% from the field (10-for-27) ... Led Indiana State to a season sweep of Bradley, 74-70, after the Sycamores trailed by 15 points mid-2nd quarter.

Jessica Cerda (LUC) - Jessica Cerda averaged an impressive 17.5 points, 3.5 rebounds and 2.5 assists as the Ramblers split a pair of games over the weekend. In Friday's 69-58 loss to Missouri State, Cerda scored a team-high 16 points, a mark aided by four makes from beyond three-point arc, to go along with four rebounds and a career-high five assists. The Streamwood, III. product followed up that performance by leading all scorers with a season-high tying 19 points, again knocking down four threes, as part of a gritty 62-53 win over in-state rival Southern Illinois.

Alexa Willard (MSU) - Alexa Willard averaged 15 points, 4.5 assists and 2.5 rebounds per game on 54 percent shooting in a pair of road wins. Friday at Loyola, Willard shot 9-for-13 from the field for 19 points with a career-high six assists, adding two rebounds and a steal. Sunday, the sophomore finished with 11 points, three rebounds and three assists in a win at Valparaiso.

Megan Maahs (UNI) - Sophomore Megan Maahs turned in a sensational effort against Drake on Friday, scoring 16 points and grabbing 16 rebounds, for her league-leading 10th double-double of the season. The 16 points and 16 rebounds matched a career-high for Maahs in each category. Maahs was also an extremely efficient 7-of-10 from the floor, while dishing out one assist against the Bulldogs. Maahs currently sits third all-time at UNI for most rebounds in a season (257), while her 10 double-doubles is the most for any Panthers since 2004-05.

Kylie Giebelhausen (SIU) - Giebelhausen averaged 15.5 points, 6.5 rebounds, 3.0 assists, a block and a steal in SIU's split over the weekend. Giebelhausen finished a rebound shy of a double-double in Southern's double overtime win at Valparaiso, as she tallied 22 points, nine rebounds, four assists, two blocks and a steal in a careerhigh 48 minutes in the win. She followed with nine points, four boards, two assists and a steal against Loyola on Sunday. Giebelhausen's 22 points in the win over the Crusaders marked the eighth time in her career that she has scored 20-plus points and her 48 minutes played in the win were the most by a Saluki since 1983.

Dani Franklin (VALPO) - Dani Franklin averaged a double-double of 24.0 ppg and 11.0 rpg this week, helping Valpo to competitive games against two of the conference's top four teams. The Crusaders took Southern Illinois to overtime on Friday night before falling by only six points to Missouri State on Sunday. Franklin exploded for a season-high 31 points on Friday, her third career game of 30+ points. That marked the second-highest single game scoring output by a Valley player in conference action this season. Franklin followed with her fourth double-double of the season on Sunday, scoring 17 points and pulling down 13 rebounds.

Gabi Haack (BRAD) - Haack averaged 14.0 points, 6.0 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 2.0 steals per game, while connecting on 50 percent of her shots and 6-of-13 three-pointers (46.2 percent). She notched nine points, four rebounds, four assists and tied a season-best with three steals in Friday's victory over Evansville. On her birthday Sunday against Indiana State, Haack scored a team-high 19 points on 7-for-12 shooting, including 4-of-8 from beyond the arc, and grabbed eight rebounds, one assist and one steal.

Alexis Delgado (INS) - Was an impressive 5-for-7 beyond the arc at Bradley, helping ISU rally back from a 15-point deficit for a 74-70 win ... Averaged 8.5 ppg, brought down six total rebounds and dished out six assists ... Credited with two steals.

Brice Calip (MSU) - Brice Calip filled the stat sheet once again with averages of 6.5 points, 3.5 assists, 2.5 rebounds and 1.5 steals in two road victories. Calip shot 50 percent in two games, going 3-for-5 with eight points, two steals, three boards, five assists and no turnovers in Sunday's win at Valparaiso. Friday, she had five points, two rebounds, two assists, a steal and a block at Loyola.

Karli Rucker (UNI)- Karli Rucker scored eight points off the bench, while matching her career-high in assists (5) and rebounds (3) against Drake. The freshman shot 3-of-6 from the floor, while knocking down both 3-pointers she attempted to led UNI's bench scoring on Friday night.

Abby Brockmeyer (SIU) - Brockmeyer averaged 12.0 points, 6.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.5 blocks in SIU's split over the weekend. The Raymond, Ill. native was also 10-for-10 from the free throw line, including 8-for-8 from the charity stripe in SIU's double overtime win over Valparaiso Friday night. Brockmeyer had 17 points, six rebounds and three blocks in a career-high 41 minutes in the Salukis win over the Crusaders, and followed with seven points and six rebounds at Loyola on Sunday.

