MVC Player of the Week

Sara Rhine, Jr., F, Drake

Sara Rhine had another outstanding weekend in Drake's two home victories, averaging 18.0 points, 8.5 rebounds, 2.5 assists, 1.5 steals and 1.0 block in while shooting 12-of-19 (63.1 percent) from the floor and impressive 12-of-13 (92.3 percent) from the free throw line. In the Loyola win, Rhine made 5-of-10 from the field and 5-of-5 from the free throw line for 15 points. She just missed a double-double with nine rebounds

and she added three assists and one steal in just 22 minutes. In the Valpo win, Rhine had a game-high 21 points on 7-of-9 shooting, and she made 7-of-8 from the free throw line. Again, she just missed a double-double with eight rebounds to go with two assists, two blocks and two steals in 25 minutes.

MVC Newcomer of the Week

Jasmine Franklin, Fr., F, Missouri State

Jasmine Franklin had 10 points and a career-high 14 rebounds in MSU's only game last week, a 66-51 win against Southern Illinois. She shot 4-of-8 from the floor with a steal. Franklin's 14 boards were the most for an MSU freshman since Christiana Shorter had 16 in 2010, while her third straight double-double marked the longest streak for an MSU player since 2012, and the longest for a freshman since Shorter in 2010.

NOTEWORTHY

Chelsea Brackmann (BRAD) - Brackmann continued her strong play, averaging 18.0 points on a blistering 71 percent shooting and also pulled down 7.5 rebounds per game as she helped power Bradley to a pair of road wins. She opened the week with 15 points on 7-of-10 from the field and also tallied five boards, one assist, one block and one steal in a win at Evansville as she scored her 600th career point. Brackmann turned in her league-best seventh double-double of the season Sunday at Indiana State, helping Bradley secure its first road win in the series with the Sycamores since 1997. She finished with a game-high 21 points on 10-of-14 shooting and pulled down 10 boards in the victory. Brackmann also had a steal against Indiana State as Bradley held the Sycamores to 22.4 percent shooting to match the fourth lowest opponent shooting percentage in program history.

Kerri Gasper (UE) - Since beginning MVC play, senior Kerri Gasper has found her rhythm, recording a pair of identical scoring performances this weekend. Opening the weekend against Bradley, Gasper scored a team-high 17 points and pulled down eight rebounds in the Aces' 75-68 loss to the Braves. On Sunday facing Illinois State, Gasper once again led the team with 17 points and eight rebounds, adding a career-high three blocks in the 72-61 loss. This season, Gasper leads Evansville in scoring (12.0 points per game), rebounds (7.1), and minutes (34.3).

Ashli O'Neal (INS) - Ashli O'Neal averaged 17 points over the weekend and shot 50% from 3-point range as Indiana State handed Illinois State its sixth consecutive loss at the Hulman Center. O'Neal scored 34 points overall, had five steals and grabbed six rebounds on the weekend while dishing out three assists, averaging 34.5 minutes played. The junior shot 38.7% from the floor and was 6 of 7 at the free throw line.

Ellie Rice (LUC) - Loyola sophomore guard Ellie Rice averaged a team-best 12.5 points in the Ramblers' two-game road swing through the state of lowa this past weekend. The Austin, Texas native opened the trip by going 6-for-10 from the field en route to a 13-point performance in Friday's 69-60 loss at Drake. She came back less than 48 hours later to add 12 points as part of a 64-52 setback against UNI. Rice has now reached double figures in scoring 10 times through 14 games this season, matching the total from that of her freshman year.

Karli Rucker (UNI) - Karli shot 14-27 (51.9 percent) from the field and averaged 18.5 points in UNI's two wins over the weekend. She scored 14 and went 3-4 from the three-point line against Valparaiso and scored a game-high 23 points and 10 rebounds for a double-double against Loyola. She scored the first seven points of Sunday's game and had as many points (12) as the Ramblers did in the first quarter. She also averaged 3.0 assists and 1.0 steals on the weekend.

Nicole Martin (SIU) - Nicole Martin finished with a game-high 19 points on 9-of-16 shooting to go along with seven rebounds and two blocks in SIU's road game against Missouri State. It marked the fourth-straight game that Martin has scored in double figures and the 11th time she has done so this season.

