MVC Player of the Week

Heather Kocken, Sr., RS, Loyola

Kocken had a big week, officially putting a rough four-match stretch in which she managed just 12 total kills and hit -.033 (12-14-60 behind her. The redshirt senior right side delivered 3.14 kills and 1.43 blocks per set, while hitting a hearty .455 (22-2-44) last week in wins against Southern Illinois and Missouri State that extended Loyola's win streak to six matches and gave it sole possession of first place. In a 3-1 win versus SIU October 11, Kocken registered 15 kills, her most since September 20, and added seven blocks, which equaled a season high, hitting .452 (15-1-31). She then went for seven kills and three blocks in a sweep of Missouri State that gave Loyola its best start to conference play since 2001

MVC Defensive Player of the Week

Emma Raleigh, Jr., L, Bradley

Raleigh helped anchor a Bradley defense which averaged 26.62 digs per set in two road matches, by averaging an impressive 8.75 digs per set. She also served up six aces (0.75 per set) and averaged 1.38 assists per set for the week. Raleigh tied for match-high honors with 22 digs in addition to tallying eight assists and two aces in Friday's four-set match at UNI before a record setting performance in Saturday's four-set win at Drake. She tallied a MVC record 48 digs in the victory against the Bulldogs to break the previous record of 46 digs by Cara Hackmann (Missouri State vs. Evansville) on Oct. 10, 2009, helping Bradley post the best dig total (126) in the country this season. Raleigh's 48 digs were the most at the NCAA Division I level since 2016 and highest dig total in the country in a four-set match since 2008. Raleigh also served up a career-best four aces in the victory over Drake. She has taken over as Bradley's libero for the last seven matches, averaging 5.69 digs per set during that stretch and is fourth in the MVC at 5.85 digs per set in league action.

MVC Freshman of the Week

Emmy Ogogor, Fr., MB, Illinois State

Emmy Ogogor turned in the second-best hitting percentage this weekend for the Redbirds, as Illinois State swept Drake and handed UNI its first conference loss of the season. The rookie combined for 16 kills – matching a career-high 13 kills against the Panthers – behind .343 hitting to average 2.00 kills per set. Ogogor had a trio of kills and blocks against the Bulldogs on Friday night, before kicking it up a notch on Saturday. The San Antonio, Texas, native registered her second double-digit kill performance of the season and turned in the fourth highest hitting percentage by a Redbird this season – hitting at a team-high .458 clip. She went without an error until the fifth set against the Panthers, finishing with just a pair in 24 attempts.

NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's player and freshman of the week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Hannah Thompson (BRAD) - Thompson pushed her streak of consecutive double-doubles to 15, averaging 3.88 kills and 6.75 digs per set in a pair of road matches. She opened the weekend road swing with match highs of 15 kills and 22 digs in a four-set contest against then league-leading Northern Iowa. Thompson followed up that performance with 16 kills and a career-best 32 digs to help the Braves pull out a thrilling four-set win at Drake. Her career-best 32 digs were the most in the MVC by a player other than a libero this season and most by a non-libero in the MVC dating back to a 32-dig performance by Missouri State's Lily Johnson at Drake on Oct. 13, 2017. In addition, Thompson had the highest dig total by a Bradley outside hitter since 2005. Thompson moved into a tie for 10th in Bradley history with her 35th career double-double in addition to becoming just the fifth player in program history to reach 600 career kills as a sophomore.

Emily Plock (DU) - Led Drake on the week with 44 kills in seven sets to average 6.29 kills per set ... also had 20 total digs to average a double-double in the Bulldogs' two matches ... had a career-high 28 kills in the four-set match against Bradley, to better her previous best by seven ... also had 88 total attempts, double her previous high in a four-set match ... also recorded a career-high 14 digs against Bradley ... opened the week with 16 kills in three sets against Illinois State ... has had double-figure kills in five-straight matches now with two double-doubles in that span.

Gabriela Macedo (UE) - In Evansville's match at Indiana State, senior Gabriela Macedo reset the program record with 43 digs over four sets of work. She also added four assists in the contest. Earlier this season, Macedo earned the Evansville record with 41 digs against Eastern Illinois before resetting the record on Friday. Her tally tied her for the 4th-highest tally in Missouri Valley Conference history.

