

NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Sara Rhine (DU) - Last week, Sara Rhine averaged 19.5 points, 5.5 rebounds, 1.5 blocks and 1.0 steal while shooting a blistering 70.8 percent from the floor and 80.0 percent from the free throw. Rhine started the week at South Dakota with 25 points on a career-best 11 field goals on just 15 attempts finishing just two points shy of her career high. Despite battling foul trouble much of the game, she added five rebounds and one steal in 27 minutes. In the next win over Creighton, Rhine scored 16 points, grabbed six rebounds, tied her career-high with three blocks and handed out two assists. She drew seven Bluejays' fouls and finished 4-of-5 from the free throw line. Rhine is leading the league in scoring at 21.8 points per game.

Lexi Wallen (ILS) - Fifth-year senior Lexi Wallen had a career day in her hometown of Champaign, Illinois on Saturday, leading the Redbirds to a 74-58 upset of Big Ten in-state rival Illinois. Wallen posted career highs in points (26) and rebounds (9), while shooting an efficient 10-of-14 from the floor and 6-of-6 from the free throw line in the winning effort. Saturday's victory was Illinois State's first over a Big Ten opponent since they last defeated Illinois in 2012 and their first Power Five win since they bested Florida on Nov. 29, 2013.

Janae Gonzales (LUC) - Loyola sophomore guard Janae Gonzales cracked the 20-point mark for the second time in three games as the Ramblers downed Eastern Illinois, 67-51, in Charleston, Ill. last Wednesday. The Tolleson, Ariz. native knocked down seven of her 12 attempts from beyond the three-point arc en route to finishing with a game-high 24 points in addition to two rebounds, two assists, and two steals. Gonzales, who is currently tied for first nationally in three-point field goals made per game (5.33), is averaging a team-best 18.3 points through Loyola's first three games of the season.

Kam Finley (UNI) - Finley scored in double figures twice to lead UNI to a pair of wins over power five opponents and the first 4-0 start since the 1998-99 season. The Panthers also won their first win over Iowa since 2006 and the first win over an SEC school since beating Arkansas in 2001. Finley was 4-11 from the field for 10 points in just 10 minutes on the court for UNI in the Panthers' 78-73 win over Missouri, Wednesday. She hit back-to-back buckets in the first quarter to give UNI a 16-14 lead, which they would maintain until the third quarter. Sunday, she racked up 20 points in just 20 minutes on the court and shot 8-13 from the field. She scored nine of her 20 points in the second quarter as the Panthers pulled away from the Hawkeyes for a 22-point win. She has yet to miss a free throw this season going 11-11 from the line to date.

Makenzie Silvey (SIU) - Silvey averaged 15.0 points, 4.5 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.5 steals per game in Southern's two games over the weekend. The Glen Carbon, Ill. native shot 46.2 percent (12-for-26) from the field and knocked down 3-of-4 from the charity stripe. Silvey led the Salukis with 17 points on 8-of-13 shooting against IUPUI, a postseason team from a year ago, and followed with 13 points, seven boards and four assists in SIU's win over Tennessee Tech on Saturday. Silvey's seven rebounds in the victory over the Golden Eagles tied her career-best.

Addison Stoller (VALPO) - Stoller averaged 22.0 points and 6.0 rebounds per game over two road games last week for Valpo. The junior opened the week with a game-high 21 points on 6-of-12 shooting in Valpo's win at North Dakota State, and followed with a game-high 23 points - just one off her career high - and nine rebounds at North Dakota. Stoller went 3-for-5 from 3-point range in both games, matching her career best for 3-pointers made in both contests.

Mahri Petree (BRAD) - Petree helped highlight Bradley's largest victory since 1981-82 by scoring a game-high 16 points off the bench as she helped the BU reserves combine for 72 points in a 101-39 victory against Eureka. She scored all 16 of her points in the second half and had three rebounds, three assists, a block and a steal in 15 second-half minutes to finish with 16 points, four boards, four assists, one block and one steal in 21 minutes. Petree was 6-of-11 from the field and made 4-of-8 three-pointers in the victory.

Kierra Collier (DU) - Kierra Collier poured in a career-high 27 points and added four rebounds, four assists and two steals against South Dakota. Collier knocked down 10 field goals, including a career-high four three-pointers. In the victory over Creighton, she pulled down a career-high five rebounds and added three assists. In her first season as a Bulldog, Collier is averaging 11.8 points and 4.5 assists per game.

