MVC Player of the Week

Gabi Haack, Jr., G, Bradley

Haack averaged 22.0 points, 5.5 rebounds and 2.0 assists while shooting 54 percent from the field and 47 percent from three-point range in a pair of wins. She made 5-of-11 three-point attempts and collected 20 points, five rebounds, two assists and a block as Bradley blitzed Western Illinois 84-49 on the road. Haack scored 18 of her game-high 20 points in the first half to help the Braves jump out to a 46-19 halftime lead against a team which has made the postseason three of

the last four years. Saturday, she tossed in a team-high 24 points and also tallied six rebounds and two assists in a 79-68 victory against a Miami (Ohio) team which has 21 or more wins each of the past two seasons and made back-to-back WNIT appearances. Haack moved up two spots on Bradley's career three-point list last week, passing head coach Andrea Gorski and former teammate Anneke Schlueter to move into fifth in BU history.

MVC Newcomer of the Week

Sam Galanopoulos, Fr., G, Loyola Chicago

Loyola freshman guard Sam Galanopoulos reached double figures in scoring in both of the Maroon & Gold's wins last week, averaging 11.5 points, 6.5 rebounds, and a team-best 5.5 assists. The Skokie, III. product flirted with only the second tripledouble in program history in Tuesday's 98-53 rout of Chicago State, finishing with 13 points (6-9 FGs, 1-2 3FGs), eight rebounds, and eight assists, all season-high marks. She added 10 points (1-8 FGs, 8-9 FTs), five rebounds and three assists

in Friday's 72-67 double-overtime thriller at Kansas City, knocking down a pair of pressure-packed free throws late in the first overtime. Galanopoulos, who has seen action in all five games this season, is averaging 3.6 assists, a mark that leads all Valley freshmen.

NOTEWORTHY

In addition to the league's Player and Newcomer of the Week selections, several conference players had notable performances, including:

Becca Hittner (DU) - Becca Hittner helped Drake race past Western Illinois, 94-75, Sunday in the team's only game of the week. Hittner recorded her second-straight double-double with a season-high 25 points and career-best 12 rebounds. She finished 7-of-17 from the floor, including knocking down three three-pointers, and made 8-of-8 from the free throw line. Hittner added two blocks, one assist and one steal in just 27 minutes of action. Her big performance moved her to No. 13 all-time at Drake in career scoring with 1,643 points.

Jada Poland (UE) - Playing three games this week, redshirt junior Jada Poland made a significant impact in helping the Aces stay competitive. Poland scored a career-high 23 points as Evansville dropped a road contest at Austin Peay on Thursday. Poland's best performance of her Aces' career to this point came on Sunday in a 66-62 overtime win for Evansville. Poland scored a game-high 19 points, while securing eight rebounds and helping the Aces win their second game of the season. On the week, Poland displayed the ability to knock down perimeter shots, going 6-10 from distance.

Lexi Wallen (ILS) - Fifth-year senior Lexi Wallen averaged 4.5 rebounds and 14 points on 73.3% shooting to help the 'Birds to a pair of non-conference wins this week and their best start since the 2007-08 season. Wallen had a team-high 18 points in Wednesday's home victory over Northern Illinois, going 7-of-9 from the field and grabbing five boards. In Sunday's road win at North Dakota, Wallen collected 10 points and four rebounds, going a perfect 2-2 from the charity stripe. Wallen has scored in the double-digits in every game so far this season.

LeAndra Echi (INS) - LeAndra Echi was dominant in Indiana State's victory over Illinois-Chicago on Tuesday. The junior posted her second double-double of the season, recording 12 points and 10 rebounds, while also tallying an impressive six blocks. Her six blocks are the most by a Sycamore since Ty Battle also earned six on Jan. 21, 2018 against Illinois State. Echi is second in the Valley in blocks-per-game with 1.5 and also fifth in the MVC in rebounds-per-game with 8.3.

