MVC Player of the Week

Sara Rhine, Jr., F, Drake

Sara Rhine helped Drake win road games at Indiana State and Evansville this past weekend. Rhine averaged 19.5 points, 8.5 rebounds, 1.0 assist and 1.0 steal per game while shooting a blistering 71.4 percent (15-of-21) from the floor. She scored a game-high 19 points, including knocking down the winning free throws in the 70-68 comeback win over the Sycamores. She added six rebounds, two assists and two steals in 30 minutes. Rhine

followed that great performance with her seventh double-double of the season in the victory over the Purple Aces. She scored 20 points on 8-of-11 shooting and added a game-high 11 rebounds in just 20 minutes.

MVC Newcomer of the Week

Lasha Petree, Fr., G, Bradley

Petree came off the bench to score a team-high 21 points in 17 minutes of action as she helped power Bradley to a 79-68 road win at rival Illinois State. She scored 16 of her team-best 21 points in the second half to help the Braves pull away down the stretch. Petree was 8-for-14 from the field, including 4-of-6 from three-point range and also tallied four rebounds, one assist, one block and one steal to help Bradley improve to 3-0 on the

road in MVC play for just the third time in program history. She had a personal 7-0 run late in the third quarter to help the Braves push a one-point lead to eight and scored nine points in the fourth quarter.

NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Janae Gonzales (LUC) - Loyola freshman Janae Gonzales averaged 18.0 points and shot nearly 53 percent (9-of-17) from beyond the three-point arc in a pair of road contests for the Maroon & Gold this past weekend. After chipping in six points in Friday's setback at Missouri State, Gonzales erupted for a career-high 30 points in Sunday's clash with Southern Illinois. The Tolleson, Ariz. product connected on eight of her 13 attempts from distance, finishing just one triple shy offormer Rambler great Maggie McCloskey's single-game school record of nine made threes in a game. Since the start of Valley play, Gonzales, who is operating at a 40 percent (42-of-104) clip from three-point land this season, has knocked down a league-best 3.4 three-point field goals per game.

Sydney Manning (MSU) - Sydney Manning led the Lady Bears in scoring in both games last week, averaging 13 points on 56 percent shooting, including 7-for-12 from beyond the arc. She added 3.5 rebounds per game, two steals and an assist, all in just 34 total minutes. Manning caught fire in Friday's win against Loyola, knocking down three 3-pointers and adding a conventional 3-point play in just three and a half minutes during the second quarter for a game-high 12 points on 4-of-9 shooting. Sunday, Manning went 4-for-6 from long range, tallying a career-high 14 points to go with three rebounds and two steals.

Karli Rucker (UNI) - Karli shot .588 from the field and .800 from the three-point line to lead UNI to a pair of MVC road wins. She scored 10 points and added four assists and two steals in the win against Evansville. She tallied 14 points, three assists and three steals in the win against Indiana State. She shot 4-7 from the field against Evansville and 6-10 against Indiana State. She averaged 4.0 rebounds in the two games as well.

Nicole Martin (SIU) - Southern Illinois junior Nicole Martin averaged 17.5 points on 57.1% (12-for-21) shooting from the field, 7.5 rebounds and 2.0 assists in SIU's two home wins over the weekend. The Jefferson City, Mo. native stuffed the stat sheet in Friday night's win over Valparaiso, as she finished with 16 points, five boards, three assists, a block and a steal in 29 minutes of play. She followed with her fourth double-double of the season, and seventh of her career, in SIU's win over Loyola on Sunday. The Preseason All-MVC selection poured in a team-high 18 points on 8-of-14 shooting to go along with 10 rebounds and an assist to help Southern improve to 8-1 at home on the year. It marked the third-straight game, and 14th time this season, that Martin has reached double figures.

Addison Stoller (VALPO) - Stoller upped her career highs in both scoring (22) and rebounding (11) on Jan. 25 at Southern Illinois, compiling her second career double-double in the process. She became the first Valpo player with multiple double-doubles this season and the first Valpo player to score 20 or more points and pull down 10 or more rebounds in the same game since Dani Franklin on Dec. 10, 2017 against Chicago State. Stoller turned in Valpo's first 20&10 game in conference play as a member of the MVC. She followed that by reaching double figures for the 11th time this season despite playing only 18 minutes on Jan. 27 at Missouri State, scoring 12 points in that game against the league's co-leader.