Tatum Koenig (BRAD) - Koenig averaged 21.0 minutes of action off the bench in two road wins, scoring 6.5 points per outing on 75 percent shooting. She scored five points in 14 minutes during Friday's win at Evansville. She provided a big spark in Sunday's win at Indiana State, helping Bradley end a 21-game road losing streak in the series with the Sycamores. Koenig matched a season-high with 28 minutes off the bench and was +27 while on the floor, tallying eight points and two assists. She scored five of her eight points to help Bradley pull away in the second half and finished the contest 2-for-2 from the field (both three-pointers). Koenig also grabbed two boards as Bradley evened its MVC record at 2-2 and improved to 5-1 on the road this season.

Makayla Wallace (UE) - Playing in the first home MVC games of her career, freshman Makayla Wallace continued an impressive first year with Evansville. Against Bradley on Friday evening, Wallace was one of four Aces in double-figures, scoring 11 points, while rallying four steals, three rebounds, an assist, and a block, while shooting four-of-six from the field and hitting three free throws. For the second-straight game, Wallace scored double-digits, recording 13 points to go along with three assists, two rebounds, and a steal in 24 minutes of action. On the year, Wallace leads the Aces in steals (2.2 per game), free-throws made (37), and free-throw attempts (62).

TeTe Maggett (ILS) - TeTe Maggett guided the Redbirds to a 72-61 win over Evansville, leading all scorers with 26 points. The junior guard was perfect from the free-throwline shooting 9-for-9. This is her sixth-straight game without missing a shot from the charity stripe. Additionally, she was 60 percent from beyond the arc, netting 3-for-5 and grabbed four rebounds and added six assists. On Friday, Maggett was the second leading scorer for the 'Birds with nine points, while also grabbing three rebounds.

Janae Gonzales (LUC) - Loyola freshman Janae Gonzales chipped in 10.0 points and 4.0 rebounds over the Ramblers' two games this past weekend against Drake and UNI. In Fridays' 69-60 loss to the Bulldogs, Gonzales connected on four threes, her fourth game this season with at least three makes from distance, as she finished with 12 points and four rebounds. The Tolleson, Ariz. product added eight points and four rebounds as part of a 64-52 defeat at the hands of the Panthers on Sunday afternoon. Gonzales has knocked down a team-high 29 triples this season and ranks third in The Valley in three-point field goals made per game (2.2).

Kam Finley (UNI) - Cam scored 10 points on 4-9 (.44.4 percent) shooting against Valparaiso. She averaged 5.0 points 1.0 rebounds, 1.0 steals and 0.5 blocks on the weekend.

Top of the Heap

Drake and Missouri State are the only two remaining teams perfect in MVC action. The Bulldogs sit 4-0 in league play, while the Lady Bears are off to a 3-0 league start. Drake will travel to UNI this weekend, while Missouri State will travel to Bradley and Illinois State.

Leading the Pack

Drake's Sara Rhine and Becca Hittner currently rank as the top two scorers in The Valley, ranking No. 1 and No. 2 respectively. Rhine is averaging 18.9 points per game, while Hittner is averaing 18.2 a contest. Only one time in the league's history has a teammate tandem finished the season ranking No. 1 and 2 as Drake's Wanda Ford (24.2 ppg) and Julie Fitzpatrick (23.1 ppg) led the way during the 1984-85 season.

Valley Streak

Drake has the longest win streak in the history of the Gateway/MVC for regular season contests, winning 44-straight. The impressive streak started Feb. 26, 2016 with a win over Loyola. The Bulldogs broke SIU's 37 game streak from 1985-1987 during the Gateway era with a win over Illinois State last season. The streak is the second longest active streak against conference opponents, trailing only UConn's streak of 119 straight wins in the American.

Taking Care of the Ball

Brittney Patrick currently leads the Valley, and ranks 4th nationally, in assist-to-turnover ratio (3.45). Patrick's 5.2 assists per game also leads the MVC while she also leads the league in total assists (73). SIU has only once had a player lead the league in assists per game (Cartaesha Macklin, 2013) and Patrick's 3.45 assist-to-turnover ratio would be a school record.

Road Winning

Bradley improved 5-1 in road games this season with victories at Evansville & Indiana State last weekend. The Braves snapped a 21-game road losing streak in the series with the Sycamores dating back to a 70-53 victory on Jan. 26, 1997 with a 61-45 win at the Hulman Center Sunday afternoon to even their MVC record at 2-2. The five road wins are tied for the MVC lead with Drake (5-2) and Indiana State (5-4)

Harper Earns 100th MSU Win

Missouri State won its 100th game under Kellie Harper on Sunday, a 66-51 triumph against Southern Illinois. Harper is the fourth Lady Bears boss to win 100 games at the school, joining Cheryl Burnett (319), Reba Sims (129) and Nyla Milleson (105).

