MVC Player of the Week

Danielle Gitzen, Sr., G, Missouri State

Missouri State's Danielle Gitzen averaged 18.0 points, 6.0 rebounds, 4.5 assists and 2.5 steals in leading the Lady Bears to a pair of road victories over the weekend. The senior shot 52 percent overall and 5-for-5 from beyond the arc. Friday, Gitzen had 15 points, six rebounds, six assists and three steals in a win at Bradley, shooting 5-for-11 with a pair of treys. Sunday, she scored a game-high 21 points on 7-of-12 shooting and 3-for-3

from distance, adding a 4-for-4 showing at the foul line with six boards, four assists and two steals in a win at Illinois State.

MVC Newcomer of the Week

Tamara Lee, Sr., G, Indiana State

Indiana State's Tamara Lee shot an impressive 53.8% from three-point range and averaged 14.5 points per game as she helped Indiana State rally from behind for a win at Valpo and nearly did the same at Loyola. Lee shot 42% overall over the weekend, dished out five assists and grabbed three steals while averaging 4.0 rebounds per game.

NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Gabi Haack (BRAD) - Haack averaged a team-best 18.0 points per game and also averaged 7.0 rebounds, 1.0 assist and 1.0 steal per outing in a pair of home games. She scored 18 points in each contest as she scored her 600th career point in her 48th game as a Brave to tie for the eighth fastest player in program history to reach 600 points. Haack opened the week with 18 points, five rebounds, one assist and one steal against Missouri State, scoring 13 of her 18 points in the second half. In Sunday's overtime victory against Southern Illinois, she was a rebound short of her second double-double of the season as she collected 18 points, nine rebounds, one assist and one steal. Haack, who was 7-for-7 from the line Sunday and 8-for-8 from the charity stripe for the week, scored four points in the overtime period including a pair of free throws with three seconds left to help seal the win which snapped an eight-game losing skid in the all-time series with the Salukis. Haack moved into seventh in career three-pointers at Bradley and now owns just the fifth season in Bradley history of 49 three-pointers and 75 or more made free throws.

Sara Rhine (DU) - Sara Rhine continued her impressive play in the Bulldogs' road victory over UNI. Rhine, who scored a game-high 26 points, made 9-of-18 from the floor, including two key 3-pointers, and made 6-of-6 from the free throw line. She added a career-high five steals and pulled down three rebounds and handed out one assist in 27 minutes. In the fourth quarter when the Bulldogs broke open the game with a 21-5 run, she scored 11 points during that stretch. Rhine, who averages a league-best 19.3 points, has scored 20 or more points in a league-leading nine games this season.

Kerri Gasper (UE) - In a pair of road MVC contests, senior Kerri Gasper recorded a double-double and reached a career milestone. Against Loyola on Friday afternoon, Gasper tallied her fourth double-double of the season, finishing with 11 points and 10 rebounds, becoming just the 20th player in program history to reach 1,000 points in their career. On Sunday afternoon at Valparaiso, Gasper scored six points and recorded five rebounds and a block in the loss. On the season, the senior leads Evansville in scoring average (11.6), rebounding average (7.2), and minutes per game (34.6).

Ashli O'Neal (INS) - Ashli O'Neal averaged 20.5 points over the weekend – including a career-high 28 points at Valpo – as she led Indiana State to its fifth come-from-behind win of the year. A junior, O'Neal was 37 percent from the floor and averaged 4.5 rebounds per game while registering 5 steals. She was credited with 6 assists, shot 33% from beyond the arc and hit 11 of 15 free throws (73%). ISU is now 6-0 all-time when O'Neal scores 20-plus points.