Monica Burich (DU) - Monica Burich scored nine points and pulled down a season-high 11 rebounds, including a career-best eight offensive rebounds, in the win over Evansville. For the second time in the past three games, she just missed recording a double-double.

Makayla Wallace (UE) - Freshman Makayla Wallace put together a pair of impressive performances. Facing UNI on Friday evening, Wallace finished in double-figures, scoring 10 points, while getting to the free-throw line nine times, adding two rebounds, two assists, and two steals. On Sunday afternoon. against Drake, Wallace led the Aces with 12 points and a career-high eight rebounds, along with two assists and one steal. Since beginning conference play, Wallace has scored double-digits six times, including six of the last seven games, after recording a double-figure scoring performance just once during non-conference play. Wallace leads Evansville in assists (2.3 per game), steals (2.2 per game), free-throws made (54), and free-throws attempted (87).

Daijah Smith (INS) - True freshman Daijah Smith recorded a career-high 14 points against Drake and shot 47% from the field over the week as Indiana State nearly upset the Bulldogs and ended the league's longest conference winning streak. Smith shot 50% from the 3-point line, was 5-for-7 from the free throw line and averaged 12.0 points per game on the weekend. The Sycamores led Drake for 27 minutes and Drake didn't hold a second half lead until 4 seconds remained in the game as Smith was 4 of 8 from the field against the Bulldogs as part of an 8 of 17 performance from the field for the week.

Cynthia Wolf (UNI) - Wolf scored seven points against Evansville and five against Indianan State. She also averaged 3.5 rebounds.

Payton McCallister (SIU) - Payton McCallister averaged 5.0 points, 1.5 rebounds and 1.5 assists in just over 8.5 minutes of work in SIU's two home wins over the weekend. McCallister dished out two assists and notched her second career block in the win over Valparaiso Friday night. On Sunday, McCallister was one of four Salukis to reach double figures in a 74-63 win over Loyola, as she went for 10 points on 2-of-3 shooting from behind the arc and was a perfect 4-for-4 from the free throw line. The Columbia, Mo. native also added three boards and an assist in the win. It was the fourth time this season that the freshman guard has scored in double figures and the first time she has done so since SIU's win over Hartford on Nov. 23, 2018.

Shay Frederick (VALPO) - Frederick averaged 12.5 points per game on the Carbondale/Springfield swing this weekend. The freshman point guard made a career-high six field goals at MVC co-leader Missouri State on Jan. 27, swishing four triples for the third time this season. She finished that game with 17 points, two shy of a career high, after turning in eight on Friday at Southern Illinois including a pair of 3s.

Historic Start

For just the third time in Valley history, a pair of teams have started the league slate with a 7-0 mark. Following two wins over the weekend, Drake and Missouri State improved to a league-best 7-0 in MVC play. Missouri State's wins over Loyola and Valparaiso gave the Lady Bears their best MVC start since the 2003-04 season (started 11-0). Drake's wins over Indiana State and Evansville gave the Bulldogs their third-straight 7-0 start in league play.

Battle Royale

For just the third time in Valley history, a pair of teams with at least a 7-0 record will meet as Missouri State travels to Drake for a 7PM matchup Friday. The only other league meetings between two 8-0 teams are listed below with both involving Drake.

Friday's showdown in Des Moines between Drake and Missouri State will feature two of the top five all-time coaching win percentages in MVC contests.

Drake's Jennie Baranczyk sits tied for third in Valley history in career winning percentage in league games. Baranczyk sits with a career record of 86-29 (.748) in league contests. Missouri State's Kellie Harper sits fifth on the chart with a career mark of 69-28 (.711).