Power Five Ahead

Drake finished the non-conference schedule with three Power Five wins on its resume as the Bulldogs beat South Carolina, Rutgers and Nebraska. The conference finished 3-13 against Power Five opponents with all but one of the games taking place on the road or a neutral court.

Strength of Schedule

Drake and Missouri State tested themselves with a difficult non-conference schedule this season. According to WarrenNolan.com, the Bulldogs played the third toughest non-conference strength of schedule this season, while the Lady Bears' non-league schedule ranks 36th nationally.

1,000 Point Club

Evansville's Kerri Gasper has moved closer to 1,000 career points. Gasper currently sits at 992 points, just eight points away from becoming the seventh active MVC player to reach 1,000 career points.

Drake has four active players are second nationally behind Marquette and Notre Dame (each with five).

Vs. Top 25

Last season, the MVC went 0-9 against Top 25 opponents, breaking a streak of three-straight years with at least one win over a Top 25 team. Drake earned a 90-85 overtime win over No. 12/13 South Carolina in Vancouver in November. It was the highest ranked win over an opponent in the regular season by a Valley team since Missouri State beat No. 10 LSU on November 24, 2000. The league finished 1-8 vs. the Top 25 this year.

Against the Field

The MVC held a winning record against 10 leagues in non-conference play, including the America East (1-0), Big West (2-1), Colonial (2-0), Conference USA (4-3), Horizon (9-5), NEC (1-0), Ohio Valley (11-8), Summitt (9-5), Sun Belt (1-0) and WAC (6-1). The MVC holds at least a .500 mark against the Atlantic 10 (2-2) and the SEC (1-1). The league finished above .500 in non-conference play for the first time since 2012-13 (59-55) and registered 60 non-league wins for the first time since 2010-11 (62-49).

Double Your Pleasure

Bradley's Chelsea Brackmann is the only MVC player averaging a double-double this season. The junior is averaging 12.5 points and 10.9 rebounds per game (leads MVC, 24th nationally). Brackmann has seven double-doubles on the season. Below are players with five or more double-doubles.

Sharp Shooters

A year after seeing Evansville lead the nation in free-throw percentage (82.0%), The Valley has two of the nation's top five teams in the category so far this season. Loyola currently leads the league and sits 3rd nationally, while UNI sits tied for 4th.

Loyola's Abby O'Connor leads The Valley and ranks No. 2 nationally hitting 94.6% of her attempts. In 2012-13, UNI's Jacqui Kalin set the MVC record with a percentage of 95.5% for a season.

Over the past five seasons, Drake has ranked in the top 10 every season in the NCAA in assists per game, including leading the nation a year ago. The Bulldogs are once again sharing the basketball as they enter the week No. 2 in the country averaging 22.3 assists per contest.

Pounding the Glass

Bradley's Chelsea Brackmann tallied just the third 20-20 performance in school history in a win over UNI. Brackmann, who scored a season-best 22 points, tied the Bradley single-game record with 24 rebounds. Brackmann's 24 boards are the second most in the country this season and tied for the fifth most in MVC history. No MVC player has collected 24 rebounds in a game since 2009 and she had the first 20-20 effort in a conference game dating back to a 26-point, 21-rebound performance by Dyana Pierre (SIU) vs. Northern Iowa on Feb. 8, 2015.

Home Sweet Home

Since 2002, home teams have won at least 55 (.611) of the 90 league contests in all but seven seasons (2003-04, 2006-07, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2015-16, 2016-17, 2017-18). The most wins by home teams in league play came in 2008 (61-29 at home in conference play). The league was 49-41 (.544) at home in league play last year, and has compiled an 11-7(.611) mark so far in 2018-19.

Two Sport Athlete

Lexi Wallen joined the team following a four-year volleyball career at ISU. The senior forward has made an immediate impact on the team, averaging 9.3 points and six rebounds per game during conference play. She is one of five reported athletes to be currently competing in both volleyball and basketball at the division 1 level. Two of the five are Valley athletes. Katherine Carlson of Valparaiso also recently joined the basketball team after a volleyball career.

Rhine on McClain Watch List


The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA announced that Drake junior Sara Rhine is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2019 Katrina McClain Award. Named after the two-time All-American and 1987 National Player of the Year, the annual award in its second year recognizes the top power forwards in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2019 Katrina McClain Award will be narrowed to just 10.

