#### Nicole Martin, So., F, Southern Illinois

Southern Illinois sophomore Nicole Martin averaged 23.0 points on 62.5% (20-for-32) shooting from the field in SIU's two road games over the weekend. She opened the weekend by pouring in 24 points on 11-of-15 shooting at Drake on Friday night, and followed with a game-high 22 points to go along with three blocks,

three rebounds and two steals at Northern Iowa on Sunday. The back-to-back 20-plus point outputs were the first of Martin's career, and she has now reached double figures in eight-straight games.

Missouri State freshman Emily Gartner finished with consecutive career high scoring totals in two road games last week, averaging 14 points and 6.5 rebounds, while shooting 70 percent from the floor. Friday at UNI, Gartner shot 5-of-6 from the floor for 10 points, five boards, an assist and a steal. Sunday, the redshirt freshman

posted 18 points on 9-of-14 shooting, adding eight boards, two blocks and an assist in 21 minutes at Drake.





## **NOTEWORTHY**

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Gabi Haack (BRAD) - Haack turned in a pair of double-doubles last week, averaging 11.5 points, 10.5 rebounds and 2.0 assists per game while shooting 90 percent from the free throw line. She helped highlight Friday's home victory against Valparaiso with 13 points and a season-high 11 rebounds to go with two assists. Haack followed it up with her second straight double-double and her third of the season Sunday against Loyola with 10 points and 10 rebounds in a season-high 38 minutes. Haack has scored in double figures 12 times this season for the most games by a Bradley freshman with 10 or more points since Katie Yohn had 16 such outings as a freshman in 2009-10.

Maddy Dean (DU) - Coming off the bench, Dean averaged 16.5 points, 6.5 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 1.5 steals while shooting a blistering 57.9 percent from the floor (11-of-19), an impressive 50 percent from behind three three-point line (6-of-12) and 83.3 percent from the free throw line (5-of-6), to help Drake win home games over Southern Illinois and Missouri State. Friday against Missouri State, Dean scored a season-high 20 points, going 7-of-11 from the field, including tying a season-best with three three-pointers. She pulled down a season-high 10 rebounds for her first double-double of the year and the eighth of her career. She added three assists and two steals in 25 minutes. In Sunday's victory over Missouri State, Dean scored 13 points on a 4-of-8 shooting performance, equaling her season-best for three-pointers once again with three. She added three rebounds, three assists and one steal in 20 minutes. This season, Dean, who missed all of 2016-17 due to injury, is averaging 9.4 points, 4.5 rebounds and 3.2 assists per game. She has scored double-figures in five of the past six games. In league games, Dean averages 11.2 points and a league-best 4.0 assists per game.

Kerri Gasper (UE) - Junior Kerri Gasper continued her strong last two weeks with a career-day against Indiana State on Friday night. Gasper scored a career-best 26 points, pulling down 10 rebounds and tallying a pair of assists and steals and one block. Over the last four games, the Olmsted Township, Ohio native averaged 18 points and six rebounds per contest. In the MVC, Gasper leads the conference in assists per game (3.9) and sits tied for sixth in three-pointers made per game (1.8), eighth in scoring average (12.2), tied for 11th in steals per game (1.2), and 13th in rebounding average (5.5).

Katrina Beck (ILS) - Katrina Beck paced the Redbirds to a two-win weekend, averaging 13.0 points, 4.0 rebounds and 3.0 steals per game. She snuck away with four steals in the win against Loyola, which tied her career high. The junior guard went 3-for-6 behind the arc on Friday and her shot was a key component to the Redbird win. Loyola trailed by two with 1:08 to play, but was shut down after Beck netted her third and final 3-pointer to put the Redbirds ahead by five with 42 seconds to play.

