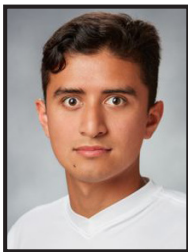

MVC Offensive Player of the Week

Adan Garcia, Sr., MF, Valparaiso

Adan Garcia made Valpo history this week by contributing to all three goals in a 3-1 road victory over Drake on Wednesday. He was credited with assists on all three, becoming just the second player in program history and first since 1985 to notch three assists in one game. He became the 20th player in the nation and first in the Missouri Valley Conference with a three-assist showing in 2019.

MVC Defensive Player of the Week

Walid Kherat, Sr., D, Bradley

Not only did Kherat anchor the defensive effort during a pair of shutouts, but he scored the only goal in either of the two games, leading Bradley to a 1-0-1 showing last week that catapulted the Braves into second place in the Missouri Valley Conference standings. Aided by Kherat's efforts as a central defender, Bradley limited Loyola Chicago to four shots on goal in Wednesday's scoreless draw and just two shots during the game's final 44 minutes, 11 seconds. Kherat and his defensive mates again limited the opposition to four shots on goal in Sunday's 1-0 win against Valparaiso. The senior defender scored his second goal of the season, and third of his career, in the 67th minute by heading home on a long throw sequence for the game-winning tally. Kherat, who netted his first career game-winning goal, logged all 190 minutes in Bradley's two games last week.

NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's player of the week selections, several conference players had notable performances, and they include:

Leroy Enzugusi (DU) - Enzugusi scored two go-ahead goals in Drake's two games this week, pushing his season total to an impressive seven goals. His seven scores rank third in the MVC, as do his 3.54 shots per game, and his 14 points are tied for third-most in the conference. Enzugusi has particularly been in strong form lately, recording three goals and an assist in his last three matches.

Jakub Hall (UE) - The highly regarded redshirt freshman opened his tally at No. 10 Missouri State on Saturday. Redshirt freshman Jakub Hall found the back of the net for the first time in his collegiate career on Saturday against Missouri State. Hall, who scored 78 goals in high school, tallied his first goal as an Ace in the 66th minute to help boost Evansville in a 2-1 loss to the Bears.

Aidan Megally (LUC) - On Senior Day, Megally scored the equalizer goal on an earned penalty kick for Loyola in the 84th minute which gave them a 3-2 lead over Drake. Megally also tallied a key assist on Billy Hency's goal, which prevented a Drake shutout. The senior also put six of his shots on target.

Matthew Bentley (MSU) - Matthew Bentley continued his stellar scoring frenzy for Missouri State, recording a goal in his fifth straight match in the 51st minute of the Bears' 2-1 win over Evansville on Saturday. The senior forward found an open window outside the Purple Aces' box and launched his ninth goal this season to increase the lead to 2-0 for MSU. In his first season as a Bear, Bentley leads the Valley with 21 points as seven of his nine goals have come during his current five-game scoring streak.

Luke Anderson (DU) - Anderson was a giant in net for the Bulldogs against Loyola, shattering his career-high with 9 saves on a whopping 24 shots faced. His previous best for saves in a game was four. Anderson is tied for second in the MVC with five official shutouts, not including his clean sheet against Evansville in a rain-shortened match.

Marcel Kampman (LUC) - Kampman picked up his fifth shutout this season in Loyola's draw with Bradley on Wednesday and tallied six total saves in matches against Bradley and Drake this week, which adds to his 30 saves on the season. The Graduate Student has also played in every single minute this year, which leads the MVC.

Michael Creek (MSU) - Goalkeeper Michael Creek collected a season-high five saves in Missouri State's 2-1 win over Evansville on Saturday to remain perfect on the season. Creek displayed a solid defensive performance between the pipes for the Bears, thwarting multiple Purple Aces' set pieces as well as securing a pair of crucial saves late in the match. The junior from St. Louis leads the conference in both save percentage (0.806) and goals against average (0.468), allowing just six goals in 2019.

MVC SOCCER NOTES

Share of Title Secure

Following Missouri State's win against Evansville on Saturday and Loyola tying with Drake on Sunday, the Bears clinched at least a share of the Missouri Valley Conference regular season title. Missouri State can claim the program's eighth regular season conference championship outright with a win or draw in Wednesday's match at Valparaiso. Missouri State is unbeaten in the all-time series against Valparaiso, owning a 9-0-1 advantage against the Crusaders.

Last Team Standing

Missouri State extended its winning streak to 13 games with Saturday's win over Evansville. The Bears have opened their season with 13 straight wins for the first time in program history. The winning streak ranks first nationally and sets a new program record.

Missouri State is the first MVC program to start a season 13-0-0 since SMU started the 2001 season 21-0-0 before suffering its only loss in the NCAA Tournament Quarterfinals to St. John's.

The Bears are the only team still sitting perfect in all of NCAA Division I.