Valley Streak Continues

Drake has the longest win streak in the MVC era for regular season MVC contests. With a road win at Missouri State on Jan. 5, Drake set the new all-time MVC era mark at 25, surpassing the Lady Bears record of 24-straight wins set in 2000. The impressive streak started Feb. 26, 2016 with a win over Loyola. The Bulldogs can tie SIU's 37 game streak from 1985-1987 during the Gateway era with a win over Bradley Friday.

Best MVC Records

Since the start of the Missouri Valley Conference in the 1992-93 season, one league team has gone through MVC play unscathed (Drake last season). Three teams (Wichita State in 2014-15, UNI in 2010-11 and Drake in 1997-98) finished Valley play at 17-1, while another four teams had their best conference finish at 16-2. Missouri State accomplished this feat three times (1995-96, 2000-01 and 2003-04), while Illinois State (2009-10), Indiana State (2005-06) and Southern Illinois (2006-07) also completed a Valley season at 16-2.

Back-to-Back 20 Wins

Missouri State owns the most 20-win seasons (since the 1982-83 season), with 16, while Drake (15) and Illinois State (12) are a close second and third, respectively. At 19-7, Drake's next victory will also be the 20th this season. The Bulldogs have won 20 or more games in each of the past three seasons. The last time the program had four-consecutive 20-plus win seasons was 1996-97 to 2001-02 when it had six-straight 20-plus win campaigns.

Southern Illinois improved to 4-0 in overtime games this season with their 88-86 double overtime win over Valparaiso on Feb. 16, breaking the MVC record for overtime wins in a single-season. Six teams were tied with three overtime games in a single-season, most recently the 2008-09 Evansville Purple Aces, who also tied the Valley record for most OT games in a single-season (5).

Knocking Down Freebies

Evansville continues to lead the nation in free-throw shooting percentage, shooting 82.9% from the charity stripe this season. Evansville is one of just three teams in the nation shooting better than 80% this season (Northern Colorado & South Dakota). The Aces are on pace to set the MVC record set by Illinois State during the 2010 season (80.5%).

Sharing Leads to Success

Last season, Drake set the MVC record for assists in a single season with 712 total assists, averaging 21.6 assists per game. The 2017-18 Bulldogs are on pace to break last season's mark and already appear 7th on the list with four regular season games and conference tournament remaining. Four of the previous top six teams went on to win the MVC regular season title with the other two finishing second in the standings.

What's the Difference?

Over the past 19 seasons (since 1999-2000), 16 MVC teams have registered a double-digit advantage in scoring margin for a season. Drake currently has a +13.7 scoring margin, which is the 7th best among any team in that span. Last year the Bulldogs finished with a +17.8 ppg margin, second in MVC history.

Against the Field

The MVC held a winning record against six leagues during non-conference play, including the Big 12 (2-1), Big South (2-1), Big West (1-0), Colonial (1-0), Southland (1-0) and WAC (4-0). The MVC held at least a .500 mark against four other conferences: American (2-2), Big Sky (1-1), Mountain West (1-1) and SWAC (1-1).

Scheduled Tough

Drake leads the league with a non-conference strength of schedule of 10. Three other league schools, including Missouri State (No. 14), UNI (No. 30) and Southern Illinois (No. 55), also have schedules that rank in the top-55. The Valley is one of four leagues to have at least four teams appearing in the Top 55, joining the Big East, Big Ten, Pac 12 and SEC.

Power Five Wins

The Missouri Valley Conference recorded four wins over Power Five opponents during non-conference play this season. Last season, the MVC finished the non-conference schedule with six wins over members of Power Five conferences.

Record Setting Win

Drake made an MVC-record 20 three-pointers, shot 69.1 percent (38-of-55) from the field and dished out 32 assists in a win at Evansville. Drake's shooting percentage is the second-best single game mark in program history, and the highest by an MVC team since #16 ranked Missouri State shot 68% from the field vs. Creighton in 2001. The 32 assists are tied for fourth all-time in MVC history. Drake is just the third team in NCAA Division I to make 20 or more three-point field goals in a game this season (FGCU vs. Abilene Christian & Lipscomb; South Florida vs. Southern).

Weekend Lockdown

UNI finished a weekend swing against Bradley and Illinois State, allowing a combined 76 points in the two wins, which is tied for the third lowest defensive output over a weekend in league history. UNI has the top five marks in the league's history, all under head coach Tanya Warren.

Named after the three-time Naismith Player of the Year, the annual award in its inaugural year recognizes the top small forwards in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2018 Cheryl Miller Award will be narrowed to just 10.