Jada Poland (UE) - In her first collegiate season since the 2017-18 season, redshirt junior Jada Poland has made an early impression for the Aces. Against SIUE on Wednesday, Poland scored 14 points, while recording a team-best seven rebounds in Evansville's road loss. Poland was efficient from the field, hitting six of her seven attempts and going one-for-one from the charity stripe.

Jasmine Elder (INS) - Freshman Jasmine Elder had the best offensive game of any Sycamore this season on Thursday at Western Illinois. The Louisville native dropped 20 points, a career-high, off the bench for the blue and white while also dishing out five assists and pulling down three rebounds in 28 minutes of action. Her play helped ISU to a 45-13 bench scoring advantage over the Leathernecks.

Gabby Walker (SIU) - Walker averaged 7.5 points, 2.0 rebounds and 1 assist per game off the bench in SIU's two games last week. The redshirt junior tallied her second double-digit scoring output of her Saluki career in the win over Tennessee Tech on Saturday, as she poured in 12 points on 5-of-8 shooting in 12 minutes off the bench.

MVC Players and Newcomers of the Week are selected each week during the women's basketball season. The players are announced on Monday afternoon and appear in a weekly press release. Nominees are provided by each school's sports information contact and voted on by a panel appointed by the league office.

Power Five Success

The MVC has already secured six wins over Power Five programs this season, including four wins last week. The Valley is 6-4 vs. Power Five teams this season, already doubling last season's win total of three. The Valley has a winning record against the Big 12 (2-1), Big Ten (3-2) and SEC (1-0) and the average margin of victory in the six wins is 10.3 points per game.

The Valley is responsible for 50% of the entire Big 12's losses and 37.5% of the entire Big Ten's losses so far this season as well as 21.4% of the losses by the Big 10, Big 12, Pac-12 and SEC combined (MVC has yet to play an ACC school).

Perfect at Home

Valley teams enter Week 3 sitting a perfect 11-0 at home this season. This week's schedule features nine home games on the schedule.

B1G Win

Illinois State defeated in-state foe Illinois, 74-58, on Saturday afternoon, marking the first Big Ten victory for the 'Birds since they last beat Illinois in December of 2012. It was also the first Redbird win over a Power Five conference team since ISU beat Florida, 68-64, on Nov. 29, 2013.

Chasing History

Loyola has a chance to make an impressive piece of history as it continues its four-game road trip this week against a pair of Western Athletic Conference (WAC) opponents in Chicago State and Kansas City. With a pair of wins, the Ramblers would match the best start to a season in program history, an honor that is currently held by the 1979-80 Ramblers, who also started 5-0 in the program's first Division I season.

Hot Start

UNI is 4-0 for the first time since the 1998-99 season, when the Panthers began the season with a 7-0 mark. The Panthers also had 4-0 starts during the 1973-74, 1972-73, 1971-72 and 1968-69 seasons.

Willard Leading the Pack

Senior Alexa Willard leads NCAA Division I this season with 44 made field goals, knocking down at least six shots from the floor in all five games. Willard is shooting 56 percent both overall and from 3-point land this year while making 89 percent of her free throws.

Frequent Flyer Miles

The Lady Bears have already played four road games this season with two separate trips to the Pacific Northwest. Missouri State traveled nearly 8,500 air and bus miles to pick up victories at No. 23 Minnesota, Boise State and Oklahoma, as well as a close loss at seventh-ranked Oregon State in the Preseason WNIT championship.

Poll Position

Drake and Missouri State continue to receive votes in this week's AP Top 25 Poll. The Lady Bears are receiving 24 votes and sit 30th, while the Bulldogs are receiving 6 votes this week (Nov. 18) and sit 32nd.

Mid-Major Top-25 Poll

Drake and Missouri State moved up in the latest CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 (Nov. 12). The Bulldogs moved up to third in the poll with two first place votes, while Missouri State moved up to fourth with four first place votes. UNI is also receiving votes, sitting 28th overall.

ESPNW Mid-Major Top-10 Poll

Drake and Missouri State appear at No. 1 and No. 3 in the latest ESPNW Mid-Major Top 10 Poll released Nov. 13 by Graham Hays. The Bulldogs and Lady Bears are joined by South Dakota, Rice and Gonzaga in the top five.