Regan Wentland (INS) - Regan Wentland led Indiana State and scored a career-high 18 points in the Sycamores' 66-57 win over Evansville on Friday. She was a perfect 3-for-3 from beyond the arc and an impressive 7-for-9 from the field overall with two blocks, two rebounds and an assist. The win, Indiana State's fifth in a row, vaulted the Trees into fourth place after an 0-2 start to the league season and secured a season sweep of the Purple Aces for the third time in four years.

Kailyn Strawbridge (LUC) - Loyola freshman Kailyn Strawbridge averaged 14.0 points, 2.0 rebounds and 2.0 assists as Loyola split a pair of games in Central Illinois over the weekend. After chipping in 11 points, three rebounds and an assist in Friday's 57-49 setback at Illinois State, the Rockford, Ill. native poured in a team-high 17 points to go along with a rebound, three assists and a steal as Loyola defeated host Bradley, 71-61, on Sunday afternoon in Peoria, Ill. Strawbridge, who knocked down a careerhigh tying four three-point attempts against the Braves, currently ranks third on the Rambler roster in scoring, averaging 8.1 points per game.

Aubrey Buckley (MSU) - Aubrey Buckley averaged a double-double for the week with 15 points and 10.5 rebounds, adding four total steals and drawing her 18th charge of the season Sunday at Drake. Buckley finished the Drake game with 22 points and 16 rebounds, both career highs, becoming the Lady Bear since Whitney Edie in December 2012 to have a 20-point, 15-rebound game. The 16 rebounds also tied for the 11th-best single-game total in school history. Additionally, Buckley netted a career day with an 11-for-14 showing at the foul line. Friday, Buckley tallied eight points, five boards and three steals in MSU's win at UNI.

Ellie Howell (UNI) - Howell scored in double figures twice as the Panthers split games against Missouri State and Southern Illinois over the weekend. The redshirt junior scored 11 points in defeat to the Bears, while earning 17 points in a victory against the Salukis. Howell also nabbed five rebounds, while dishing out three assists in Sunday's 71-63 win. On the season, Howell has scored in double figures 13 times, with nine of those coming in MVC games.

Simone Goods (ILS) - Simone Goods led the Redbirds over Valparaiso on Sunday, securing a career high in free-throws attempted and made going 11-for-13. With her performance at the charity stripe, the Redbirds captured their best free-throw percentage this season, shooting 89.3 percent at the line. The junior forward racked up 27 points, 13 rebounds and added two blocks this weekend to help the Redbirds secure their first conference weekend sweep since the 2013-14 season.

Ty Battle (INS) - Freshman Ty Battle scored six points and brought down three rebounds as Indiana State secured the season sweep of Evansville for the third time in four years. Battle, a true freshman, had an assist and was 3-for-6 from the field in the game.

Karli Rucker (UNI) - Rucker scored seven points off the bench to propel the Panthers past Southern Illinois on Sunday, while also dishing out four assists and grabbing two rebounds. On Friday night, the freshman scored three points in defeat to Missouri State, while earning one assist.

Abby Brockmeyer (SIU) - Brockmeyer averaged 9.0 points and 6.5 rebounds in SIU's two road games over the weekend. Brockmeyer opened her weekend with 10 points and six rebounds at Drake, and followed with eight points and seven rebounds at Northern Iowa. The Raymond, III. native leads all Valley freshmen in rebounds, blocks and is second to Loyola's Abby O'Connor in scoring.

## Bulldogs Expand MVC Lead

Drake improved to 11-0 following wins over Southern Illinois and Missouri State last weekend, taking a three-game lead over the Lady Bears (8-3) in the league standings. Southern Illinois and UNI are tied for third place (7-4), while Indiana State is fifth (6-4).

Drake's 11-0 league start matches seven others who have started with at least 11-straight league wins in 2017-18. Only 14 NCAA teams are still unbeaten in their respective leagues (through Feb. 4).

## **Valley Streak Continues**

Drake has the longest win streak in the MVC era for regular season MVC contests. With a road win at Missouri State on Jan. 5, Drake set the new all-time MVC era mark at 25, surpassing the Lady Bears record of 24-straight wins set in 2000. The impressive streak started Feb. 26, 2016 with a win over Loyola. The Bulldogs are currently four wins shy of tying SIU's 37 game streak from 1985-1987 during the Gateway era.