Leading the Pack

Drake's Sara Rhine and Becca Hittner currently rank as the top two scorers in The Valley, ranking No. 1 and No. 2 respectively. Rhine is averaging 19.3 points per game, while Hittner is averaging 18.2 a contest. Only one time in the league's history has a teammate tandem finished the season ranking No. 1 and 2 as Drake's Wanda Ford (24.2 ppg) and Julie Fitzpatrick (23.1 ppg) led the way during the 1984-85 season.

Valley Streak

Drake has the longest win streak in the history of the Gateway/MVC for regular season contests, winning 47-straight. The impressive streak started Feb. 26, 2016 with a win over Loyola. The Bulldogs broke SIU's 37 game streak from 1985-1987 during the Gateway era with a win over Illinois State last season. The streak is the second longest active streak against conference opponents, trailing only UConn's streak in the American.

Home Court Streaks

Drake currently holds the longest active home winning streak in Valley games at 24. The streak is tied for the third longest in Valley history with Illinois State. Missouri State holds the record with 66-straight MVC home wins from 1989-1997.

Power Five Ahead

Drake finished the non-conference schedule with three Power Five wins on its resume as the Bulldogs beat South Carolina, Rutgers and Nebraska. The conference finished 3-13 against Power Five opponents with all but one of the games taking place on the road or a neutral court.

Vs. Top 25

Last season, the MVC went 0-9 against Top 25 opponents, breaking a streak of three-straight years with at least one win over a Top 25 team. Drake earned a 90-85 overtime win over No. 12/13 South Carolina in Vancouver in November. It was the highest ranked win over an opponent in the regular season by a Valley team since Missouri State beat No. 10 LSU on November 24, 2000. The league finished 1-8 vs. the Top 25 this year.

Against the Field

The MVC held a winning record against 10 leagues in non-conference play, including the America East (1-0), Big West (2-1), Colonial (2-0), Conference USA (4-3), Horizon (9-5), NEC (1-0), Ohio Valley (11-8), Summitt (9-5), Sun Belt (1-0) and WAC (6-1). The MVC holds at least a .500 mark against the Atlantic 10 (2-2) and the SEC (1-1). The league finished above .500 in non-conference play for the first time since 2012-13 (59-55) and registered 60 nonleague wins for the first time since 2010-11 (62-49).

Strength of Schedule

Drake, Missouri State and UNI tested themselves with a difficult non-conference schedule this season. According to WarrenNolan.com, the Bulldogs played the third toughest non-conference strength of schedule this season, while the Lady Bears' non-league schedule ranks 50th and Panthers 64th nationally.

What's the Difference?

Over the past 20 seasons (since 1999-2000), 11 MVC teams have registered a scoring margin of +12 or better for a season. Drake currently has a +12.5 scoring margin, which is the 11th best among any team in that span. Last year the Bulldogs finished with a +15.0 ppg margin. This would be the fourth-straight season with a scoring margin of +12 for the Bulldogs.

Sharp Shooters

A year after seeing Evansville lead the nation in free-throw percentage (82.0%), The Valley has two of the nation's top five teams in the category so far this season. UNI currently leads the league and sits 2nd nationally, while Loyola sits 9th.

Loyola's Abby O'Connor leads The Valley and ranks No. 6 nationally hitting 92.2% of her attempts. In 2012-13, UNI's Jacqui Kalin set the MVC record with a percentage of 95.5% for a season.

The RPI Ratings Game

"So You Want to Be A Coach"

Valparaiso senior Meredith Hamlet and Drake senior Becca Jonas were named participants in the 2019 "So You Want to be a Coach" program, hosted by the WBCA. This marks the 17th annual "So You Want to be a Coach" program as each member will participate in a three-day workshop with speakers provided by the WeCOACH on April 3-5 in conjunction with the WBCA Convention in Tampa, Florida.

Pounding the Glass

Bradley's Chelsea Brackmann tallied just the third 20-20 performance in school history in a win over UNI. Brackmann, who scored a season-best 22 points, tied the Bradley single-game record with 24 rebounds. Brackmann's 24 boards are the second most in the country this season and tied for the fifth most in MVC history. No MVC player has collected 24 rebounds in a game since 2009 and she had the first 20-20 effort in a conference game dating back to a 26-point, 21-rebound performance by Dyana Pierre (SIU) vs. Northern Iowa on Feb. 8, 2015.