MSU is one win shy of tying last year's Saint Mary's (Calif.) team that went 14-0 to start the 2018 season.

Historical Win Streaks

Missouri State moved to 7-0-0 in Valley play for the first time in program history with a win over Evansville Saturday. The streak is tied for the third longest league win streak in Valley history. A win Wednesday at Valpo would put the Bears into second, tied with 2000 SMU's 8 straight wins.

High Scoring Bears

Missouri State has already scored 31 goals on the season, marking their best season output this decade, surpassing 26 goals in 2018 and 2011. The Bears have only led The Valley in scoring twice in league history, netting 59 goals in 1995 and 49 goals in 1999 (MVC Champs with 17-1-3 record).

Road Winning Streak

Missouri State is sitting on a seven match road win streak entering Wednesday's afternoon match at Valpo. The streak is the second longest nationally behind St. Mary's (CA) who has won 8-straight on the road.

Elite on Both Ends

The Bears rank 6th nationally with a GAA of .453 (6 goals allowed) and rank 9th in goals per game (2.38). Missouri State is the only team in the nation to rank Top 10 nationally in both categories.

Polling

Missouri State continues to appear in the national rankings this week, sitting in the top 10 at No. 9 in the latest United Soccer Coaches Top 25 poll, No. 13 in the TopDrawerSoccer.com Top 25 and No. 15 in the College Soccer News Top 30 poll.

Loyola is receiving votes in the TopDrawerSoccer.com and College Soccer News polls this week.

The No. 9 ranking marks the highest spot for the Bears since the 2005 team peaked at No. 9 during an eight-week stretch inside the top-25. They also became the fourth team in program history to receive a top-10 ranking in the national poll, joining the 1999, 2000, and 2005 teams.

MSU's highest ranking came in the 2000 season with a No. 3 spot in the Sept. 11 poll.

MVC in Regional Rankings

The MVC has four teams ranked in the latest United Soccer Coaches West Regional rankings released on Tuesday (Oct. 29). Missouri State remained in the top spot in the region and sits No. 1, while Loyola (5th), Bradley (9th) and Drake (10th) also appear in the poll.

A year after going 1-5-0 in the Missouri Valley Conference race to finish seventh in the final league standings, Bradley's four points earned in its two games last week bumped the Braves into second place in the league standings with 14 total points ... Bradley will play non-conference road games Friday at Northern Kentucky and Nov. 4 at Western Illinois, before closing out the regular-season Nov. 9 against Evansville at Shea Stadium ... While a win against Evansville will be key to the race for a first-round bye in next month's MVC Men's Soccer Championship, the Braves will need some help as fourth-place Loyola Chicago (3-1-3, 11 points) still has three Valley games remaining.



1st Career Points

Sophomore midfielder Nick Feeney started the scoring play with a long throw from the left flank ... Aidan Megally leads the Missouri Valley Conference with 23 shots on goal and 55 shots this season (new program record). The senior has been topping Loyola's leaderboard but has also continued to move his way up in the conference. While leading in shots, Megally is also tied for first with nine goals and sits second in points with 20.



Every Point Counts

Loyola played to a draw in back-to-back matches this week, finishing in a scoreless tie with Bradley for the second time this season and a 3-3 tie with Drake on Sunday. Looking Ahead

If Loyola wins two of its final three games it will guarantee a second seed in the MVC Tournament, potentially earning an opening round bye. Loyola Soccer Park will play host to the MVC Tournament, where the Ramblers are 37-8-10 at since the start of the Neil Jones era in 2013.

Three Assist Showing

Senior midfielder Adan Garcia made Valpo history this week by contributing to all three goals in a 3-1 road victory over Drake on Wednesday. He was credited with assists on all three, becoming just the second player in program history and first since 1985 to notch three assists in one game. He became the 20th player in the nation and first in the Missouri Valley Conference with a three-assist showing. In addition, Garcia cracked the program record book in career assists by upping his total to 11. He now owns sole possession of 10th in program history and is the first Valpo player with a double-figure assist total since Adrian Ortiz finished his collegiate tenure with 13 in 2010.



Ranked Opponents

For the second time this season, Valpo will battle a nationally-ranked team on Wednesday as Missouri State makes its way to Brown Field. After visiting SMU on Sept. 13, the Brown & Gold will face an even tougher test with the Bears ranked in the Top 10 nationally entering the match. Since the start of the 2013 season, Valpo has five wins and one draw against nationally-ranked sides. Valpo last hosted a ranked team on Sept. 28, 2015, a 1-0 overtime victory over Omaha.

Four Goal Club

Mason Marcey posted his fourth goal of the season and the fifth of his career on Wednesday, becoming just the eighth player in the Missouri Valley Conference with four or more goals. He was the first Valpo player to hit that mark. Marcey had a three-point night in a 3-1 win over Drake, also notching his second assist of the year.