Indiana State is riding a five-game win streak for the first time since the 2013-14 season. During that 2013-14 season, Indiana State had separate MVC win streaks of six and seven games, sharing the regular season title with Wichita State with a 14-4 league record.

## **Knocking Down Freebies**

Evansville continues to lead the nation in free-throw shooting percentage, shooting 83.4% from the charity stripe this season. Evansville is one of just three teams in the nation shooting better than 80% this season (Northern Colorado & Central Michigan). The Aces are on pace to set the MVC record set by Illinois State during the 2010 season (80.5%).

## **Against the Field**

The MVC held a winning record against six leagues during non-conference play, including the Big 12 (2-1), Big South (2-1), Big West (1-0), Colonial (1-0), Southland (1-0) and WAC (4-0). The MVC held at least a .500 mark against four other conferences: American (2-2), Big Sky (1-1), Mountain West (1-1) and SWAC (1-1).

## **Scheduled Tough**

Drake leads the league with a non-conference strength of schedule of 17. Four other league schools, including Missouri State (No. 19), UNI (No. 40), Southern Illinois (No. 58) and Indiana State (No. 75), also have schedules that rank in the top-75. The Valley is one of five leagues to have at least five teams appearing in the Top 75, joining the Big East, Big Ten, Pac 12 and Southland.

## **Power Five Wins**

The Missouri Valley Conference recorded four wins over Power Five opponents during non-conference play this season. Last season, the MVC finished the non-conference schedule with six wins over members of Power Five conferences.

## **Senior Leaders**

Five league seniors are leading their respective teams in scoring, including Missouri State's Liza Fruendt (16.0 ppg), Valpo's Dani Franklin (15.5 ppg), Evansville's Hannah Noe (14.8 ppg), Illinois State's Hannah Green (12.7 ppg) and UNI's Kennedy Kirkpatrick (10.5 ppg).

#### **Home Sweet Home**

Since 2002, home teams have won at least 55 (.611) of the 90 league contests in all but six seasons (2003-04, 2006-07, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2015-16, 2016-17). The most wins by home teams in league play came in 2008 (61-29 at home in conference play). The league was 51-39 (.567) at home in league play last year, and has compiled a 31-23 (.574) mark so far in 2017-18.

## **Impactful Newcomers**

The  $\overline{\text{Valley}}$  has many new faces contributing to their team's success this season. Four of those players are currently averaging double-figures in the scoring column.

## **BRADLEY (11-11, 5-6 MVC)**

## **Double Trouble**

Freshman guard Gabi Haack has turned in double-doubles in each of the last two games and has a team-best three double-doubles this season. Bradley's first freshman with three double-doubles in a season since Sonya Harris had five double-doubles as a frosh in 2007-08, Haack is now Bradley's leading scorer on the year



at 9.7 points per game and is averaging 11.5 points per game in Valley play. She has scored in double figures a team-best 12 times, including eight of the last nine contests, and is the first Bradley freshman to top 10 points in 12 different games since Katie Yohn did so 16 times in 2009-10. Over the last nine games, Haack has averaged 12.6 points, 7.3 rebounds and 2.0 assists per game. Only two freshmen have led Bradley in scoring (Yohn in 2009-10 & Connie Griffith in 1977-78). Haack joins sophomore Chelsea Brackmann along with Bradley Hall of Fame members Heather Best, Karin Nicholls and Shelli Braud as the only freshmen in program history to collect 200 points, 140 rebounds and 30 or more assists.