Rhine on McClain Watch List

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA announced that Drake junior Sara Rhine is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2019 Katrina McClain Award. Named after the two-time All-American and 1987 National Player of the Year, the annual award in its second year recognizes the top power forwards in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2019 Katrina McClain Award will be narrowed to just 10.

Senior CLASS Award Candidate

Drake's Sammie Bachrodt has been named a candidate for the 2018-19 Senior CLASS Award. Bachrodt is among 30 NCAA Division I candidates in women's basketball for the award which recognizes notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition.

The league has had nine different regular-season champions in the past 12 seasons (SIU-2007, DU/ UE/ILS-2008, ILS-2009, ILS-2010, UNI-2011; MSU-2012; WSU/CU-2013; INS/WSU-2014; WSU-2015; UNI-2016; DU-2017; DU-2018). Bradley, Loyola and Valparaiso are the only league teams not to have won a regular-season MVC championship.

Mid-Major Top-25 Poll

Drake continues to sit towards the top of the latest (Jan. 22) CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 poll coming in at No. 2. The Bulldogs received 14 first place votes and sit just behind first place Gonzaga who is receiving 16 first place votes. Missouri State is receiving votes in the poll.

Two Sport Athlete

Lexi Wallen joined the team following a four-year volleyball career at Illinois State. The senior forward has made an immediate impact on the team, averaging 6.0 points and 3.7 rebounds per game during conference play. She is one of five reported athletes to be currently competing in both volleyball and basketball at the division 1 level. Two of the five are Valley athletes. Katherine Carlson of Valparaiso also recently joined the basketball team after a volleyball career.

Postseason League

The MVC has seen an average of four league teams participate in postseason play in the last 20 seasons, including three teams reaching postseason play in 2017-18. Drake fell at Texas A&M in the NCAA Tournament, while Missouri State and UNI each received bids into the WNIT. The Valley has earned multiple NCAA Tournament bids in 11 different seasons, including a pair of bids in the 2017 NCAA Tournament (Drake and UNI).

Hoops In the Heartland

The 2019 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxSlayer Center in Moline, III., for the fourth-straight season.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event (Mar. 14-17) will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

The MVC extended an agreement with the Quad Cities Convention & Visitors Bureau to conduct the MVC Women's Basketball Championship in TaxSlayer Center through at least 2021.


The 2019 tournament will mark the 12th-consecutive season in its 37-year history that the event will take place at a neutral site.

The Missouri Valley Conference is one of only seven conferences (out of 32 nationally) where the women's basketball tournament is played at a neutral site, separate from the men's championship (AAC, ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, MVC, Pac-12 and SEC are the others).

Getting Better

Saturday's 79-68 victory at I-74 rival Illinois State gave Bradley 14 victories on the year, surpassing the team's overall win total from 2017-18. In addition to marking the most wins since closing the 2012-13 campaign with a 14-16 record, the Braves have now improved their



win total in four consecutive seasons to mark the first time in program history with four straight seasons with an improved record. Head Coach Andrea Gorski is the first coach in program history to lead Bradley to an improved win total in each of their first three seasons on the BU bench. The 14-4 record through 18 games is the best by the Braves since starting the 1981-82 season 17-4 and marks just the third 14-4 start to a season in program history (1980-81 - 14-4).

Streaking

Sophomore Gabi Haack scored 13 points at Illinois State to push her streak of consecutive games in double figures to 16. The MVC leader in three-point makes, Haack has hit at least one three-pointer in 12 consecutive contests. She is the first Bradley to have 10+ points in 16 straight games since Sara Bailey in 2000-01 and her streak is tied for the seventh longest in school history. The last Brave with a streak longer than 16 games scoring in double figures was Carrie Coffman with 28 straight 10+-point efforts between the 1993-94 and 1994-95 seasons. Haack's career-best streak of 12 consecutive games with a three-pointer is tied for the ninth longest in program history. She is just the third player in program history to connect on 50 three-pointers and make at least 80 free throws in a season. In fact, she is one of just five players in the nation to collect 50 three's and 80 made free throws through games of Jan. 27.