Allison Day (LUC) - Loyola sophomore forward Allison Day averaged 16.5 points, 5.5 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 1.0 blocks as the Ramblers picked up a pair of road wins last week. In Tuesday's 98-53 victory at Chicago State, Day connected on seven of her nine attempts from the field en route to finishing with 16 points, six rebounds, and three assists. The Russellville, Ohio native paced the Rambler attack three days later against Kansas City, pouring in 17 points (8-19 FGs, 1-2 FTs) in addition to five rebounds, two assists, and two blocks as Loyola picked up a thrilling 72-67 double-overtime win. Day currently ranks third on the Loyola roster in scoring (13.2 ppg) and is operating at a 62.5 percent (30-of-48) clip from the field, good enough for fourth overall in the MVC.

Emily Gartner (MSU) - Emily Gartner scored a career-high 20 points in No. 22 Missouri State's 71-64 win over Santa Clara on Friday, adding eight rebounds, one assist, one steal and a blocked shot. Gartner shot 7-for-15 from the floor, with additional career highs of 27 minutes and 6-for-8 at the free throw line to help the Lady Bears move to 5-1 on the season.

Mackenzie Silvey (SIU) - Makenzie Silvey averaged 25.0 points on an efficient 60-percent (21-of-35) shooting from the floor, which included 54.5% (6-of-11) shooting from behind the arc. The junior from Glen Carbon, III. also averaged 4.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists, 1.5 blocks and a steal in SIU's two games last week. Silvey tied her season-high with 28 points on 11-of-21 shooting against Memphis, of which 17 points came in the fourth quarter. At Eastern Michigan on Saturday, Silvey poured in 22 points on 71.4% (10-of-14) shooting. In doing so, it marked just the 30th time in program history that a Saluki has scored 20-plus points in back-to-back games. She also upped her season average to 21.6 points per game-which leads the Valley and ranks 16th nationally.

Shay Frederick (VALPO) - Frederick was instrumental in Valpo's come-from-behind win over Bowling Green on Sunday, scoring 13 of her 21 points in the fourth quarter and overtime and adding a pair of key assists in the extra period. Frederick's 21 points against BGSU matched a career high, while she went 13-of-14 from the foul line, easily setting a new career high for made free throws. Her 13 made free throws tied the fifth-most by a Valpo player in a single game and were the most by a Valpo player since February of 2012. Thursday against Northwestern, Frederick tied for team-high honors with six rebounds.

Mahri Petree (BRAD) - Petree averaged 9.5 points, 5.0 rebounds, 0.5 assists, 1.0 block and 1.0 steal per game, helping Bradley to a pair of wins last week. She came off the bench to notch 14 points, seven rebounds, one assist, one block and one steal in an 84-49 road win at Western Illinois. Petree did the bulk of her scoring in the first half, collecting nine points, five rebounds, one assist and a steal in the opening 20 minutes to help the Braves to a 46-19 halftime lead against a team which made the postseason three of the last four years. Saturday, Petree had five points, three rebounds, a block and a steal in 19 minutes off the bench to help the Braves a 79-68 win over Miami (Ohio), which has 21 or more wins each of the past two seasons and made back-to-back WNIT appearances.

Mary Crompton (ILS) - Crompton posted nine points and four rebounds in each of Illinois State's games this week to help the Redbirds to a pair of non-conference wins and their best start since the 2007-08 season. In Wednesday's 69-66 home victory over Northern Illinois, Crompton tallied all nine of her points in the fourth quarter, six of which came from back-to-back three-pointers. The redshirt freshman also hit a season-high three triples in Sunday afternoon's win at North Dakota, shooting 3-of-7 from behind the arc.

Carie Weinman (VALPO) - Weinman scored a season-best 18 points in Sunday's overtime win over Bowling Green, hitting 6-of-10 from the field. She led Valpo by going 4-of-8 from 3-point range after going just 4-of-20 from deep in the season's first four games.