## **Showing Improvement**

With seven regular-season games remaining on the schedule, Bradley can match last season's overall win total (12) with a victory and the Braves are two wins from tying last year's MVC win total. Bradley has won 11 or more games in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 2011-12 (18) and 2012-13 (14), which is also the last time the Braves had six or more league wins in back-to-back campaigns. Second-year head coach Andrea Gorski has joined Joe Stowell as the only coaches in program history to guide the team to 11 or more wins in each of their first two seasons as head coach of the Braves. Stowell, who coached the Bradley women's team to 33 victories in his two seasons (1981-82 & 1982-83), and Gorski are the only Bradley graduates to have coached the Braves. The last Bradley coach to win six or more conference games in each of their first two seasons was Lisa Boyer in 1986-87 and 1987-88.

## Comeback

Drake rallied back from a 14-point, third-quarter deficit to beat Southern Illinois, 84-73, Friday night at the Knapp Center. The Bulldogs trailed at halftime, 37-30, to the Salukis, and it was their first halftime deficit of the MVC slate. The victory also marked the first time this season Drake rallied from a halftime deficit to win



a game. the 14-point deficit was also the largest overcome this season for the Bulldogs.

## **Blistering Shootout**

In the win over SIU, redshirt sophomore Sara Rhine scored a team-high 18 points going a perfect 8-of-8 from the field. It is the second perfect-shooting performance in her career as she went 7-of-7 against Wichita State in 2016. Rhine, who leads the MVC and ranks 26th in the nation in field goal percentage at 56.1, has a career mark of 58.3. That mark already ranks third all-time at Drake and sixth all-time in the MVC.

## **Bulldog Bench Crew**

Drake's bench was instrumental in the wins this past weekend over SIU and Missouri State. In the win over the Salukis, the Bulldogs' reserves scored 42 points to just 2 from SIU's. The bench followed that with 44 points to 23 for the Lady Bears' reserves. This season, Drake's bench has outscored its MVC opponents' benches, 416-195, and in 10 out of 11 MVC contests the Bulldogs' bench has outscored the opposition's bench.

## **Player of the Week**

Southern Illinois sophomore Nicole Martin averaged 23.0 points on 62.5% (20-for-32) shooting from the field in SIU's two road games to be named MVC Player of the Week for the first time in her career. She opened the weekend by pouring in 24 points on 11-of-15



shooting at Drake on Feb. 2, and followed with a game-high 22 points to go along with three blocks, three rebounds and two steals at Northern lowa on Feb. 4. The back-to-back 20-plus point outputs marked the first time that she has reached 20-plus points in consecutive games in her career and she has now reached double figures in eight-straight games, and 16 times in 22 games this season.

## **Working Overtime**

SIU is one of  $2\overline{4}$  teams in the nation to have played at least three overtime games this season. Creighton leads that category, having already played five overtime contests. Of the 24 teams nationally to have played in at least three overtime games, the Salukis are one of only five with an unblemished record. SIU, Albany, American, Siena and North Carolina are the only programs to have won at least three overtime games without recording a loss. Southern improved to 3-0 this season in overtime games and SIU's three overtime wins are it's most in a single season in program history.

## **Getting Steals**

The Salukis have recorded 10-plus steals in seven games this season. That's the most 10-plus steal games in a single season in the Cindy Stein era, and the most since the 2012-13 season when the Salukis posted eight games with 10-plus steals. The school record for most games with at least 10 steals is 20, set by the 1994-95 Salukis. Southern is 5-2 this season when snagging 10-plus steals and are 118-104 (.531) since 1988 when finishing with at least 10 steals.

Since that time, Butler has made two conference changes, going from the Horizon League to the Atlantic 10 to the Big East, while Valpo has made a conference climb of its own, going from the Horizon League to The Valley. A win on Sunday would give Tracey Dorow her first sweep of a conference foe as Valpo head coach.

## **Keeping Control**

When Valpo made 20 turnovers in the 69-58 loss at Bradley last week, it was just the second time (and the first in Valley play) that Valpo has had a 20-turnover game this season. The only other game with 20+ turnovers was at Liberty on Dec. 2. Last year, Valpo made 20 or more turnovers in 11 games.
