NOTEWORTHY

- Veteran head coach Jim DeRose begins his 23rd season at the helm of the Bradley program boasting a 234-180-46 record with the Braves. The second-winningest coach in Missouri Valley Conference men's soccer history, DeRose owns 82.1 percent of Bradley's 285 all-time victories and 96.1 percent of the program's 76 MVC wins.
- Among Bradley's 18 returning lettermen from the 2017 season, the Braves return their top five scorers for just the second time in program history. In 32 NCAA Division I seasons, the only other year the Braves returned their top five scorers was 1999, when Bradley welcomed the return of its top eight scorers from its first Missouri Valley Conference championship squad in 1998. In total, Bradley's 16 returning field players accounted for 78 of the team's 92 points (84.8 percent) last season. In addition to the top five scorers from last year's squad, Bradley also welcomes the return of 2016 scoring leader Richard Olson, who received a medical redshirt last year and begins his senior season this fall as the program's active leader with seven career assists.

- Evansville is coming off back-to-back double-digit win seasons for the first time since the 1995 and 1996 seasons after the Purple Aces won 10 games in 2016 and increased their win total to 11 a season ago. UE also advanced to the semifinals of the 2017 Missouri Valley Conference Tournament, marking the Aces second-straight semifinal appearance; the first time Evansville had done so in consecutive seasons since the 1995 and 1996 campaigns.
- The Aces face a tough slate for their 2018 campaign. Including exhibitions, four of Evansville's non-conference opponents finished 2017 in the top 50 in RPI. Indiana, UE's opponent at Arad McCutchan Stadium on September 21, was the national runner-up and ended 2017 in fourth in RPI. Also on the Aces' 2018 schedule are Butler (12th) and Kentucky (47th) who were ranked in the top 50 of the final RPI rankings.

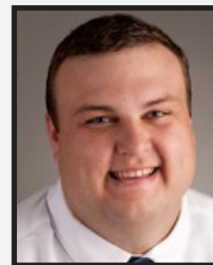

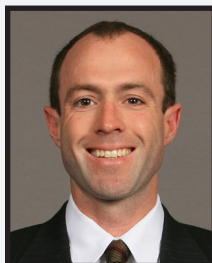

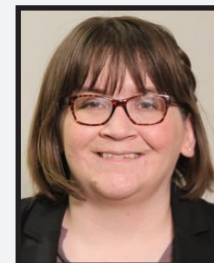