Abby O'Connor (LUC) - Loyola sophomore forward averaged a team-high 14.0 points, 7.0 rebounds and 1.5 blocks as the Ramblers swept a pair of games this past weekend. Following a 10-point, six-rebound showing in a 61-56 win over Evansville on Friday, O'Connor poured in a team-best 18 points, 11 of which came in the fourth quarter, as Loyola held on for a 56-54 victory against Indiana State on Sunday afternoon. The South Bend, Ind. native, who also corralled eight rebounds and blocked two shots against the Sycamores, went a perfect six-of-six from the free throw line in the final minute to help seal the outcome. O'Connor currently ranks 10th in the MVC in scoring (13.9 ppg), eighth in rebounding (6.7 rpg) and leads the league in three-point field goal percentage (45.2%), free throw percentage (95.6%) and blocked shots (1.6 bpg).

Makenzie Silvey (SIU) - Southern Illinois sophomore Makenzie Silvey averaged 13.5 points 3.5 rebounds and 3.0 steals in SIU's two road games over the weekend. She opened the weekend with 13 points on 40% shooting to go along with three steals at Illinois State. The 2018 MVC All-Freshman Team selection followed with 14 points, six boards and three steals in 43 minutes at Bradley on Sunday. The Glen Carbon, Ill. native has now scored in double figures in five-straight games and in 14 of SIU's 16 games this season.

Meredith Hamlet (VU) - Senior Meredith Hamlet enjoyed an impressive bounce-back week as Valpo hosted Indiana State and Evansville. After being held to three total points in two games at Drake and at UNI the previous weekend, Valpo's leading scorer rebounded by averaging 21.5 points per game this weekend. She came within two points of a season high and three points of a career high on Friday against the Sycamores, breaking out for 26 points - her third time this season surpassing the 25-point threshold. She also pulled down five rebounds, handed out four assists and swiped three steals against Indiana State. Hamlet followed that up with an efficient 7-of-8 shooting showing on Sunday against Evansville, turning in 17 points while grabbing a team-high six boards. That helped Valpo to a 44-point win over the Purple Aces, the largest margin of victory by a Valley team against a Division-I opponent this season.

Lasha Petree (BRAD) - Petree averaged 9.5 points, 3.5 rebounds, 1.0 block and 3.5 steals in a pair of home games. In 25 minutes of action against Missouri State, she had five points. two rebounds, one block and steals. Petree came off the bench for the first time since late November in Sunday's overtime win against Southern Illinois to score 15 points. She also pulled down five rebounds (four offensive) and had an assist, one block and four steals. After a tough start offensively in which she was 2-for-9 from the field, Petree knocked a three-pointer with 1:34 to play in regulation which gave the Braves a 47-45 lead. She made her final three shots of the day including a go-ahead threepointer near the three-minute mark of the overtime period to give the Braves a 54-51 advantage. Petree also hit a pull-up shot in the lane with just under 30 seconds remaining to help seal the 58-53 overtime win for Bradley which snapped an eight-game losing streak in the series with the Salukis.

Monica Burich (DU) - Monica Burich had her best all-around game as a Bulldog in the victory over UNI. Burich, who transferred to Drake from Colorado and is in her first season at Drake, scored nine points, grabbed a career-high nine rebounds and handed out a career-best five assists in $17\,$ minutes off the bench. She has appeared in all $17\,$ games in her first season and averages $4.5\,$ points and $3.4\,$ rebounds.

Makayla Wallace (UE) - On the road against Loyola and Valparaiso this weekend, freshman Makayla Wallace continued to show her defensive ability, while getting to the line consistently for Evansville. Facing Loyola, Wallace recorded her fourth-straight double-figure scoring performance with 10 points, adding five rebounds, three steals, and an assist. Against Valpo on Sunday, Wallace scored six points, while tying for the team-high with five rebounds and recording a team-best four assists and two steals. Wallace has excelled the season in creating opponent turnovers as she leads the Aces with 38 steals on the year, while also leading Evansville in assists per game (2.4), free throws made (44), and free throw attempts (72), and leads all Aces' freshman in scoring average (6.4).

