MVC Offensive Player of the Week

Cory Griffith, Sr., F, Valparaiso (Lemont, Ill.)

Griffith broke Valpo's single-match record by scoring an MVC season-high four goals in Sunday's win over Robert Morris, carrying Valpo to a 4-2 victory. She scored all four of her goals in a 28-minute stretch spanning the two halves, netting a first-half hat trick before closing out her scoring with a 48th-minute goal. Griffith, who is the only player

in Valpo history with multiple hat tricks during her career and also broke the program's single-match record for points, now owns Valpo's career match-winning goals record with 11 and ranks second in program history in career goals (26) and third in career points (58).



MVC Defensive Player of the Week

Danielle Varner, So., D, Indiana State (Henderson, Nev.)

Danielle Varner continued to lead the Sycamore defense with a pair of shutouts and just two goals allowed over a three-game road stretch that saw the Sycamores go undefeated at 2-0-1. Varner was extremely active she continues to be the front line of defense and limit the amount of shots that opponents are able to get on goal. She

added to her contributions with her first goal of the season a second half equalizer at Akron which led to a 2-2 draw with the Zips.



MVC Newcomer of the Week

Anna Durnin, R-Fr., F/M, Missouri State (Wentzville, Mo.)

Anna Durnin found the net early to boost Missouri State to a 1-0 victory over Omaha here Friday night. From the jump Durnin was hot offensively, taking two shots within the opening five minutes. While the first fell wide, Durnin's second attempt from 20 yards out connected in goal giving the Bears the 1-0 advantage, and eventually the

win. She had four of the Bears' eight shot attempts.

In addition to the league's Offensive and Defensive Player of the Week and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, and they include:

OFFENSE

Olivia Bruce, So., F, Drake - Olivia Bruce scored the game winner against North Dakota State in 1-0 victory Sunday. It is the second goal of the season for Bruce, who scored in the 84th minute against the Bison. She has scored four goals in her young career. Hallie Reznik beat two Bison defenders, drove with the ball to the backline and slipped a pass to Bruce, who opened up and buried it far post.

Montana Portenier, Sr., F, Evansville - In a busy week of matches, senior forward Montana Portenier was an active offensive threat for the Purple Aces. On Sunday, Portenier tied a career-high with six shots, scoring a goal just 1:57 into the match to give Evansville the early advantage before the Aces fell to Miami (Ohio), 2-1. On the season, Portenier is tied for most goals for Evansville with two goals through six matches this year.

Mikayla Unger, Jr., F, Illinois State - Unger netted a goal and added an assist in Illinois State's defeat of UIC, 5-2, on Sunday afternoon. The junior forward broke free in the 17th minute, to beat the goalkeeper one-on-one and put the Redbirds up 3-0. It was her first goal of the season and tenth career goal. Later in the 35th minute, Unger would assist on Alex McArthur's goal, helping the Redbirds to a 4-0 lead at halftime.

Katie Wells, Sr., F, Indiana State - Indiana State senior Katie Wells led the Sycamores offensively through a tough stretch of three road games last week in which ISU went undefeated with a mark of 2-0-1. She recorded a pair of assists in the Sycamores' 2-2 draw at Akron, marking the 15th time in the history of the program that a player has recorded two assists in one match. Then on Sunday at Wright State, Wells got the scoring going when she blasted a free kick into the left back corner of the net over the outstretched arms of the Raiders' goalkeeper for her second goal of the season and the 14th of her career. She now ranks No. 6 in the ISU record book with 42 career points scored and her 14 career goals are eighth-best in ISU soccer history.

Jenna Szczesny, Sr., F, Loyola - Loyola senior Jenna Szczesny continued her fast start to the 2018 campaign over the weekend. Fresh off being named The Valley's Offensive Player of the Week, Szczesny netted her third goal of the season, a mark which leads the Rambler roster, in the second half of Friday's 4-0 blanking of Purdue Fort Wayne. The Hoffman Estates, Ill. native, who added a pair of attempts on Sunday against No. 14/13 Oklahoma State, now finds herself just two goals shy of former Rambler Mary Dale (2003-06) for third on the program's all-time leaderboard in the category.

Kelsey Yarrow, Sr. M, UNI - Kelsey Yarrow's late goal in the second half against Central Michigan forced the game to overtime on Sunday. Yarrow was named to the All-Tournament team, following UNI's match. Yarrow is a leader on the offensive, totaling 16 shots this season. Yarrow has started all games this season for the Panthers, after starting in 19 of the Panthers matches last season.