Sydney Holt (ILS) - Sydney Holt combined for a team-leading .353 hitting percentage this weekend in a pair of wins over Drake and UNI. The junior matched a career-high 16 kills in ISU's five-set victory over the Panthers, handing UNI its first conference loss of the season. Holt turned in a .324 average - the second-best average for the Redbirds - and finished with a team-leading six blocks, falling just one shy of matching her career high in the category. Her 16 kills in ISU's win against UNI marked her third double-digit kill performance of MVC play and 10th of the season. On Friday night, Holt hit over .400 for the fourth time this season, turning in a .412 average with eight kills. She finished the weekend averaging 1.50 digs per set and a team-leading 1.38 blocks per set.

Melina Tedrow (INS) - Melina Tedrow was dominant in the defensive facet of Friday's Homecoming match against Evansville. Tedrow, the libero for the Sycamores, set a single-game record for the blue and white for most digs in a game, tallying 44 during the match to go along with six assists, overtaking Kelly Spisak's previous record of 41 against Creighton in 2004. Not only does Tedrow own the school record for ISU, her total is tied for fourth in the history of the Valley and currently is second-best in the NCAA.

Karlie Taylor (UNI) - Karlie Taylor totaled 37 kills, 37 digs, 5 block assists, and 4 assists while going 1-1 against MVC opponents over the weekend. Taylor helped the Panthers to a 3-1 victory of Bradley by recording a team-high 14 kills. Taylor also led the Panthers in digs with 19 and added 2 block assists. The following night the Panthers and Redbirds fought for five sets with the Redbirds coming out on top. Taylor tallied 23 kills with 18 digs and 3 block assists for a match-high 25.5 total points.

Savannah Sheridan (SIU) - Sheridan averaged a team-best 2.71 kills per set for the Salukis in a pair of road conference matches. The junior transfer put down 15 kills against first-place Loyola on Friday, which marked the 10th time this season she has put down double-digit kills.

Peyton McCarthy (VALPO) - McCarthy led Valpo offensively in both matches as it rolled to a pair of sweeps last weekend. The junior led all players with 11 kills on Friday in a 3-0 win over Missouri State, adding three blocks. She then had the most efficient offensive performance of her career in a 3-0 win over SIU, racking up 12 kills on just 19 swings without committing an error. Her .632 hitting percentage was a career best and a Valpo season best, as well as the second-best effort in MVC play to date this season. McCarthy also chipped in three blocks and a pair of service aces as Valpo rolled to the win over the Salukis.

Kylee Macke (DU) - Had a career-high 34 digs in the four-set match against Bradley to help the Bulldogs to 117 digs, the fourth-highest total in school history ... opened the weekend with a team-high 15 digs against Illinois State ... her 49 total digs on the week gave her a staggering 7.0 digs per set average ... against Bradley, she recorded 12 digs in each of the first two sets ... now has 1,450 career digs ... also added five assists in the two matches.

Kaity Weimerskirch (ILS) - Kaity Weimerskirch returned to the court this weekend as the Redbirds' starting libero and averaged 5.75 digs per set, as Illinois State picked up a pair of wins in Iowa over Drake and UNI. The freshman paced the Redbird defense in both matches, as the Bulldogs and the Panthers combined for a .146 hitting percentage on the weekend against ISU. In Friday night's match at Drake, Weimerskirch collected 22 digs and helped hold the Bulldogs to a .085 hitting percentage. On Saturday, the Brooklyn Park, Minnesota, native recorded a weekend-high 24 digs and anchored ISU's defense that held the Panthers to a .180 hitting percentage - UNI's lowest of the conference slate. Weimerskirch also added nine assists, including a season-high seven assists at UNI, and three service aces.

Maddy Moser (LUC) - Last week, Moser recorded 5.00 digs per set to help Loyola collect a pair of wins and extend its win streak to six matches. The redshirt senior libero totaled 22 digs and a season-high eight assists in a four-set win against Southern Illinois, then picked up 13 digs, four assists and an ace in a clean sweep of Missouri State. Moser, who missed all last season with a knee injury, now ranks fourth in Loyola annals with 1,447 career digs. For the season, Moser is averaging 5.21 digs and 0.31 aces per set.