Janae Gonzales (LUC) - Loyola freshman Janae Gonzales added 9.0 points and 6.5 rebounds in a pair of victories for the Maroon & Gold this past weekend. After chipping in five points and eight rebounds in Friday's 61-56 triumph over Evansville, the Tolleson, Ariz. product finishing with 13 points, knocking down a three three-point attempts, five rebounds, two assists and a steal in a thrilling 56-54 win against Indiana State. Gonzales, who is currently averaging 10.8 points on the year, ranks in the top 10 in The Valley in both three-point field goals made per game (4th, 2.2) and three-point field goal percentage (8th, 37.9%).

Jasmine Franklin (MSU) - Jasmine Franklin averaged 10 points, seven rebounds and 1.5 blocks in two road wins, shooting 50 percent from the floor. Franklin had 12 points, six boards and a block Friday at Bradley, and tallied eight points, eight rebounds and two blocked shots on Sunday at Illinois State.

Drake and Missouri State's 5-0 league starts match 26 others who have started with five-straight league wins in 2018-19. The MVC is one of 11 leagues to have two unbeatens left in league play (through Jan. 21).

Missouri State is now 5-0 in MVC play for the sixth time in school history and first time since the 2004 team won its first 11 league games. The Bulldogs have opened league play 5-0 three out of the last four seasons.

Leading the Pack

Drake's Sara Rhine and Becca Hittner currently rank as the top two scorers in The Valley, ranking No. 1 and No. 2 respectively. Rhine is averaging 19.3 points per game, while Hittner is averaing 18.2 a contest. Only one time in the league's history has a teammate tandem finished the season ranking No. 1 and 2 as Drake's Wanda Ford (24.2 ppg) and Julie Fitzpatrick (23.1 ppg) led the way during the 1984-85 season.

Valley Streak

Drake has the longest win streak in the history of the Gateway/MVC for regular season contests, winning 45-straight. The impressive streak started Feb. 26, 2016 with a win over Loyola. The Bulldogs broke SIU's 37 game streak from 1985-1987 during the Gateway era with a win over Illinois State last season. The streak is the second longest active streak against conference opponents, trailing only UConn's streak of 121 straight wins in the American.

1,000 Point Club

Evansville's Kerri Gasper became the seventh active MVC player to join the 1,000 career points club Friday. Gasper scored 11 points in the Aces' loss to Loyola becoming the 20th player in Evansville history to reach the milestone.

Drake has four active players are second nationally behind Marquette and Notre Dame (each with five).

Currently the Bulldogs have equalled Missouri State's Casey Garrison, Christiana Shorter, Jaleshia Roberson, and Jasmine Malone who all had at least 1,000 points when the 2011-12 season ended.

Power Five Ahead

Drake finished the non-conference schedule with three Power Five wins on its resume as the Bulldogs beat South Carolina, Rutgers and Nebraska. The conference finished 3-13 against Power Five opponents with all but one of the games taking place on the road or a neutral court.

Elite Profile

Drake's three Top 25 RPI wins (Rutgers, South Carolina and South Dakota) trail only Notre Dame (5), Baylor (4) and Oregon (4) and are tied with Mississippi State (3). Drake's seven games vs. RPI Top 25 teams is the most in the nation (Data through Jan. 20).

Vs. Top 25

Last season, the MVC went 0-9 against Top 25 opponents, breaking a streak of three-straight years with at least one win over a Top 25 team. Drake earned a 90-85 overtime win over No. 12/13 South Carolina in Vancouver in November. It was the highest ranked win over an opponent in the regular season by a Valley team since Missouri State beat No. 10 LSU on November 24, 2000. The league finished 1-8 vs. the Top 25 this year.

Against the Field

The MVC held a winning record against 10 leagues in non-conference play, including the America East (1-0), Big West (2-1), Colonial (2-0), Conference USA (4-3), Horizon (9-5), NEC (1-0), Ohio Valley (11-8), Summitt (9-5), Sun Belt (1-0) and WAC (6-1). The MVC holds at least a .500 mark against the Atlantic 10 (2-2) and the SEC (1-1). The league finished above .500 in non-conference play for the first time since 2012-13 (59-55) and registered 60 nonleague wins for the first time since 2010-11 (62-49).