Power Five Success

The MVC has already secured six wins over Power Five programs this season. The Valley is 6-5 vs. Power Five teams this season, already doubling last season's win total of three. The Valley has a winning record against the Big 12 (2-1) and SEC (1-0) and is 3-3 vs. the Big Ten. The average margin of victory in the six wins is 10.3 points per game.

Valley women's hoops sits 37-15 during the first three weeks of play. The Valley has the highest winning percentage outside of the Power Five conferences entering this week's action.

Hot Starts

Six Valley teams are sitting with one or fewer losses entering play this week. Four of those six teams are off to historic starts.

Loyola's 5-0 start is the second in program history, matching the 1979-80 Ramblers. A win at Portland Sunday would give Loyola the best start in program history.

UNI's 5-0 start is the first for the program since the 1998-99 season. That Panthers team holds the program record with a 7-0 start.

Missouri State's 6-1 start is the best for the Lady Bears since opening the 2003-04 season 19-1.

Illinois State's 4-1 start is the best for the Redbirds since going 18-1 in 2007-08.

Bradley's 4-1 start marks the second-straight season and 10th time in school history Bradley has kicked off a season with a 4-1 record or better. The Braves have back-to-back starts of 4-1 or better for the first time since 1981-82.

Drake is no stranger to 4-1 starts. The Bulldogs have kicked off a season 4-1 seven times since the 2000-01 season.

Sister Act

Bradley's first set of sisters on a roster since 1977-78, sophomore Lasha Petree and freshman Mahri Petree are one of 22 sets of sisters on NCAA Division I rosters in 2019-20. Mahri (9.2 ppg) has scored in double figures in two of the last three games and has combined with her sister Lasha (13.4 ppg) to average 22.6 points per game. The duo is the third highest scoring sister combo in the country through games of Nov. 25. Only four sets of sisters are combining to average at least 20 points per game, with Mahri the lone freshman among that group.

Willard's Hot Shooting

Missouri State's Alexa Willard is well above pace to finish 50-40-90 this season, a shooting percentage line very few players reach. Through seven games, the senior is shooting 54.9 percent overall, 61.5 percent on three-pointers and 92.3 percent at the foul line.

Frequent Flyer Miles

After traveling roughly 10,000 miles in November, the Lady Bears have a much-needed home stand to start December, with three straight games at JQH Arena to begin the month. In all, four of MSU's five December games will be in Springfield, though a trip to Gonzaga on Dec. 20 will still add a few thousand miles to the travel ledger.

Poll Position

Drake and Missouri State continue to receive votes in this week's AP Top 25 Poll. The Lady Bears are receiving 36 votes and sit 29th, while the Bulldogs are receiving 6 votes this week (Nov. 25) and sit 32nd.

The Lady Bears entered the national rankings on Nov. 19 in the No. 22 spot of the USA Today Coaches poll, and moved up to 19th this week. MSU has now been ranked 111 weeks (58 Coaches, 53 AP), most recently at 24th in the final coaches poll last season. Prior to this year, Missouri State last had a regular season ranking on Feb. 9, 2004.

Mid-Major Top-25 Poll

Drake, Missouri State and UNI all appear in the latest CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 (Nov. 19). The Bulldogs sit third in the poll, while Missouri State sits fourth with two first place votes. UNI entered the poll this week and jumped all the way up to No. 15.

ESPNW Mid-Major Top-10 Poll

Drake and Missouri State appear at No. 1 and No. 3 in the latest ESPNW Mid-Major Top 10 Poll released Nov. 13 by Graham Hays. The Bulldogs and Lady Bears are joined by South Dakota, Rice and Gonzaga in the top five.

Against the Field

The MVC holds a winning record against 11 leagues in non-conference play, including the America East (1-0), Big 12 (2-1), Conference USA (1-0), Horizon (3-1), MAC (4-0), Mountain West (1-0), SEC (1-0) Southland (1-0), Summit (6-3), West Coast (1-0) and WAC (2-0). The MVC holds at least a .500 mark against the American (1-1), Big East (1-1), Big Ten (3-3) and Ohio Valley (4-4). The MVC has a losing record to only the Pac-12 (0-1).