DEFENSE

Michaela Till, So., GK, Evansville - Playing in three matches over a

five-day span, sophomore goalkeeper Michaela Till was a steady force between the posts. In the opening match of the week on Wednesday, Till made six saves, allowing one goal, as Evansville dropped a 1-0 match on the road at UT Martin. Against Tennessee Tech on Friday night, the Avon, Ind. native recorded her second shutout of her collegiate career, making two saves, and helping the Purple Aces earn a 3-0 victory over the Golden Eagles. The week concluded on Sunday as Till tallied three saves, allowing a pair of goals, as Evansville lost to Miami (Ohio), 2-1, in Oxford, Ohio. On the season, Till has amassed 27 saves and a 1.45 goals-against average in 495 minutes in goal this season.

Jenna Ross, So., D, Loyola - Loyola sophomore Jenna Ross turned in two strong performances as the Maroon & Gold split a pair of games over the weekend. The Crystal Lake, Ill. native dished out tied a career high by dishing out three assists as part of a 4-0 win over Purdue Fort Wayne in which she also helped the Ramblers earn their first shutout of the 2018 season. Ross, who tied for The Valley lead with eight assists as a freshman, went on to put in a full 90-minute shift amidst hot and humid conditions in Sunday's clash with No. 14/13 Oklahoma State, firing a pair of shots against the Cowgirls. The sophomore has been a fixture in the Rambler lineup early on this season, earning the starting nod in each of Loyola's first six games.

Drew Moulton, Sr., GK, Valparaiso - Moulton kept Robert Morris off the scoresheet in her 75 minutes of action against the Colonials in Sunday's win, picking up her first win of the season. She has now lowered her GAA on the season to 0.65.

NEWCOMER

Halie Reznik, Fr., F, Drake - Reznik tallied her first career assist on Bruce's goal in the win over North Dakota State. Reznik beat two Bison defenders, drove with the ball to the backline and slipped a pass to Bruce, who opened up and buried it far post.

Shaina Dudas, Fr., F, Illinois State - Dudas experienced many "firsts" during Illinois State's 5-2 victory over the UIC Flames on Sunday afternoon. In her first career start, the Elk Grove Village, Illinois native scored her first career goal and recorded her first career assist. Dudas sent in a cross to a breaking Angel Krell in the sixth minute, which she slotted into the lower right corner, putting the Redbirds up 2-0. Later, she would find the back of the net herself in the 65th minute off a pass from Kiley Czerwinski. Dudas would finish out the weekend earning her first three points

Sidney Ewing, Fr., MF, Indiana State - Indiana State freshman Sidney Ewing continues to emerge for the Sycamores as she recorded three total shots on the week, including a shot on goal at Akron. That shot against the Zips found the back of the net and staked Indiana State to an early 1-0 lead in a match in which ISU went on to a 2-2 draw at Akron. It was Ewing's first collegiate goal and she now has three points on the year.

Abby Swanson, Fr., MF, Loyola - Loyola freshman Abby Swanson found the back of the net for the second time this season as part of Friday's 4-0 rout of Purdue Fort Wayne. Out of Downers Grove, Ill., Swanson finished off a delivery from a corner kick by junior Aleksa Tataryn late in the first half as part of a 90-minute performance in the Maroon & Gold's victory. She added a pair of attempts, again putting in a full shift, two days later against No. 14/13 Oklahoma State.

Sycamores Enjoyed Undefeated Week Of Play On The Road

Indiana State faced three tough matches during the third week of the regular season – much as they have all season long as they are playing each of their first eight matches away this season away from Memorial Stadium. The Sycamores found success on the road with a 2-0-1 record as they have now gone undefeated on the road over three consecutive matches for the first time since 2015. ISU's next game is Friday, September 7 at Eastern Illinois as ISU will look to make it four consecutive games on the road without a defeat for the first time in program history. Indiana State has already won more road games this year (3) than they did later year and it is the most road victories in a single season for the program since 2015. The last time the Sycamores won four on the road came in 2012 and the school record of five road victories happened in 2006.

An Ohio State Of Mind

Indiana State found success in the Buckeye state for the first time in a long while. The Sycamores tied with Akron on Friday night but then in Dayton against Wright State on Sunday they picked up their first win in the state of Ohio since a 2006 victory at Cleveland State. It was also the Sycamores' first victory in three all-time matches against Wright State.

What A First Collegiate Shot!

Indiana State sophomore Camryn DeGrafft entered Wednesday night's game at Illinois-Chicago having played 113 career minutes and never taken a shot in nine matches played. That all changed in the blink of an eye in the 32nd minute against the Flames. DeGrafft was the recipient of a cross field pass at the 20 yard mark and instead of making a pass into the large group in front of the net, she took a shot which dropped right over the Flames goalkeeper and into the back of the net. It was DeGrafft's first career shot and she found the back of the net for the game winner against UIC!