Alayna Martin (SIU) - Martin averaged 1.14 kills, 5.14 assists and 2.86 digs per set for the Salukis over the weekend. The senior six-rotation player tallied her 15th assist-dig double-double of the season at Valparaiso on Saturday and finished with six kills, 18 assists, 12 digs and two aces. She also became just the 12th player in program history to reach the 2,000 career assist plateau.

Rylee Cookerly (VALPO) - Cookerly led Valpo's back-row effort as the Crusaders limited both their opponents last weekend to under .100 hitting in a pair of sweeps. The junior led all players in digs in both matches, tallying 19 digs in the win over Missouri State and 21 in the sweep of Southern Illinois. The nation's active leader in digs among juniors, Cookerly has surpassed the 20-dig mark in three of Valpo's last four matches and is up to an even 5.00 digs/set for the season, including 5.65/set within MVC play.

Carlee Camlin (BRAD) - Camlin averaged a team-best 6.75 assists per set and also collected 1.88 digs per set as she helped Bradley split a pair of MVC road matches last week. Friday at then league-leading UNI, Camlin collected 19 assists, six digs and an ace in a four-set contest, splitting time at setter with sophomore Hailey Delacher. In Saturday's win at Drake, she had a match and season-high 35 assists to go with nine digs as the Braves collected the second-highest team dig total in the nation this season (126) in the victory to help Bradley hold onto a share of third in the MVC standings.

Maddy Baxter (DU) - Recorded a career-high 16 digs in the four-set loss to Bradley and finished the week with 18 total digs to average 2.57 digs per set ... also had three aces in three sets against Illinois State to tie for the most aces by a Bulldog this season.

Kylie Newby (INS) - Kylie Newby helped Indiana State control the net on Friday against Evansville. The middle blocker led the Sycamores in the blocking category with one solo block to go along with four block assists, both of which were match-highs. Newby was also strong on offensive, ending her evening with 10 kills while hitting .429.

Addie Barnes (LUC) - In two outings last week, both Rambler victories that pushed the team into sole possession of first place in the Valley race, Barnes accounted for 3.00 kills, 3.57 digs and 0.71 service aces per set. The freshman outside hitter leads the team with nine double-doubles this fall and has notched at least 10 kills and 10 digs in each of Loyola's last three contests. She went for 11 kills, 13 digs and three aces in a four-set victory versus Southern Illinois October 11 before coming back to rack up a team-best 10 kills, 12 digs and a pair of aces in a sweep of Missouri State. Barnes leads the club with 214 total kills on the year and is attempting to become the first freshman to lead Loyola in that category since Morgan Reardon in 2013 (213).

Brooklyn Cink (MSU) - Brooklyn Cink continued the solid start to her career last week, averaging two kills per set and hitting .241 at Valpo and Loyola. Cink had five kills in each match, hitting .364 against the Ramblers, and added two blocks and a dig Friday at Valpo. She committed just three attack errors in 29 total attempts.

Kaylissa Arndorfer (UNI) - Kaylissa Arndorfer totaled 22 kills and 4 block assists in two MVC matches over the weekend. While only totaling 4 kills against Bradley, Arndorfer finished with 18 kills and a .395 hitting percentage in five sets against the Redbirds of Illinois State. Arndorfer also added 4 block assists against to finish with 21 points against the MVC rival.

Abi Fitzpatrick (SIU) - Fitzpatrick averaged a team-best 4.14 digs and .28 aces per set for the Salukis over the weekend. The freshman defensive specialist tallied a career-high 19 digs and added an ace against first-place Loyola and followed with 10 digs and an ace at Valparaiso. In doing so, she became the first Saluki freshman since 2017 to reach the century mark in total digs.

Alone at the Top

Loyola remains unbeaten in MVC action after another perfect week of league play, sitting at 6-0. The first-place Ramblers are off to their best start ever in Missouri Valley Conference play and their best start in league action since commencing the 2001 Horizon League campaign with a 7-0 ledger. The Ramblers are approaching a pivotal three-match stretch versus second place UNI and third place Illinois State and Bradley.