Wade Award Watch List

Drake's Becca Hittner and Sara Rhine have each been selected to the "Wade Watch" list of candidates for the 2020 Wade Trophy presented to the best player in college women's basketball, the WBCA announced Thursday. Drake joins top ranked Oregon, #3 Stanford, #5 UConn and #7 Oregon State as the only schools with multiple players on the list.

Wooden Award Watch List

Drake senior Becca Hittner has been named to the John R. Wooden Award® presented by Wendy's® Women's Preseason Top 30 Watch List. The preseason list represents nine conferences: the Pac-12 leads all conferences with nine selections, followed by the SEC with six, the ACC and Big 12 with four apiece, the American and Big Ten with two each, and Conference USA, lvy League, and Missouri Valley with one selection apiece.

Rhine on McClain Watch List

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA announced that Drake senior Sara Rhine is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2020 Katrina McClain Award. Named after the two-time All-American and 1987 National Player of the Year, the annual award in its third year recognizes the top power forwards in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2020 award will be narrowed to just 10.

Hittner on Drysdale Watch List

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA announced that Drake senior Becca Hittner is one of 20 watch list candidates for the 2020 Ann Meyers Drysdale Award. Named after the first player, male or female, selected to the All-America Team in four-straight college seasons, the annual Drysdale award is in its third year and recognizes the top shooting guard in NCAA Division I women's college basketball. By mid-February, the watch list of 20 players for the 2020 award will be narrowed to just 10.

Postseason League

The MVC has seen an average of four league teams participate in postseason play in the last 21 seasons, including three teams reaching postseason play in 2018-19. Missouri State reached the Sweet Sixteen for the fourth time in program history, while Drake fell to Missouri in the First Round of the NCAA Tournament. UNI received a bid to the WNIT for the second-straight season. The Valley has earned multiple NCAA Tournament bids in 12 different seasons, including two out of the last three seasons.

Hoops In the Heartland

The 2020 Missouri Valley Conference Women's Basketball Tournament will return to the TaxS-layer Center in Moline, III., for the fifth-straight season.

Affectionately coined "Hoops in the Heartland," the four-day event (Mar. 12-15) will showcase all 10 Missouri Valley Conference schools as they compete for the Valley's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

The MVC's agreement with Visit Quad Cities will keep the MVC Women's Basketball Championship in TaxSlayer Center through at least 2021.

The 2020 tournament will mark the 13th-consecutive season in its 38-year history that the event will take place at a neutral site.

The Missouri Valley Conference is one of only seven conferences (out of 32 nationally) where the women's basketball tournament is played at a neutral site, separate from the men's championship (AAC, ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, MVC, Pac-12 and SEC are the others).

Bulldogs Favored


Drake was tabbed as the preseason favorite in the MVC Women's Basketball race in the annual survey of the league's coaches, SIDs and media.

Starters Returning

The Missouri Valley Conference will see 30 of 50 starters return (60%) for the 2019-20 season. The league will return nine of its top 10 in scoring, seven of its top 10 in rebounding and four of its top five in assists. The Valley will also have eight of its 11 All-MVC players return and five of its six honorable mention selections.

1,000 Point Club

The Valley has four active players in the 1,000 point club entering the season. Sara Rhine sits sixth on the NCAA career scoring chart, while Hittner sits eighth. The duo is the second highest teammate scoring tandem in the country behind Oregon's Sabrina lonescu and Ruthy Hebard.

Junior Gabi Haack got off to a bit of a cold start to the year, going 0-for-10 from three-point range to kick off the season. Since halftime of the Nov. 10 game at #24/25 Michigan, Haack has made 14-of-31 (45.2 percent) three-point attempts. In fact, Haack has connected on 12 of her last 23 triples. She moved up two



spots on Bradley's career three-point list with her 4-for-8 performance from beyond the arc in Saturday's win over Miami (Ohio). Haack passed head coach Andrea Gorski and former teammate Anneke Schlueter to move from seventh to fifth in career three-point field goals at Bradley. She enters the week fifth with 151 career trey's and needs nine to move up two more spots into third.