"So You Want to Be A Coach"

Valparaiso senior Dani Franklin was named a participant in the 2018 "So You Want to be a Coach" program, hosted by the WBCA. This marks the 13th annual "So You Want to be a Coach" program as each member will participate in a three-day workshop with speakers provided by the Alliance on March 28-30 in conjunction with the WBCA Convention in Columbus, Ohio. Franklin is an elementary education major and holds a 3.57 GPA while balancing basketball with her academic load. Franklin was one of 62 players across all NCAA Divisions and NAIA to be chosen.

Senior CLASS

Southern Illinois' Kylie Giebelhausen was named a candidate for the 2017-18 Senior CLASS Award. Giebelhausen is among 30 NCAA Division I candidates in women's basketball for the award which recognizes notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition.

The league has had nine different regular-season champions in the past 11 seasons (SIU-2007, DU/ UE/ILS-2008, ILS-2009, ILS-2010, UNI-2011; MSU-2012; WSU/CU-2013; INS/WSU-2014; WSU-2015; UNI-2016; DU-2017). Bradley, Loyola and Valparaiso are the only league teams not to have won a regularseason MVC championship.

Hoops In the Heartland

The 2018 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxSlayer Center in Moline, Illinois on March 8-11, for the third year of a three-year contract with the Quad Cities Convention and Visitors Bureau.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

Neutral Colors

For the 11th-straight season, the Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will be played at a neutral site after using institutional home arenas as hosts for the first 22 league tournaments. Just six Division I conferences conduct stand-alone neutral site women's basketball tournaments (Big Ten, Big 12, ACC, SEC, Pac-12 and MVC).

Valley History

One of the premier women's basketball leagues in the country, the MVC has seen an average of four league teams participate in postseason play in the last 20 seasons. The Valley has earned multiple NCAA Tournament bids in 11 different seasons, including a pair of bids to last season's NCAA Tournament. The league has also had two Final Four teams (Missouri State, in both 1992 and 2001), a WNIT champion (Missouri State, 2005) and three WNIT semifinal appearances (Illinois State, in 2011, 2010 and 2009).

Close Calls

Bradley has had a fair number of close calls in Missouri Valley Conference play with the Braves owning a 1-5 record in league games decided by nine points or less. Among those five losses, Bradley has either held a fourth quarter lead or trailed by three points or less inside of seven minutes to play in all but one contest. In



fact, among BU's nine league losses this season the Braves have either led in the fourth quarter (3x) or trailed by six points or fewer inside of eight minutes to play in six of the nine setbacks.

Continuing to Improve

Second-year Bradley head coach Andrea Gorski looks to join exclusive company in BU history after her team matched last season's overall win total at 12 with Friday's 92-47 victory over Evansville. With at least four games remaining, the Braves need just one more victory to make Gorski just the second head coach in program history to lead the team to an improved overall win total in each of their first two seasons. The only other Bradley Women's Basketball coach to do so was Paula Buscher, who was head coach from 2000-01 through the 2011-12 season. The Braves have 12 wins before the end of February for the first time since the 2011-12 campaign, which resulted in an 18-16 overall record and a second-round appearance in the WBI.

With its 72-67 road win at UNI Friday and four games left in the regular season, Drake is one victory away from clinching its second-straight outright Missouri Valley Conference regular season title. With Bradley and Illinois State set to visit the Knapp Center this weekend, the Bulldogs are 14-0 in league play this



season and hold a three-game advantage over second-place Missouri State. Drake swept the season series with Missouri State. The last time Drake won back-to-back outright MVC titles was 1996-97 and 1997-98.

One More Win for 20

At 19-7, Drake's next victory will also be the 20th this season. The Bulldogs have won 20 or more games in each of the past three seasons. The last time the program had four-consecutive 20-plus win seasons was 1996-97 to 2001-02 when it had six-straight 20-plus win campaigns.

Baranczyk, who won her 100th career game, with the season-opening win over Milwaukee holds a 118-68 overall record and a stellar 75-29 mark in MVC play. conference play began. The Olmsted Township, Ohio native has led, or been tied for the lead, in scoring in each of the last seven Aces contests and is averaging 18.4 points and 6.3 rebounds per game while shooting 43.1% (22-51) from beyond the arc during that stretch.

Breakthrough Performance

Lovola bounced back from a weekend-opening 69-58 setback to Missouri State by snapping a three-game skid to Southern Illinois as it defeated the Salukis by a final count of 62-53 on Sunday afternoon in Rogers Park. Three Ramblers scored in double figures, led by



Jessica Cerda's 19 points, while Loyola used a sparkling effort on the defensive end of the floor, holding the Salukis to only 37 percent shooting and forcing 16 Southern Illinois turnovers.

Don't Sleep on this Cerda

Graduate transfer Jessica Cerda has established herself as one of the Valley's top three-point shooters during her short time in the conference. Cerda, fresh off a weekend that saw her operate at a 47.1 percent (8of-14) clip from distance, currently ranks second overall in the MVC in three-point field goals made per game (2.4) and fifth in three-point field goal percentage (.382). Since the start of Valley play, she has knocked down a league-best 2.4 triples per game.