Mastering McLeod

Illinois State's 3-2 victory at UNI on Saturday night was the first for the program since 2016 and gave the host Panthers their first MVC defeat of the season. Illinois State has only won 10 matches all-time on the road against UNI, dating back to 1983. Additionally, the last four wins against the Panthers for the Redbirds have all been five-set victories.

Deja Vu for Bradley

Bradley is currently tied with rival Illinois State for third in the Missouri Valley Conference standings at 4-2. The Braves are in a similar position to last year's historic 2018 campaign in which Bradley started league play 4-2. Bradley has had back-to-back 4-2 starts to Valley play for the first time since 2003 (4-2) and 2002 (6-0).

Record Setters

The Valley saw three of the top single match dig totals in the nation over the weekend, including a new league-best mark.

Bradley junior Emma Raleigh tallied a MVC single-match record 48 digs in a win over Drake. Raleigh broke the previous MVC match dig record of 46 set by Missouri State's Cara Hackmann vs. Evansville on Oct. 10, 2009. Raleigh's 48 digs were the most in the nation since 2016 and highest dig total in a four-set match in the country dating back to 2008.

Evansville's Gabriela Macedo recorded a program record 43 digs on Friday against Indiana State. It broke her own program mark of 41, which was set in September against Eastern Illinois. In the same match, Indiana State's Melina Tedrow earned a school record 44 digs. Tedrow and Macedo are No. 2 and 3 behind Raleigh on the national single match leader board.

NCAA RPI Report

The newest edition of the NCAA RPI report for the 2019 season has been released and the Valley has three teams featured in the top-100. UNI leads the league at No. 61, while Illinois State (No. 95) and Loyola (No. 96) are also among the nation's top-100. Three other teams rank in the Top 175 (Bradley, Valpo and Evansville).

Tough to Kill

Six of the 10 MVC programs currently rank Top 25 nationally in digs per set, including three in the top 10. Bradley leads the nation with 19.94 digs per set, while Indiana State ranks 4th (18.40). Evansville (9th, 17.66), UNI (14th, 17.49), Southern Illinois (19th, 17.31) and Valparaiso (21st, 17.10) round out the teams ranking in the Top 25 nationally.

ATTACK!

The Valley is also heavily representing in team attacks per set among NCAA leaders, occupying five of the top 10 slots. Bradley leads the nation in team attacks per set with 40.75, while Valparaiso sits second nationally (39.92). Evansville currently sits third (39.76), while UNI ranks 5th (39.24) and Indiana State 10th (38.48) nationally.

Double-Double Leaders

10 different league players have posted nine or more double-doubles this season. Bradley's Hannah Thompson pushed her streak of consecutive double-doubles to 15 (school record) with a pair over the weekend. Southern Illinois' Alayna Martin and Rachel Maguire are tied with Thompson for The Valley lead with 15 double-doubles this season.

Triple Doubles Galore

SIU's Rachel Maguire leads the nation in triple-doubles with nine. She recorded her ninth triple-double of the season in SIU's four-set win over Drake on Oct. 4. Maguire's nine triple-doubles are not only the most by a Missouri Valley Conference player since at least 2015, but are the third-most in a single-season in the NCAA over at least the past five seasons.

Power Wins

The Valley has three wins over Power Five programs this season, including three more against the American and Big East. Illinois State has wins over Illinois, UCF and Tulsa, while Loyola has added wins over North-western and DePaul. Missouri State has the league's third Power Five win, beating Kansas State in five sets.

Scheduled Tough

Seven of UNI's eight losses in non-conference play were to Top 35 RPI teams (Texas, Kentucky, Creighton, Marquette, Missouri, Iowa State and USC), including five in the Top 20. The Panthers were only swept in one of those matches (Kentucky). UNI's non-conference strength of schedule is ranked 23rd nationally.

Against 2018 NCAA Field

The Valley has won five matches against 2018 NCAA Tournament teams. UNI and Illinois State lead the conference with a pair of wins over participants in the 2018 NCAA tourney. The Panthers have wins over Green Bay and Texas State, while the Redbirds beat Illinois and UCF. Southern Illinois has the leagues fifth win, beating Alabama State.