Cleaning the Glass
Senior Chelsea Brackmann pulled down a season-high 18 rebounds in
Saturday's win at Miami and averaged an impressive 15.0 rebounds per
outing in two contests last week. Currently leading the MVC once again in rebounding at 10.2 per tilt, she has been even more efficient on the glass so far in 2019-20. Brackmann, who had a league-best 16 doubledoubles last year, has yet to collect a double-double through the first five games. Averaging 19.6 minutes per game this year vs. her 27.5 minutes per game in 2018-19, Brackmann has collected 20.8 boards per 40 minutes this year compared to 15.8 boards per 40 minutes during her record-setting junior campaign.

On a Roll

Bradley brings a three-game win streak into this week's Coastal Carolina Thanksgiving Classic after the Braves improved to 4-1 on the year with a 79-68 home victory over Miami (Ohio). The 4-1 start to the year marks the second straight season and 10th time in school history Bradley has kicked off a season with a 4-1 record or better. The Braves have backto-back starts of 4-1 or better for the first time since 1981-82 (5-1) and 1980-81 (7-1).

Loyola matched its best start to a season in program history as it ran its record to a perfect 5-0 after picking up a pair of road wins over opponents from the Western Athletic Conference (WAC) last week. In Tuesday's emphatic 98-53 triumph at Chicago State, the Ramblers



shot a sizzling 55.2 percent (37-of-67) from the field and dished out 31 assists, finishing just two shy of the program's single-game record. Just three days later, Allison Day scored a team-high 17 points to help push the Maroon & Gold to a thrilling 72-67 double-overtime victory at Kansas City.

Working (Double) Overtime

Friday afternoon's exciting clash with Kansas City marked Loyola's first double overtime game since February 11, 1999 against former Horizon League foe Wright State. It was also the Ramblers' first overtime victory since a 69-68 win at Southern Illinois back on January 10, 2016.

One More & Then We Are Home

Loyola will look to move to 6-0 for the first time in program history when it closes out a season-long four-game road trip at Portland on Sunday afternoon. The Ramblers, who will be playing their first game in the state of Oregon, have already matched their road win total from all of last season. Following its trip to the Pacific Northwest, Loyola will return to the friendly confines of Gentile Arena for the first time in nearly a month when it hosts Dartmouth on December 4.

SOUTHERN ILLINOIS (3-2)

Getting to the Basket

Through five games, SIU leads the Valley, and ranks 12th nationally in field goal percentage (48.9%). SIU shot 55% from the field in its win at Eastern Michigan-which marked the third time already this season that Southern has shot 50% or better from the floor.



SIU's three games shooting 50% or higher are as many as it had during the entire 2018-19 season. Southern is 14-6 under seventh-year head coach Cindy Stein when making at least half of its shot attempts and holds an .811% (86-20) winning percentage when shooting 50% or better since 1988.

Upping Its Average

Southern scored 85 points in its win over Eastern Michigan, and it marked the fourth time in five games that SIU has scored 75 or more points in a game. The Salukis currently rank second in the Valley, and 27th in the nation, with an 81.6 points per game average. Southern is doing so by ranking in the top-20 nationally of both field goal and three-point field goal percentage. SIU ranks 19th nationally in 3-point FG percentage at 40.2-percent.

Mak Attack

Makenzie Silvey scored 22 points in SIU's win over Eastern Michigan on Saturday on an efficient 71.4-percent (10-of-14) shooting Saturday-which marked the second-straight game in which she has reached the 20-point plateau. The Glen Carbon, III. native is just the 30th player in program history to record back-to-back 20-point efforts and first to do so since Nicole Martin in 2018. Silvey is averaging 21.6 points per game-which leads the Valley and ranks 16th nationally.