Later the teams played in the semifinals of the MVC Tournament and Drake rallied from a 12-point deficit early in the second quarter to advance to the championship game.

Freshman Janae Gonzales scorched the nets from distance this past weekend, operating at a 53 percent (9-of-17) clip from beyond the three-point arc. Gonzales connected on eight threes in Sunday's matchup with Southern Illinois, the most in a single game by a Ram-



bler since 2010, as part of a 30-point performance. The Tolleson, Ariz. native currently ranks second in The Valley in three-point field goals made per game (2.5) and sits fourth in three-point field goal percentage (40.4%).

The 30s Are Wild

As noted above, Janae Gonzales enjoyed a career day this past Sunday against the Salukis, scoring a season-high 30 points. Gonzales is the second Rambler to reach the 30-point plateau this season, joining Abby O'Connor, who turned in a 31-point effort against city-rival DePaul back on December 20, 2018. O'Connor and Gonzales are the first two Ramblers to score at least 30 points in the same season since Taylor Johnson (31 points vs. Western Illinois) and Troy Hambric (30 points vs. Indiana State) accomplished the feat during the 2013-14 campaign.

Sweet Home Chicago

Loyola opens up a season-long four-game homestand this coming weekend as it welcomes in-state rivals Illinois State (February 1) and Bradley (February 3) to Gentile Arena. The Ramblers have already racked up seven victories at home, their most since 2015-16, and are 3-0 in the Windy City since the start of Missouri Valley Conference play.

MISSOURI STATE (11-7, 7-0 MVC)

Perfect January

Missouri State finished off the month of January with a 7-0 record, the Lady Bears' first unbeaten month since February 2012. MSU also went 7-0 on that occasion in the midst of an 11-game win streak that secured the program's most recent MVC regular season title.



Win Streak Continues

The Lady Bears kept their winning streaks intact with a pair of home victories, extending them to 10 consecutive wins overall, 14 in the MVC, and 13 in MVC home games. The team's current overall streak ties the longest under Kellie Harper (Feb. 13-March 14, 2015), and represents the 14th double-digit streak in school history. The Valley streak ranks third at MSU, and the 13 straight Valley home wins tie for fourth on that list.

Offensive Weekend

Missouri State averaged 96 points in two games last week, getting exceptional offensive balance with 13 different players tallying at least six points and no player averaging more than 13 points per game. Sunday's 108-point performance against Valpo represented a number of notable marks, including: Fourth-most points in MSU history and most since 1998; Most point ever for MSU in an MVC game; Fifth-highest scoring total for any league team in an MVC game; 41 field goals are the fifth-most in school history; .641 field goal percentage is the 10th-best in school history.

Tossing Up Triples

Valpo fired off a season-high 40 3-pointers on Sunday at Missouri State, setting the JQH Arena record for attempted 3s in a game. In addition, that total ranks second in program history behind only 41 attempts on Feb. 27, 1992 vs. Wright State and set the record for



3-point attempts in a road game. This year's team already owns three of the top four single-game 3-point attempt totals in program history. Before this season, Valpo had attempted more than 36 3s in a game just once all-time. The team has done so three times this year (vs. Bowling Green, at Drake, at Missouri State).

Joining Top 10s

The latest achievement in the storied career of Valpo senior guard Meredith Hamlet occurred on Jan. 25 at Southern Illinois as Hamlet moved into the Top 10 in program history in career scoring. She enters Friday's game against Bradley with 1,202 career points after recently passing Aimee Forsman (1988-1992), who was previously 10th. The career scoring list wasn't the only Top 10 Hamlet joined with her performances this past weekend, as she also moved into the Top 10 in the MVC in scoring average at 13.3 points per game.

Home Sweet Home

Valpo will begin a four-game homestand on Friday against Bradley, a much needed break from travel after starting the conference slate with five of the first seven away from the ARC. This begins Valpo's longest homestand of the season and marks the first time the team has played four in a row at home since Nov. 21 through Dec. 3, 2016. Valpo hasn't had four consecutive conference home games since the 2015-16 season.