Non-Con This Decade

Since 2010, the Valley has posted a record above .500 in non-conference play every year except 2014 (.55-.57) and 2017 (.61-.66). The MVC finished non-league play with a .57-.69(.452) mark in 2019.

Against the Field

The MVC holds a winning record against nine leagues in non-conference play (Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big West, MEAC, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Summit, Sun Belt & SWAC), and at least a .500 record against another five (Big Ten, Conference USA, Mountain West, Southern & WAC).

POSTSEASON SUCCESS

For the 15th time in league history, at least two Valley volleyball teams were selected as part of the field of 64 in 2018. It was the 11th time in the last 13 years that the MVC has placed multiple teams into the NCAA tourney.

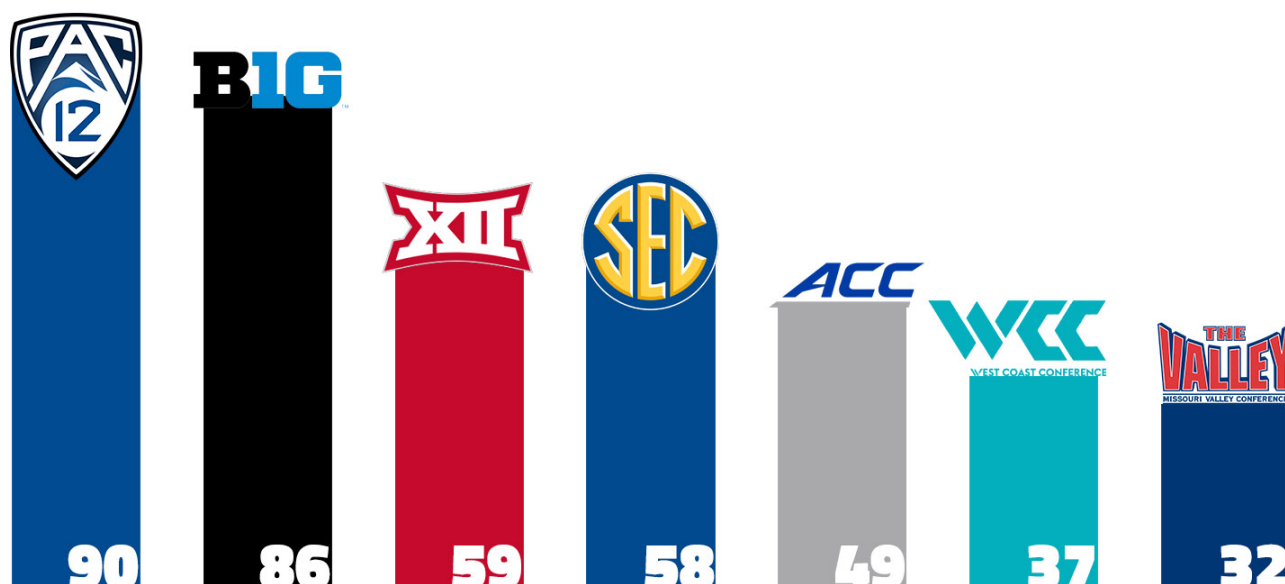

Can You Dig It?

Bradley leads the nation in digs per set, now averaging 19.94 digs per set after collecting 126 digs in Saturday's four-set win at Drake. Junior Emma Raleigh helped anchor BU's defensive efforts with a Missouri Valley Conference single-match record 48 digs. Raleigh, who has taken over as the team's libero and averaged 5.69 digs per set in that role, broke the previous MVC match dig record of 46 set by Missouri State's Cara Hackmann vs. Evansville on Oct. 10, 2009. In fact, Raleigh's 48 digs were the most in the nation since 2016 and highest dig total in a four-set match in the country dating back to 2008.



Defensive Struggle

Saturday's match between Bradley and Drake was another defensive struggle with the teams combining for 243 digs. The defensive effort should come as no surprise, however, with the Braves tallying 125 digs in last year's MVC Tournament matchup with the Bulldogs after 126 digs in the Nov. 3 home match between the squads. Bradley's 126 digs Saturday is tied for the most in the nation this season (Oakland vs. Northern Kentucky). Bradley's 126 and 125 digs totals last year vs. Drake were the most in the country in 2018 with Bradley now posting three of the top four dig totals in the nation since the start of the 2018 (all three against the Bulldogs).