Strength of Schedule

Drake and Missouri State tested themselves with a difficult non-conference schedule this season. According to WarrenNolan.com, the Bulldogs played the third toughest non-conference strength of schedule this season, while the Lady Bears' non-league schedule ranks 47th nationally.

Double Your Pleasure

Bradley's Chelsea Brackmann is the only MVC player averaging a double-double this season. The junior is averaging 12.5 points and 11.1 rebounds per game (leads MVC, 20th nationally). Brackmann has nine double-doubles on the season. Below are players with six or more double-doubles.

Looking to Stop the Streak

Sharp Shooters

A year after seeing Evansville lead the nation in free-throw percentage (82.0%), The Valley has two of the nation's top five teams in the category so far this season. Loyola currently leads the league and sits 2nd nationally, while UNI sits 5th.

Loyola's Abby O'Connor leads The Valley and ranks No. 2 nationally hitting 95.6% of her attempts. In 2012-13, UNI's Jacqui Kalin set the MVC record with a percentage of 95.5% for a season.

The RPI Ratings Game

The latest installment of the NCAA RPI Report (Jan. 21) has six Valley teams that rank in the top-175, led by Drake at No. 11, followed by UNI (79), Missouri State (92), Indiana State (158), Southern IIlinois (166) and Bradley (171). The MVC ranks 12th among 32 conferences. The league ranking is the highest for the league since the 2013 season (finished 10th).

Pounding the Glass

Bradley's Chelsea Brackmann tallied just the third 20-20 performance in school history in a win over UNI. Brackmann, who scored a season-best 22 points, tied the Bradley single-game record with 24 rebounds. Brackmann's 24 boards are the second most in the country this season and tied for the fifth most in MVC history. No MVC player has collected 24 rebounds in a game since 2009 and she had the first 20-20 effort in a conference game dating back to a 26-point, 21-rebound performance by Dyana Pierre (SIU) vs. Northern Iowa on Feb. 8, 2015.

Rhine on McClain Watch List

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA announced that Drake junior Sara Rhine is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2019 Katrina McClain Award. Named after the two-time All-American and 1987 National Player of the Year, the annual award in its second year recognizes the top power forwards in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2019 Katrina McClain Award will be narrowed to just 10.

Senior CLASS Award Candidate


Drake's Sammie Bachrodt has been named a candidate for the 2018-19 Senior CLASS Award. Bachrodt is among 30 NCAA Division I candidates in women's basketball for the award which recognizes notable achievements in four areas of excellence – community, classroom, character and competition.

Title Town

The league has had nine different regular-season champions in the past 12 seasons (SIU-2007, DU/UE/ILS-2008, ILS-2009, ILS-2010, UNI-2011; MSU-2012; WSU/CU-2013; INS/WSU-2014; WSU-2015; UNI-2016; DU-2017; DU-2018). Bradley, Loyola and Valparaiso are the only league teams not to have won a regular-season MVC championship.

Two Sport Athlete

Lexi Wallen joined the team following a four-year volleyball career at Illinois State. The senior forward has made an immediate impact on the team, averaging 7.0 points and four rebounds per game during conference play. She is one of five reported athletes to be currently competing in both volleyball and basketball at the division 1 level. Two of the five are Valley athletes. Katherine Carlson of Valparaiso also recently joined the basketball team after a volleyball career.



Postseason League

The MVC has seen an average of four league teams participate in postseason play in the last 20 seasons, including three teams reaching postseason play in 2017-18. Drake fell at Texas A&M in the NCAA Tournament, while Missouri State and UNI each received bids into the WNIT. The Valley has earned multiple NCAA Tournament bids in 11 different seasons, including a pair of bids in the 2017 NCAA Tournament (Drake and UNI).

Hoops In the Heartland

The 2019 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxSlayer Center in Moline, Ill., for the fourth-straight season.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event (Mar. 14-17) will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.


The MVC extended an agreement with the Quad Cities Convention & Visitors Bureau to conduct the MVC Women's Basketball Championship in TaxSlayer Center through at least 2021.