1,000 Point Club

The Valley has four active players in the 1,000 point club entering the season. Sara Rhine sits fourth on the NCAA career scoring chart, while Hittner sits eighth. The duo is the second highest teammate scoring tandem in the country behind Oregon's Sabrina Ionescu and Ruthy Hebard.

Charity Strippers

Three Valley players are currently perfect from the free-throw line so far this season, including Bradley's Nyjah White (8-of-8), UNI's Megan Maahs (13-of-13) and UNI's Kam Finley (11-of-11). Just 24 players in all of NCAA DI have made every free throw attempt this season.

Wade Award Watch List

Drake's Becca Hittner and Sara Rhine have each been selected to the "Wade Watch" list of candidates for the 2020 Wade Trophy presented to the best player in college women's basketball, the WBCA announced Thursday. Drake joins top ranked Oregon, #3 Stanford, #5 UConn and #7 Oregon State as the only schools with multiple players on the list.

Wooden Award Watch List

Drake senior Becca Hittner has been named to the John R. Wooden Award® presented by Wendy's® Women's Preseason Top 30 Watch List. The preseason list represents nine conferences: the Pac-12 leads all conferences with nine selections, followed by the SEC with six, the ACC and Big 12 with four apiece, the American and Big Ten with two each, and Conference USA, Ivy League, and Missouri Valley with one selection apiece.

Rhine on McClain Watch List

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA announced that Drake senior Sara Rhine is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2020 Katrina McClain Award. Named after the two-time All-American and 1987 National Player of the Year, the annual award in its third year recognizes the top power forwards in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2020 award will be narrowed to just 10.

Hittner on Drysdale Watch List

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA announced that Drake senior Becca Hittner is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2020 Ann Meyers Drysdale Award. Named after the first player, male or female, selected to the All-America Team in four-straight college seasons, the annual Drysdale award is in its third year and recognizes the top shooting guard in NCAA Division I women's college basketball. By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2020 award will be narrowed to just 10.

Postseason League

The MVC has seen an average of four league teams participate in postseason play in the last 21 seasons, including three teams reaching postseason play in 2018-19. Missouri State reached the Sweet Sixteen for the fourth time in program history, while Drake fell to Missouri in the First Round of the NCAA Tournament. UNI received a bid to the WNIT for the second-straight season. The Valley has earned multiple NCAA Tournament bids in 12 different seasons, including two out of the last three seasons.

Hoops in the Heartland

The 2020 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxSlayer Center in Moline, Ill., for the fifth-straight season.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event (Mar. 12-15) will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

The MVC's agreement with Visit Quad Cities will keep the MVC Women's Basketball Championship in TaxSlayer Center through at least 2021.

The 2020 tournament will mark the 13th-consecutive season in its 38-year history that the event will take place at a neutral site.

The Missouri Valley Conference is one of only seven conferences (out of 32 nationally) where the women's basketball tournament is played at a neutral site, separate from the men's championship (AAC, ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, MVC, Pac-12 and SEC are the others).

Bulldogs Favored

Drake was tabbed as the preseason favorite in the MVC Women's Basketball race in the annual survey of the league's coaches, SIDs and media.

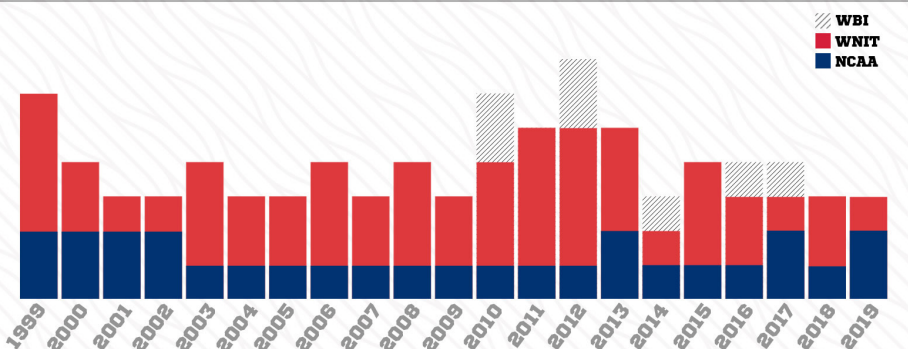

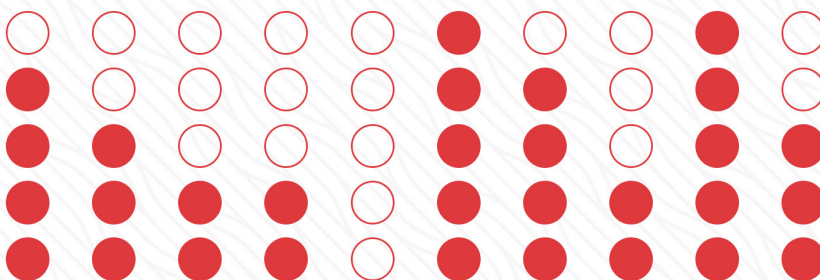

BRADLEY (2-1)