Doubling Up

Sophomore Hannah Thompson has pushed her school record streak of consecutive double-doubles to 15 after tallying 16 kills and career-best 32 digs Saturday at Drake. Thompson, who is now tied for 10th in Bradley history with 35 career double-doubles, had the highest dig total in the MVC other than a libero since Missouri State's Lily Johnson had 32 digs vs. Drake on Oct. 13, 2017 and she had the most digs by a non-libero for the Braves dating back to 2005. Thompson also became the fifth player in Bradley history to reach 600 career kills as a sophomore in the outing with Drake.

Historic Conference Start

Loyola brings a six-match win streak, its longest of 2019, into a pivotal three-match stretch versus Illinois State, Bradley and Northern Iowa. At 6-0, the first-place Ramblers are off to their best start ever in Missouri Valley Conference play and their best start in league action since commencing the 2001 Horizon League campaign with a 7-0 ledger.



Winning Ways

Loyola is looking to post its second straight winning season. The last time the Ramblers recorded back-to-back winning campaigns was when they did so in eight straight seasons, 1997 through 2004. Over that eight-year period, Loyola went 171-81 (.679) overall and 85-19 (.817) in conference play, reaching the NCAA tournament on three occasions, while averaging 21 wins per season. The Ramblers have also never won more than nine MVC contests in a single season and have never finished higher than sixth in the Valley regular-season standings.

Fresh Success

Freshman outside hitter Addie Barnes leads the team with nine double-doubles this season and has produced at least 10 kills and 10 digs in each of the Ramblers' last three outings. During that three-match stretch, the Neenah, Wisconsin native is posting 3.10 kills, 4.10 digs and 0.70 service aces per set. Barnes leads Loyola with 214 total kills this season and is attempting to become the first freshman to lead the team in that category since Morgan Reardon in 2013 (213).

Rachel Maguire leads the nation in triple-doubles with nine. She recorded her ninth triple-double of the season in SIU's four-set win over Drake on Oct. 4 with 10 kills, 18 assists and 12 digs. Her nine triple-doubles are not only the most by a Missouri Valley Conference player since at least 2015, but are the third-most in a single-season in the NCAA over at least the past five seasons. Maguire's next triple-double will tie her with Meg Viggars (10) for the most triple-doubles in a career in school history.



Past 1,000

The Salukis notched their 1,000 dig of the season in the four-set win over Western Illinois on Sept. 21. Southern ranks first nationally in total digs with 1,437 and is 19th in the nation with a 17.31 digs per set average. Five Salukis have already reached the century mark for digs - Laura Rojas (354), Alayna Martin (246), Rachel Maguire (218), Katy Kluge (188) and Abi Fitzpatrick (123).

Piloting the Offense

Sweeps Upon Sweeps

Saturday's sweep over Southern Illinois was not only Valpo's third consecutive win to move back to .500 in MVC play, but also its third straight sweep dating back to last Saturday at Indiana State. This marks just the second time in the last four years that Valpo has swept three consecutive conference opponents. Last season, the Crusaders picked up four straight sweeps against MVC foes Sept. 21-28.



Stellar Defensive Effort

Valpo entered the weekend having limited just one of its first 18 opponents of the season to under .100 hitting, but did just that in both of the weekend's sweeps. The Crusaders opened by limiting Missouri State to .068 hitting, the lowest clip by a Valpo opponent since the Brown and Gold held Drake to .041 hitting on Sept. 28 of last season. Then, Valpo capped the weekend by holding Southern Illinois to .078 hitting in Saturday's sweep.

Hart Back in Middle

Sophomore Haley Hart only appeared in three of Valpo's first 15 matches to start the season, but the middle has started all five of Valpo's MVC contests to date and has been a strong presence. Thus far in MVC play, Hart is averaging 2.29 kills/set on a team-best .317 hitting and also leads Valpo with 1.06 blocks/set. After reaching double figures in kills just twice last season, Hart has tallied 10 or more kills in three of Valpo's last four matches, including a season-high tying 11 kills Saturday on .429 hitting in the win over SIU.