The 2019 tournament will mark the 12th-consecutive season in its 37-year history that the event will take place at a neutral site.

The Missouri Valley Conference is one of only seven conferences (out of 32 nationally) where the women's basketball tournament is played at a neutral site, separate from the men's championship (AAC, ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, MVC, Pac-12 and SEC are the others).

Starters Returning

The Missouri Valley Conference will see 37 of 50 starters return (74%) for the 2018-19 season. Bradley had played 118 games at Renaissance Coliseum before the first overtime contest against Northern Iowa Jan. 6 and two of the last three home games have now gone to OT after Sunday's matchup with Southern Illinois needed an extra period. The Braves had played



a total of two overtime home games over a 17-year stretch between 2001-02 and the start of the 2018-19 campaign. Bradley had not played a pair of overtime games at home in the same season since 1995-96 when BU had back-to-back OT contests (vs. UNI & Indiana St.). The Braves are 2-2 in overtime games under third-year head coach Andrea Gorski after losing three consecutive OT games prior to her return to The Hilltop.

Still One for the Record Book

Bradley is still off to one of the best starts in program history, heading into Saturday's outing at Illinois State with a 13-4 overall record and 3-3 league mark. The Braves are 3-3 through six MVC games for the second consecutive year, but Bradley is 3-3 through six Valley contests for just the second time since an 8-3 start to conference play in 2009-10. Overall, the Braves are 13-4 to match the team's season win total from last year. Bradley is looking for 14 wins in a season for the first time since closing the 2012-13 campaign with a 14-16 overall mark. The Braves have four previous starts of 13-4 or better to a season with the last coming in 2008-09 (13-4). The other three seasons Bradley started 13-4 or better were prior to playing a full NCAA Division I schedule in 1982-83.

Reaching 1,000 Points

Against Loyola on Friday afternoon, senior Kerri Gasper achieved a milestone with a three-point play in the fourth quarter. Gasper became the 20th player in program history to reach 1,000 points in their careers and the first since Sara Dickey hit 1,000 points on Feb. 15, 2015.



Wallace's Strong Week

Facing Loyola, Wallace recorded her fourth-straight double-figure scoring performance with 10 points, adding five rebounds, three steals, and an assist. Against Valpo on Sunday, Wallace scored six points, while tying for the team-high with five rebounds and recording a team-best four assists and two steals. Wallace has excelled the season in creating opponent turnovers as she leads the Aces with 38 steals on the year, while also leading Evansville in assists per game (2.4), free throws made (44), and free throw attempts (72), and leads all Aces' freshman in scoring average (6.4).

Tucker Leads the Way

Over the weekend, freshman Sydney Tucker put together the two best games of her young collegiate career. On Friday at Loyola, Tucker scored her first collegiate points, hitting her first triple of the season and finishing with three points. The Redbirds were a perfect 12-for-12 at the charity stripe on Sunday against Missouri State, shooting 100 percent for the first time in the 2018-19 season. On Friday, the squad added 21 points at the line, attempting 27 shots. ISU is tied at 43rd nationally for free-throw attempts, getting to the line 358 times this season.



Double-Double Trouble

Senior forward Simone Goods led the 'Birds to a 60-52 victory over Southern Illinois Friday night, capturing her 10th career double-double with 10 rebounds and 16 points. Goods' performance earned her a spot in ISU's top 25 list for double-doubles in a season with six thus far and pushed her to 14th all-time with 10 career double-doubles. The senior forward is third in the Valley for double-doubles this season behind Chelsea Brackman (9) and Abby Brockmeyer (7).

Queen of the Boards

Senior guard Viria Livingston has made a mark in the ISU record books, being the class leader in total rebounds the previous three seasons, and continues to climb the career rebounding records as her senior campaign unfolds. Last season, the Minneapolis native grabbed 86 offensive boards which landed sixth all-time. With 35 offensive rebounds this season, she currently sits at 254, marking her third all-time in ISU history. She has tallied a career total of 577 rebounds, which puts her 17th all-time. Livingston is currently the second leading rebounder averaging 5.0 rebounds in the 2018-19 season.

double overtime win at Grand Canyon in November, the Trees are not only 2-0 in OT games this season but have won nine of their last 10 OT games.