One For the Record Book

Bradley's home opener was certainly one for the record book with the Braves posting a 101-39 victory over Eureka. The Bradley bench combined for 72 points in what was the largest margin of victory (+62) for Bradley since a 104-38 win against St. Xavier on Dec. 14, 1981. The 11 first-half points scored by Eureka marked the lowest scoring half on record for a Bradley opponent and the Braves had the largest rebounding margin (+40) in program history. BU's 14 made three-pointers were the most in a home game in Bradley history and tied for the second most by the Braves behind 17 triples at Evansville (Jan. 21, 2018). Bradley's 63 rebounds rank second most all-time in school history behind a 64-rebound effort against Chicago State on Dec. 12, 1981.



Defending the Home Court

Bradley was 12-3 at Renaissance Coliseum last year and the Braves have won seven consecutive home contests after claiming the home opener. Overall, Bradley has won seven consecutive home non-conference contests dating back to a loss to Cleveland State on Dec. 19, 2017 with the Braves owning an 11-1 mark over their last 12 non-conference home games. Bradley's current seven-game home win streak is the longest in the now 10-year history of Renaissance Coliseum and the Braves also own the longest non-conference home win streak since a nine-game stretch between 2007-08 and 2008-09.

Strong Starts

Bradley is 2-1 or better to start a season for the third consecutive year and will be trying to make it three straight starts of 3-1 or better. SOUTHERN ILLINOIS (2-1)

Seeing An Uptick

The Salukis are averaging 85.7 points per game through the first three games of the 2019-20 season- which leads the Missouri Valley Conference and ranks 14th nationally. SIU also leads the MVC, and ranks 20th nationally, in field goal percentage (48.5%) and are ranked 24th in the nation in free throw percentage (79.3%). Southern's 257 points through its first three games is a school record.



Points Per Possession

Southern is averaging 117.9 points per possession- the ninth-best average in the nation. Not only do the Salukis rank ninth nationally in the category, but it is the highest average of any mid-major program. SIU is doing so thanks to a .97 points per play average- the 10th-best average in the nation.

Cleaning Glass

The Salukis defeated the Tennessee Tech Golden Eagles, 76-65 on Saturday thanks to a healthy advantage on the glass. Southern won the rebounding battle, 46-to-32, including a 17-to-5 edge on the offensive glass. The Salukis have won the rebounding battle in all three of their games this season and SIU leads the Valley, and ranks 21st nationally, with a 43.4% offensive rebound rate.

Challenging Slate

Valpo's game at Northwestern on Thursday will be the second of fourth against postseason teams from a season ago in the Crusaders' non-conference schedule, and perhaps the most challenging, as the Wildcats were WNIT finalists last year and are coming off a 21-point win at Duke on Sunday. Valpo already faced Ohio State and still has games remaining against Toledo and Morehead State - both of which advanced to the second round of the WNIT last year.



Finally Coming Home

Fans will finally get the chance to see Valpo at home in the ARC this coming Sunday, Nov. 24 when it hosts Bowling Green after four consecutive games away from home to start the season. It is Valpo's longest stretch of games away from home to open a season since beginning the 2007-08 season with six consecutive games away from the ARC. In addition, the Nov. 24 home opener is the program's latest since the 2010-11 squad also took to the ARC floor for the first time on Nov. 24.

Pouring in the Points

Junior Addison Stoller has picked up right where she left off last season leading the Crusaders. Stoller is averaging team highs of 18.3 points and 6.0 rebounds per game through three games, including consecutive efforts of 21 and 23 points last weekend at North Dakota State and North Dakota, respectively. It was the second time in her career Stoller has scored 20+ in back-to-back games, as she dropped 22 against Missouri State and 24 versus Southern Illinois in a three-day span last year.