Senior CLASS Award Candidate

Drake's Sammie Bachrodt has been named a candidate for the 2018-19 Senior CLASS Award. Bachrodt is among 30 NCAA Division I candidates in women's basketball for the award which recognizes notable achievements in four areas of excellence – community, classroom, character and competition.

Title Town

The league has had nine different regular-season champions in the past 12 seasons (SIU-2007, DU/UE/ILS-2008, ILS-2009, ILS-2010, UNI-2011; MSU-2012; WSU/CU-2013; INS/WSU-2014; WSU-2015; UNI-2016; DU-2017; DU-2018). Bradley, Loyola and Valparaiso are the only league teams not to have won a regular-season MVC championship.



Postseason League

The MVC has seen an average of four league teams participate in postseason play in the last 20 seasons, including three teams reaching postseason play in 2017-18. Drake fell at Texas A&M in the NCAA Tournament, while Missouri State and UNI each received bids into the WNIT. The Valley has earned multiple NCAA Tournament bids in 11 different seasons, including a pair of bids in the 2017 NCAA Tournament (Drake and UNI).

Hoops In the Heartland

The 2019 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxSlayer Center in Moline, Ill., for the fourth-straight season.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event (Mar. 14-17) will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.


The MVC extended an agreement with the Quad Cities Convention & Visitors Bureau to conduct the MVC Women's Basketball Championship in TaxSlayer Center through at least 2021.

The 2019 tournament will mark the 12th-consecutive season in its 37-year history that the event will take place at a neutral site.

The Missouri Valley Conference is one of only seven conferences (out of 32 nationally) where the women's basketball tournament is played at a neutral site, separate from the men's championship (AAC, ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, MVC, Pac-12 and SEC are the others).

Starters Returning

The Missouri Valley Conference will see 37 of 50 starters return (74%) for the 2018-19 season. Defending champion Drake returns all five starters next season, while Illinois State, Indiana State, UNI, Southern Illinois and Valparaiso will see four starters return. Bradley, Evansville, Loyola and Missouri State will each see three starters return to the court.

Halfway Point

Last weekend's road trip marked the halfway point of the 2018-19 regular season and the Braves enter the second half of the regular-season schedule just one win short (12) of matching last year's overall win total (13). In fact, the Braves have 12 wins before the end of Janu-



ary for the fifth time in program history. Bradley's 12-3 start to the year is the third in school history with the two previous starts of 13-3 (2008-09 & 1979-80) resulting in the only 20-win seasons in Bradley history.

All Even

Bradley improved 5-1 in road games this season with victories at Evansville & Indiana State last weekend. The Braves snapped a 21-game road losing streak in the series with the Sycamores dating back to a 70-53 victory on Jan. 26, 1997 with a 61-45 win at the Hulman Center Sunday afternoon to even their MVC record at 2-2. Bradley is 2-2 or better to start league play for the second consecutive year. Prior to last year's 3-0 opening to Valley play, the Braves hadn't started conference action 2-2 or better since 2009-10 (6-2).

Shutting Them Down

Indiana State got off to a hot start in Bradley's win in Terre Haute, Ind., Sunday with the Sycamores making 3-of-5 from the field before the Braves locked down defensively. After the hot start, Bradley held Indiana State to 8-for-53 (15.1 percent) shooting over the final 37 minutes of the contest. Overall, the 22.4 percent shooting by the Sycamores tied for the fourth-lowest opponent field goal percentage for a BU opponent and marks the lowest opponent field goal percentage against the Braves in a road game.

What A Pair

Rhine and Hittner are the top two scorers in the MVC at 18.9 and 18.2 points per game, respectively. Recently the pair moved into the top 10 all-time in career scoring average at Drake as each player averages an impressive 15.0 clip. The duo are linked even more as they



are the No. 2 and No. 3 active career scoring leaders in the conference, Rhine (1,335) and Hittner (1,185), trailing just their teammate, redshirt senior, Maddy Dean, who has a league-high 1,366 career points.

Double-Double Club

Junior guard Becca Hittner recorded her first double of the year and sixth all-time in Drake's win over Valparaiso. Hittner scored 19 points and pulled down a season-high 11 rebounds. She and Rhine are the only Bulldogs with a double-double this season. Rhine is the MVC's career leader in double-doubles with 17.