Queens of the Comeback

Indiana State is not letting any deficit get them down this season. Already five times this year the Sycamores have found a way to win tough games after trailing at halftime, including in the OT win at Valpo on Jan. 18. Three came early on in the season while the fourth took place once league play started. All five comeback wins have come on the road this season.

5-0 in Valley Play

Missouri State is now 5-0 in MVC play for the sixth time in school history and first time since the 2004 team won its first 11 league games. The Lady Bears started 5-0 in 1994, 6-0 in 1997, 10-0 in 2000 and 12-0 in 1996. MSU owns three regular-season titles and two



second-place finishes following the previous five starts of 5-0 or better.

Lady Bears Streaking

Missouri State has won eight consecutive games overall and 12 in a row in MVC play. The stretch of 12 straight league wins began on Feb. 9, 2018, and ties for the third-longest Valley streak in school history and longest since a record 24 consecutive wins in 1999 and 2000. It's the second streak of 10-plus league wins (10 from Feb. 13, 2015-Jan. 3, 2016) under Kellie Harper, and the ninth overall at MSU. The eight straight overall wins mark the third time the Lady Bears have won at least that many games consecutively under Harper (8 in 2018 and 10 in 2015).

Alumni Reunion

Missouri State will host an alumni reunion Sunday afternoon as it celebrates the 50th season of Lady Bears basketball. Former greats from MSU's storied women's basketball history will be on hand when Missouri State hosts Valpo in a 2 p.m. contest.

Thanks for the Lift

The Saluki reserves kept SIU in the game against Bradley on Jan. 20- combining to score 13 points, which was the most for Southern's bench since scoring 16 points in the win over EIU on Dec. 8. It marks the eighth time this season that the bench as a whole has



reached double figures and is averaging 9.6 points per game this season.

Running the Point

Brittney Patrick currently leads the Valley, and ranks 17th nationally, in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.72). Patrick's 4.9 assists per game also leads the MVC while she also leads the league in total assists (79). SIU has only once had a player lead the league in assists per game (Cartaesha Macklin, 2013) and Patrick's 2.72 assist-to-turnover ratio would be a school record.

Closing in on 500

Abby Brockmeyer enters the weekend just nine points shy of 500 for her career. When she reaches the 500-point milestone, Brockmeyer will become the 16th Saluki with at least 500 career points/300 rebounds/50 assists/50 blocks. Brockmeyer is currently top-5 in the league in double-doubles (2nd, 7), blocks per game (5th, 1.13) and rebounds per game (2nd, 8.5).

VALPARAISO (5-12, 1-4 MVC)

A Major Margin

Valpo's victory over Evansville on Sunday afternoon featured a 44-point gap between the two teams (93-49). It was the largest margin of victory by a Missouri Valley Conference team against a Division-I opponent this season. The only more lopsided win for a Valley



squad this year was Drake's 48-point triumph over Clarke (NAIA) on Dec. 4. In addition, it was Valpo's largest margin of victory in nine years – an 80-28 win over Youngstown State on Feb. 13, 2010.

Sharp Shooting

Valpo shot 58.3 percent in the win over the Purple Aces, the team's best clip since Dec. 15, 2017 vs. IU Northwest (.590) and best against a D-I opponent since March 8, 2014 vs. Wright State (.596). Sunday's showing cracked the Top 10 in program history for single-game field goal percentage, ranking 10th all-time.

Ella's Emergence

Ella Ellenson had quite a weekend as Valpo hosted instate rivals Indiana State and Evansville. The sophomore tied a career high with 15 points against the Sycamores before pouring in 16 against the Purple Aces. She has reached double figures in three straight games after doing so once over the first 14 games of the year and three times in 30 games played last season. Ellenson has had five rebounds or more in eight of her last nine games after pulling down five boards just once over the first eight games of the year.