Hoosier State Hysteria

Looking to build off its aforementioned win over Southern Illinois, Loyola will wrap up the road portion of its MVC schedule this coming weekend with a pair of games in the state of Indiana, where it is slated to take on Evansville (February 23) and Indiana State (February 25). Since moving to the Valley prior to the start of the 2013-14 academic year, the Ramblers have struggled against their Hoosier State counterparts, going a combined 1-7 (.125) in road tests versus the Purple Aces and Sycamores.

Sunday's victory at Valparaiso represented MSU's 12th MVC victory on the season, giving the Lady Bears 12 league wins for the fourth consecutive year and a 51-18 conference record since the start of the 2014-15 campaign. It's also the 19th time in 26 MVC seasons that MSU has posted at least 12 Valley wins.



Another Successful Road Trip

Missouri State picked up two more road wins this weekend to finish with a 7-2 mark in away Valley games this season. The Lady Bears have won at least six conference road games in four consecutive seasons, and are now 24-7 in their last 31 MVC games in opposing gyms.

Closing at Home

Missouri State will play its final three regular season games at JQH Arena, where the Lady Bears own a 9-2 record this year. MSU's offense has played well at home in 2017-18, averaging 74.4 points on 43.4 percent shooting, including 39 percent from long range in 11 games. The Lady Bears also boast a 1.2 assist-to-turnover ratio at JQH, and allow 58.3 points per contest.

Approaching 200 Wins

Tanya Warren enters Friday's contest on the verge of a momumentous milestone, as the 11-year head coach sits on 199 career victories. Should Warren secure 200 wins, she would become the only active MVC coach to achieve the feat. Only four coaches in Valley history



have crossed the 200-win mark, with SIU's Cindy Scott (353), MSU's Cheryl Burnett (319), Illinois State's Jill Hutchison (277) and Eastern Illinois' Barbara Hilke (231) being the only coaches in league history to do so.

Double-Double Queen

Sophomore Megan Maahs leads the MVC with 10 double-doubles this season. That total is the most in a season for UNI since Alex Cook earned 10 in 2004-05. Maahs ranks 27th in the NCAA for total rebounds per contest at 10.3. In the MVC, Maahs tops the league this season in rebounds per game (10.3), defensive rebounds per game (7.0) and most double-doubles (10).

Kirkpatrick Senior Day

Kennedy Kirkpatrick's senior season has been by far her best, as she's earned career-highs in minutes, starts, points, rebounds, assists and steals for her senior campaign. The Lawrence, Kansas native, has averaged 10.6 points per game, while also leading the Panthers from the 3-point line with 38 made from beyond-the-arc.

40 Minute Club

Three Salukis played 40-plus minutes in the double overtime win over Valparaiso, led by Kylie Giebelhausen's career-high 48 minutes played. Makenzie Silvey (42 mins.) and Abby Brockmeyer (41 mins) each played 40-plus minutes for the first time in their young



careers. Giebelhausen's 48 minutes played are the most in a game by a Saluki since Feb. 23, 1983 when D.D. Plab, Rose Peeples and Sue Faber all played 50 minutes in SIU's 83-76 double overtime loss to Missouri.

MVC Single-Season Record for OT Wins

The Salukis improved to 4-0 in overtime games this season with their 88-86 double overtime win over Valparaiso on Feb. 16, breaking the Missouri Valley Conference record for overtime wins in a single-season. Six teams were tied with three overtime games in a single-season, most recently the 2008-09 Evansville Purple Aces, who are also tied the Valley record for most OT games in a single-season (5).

20-Plus Assists

The Salukis dished out 20 assists in their 88-86 20T win over Valpo, with four Salukis tallying at least four assists. Brittney Patrick finished with a game-high seven assists, while Makenzie Silvey tied her career-high with five assists and Kylie Giebelhausen added four helpers. It marked the seventh time SIU has dished out 20-plus helpers during the Cindy Stein era, and Southern improved to 6-1 when doing so.

Working Overtime

Friday's affair with Southern Illinois needed an extra 10 minutes to be decided – marking Valpo's fifth double overtime game in program history and first since Feb. 18, 2006, a 75-67 victory over Chicago State. Double OT games have come in pairs in the past for the Crusaders, who played double overtime twice in both 1999-2000 and 2005-06. Friday's game was the first overtime contest for the Crusaders since a memorable 94-91 win over Detroit Mercy in the first round of the Horizon League Tournament on March 11, 2016 in Green Bay. Valpo hadn't played OT at the ARC since Feb. 28, 2012, an 83-78 loss to Wright State.


Franklin Does Franklin Things