Player of the Week Domination

Redshirt junior Sara Rhine earned her fifth MVC Player of the Week award this season Monday afternoon. It is the eighth career MVC Player of the Week award for Rhine. Rhine is the first MVC player since former Bulldog great Lizzy Wendell (2016-17) to win the award five times in one season. Since Drake head coach Jennie Baranczyk took over in 2012-13, the Bulldogs have won player of the week a league-high 29 times. The next closet school during that span is Missouri State with 14. All-time Drake has a league-best 95 MVC Player of the Week winners.

Both Gasper and Miller sit in the top 16 in the MVC in minutes per game with Gasper in third and Miller in 16th. The two have also limited their fouls with Gasper committing just 2.1 fouls per game and Miller only recording 1.3 fouls per game.

Turnovers the Norm

Indiana State opponents must be maddened when facing the Sycamores as ISU opponents turnover the ball on 25.5 percent of their possessions. That turnover rate ranks eighth in the nation while the average of 21.3 turnovers per game Sycamore opponents are averaging ranks 16th nationally. Both marks lead the Valley.



Success in Small Margins

This year Indiana State has started to find more success in games decided by small margins than they have in recent memory. The Sycamores have posted a 5-1 mark this season in games decided by 10 or fewer points, matching the same number of wins in that category from a year ago. ISU has not posted a winning record in those close games since the 2014-15 season, when they went 8-6 (.571) in such contests.

Swipe Right (and Left)

Indiana State is putting its defensive pressure on opponents and coming away with added possessions because of it. Early on this season the Sycamores are averaging 10.6 steals per game, the most an Indiana State team has averaged for a season since averaging 11.4 per game in 2004-05. That mark ranks the Trees 39th in the nation and first in the Valley.

More Franklin Feats

Freshman Jasmine Franklin collected another double-double on Sunday against SIU, finishing with 10 points and a career-high 14 rebounds. Her third straight double-double makes her the first MSU player to accomplish the feat since Whitney Edie in 2012, and the first freshman since Christiana Shorter in 2010. Her 14 boards are the most for a Lady Bear freshman since Shorter had 16 against Wichita State on Jan. 23, 2010. Franklin is also the first MSU player with 10-plus boards in three straight games since Hillary Chvatal in 2015.

Nicole Martin made her first 11 attempts from the floor in the win over Evansville on Jan. 4 and finished 11-for-12. Martin's 91.7% field goal percentage is tied for the fifth-best single game performance in NCAA DI this season and was the best by a Saluki with at least



10 attempts since Dyana Pierre made 14-of-14 attempts from the floor in SIU's win over Murray State on Dec. 16, 2014. Martin has now scored in double figures in 11 of SIU's 14 games this season.

Taking Care of the Ball

Brittney Patrick currently leads the Valley, and ranks 4th nationally, in assist-to-turnover ratio (3.45). Patrick's 5.2 assists per game also leads the MVC while she also leads the league in total assists (73). SIU has only once had a player lead the league in assists per game (Cartaesha Macklin, 2013) and Patrick's 3.45 assist-to-turnover ratio would be a school record.

Getting it Done from Distance

Valpo has equaled or bettered its opponent in made 3-pointers in 12 of the last 13 games. The only time Valpo made fewer 3s than the opponent in the last 12 games was Jan. 6 at Loyola. Valpo has made eight 3s or more seven times this season, including 13 against



Drake on Jan. 13. Valpo has already surpassed last year's season total for number of games equaling or bettering the opposition's number of made 3s. Valpo became just the second team to make 13 3-pointers in a game against Drake this season, joining Creighton (Nov. 28).

Swiping it Away

Three Valpo players reached career highs in steals on Jan. 13 at Drake. Ella Ellenson and Grace Hales had new personal bests by sharing the team lead with four steals apiece, while Ilysse Pitts tied a career high with three steals. The team had 13 steals, the most since Nov. 16 at Morehead State and the most steals by a Drake opponent in a game this season. The Valpo defense helped force Drake into 23 turnovers, the most the Bulldogs had committed since Nov. 15 and the second most by the Bulldogs this season. Valpo is averaging 9.3 steals per game, up from 6.9 per game last season. The last time Valpo finished a season with a steals per game average better than the team's current mark was 2002-2003 (9.4 spg).

Hales Heats Up

Grace Hales scored 15 points in the second half on Jan. 13 at Drake, finishing with a team-high 18 points in the game. She matched a career high with seven made field goals while also setting personal bests in assists (4) and steals (4). The Valpo junior had her highest scoring output since a career-high 21 points on Dec. 2 vs. Eastern Illinois. Hales has reached double figures in four of the last five games after doing so just twice over the first 10 games of the season.
